

Much more than a World Championship, the 2010 meeting in Paris will be a matchless opportunity to place fencing on the highroad to elegance and aesthetics. The choice of the *Grand Palais*, declared a historic monument, to host the event could not have been better, and fencers will have a unique chance of proving their talent and their prowess in a luxurious and historical setting.

The Grand Palais was conceived and designed to provide the dazzling quality expected of universal exhibitions organized in large European Capitals. Even today, the magnificent glassdomed roof of the nave (Nef), where competitions take place, is the largest in Europe.

UNIVERSAL EXHIBITIONS

Paris hosted a Universal Exhibition for the first time in 1855. This large event was repeated every 11 years from 1867 until 1900. For this first Exhibition, the *Palais de l'Industrie*, inspired by the *Crystal Palace* in London, where the first Universal Exhibition in history took place, was opened. With each exhibition, the extension of the facilities was enlarged and it grew from 16 hectares in 1855 to 135 in 1900.

During the exhibition of 1889, the celebrated *Tour Eiffel* was opened, originally planned to be dismantled, it became, with time, one of the symbols of the French capital.

When the 1889 Exhibition was over, there was much discussion as to the preparations for the 1900 Exhibition. This date was highly symbolic and marked the passage from the prodigious XIX century to the XX century that was expected to go beyond the wildest bounds of man's imagination. In 1892 the press announced in the news that Berlin would organize a Universal Exhibition that same year; this was sufficient for the French authorities to start work on an architectural project that would surpass

everything that had so far been built for this purpose.

THE PROJECT

Therefore, when the design for the 1900 Exhibition was begun it was with the first sketches of a building that would forever change the face of Paris. It would bring into play a new perspective linking the **Champs-Elysées** with the **Esplanade des Invalides** extremely significant points in the city.

It meant replacing the Palais de l'Industrie with a totally new fine arts palace, and the final construction project in 1896 is attributed to 4 architects whose respective projects were joined together.

THE CONSTRUCTION

Construction finally commenced in 1897 and had to be concluded in record time for the opening of the Exhibition. For this feat to be successful and to overcome the numerous obstacles that could delay the immense building project, almost 15,000 workers were employed and the most modern mechanical devices used such as movable cranes, steam powered maChinas and even movable bridges.

Finally about 40 artists were employed to give the finishing touches to the Palace. They were charged with designing and executing the statues, ornaments and other monuments to embellish the building. The inscription displayed on the facade of the building clearly states the ambition of this highly cultural edifice: "Monument consecrated by the Republic to the glory of French art"

Finally, the Grand Palais was officially inaugurated on May 1, 1900, by the President of the Republic, *Emile Loubet*, marking the opening of the Universal Exhibition that was attended that year by more than 50 million visitors. The *Alexandre III Bridge* over the *Seine* linked the Invalides with the Champs-Elysées.

THE EVENTS

The Grand Palais was the venue for universal exhibitions, artistic shows, equestrian events, automobile and aviation shows, fairs and spectacles that followed one another throughout the XX century, and was unfortunately interrupted by two dark periods.

During the First World War, the army requisitioned it to serve as a rest centre for the troops and as military hospital. And during the Second World War, the Germans used it as a warehouse and to serve the aims of Nazi propaganda.

Restoration work, which is still ongoing, was begun in November 2001 after it was closed for 8 years, and must be completed in 2011 when the last phase of restoration and reconstruction will be accomplished. Meanwhile, the Grand Palais was reopened to the public in 2005.

THE NAVE AND PARIS 2010

The space of the huge nave, which will be completely converted for the occasion into a fencing arena, will make this World Championship a unique event in the history of fencing, and an incontrovertible venue for all fencing fans, as also for fans of sports and culture in general.





THE THREE WEAPONS

EPÉE

The épée is a thrusting weapon only. Attacks with this weapon are therefore made with the point only.

At épée, the target includes the whole of the fencer's body including his clothing and equipment.

Thus any hit which arrives is counted, whatever part of the body (trunk, limbs or head), clothing or equipments is touched.

FOIL

As épée, foil is a thrusting weapon only. Offensive actions with this weapon are made therefore with the point only.

At foil, only hits which arrive on the target are counted as valid, but the non-valid hit (white light) stops the bout between the two foil fencers.

The target excludes the limbs and the head. It is confined to the trunk, the upper limit being the collar up to 6 cm above the prominences of the collar bones.


SABRE

The sabre is a weapon for thrusting and cutting with both the cutting edge and the back of the blade.

All hits made with the cutting edge, the flat or the back of the blade are counted as good (cuts and back-cuts).

Only hits which arrive on the target area are counted as valid. A hit which arrives on a non-valid part of the target is not counted as a hit; an off-target hit does not cause any signaling of the machine and does not affect the existing byplay of the fencing phrase in any way.

The target comprises any part of the body above a horizontal line drawn between the top of the folds formed by the thighs and by the trunk of the fencer when in the on-guard position.



TRAINING CAMP

President Alisher Usmanov hopes that all the National Federations affiliated to the FIE have the chance to participate in the World Championships.

It is also thanks to the joint effort of the FIE and the French Federation, FFE, (travel, lodging, local transport, technical training), that one fencer per country from 36 different countries has been invited to participate in a training camp which has taken place at the Ecole Interarmee Sports at Fontainbleau from 28th October till 2nd November. Their participation in the World Championships has been undertaken under the same conditions by the FIE from 2nd to 9th November, the date at which the individual competitions will finish.

Individual events

Team events

Gold medal: 30,000 US per team x 6 = 180,000 US\$ Silver medal: 15,000 US\$ per team x 6 = 90,000 US\$ Bronze medal: 10,000 US\$ per team x 6 = 60,000 US\$
