This moral report covers the events which occurred over the period from 1st January to 31 December 2016.

OBITUARY

The International Fencing Federation has been affected by the death of several friends:

GERRIE BAUMGART (USA) - 1942-2016

The USA Fencing family lost one of the trailblazers for the referee community when Gerrie Baumgart (Northglenn, Colo.) passed away at 73 years old. Baumgart, who took up fencing as an adult, would go on to break the glass ceiling for female referees. Not only was she the first U.S. woman to earn an FIE A rating, but she also became the first to not only officiate at the Olympic Games, but she refereed the gold medal epee team final at the Games in Atlanta in 1996.

Baumgart was an outstanding international referee, but she was also a woman determined to help groom future generations of fencing officials and is known among the referee cadre for being a mentor and role model to her fellow officials for the past four decades, both at tournaments as well as through her role on the Fencing Officials Commission.

ZSOLT KAPOSVÁRI (HUN) - 1969-2016

Zsolt Kaposvári passed away in Wuxi, China, on April 14, 2016, where he was nominated as a referee for the Asian qualifying event and Asian Senior Championships. He was a Hungarian national champion sabre fencer, and after an active sports career he became one of the world's leading referees.

Zsolt Kaposvári started fencing in 1977 and participated in the Junior World Championships representing his club, Honvéd. During his career he won team gold in the seniors. His results were:

- 1988 – Junior World Cup: 8th place
- 1990 – Senior Hungarian Team Championship: 1st place
- 1990 – Senior Hungarian Individual Championship: 7th place
- 1991 – Champions League: 2nd place
- 1991 – Senior Hungarian Team Championship: 1st place
- 1992 – Champions League: 4th place ('B' National Team)
- 1993 – Champions League: 3rd place

He retired as a fencer in 1994 and started refereeing, finding success in this field quickly. As a referee with a license for all three weapons, he refereed in the finals of the 2012 London Olympic Games, and the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games, and Paralympic Games. He was assigned to the 2016 Rio Olympic Games by the FIE. He also refereed in the:

- Senior World Championships in Moscow (2015), Kazan (2014), Budapest (2013), Catania (2011), Paris (2010), Antalya (2009), St. Petersburg (2007), Turin (2006).
- Junior and cadet World Championships in Acireale (2008), Belfast (2009), Baku (2010) and Plovdiv (2014).

And in many Zonal Championships, World Cup and Grand Prix competitions.

He was nominated by the FIE as an elite referee in 2014 and 2015, third best Referee in the world in 2012. He was best Referee in Hungary in: 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010.

In 1997, he graduated from the marketing college of the Economic University of Pennsylvania. In 2006, he got an MBA English College degree in marketing. In 2009-2010, he was a member of the Hungarian Paralympic Committee – Marketing Division Leader.

The FIE and the sport of fencing have lost a talented fencer and a remarkable referee of great merit.

DR. PREMYSL HERYCH (CZE) - 1928-2016

Dr. Herych was a renowned and highly respected figure in the fencing community who devoted the majority of his life to the sport.

As a fencer, Dr. Herych quickly mastered all three weapons and found success at youth level before representing Czechoslovakia at senior level. He was a national champion in individual and a five-time national team champion. In 1953, he was a founding member of the Czech Fencing Club SLAVIA VS Praha, still one of the biggest and best clubs in the Czech Republic (now called USK Praha), and was its first president.

He then became president of the Czechoslovak/Czech Fencing Federation from 1968 to 2001, and served as vice president of the Czech Olympic Committee from 1990 to 1998.

In 1991, he represented his federation in Vienna as one of the founders of the Union Européenne d'Escrime, which later became the European Fencing Confederation.

At the International Fencing Federation, he served for 20 years as member of the Calendar and Promotion Commission.

FULVIO GALIMI (ARG) - 1927-2016

Fulvio Galimi won his first tournament at the age of 13, At 15, he became national champion in épée. Then practising the three weapons, he participated in many renowned competitions in America and Europe and obtained innumerable awards. Some of his achievements were:

- 1946 – National Sabre Tournament: 1st place; South American Championship: 1st place by team, 3rd place for individual. National champion (foil)
- 1947 – National champion (foil). International tournaments in Punta del Este and Villa del Mar: 1st place (foil)
- 1948 – London Olympic Games (foil, team): 5th place. 1st place in the University Championships in Buenos Aires (foil and sabre)
- 1949 – National Tournament of the Republic (foil): 1st place
- 1951 – 1st Panamerican Games (foil): 2nd place
- 1952 – Helsinki Olympic Games (member of the national team)
- 1953 – World University Games (foil): 4th place
- 1955 – 2nd Panamerican Games : 1st place (foil, team); 3rd place (foil, individual), and 3rd place (sabre, team)
- 1962 – National Championship: 1st place (sabre); 2nd place (foil)

Fulvio Galimi retired from fencing in 1967 at the Championship of the Republic of Argentina, where he was crowned foil and sabre champion.

In 2012, the Argentine National Senate awarded him the "Diploma of Honor for his services to the Argentinian Sport".

He was the President of the Fencing Federation of the City of Buenos Aires.

LUTZ SCHIRRMACHER (GER) - 1943-2016

Lutz Schirrmacher was born in 1943 in Leipzig. He started fencing in 1960 and won several national titles (individual and team) in all weapons. As such, he had been a Member of the German National Sabre Team (DFB).

He was also Team Captain of the German Sabre Team from 1998 to 2004.

As an FIE international referee, he officiated in numerous international tournaments, World Championships and Olympic Games. He started his career as international referee in 1968 and became an FIE A-grade referee at all three weapons in 1976.

He had been a Member of the EFC Refereeing Commission from 2001 until 2009.

Since 2004, he was a member of the FIE Rules commission. For the 2016 elections, he was a candidate to the FIE Executive Committee.

The FIE and the sport of fencing have lost a talented fencer, a referee of great merit and a remarkable member of the Rules Commission.

Lutz Schirrmacher was highly regarded for his loyalty, his experience and knowledge, as well as for his commitment for junior fencers.

GENERAL HOUSHMAND ALMASSI (IRI) - 1928-2016

He was a member of the Iranian fencing national team participating in Tokyo Olympic Games.

He got his fencing diploma from Italy and was Iran national coach for many years.

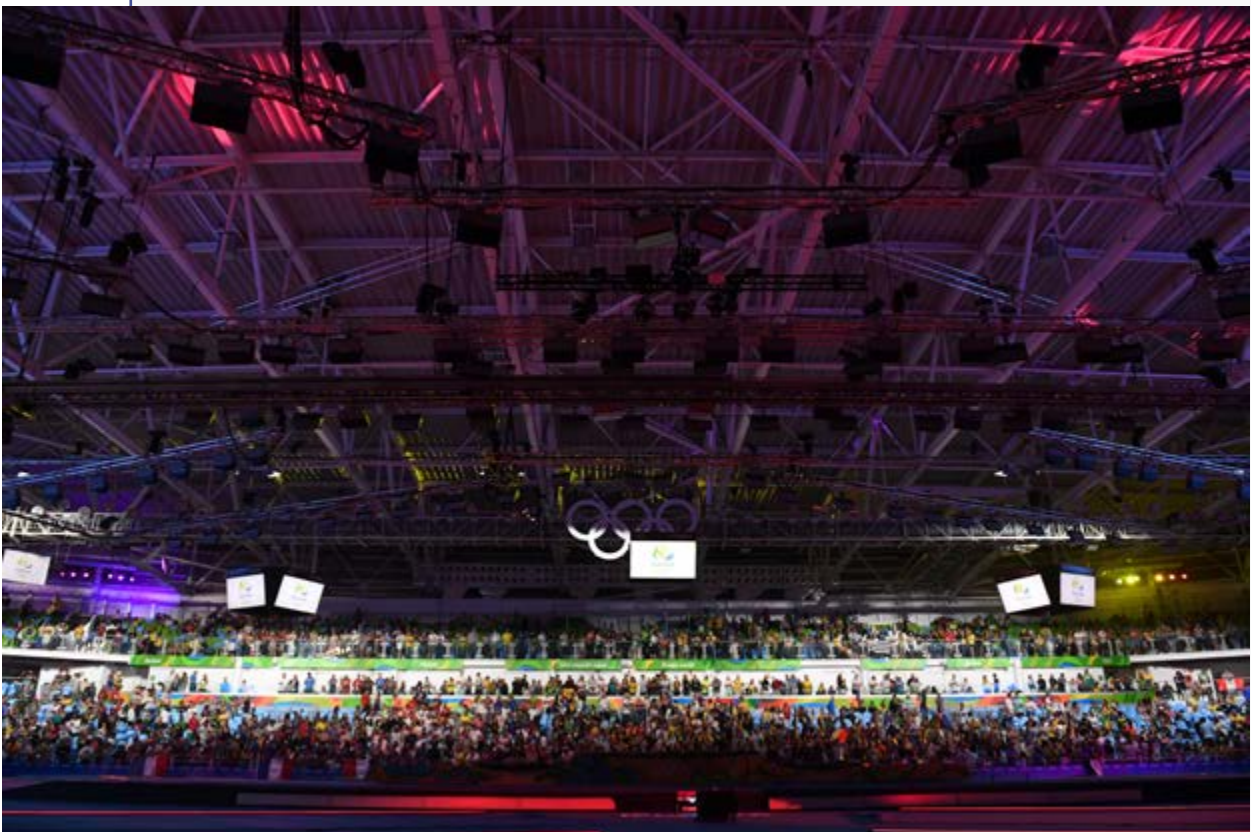
He was the third president after the foundation of the Iranian Fencing Federation.

He was the founder of the Iranian modern fencing era in which Iran became first in fencing in Tehran Asian Games in 1974.

In 1972, he became the president of AFC, 2 years before Tehran Asian Games.

He not only improved fencing in Iran but also had great effects on the improvement of the sport through the continent.

The Bureau met prior to each meeting of the Executive Committee.

The Congress 2016 was held on 27 November 2016 in Moscow (RUS).

The Executive Committee was consulted 14 times by e-mail, when an urgent decision was required.
The measures taken by these management bodies were notified on a regular basis to members of the FIE in **12 Information Letters and 8 Urgent Letters**. These letters as well as their annexes were sent by email to the national federations, Members of Honour and Members of the Executive Committee.

1.3 ANTI-DOPING

1.3.1 CONTROLS

The fight against doping was maintained throughout the period and no case of doping occurred in competitions run by the FIE.

389 tests were performed in competitions and 79 tests were conducted out of competitions.

386 tests during competitions and 620 tests out of competition were performed by national anti-doping agencies using the ADAMS system (Anti-Doping Administration & Management System).

1.3.2 ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION

The 2016 anti-doping outreach program took place during the Junior and Cadet World Fencing Championships in Bourges from 2 to 6 April 2016, providing an ideal opportunity to share information and educational material with young fencers and their entourage from many different countries.

The outreach stand was kindly made available near the main entrance to the fencing venue by the French Fencing Federation's local Organising Committee.

Many Cadet and Junior fencers (as well as some coaches) participated in the computer-based WADA "Play True" Quiz game which traditionally forms the backbone of this outreach event.

We are grateful to the FIE for making available substantial cash prizes for the winners of the daily "Lucky Draw" competition, which plays an important role in encouraging the young fencers to participate.

Fencers from 59 different countries played the Quiz and took the opportunity of discussing doping issues with us. Each fencer and coach who played the educational Quiz game was also given the very popular "USB" wrist-band which contains a wealth of up to date informative documentation, including a copy of the Quiz game itself, some anti-doping videos, and educational pamphlets designed by WADA for this purpose.

Altogether 350 participants (306 fencers, 36 coaches, 8 officials) took part in this successful Outreach programme. The fencers were expressly encouraged to copy and share the information with their fellow fencers, coaches and officials on their return home, thereby helping to spread the anti-doping message throughout the fencing world.

We were particularly fortunate to share the floor with staff from the International Fair Play Committee, enabling our two organisations to collaborate closely and work towards a common goal by promoting the ideals of sportsmanship and doping-free competition.

1.4 FAIR-PLAY EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The fair play education programme which was carried out by the International Fair Play Committee (CIFP) during the Cadet – Junior World Fencing Championships in Bourges, France.

It was the first time in the history of fencing that fair play had been promoted within the framework of an education programme.

The fair play education programme was financed by the FIE. The organisation covered almost all expenditures (i.e. production of promotional materials, transportation, accommodation and meals) of the project except for the travel and meals of a second staff member which was necessary to carry out the activities. The CIFP provided the remaining amount.

The Fair Play Stand was located next to that of anti-doping. The two teams closely cooperated during the event and encouraged the visitors to get involved in both the fair play and anti-doping activities. This partnership proved to be successful and largely contributed to the reinforcement of the common messages of sportsmanship and anti-doping throughout the event.

The educational objectives of the CIFP's fair play programme were as follows:

1. To promote sportsmanship among athletes and the values composing fair play.
2. To develop a better understanding of the notion of fair play and how fair play and its values can be applicable in the daily lives of the athletes.
3. To put fair play theory into practice via exciting interactive activities and eye-catching promotional materials.

The CIFP included the following elements in the fair play games to convey the messages of sportsmanship:

- Clear definition of values composing the notion of fair play;
- Key messages and slogans related to sportsmanship;
- Examples of how the values of fair play can be adopted in the daily lives of the athletes on and off the sporting field;
- Images and stories of popular athletes showing fair play attitude throughout their career;
- Exciting case studies introducing fair play acts carried out in the history of the Olympic Games.

The CIFP conducted its activities in the following formats:

- Board games and computer games;
- Free and easy 10 to 15-minute activities supported by experts;
- Activities were available in English and French.

The Fair Play Stand offered the following activities to its visitors: Fair Play Board Game, Fair Play Computer Games. In addition to the interactive games, printed materials and giveaways conveying slogans and messages of sportsmanship complemented the fair play education programme.

Brochures introducing the world of fair play and also containing a Fair Play Charter specifically written for the youth were produced in English.

Postcards featuring the most exciting short stories of the Fair Play Awards in fencing such as colourful pins and bracelets were distributed among the visitors.

Last but not least two roll-up banners displaying fair play scenes in fencing decorated the stand.

According to the statistics, a total of 135 visitors representing 33 countries (out of the 150 participating nations) played the six computer games. In average, 2,14 different games were played by each player. An estimated number of 250-300 people might have visited the Fair Play Stand during the 5 days of its operation.

1.5 INTERNET SITES, SOCIAL MEDIA, MAGAZINES

FIE MEDIA REPORT 2016

Over the course of 2016, the FIE developed its digital communication platforms and increased its online audience significantly, in particular as a result of the Rio Olympic Games.

The FIE had a strong presence in social media and additional digital platforms, as part of the promotional campaign, 'Rio Loves Fencing'. During 2016, the FIE developed an additional Web portal dedicated to Olympic qualification, as well as an associated mobile app. Digital engagement was achieved by producing digital content about the top athletes on their 'Road to Rio'.

Additionally, a successful partnership was secured with the Olympic Channel in order to promote FIE digital content before and after the Games. ESCRIME XXI, the FIE digital magazine that keeps fans up to date on our news, was translated into Portuguese in order to reach out to a broader audience during the Olympics. The Fencing Grand Prix Series was broadcasted to NBC and Eurosport, and local agreements with Brazilian Globo TV were arranged.

SOCIAL MEDIA:

The FIE media team developed a dynamic social media strategy through 2016, following IOC recommendations for the Olympic Games in Rio. With the evolution of Instagram as a highlight of the year, the FIE continues to run five social media platforms on a daily basis including Facebook, Twitter, Google+, and YouTube. Online views on the YouTube fencing channel have reached 12 million, from 10 million in 2015. During 2016, with the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, Fencing Grand Prix, and the fencing qualification events around the world, the FIE achieved an average 40 percent increase of followers on Facebook and Twitter and a 300 percent increase on Instagram. Great interaction and involvement with the athletes have been established on social media, where athletes take over the FIE accounts during the events to showcase and share their personal perspectives to our audience.

FENCING DIGITAL MAGAZINE - ESCRIME XXI:

In 2012, ESCRIME XXI became the first interactive digital magazine in five languages of any international federation. In 2016, the digital magazine reached 900,000 page views. The reason for such a significant increase is attributed to the content variation from fencing stories around the world, as well as the efficient cross-communication on social media and national federations' platforms. Moreover, the additional language attracted a Brazilian audience interested in knowing more about fencing prior to and during the Olympics. Based on our metrics, the most popular regions interested in the magazine are Russia, France, Mexico, USA and Egypt. The magazine reaches out to a large population globally and increases fencing awareness, spreading a positive image for our sport.

FIE WEBSITE FIE.ORG AND RIO 2016 PORTAL:

At the beginning of 2016, the FIE launched its new portal dedicated to Rio 2016 as part of the digital campaign, 'Rio Loves Fencing'. The portal combined media/press services for all national federations and agencies as well as information for live results for the Olympic Games and all qualification events. The FIE Rio 2016 portal enabled viewers to watch athlete qualifications, competitions, athlete profile features, biographies, highlights, and photo galleries dedicated to specific events on the Road to Rio. Over the last year, the fie.org Web site received 10,489,529 page views, while the Rio 2016 portal (online from March 2016) received 1,844,734 page views (with 105,362 users who visited portal during OG) with the most popular viewers located in the USA, France, Russia, Italy, and Germany.

TV FACTS AND FIGURES FOR THE RIO OLYMPIC GAMES 2016:

Fencing coverage was aired in 61 of the 73 territories. From these regions, there was a total of 609 hours of dedicated fencing coverage. The territory to show the most fencing coverage overall was Malaysia, with 82 hours of coverage, while Italy showed the most coverage on Free-to-Air (FTA) channels (52 hours). The total number of viewer hours consumed of fencing coverage was 252.744 million hours. The highest audience for any single fencing broadcast was 33.068 million viewers in the USA. The average minute of fencing coverage was seen by 38.350 million viewers globally.

The **FIE SWORDPLAY** was launched in July 2016. It is the world's first mobile game with real rules and techniques from athletic fencing with gorgeous 3D graphics, phenomenal animation, and real fencing physics officially supported by the International Fencing Federation. The total number of installations (until 31 December) was 1,370,000 for iOS and 3,100,000 for Android.

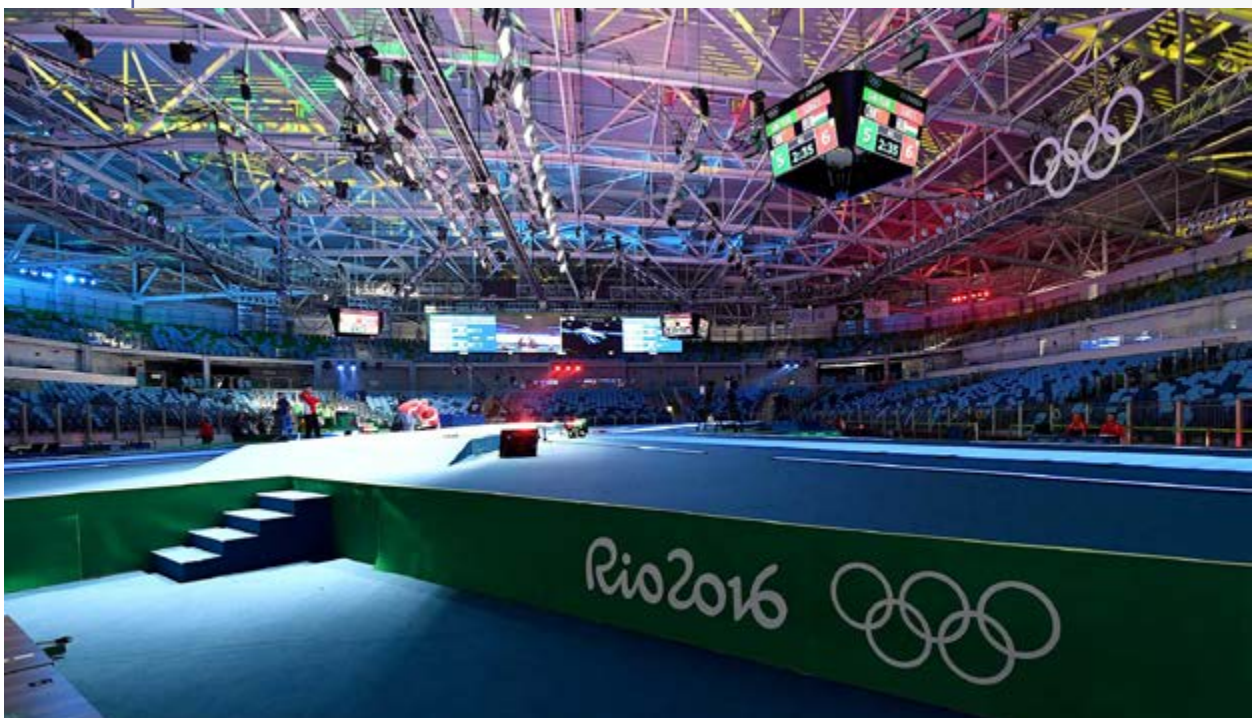

2. FIE ASSISTANCE WITH SPORTS DEVELOPMENT

2.1. ATHLETE TRAINING COURSES

One course was on the occasion of the Junior and Cadet World Championships held in Bourges (FRA), with the FIE paying all expenses for these (air ticket, local transport, hotel, food, experts).

The FIE continued to pay for the athletes from the end of this course up until the individual competitions for the World Championships were completed.

These courses were organised in order to target the following points:

- Encouraging and facilitating the participation of all the national federations in the World Championships.
- Offering a week of intensive preparation to fencers who do not always have enough training partners to allow them to aim for a high international level.
- Introducing these young fencers with definite talent to the entire content and structure of a modern training session.
- Allowing them to benefit from advice from highly experienced fencing teachers, with the determination to implement this advice in practice.
- Providing them with their initial contact with the world fencing elite under the best possible conditions in order to stimulate them to redouble their efforts, giving them the encouragement to provide an example when they return to their training halls.

2.2. EIMA SCHOOL

The FIE continued to provide its support to the African federations by training African fencers at the Dakar Fencing School as part of its fencing development programme in Africa.

The school was set up in 1999. By the end of 2016, seventeen years since it was established, 26 African federations have 128 specialists (including 30 persons for Senegal), among whom 13 women, capable of running a programme for promoting fencing.

THE ACCOMMODATION CENTRE

The accommodation Centre consists of a building on 3 floors with over 10 bedrooms and capable of housing up to twenty (20) students. Students are allocated single or double accommodation depending on the size of the room. Catering is provided in situ.

Trainees receive an allowance at the start of each month for breakfast and dinner and are responsible for organising themselves and ensuring that they eat properly and arrive at their lessons on time.

RECRUITMENT CONDITIONS

Students are recruited by means of sending out a call for applications. These forms were sent to all the affiliated African federations. Federations which have never sent any candidates or who have fewer candidates than the others take priority.

THE PROGRAMME:

Fencing topics are taught from 7h30 am to 12h30 and from 14h30 to 17h.

EQUIPMENT

As in previous years, teachers and trainees received their equipment packages (weapons and clothing) from the FIE. In addition to this free equipment, pupils receive an allowance from the FIE on starting and completing training and this constitutes their pocket money.

FINAL EXAMINATION

The trainees finished their training with an examination on completion.

The trainees were assessed as students and as fencing teachers and all 17 passed the examinations.

2.3 OFMA - OCEANIA FENCING MASTER'S ACADEMY

ATTENDANCE AT FIE COACH TRAINING COURSES

Two Coaches from Oceania (Joe Raciborski – Australia; Kyle Macdonald – New Zealand) attended the FIE Coaching Academy which was conducted in Budapest from April - June 2016. Both coaches benefited significantly from the intensive three-month course and were able to bring what they had learnt back to their own countries. OFMA will continue to encourage participation from Oceania in such courses, with another candidate selected for the first Academy to be held in 2017.

In addition, the Samoa Fencing Association Development Officer, Walterlee Imo, is being trained by the Regional Development Officer (RDO) to become accredited as a Level 1 Foil and Epee Coach as part of the activities conducted by the RDO as part of his visits to Samoa. This involved the following activities during 2016:

During the first visit of the RDO in March 2016

- 8 hours Club fencing training (supervised)

During the second visit of the RDO in September 2016

- 8 hours Club fencing training (supervised)
- 20+ hours conditioning training of Team (unsupervised)

- Attended 2 day Oceania International Training Camp prior to Oceania Junior Championships for observation and participation.
- Coach/Manager at Oceania Junior Championships, 2016

COACHING PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Fencing NZ and the Australian Fencing Federation both have appointed Coaching Directors to supervise accreditation processes in their respective countries. These Coaching Directors are currently working with OFMA to improve the standardization of coach training across Oceania and to further incorporate the OFMA syllabus into their programs. In the past, OFMA activities have been largely managed by the Australian Fencing Federation, but it is expected the increase in the administrative capacity of the Oceania Fencing Confederation will allow the OFC to become responsible for the overall management of OFMA from 2017.

OFMA COACH ASSESSMENTS AND COACH ACCREDITATIONS

During 2016 several assessments for coaches at Level 2 and Level 3 were conducted based on recognition of prior learning. OFMA is currently investigating possibilities for conducting Level 2 Training Courses in the future.

2.4 BUDAPEST COACHING SCHOOL

The lack of appropriate level coaching education is a worldwide bottleneck in the development of fencing, therefore the strategic aim of the FIE is to open coaching educational centres.

In line with this goal it was decided that in 2016 a FIE coaching school would be launched in Budapest, Hungary.

We have agreed with a local government of the 13th District of Budapest and rented the appropriate venue suitable to host the FIE School. The rooms to accommodate the students, catering and the fencing hall are in the same venue. The financial conditions are beneficial.

The FIE has also agreed with the Hungarian University of Physical Education that they join our program by teaching theoretical subjects: Psychology, Physiology, Pedagogy, Training-theory and Strategy & Management. The total number of theoretical classes was 60. Part of the agreement that the University acknowledges our course and provides with an internationally recognised Level 3 diploma to our students who pass the final examination.

In 2016 two 3-months courses were organised.

The first session was held in January-March and 26 students were selected from Europe.

The second session was held in April-June and 26 students were hosted: 16 from Asia/Oceania and 10 from other continents within the frame of the FIE Athletes Career Program.

The students' engagement was as follows: From Monday till Friday 6 hours per day, during 12 weeks. In total: 360 classes.

At the end of the program the University conducted the final examination.

The selected experts holding the course are well renowned fencing coaches who were selected jointly with the University and agreed by the Hungarian Fencing Federation.

Epee: Bela KOPETKA

Sabre: Ioan POP

Foil: Zoltan BERNAT

- All the students who attended the FIE school are former fencers.
- 76% of the participants had some coaching experiences before joining the school.

Current professional experience:

- 100% are active coaches: 58% full time, 42% part-time.
- Currently they are working in the following environmental breakdown: 86% are working in a club, 30% are (also) working in a university, school or other educational environment, 20% are employed by their National Federation.
- Levels of fencers trained: 38% are working with international level fencers, 61% are working with national level fencers, 76% are working with beginners and children.

2.6 EQUIPMENT AID

Aims of the Sport Department: to meet the expectations of the federations in the best possible way, with total transparency, objectivity and efficacy.

The criteria used for carrying out an analysis and allocating the equipment were as follows:

- Federations who received equipment in 2015: national federations which did not receive any equipment in 2015 were given priority in the first part of the 2016 programme.
- Specific requirement: participation in FIE or other competitions,
- Federations in need of equipment: organisation of important competitions (Olympic Games, World Championships, Grand Prix, World Cup, Continental Championships, Regional Games, Universiades),
- Federations making a real effort to develop fencing: proven development of fencing in the beneficiary country,
- Special attention paid to the organisers of the Grand Prix, Continental Championships and, in this Olympic year, the RIO Games.
- Special cases

The budget for 2016 was 600,000 CHF. The FIE received requests from 105 national federations.

After analysis, the FIE management awarded equipment to these 110 federations: 29 for Europe, 30 for Asia, 30 for the Americas, 18 for Africa and 3 for Oceania.

The first equipment distribution round was carried out on 30 June 2016.

A second distribution round took place on 15 November 2016.

All the equipment was sent to the national federations before 15 November 2016.

The list of countries together with the amount allocated to each federation was displayed on the FIE site.

The feedback and thanks received after the equipment was delivered are extremely positive. These activities allow the FIE to be fully involved in working for the national federations.

2.7 PRIZES FOR WINNERS OF THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Following a private initiative started by the President of the FIE in 2009, prizes are awarded to winning athletes in the World Championships. In the course of 2016, the International Charity Fund "For the Future of Fencing" (the "Fund") allocated prizes for winners and medallists of the following competitions organised under the aegis of the FIE.

Due to the fact that in 2016, there were Olympic Games– the Fund did not allocate prizes for the World Championships winners and medallists.

2016 J&C World Championships in Bourges (FRA) – USD 132'000.00;

The Fund has distributed Junior Athletes' prizes by means of transferring the corresponding amounts of money to their personal banking accounts.

Cadet Athletes including those who won medals in Cadet Mixed Team event received their prizes from ALLSTAR Fecht-Center GmbH & Co. KG in the form of fencing equipment and material for the corresponding amounts:

2.8 ASSISTANCE FOR ATHLETE PARTICIPATION

Since 2009, the FIE has been implementing a special programme providing assistance to NF athletes taking part in the senior regional championships and the World Championships (Juniors and Seniors).

For each national federation taking part, all the confederations received a grant to cover the costs (air ticket and hotel expenses) of an athlete taking part in the:

- World championships - juniors and cadets 2016
- Continental championships - seniors 2016

2.9 ASSISTANCE FOR THE PARTICIPATION OF PRESIDENTS

As a result of the grant programme (air ticket, hotel and meal expenses) applicable to all the presidents of Federations, they were able to be involved in the work carried out by the FIE Congress 2016, which is very important for the development of fencing throughout the world. 127 national federations took part in the FIE Congress in Moscow.

2.10 ASSISTANCE FOR CONFEDERATIONS

All the confederations received an annual grant for their administrative expenses.

In addition, those Confederations employing a sport director have received a subsidy for the salary of this sport director.

2.11 ASSISTANCE FOR COMPETITION ORGANISERS

Each national federation organising an FIE competition (senior World Cup, Grand Prix) and making the relevant request received a grant of 3000 euros to cover the costs of video-refereeing.

GP organisers received a subsidy of 25.000 CHF from the FIE for organisation and promotion purposes.

The FIE subsidised the cost of wireless in GP competitions.

2.12 VETERAN FUND

The Fund specialising in assistance for fencing veterans, the "VSE", was set up by the Foundation entitled "For the future of fencing" at the end of 2012.

The operational priorities of the VSE were defined as follows:

- to give fencing veterans access to medical services (co-financing of costly treatments, surgical procedures, medicines, etc.);
- to give fencing veterans access to sickness insurance;
- to support fencing veterans in difficult situations (e.g. to resolve practical problems: house repairs, car repairs, etc.);
- to finance programmes and events to provide social support for fencing veterans.

The criteria used to define the recipients of the fund are as follows:

- **Fencing veterans** - people with close relations with the fencing community /the world of fencing (1), acknowledged at national and international level (2), and falling into one of the applicable age groups;
 - On request of the VSE, each applicant must provide all the supporting documentation required to check the request and safeguard transfer of the gift in accordance with Russian legislation
- Career as a competitor and (or) coach, or other significant contribution to developing fencing or making it popular.
- Personal results and accomplishments; results of pupils; projects carried out and accomplishments within the para-sporting field; acknowledgement of merits or services rendered to fencing.

In the course of 2016, Specialized Fencing Veterans Support Endowment (Fund) (the "VSE") secured the distribution of information of its activities and capabilities by means of:

- sending the information about the VSE directly to the National Federations;
- providing the information for publication on the FIE web-site (www.fie.org);
- launching a dedicated VSE web-site (www.fencingvse.org);
- developing direct contacts with fencing veterans community.

All the applications (a total of 11) to directly support the veterans of World fencing, received by the VSE in 2016, have been granted the requested assistance.

Veterans from Salvador, Nicaragua, Cuba, Georgia, Venezuela, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, Germany, RSA who applied for assistance either directly or via their National Federations, have in total been allocated:

USD 42'333.00;

EUR 34'000.00.

2.13 “CLUB MOVEMENT INITIATIVE”

The Club Movement Initiative (CMI) was launched in 2014 with the aim of “creating an international network of major fencing sites and establishing a system to develop their assets in terms of talent”.

After approving the business plan:

- 1) We identified several clubs
- 2) We established formal relations with them by signing agreements which also committed their respective national federations
- 3) We launched the project in the third quarter of 2014.

The CMI network currently has 9 sites in 8 countries. Our partners are:

1. Tauberbischofsheim Fencing Club, Germany;
2. Fencers Club New York, United States;
3. Cercle d’Escrime Melun, France;
4. Novosibirsk Regional Fencing, Russia;
5. Smolensk Academy of Sport and Physical Culture, Russia;
6. Scherma Modica, Italy;
7. Vasas Sport Club, Hungary;
8. Laoshan Youth Fencing Training Center, China;
9. National Training Center, Japan.

In 2016, the FIE has organised in total 6 training camps for athletes in 3 continents: Pan-America, Europe, Asia.

1 Pan-American Training Camp for high-performance athletes was organised within the framework of CMI at the Fencers’ Club of New York.

5 training camps for young athletes (under 23) have been organised within the framework of the CMI: 3 in Europe (Italy, Germany and Hungary) and 2 in Asia (Japan and China).

In total, 82 athletes from 59 federations took part in the FIE training camp within the framework of FIE Club Movement Initiative.

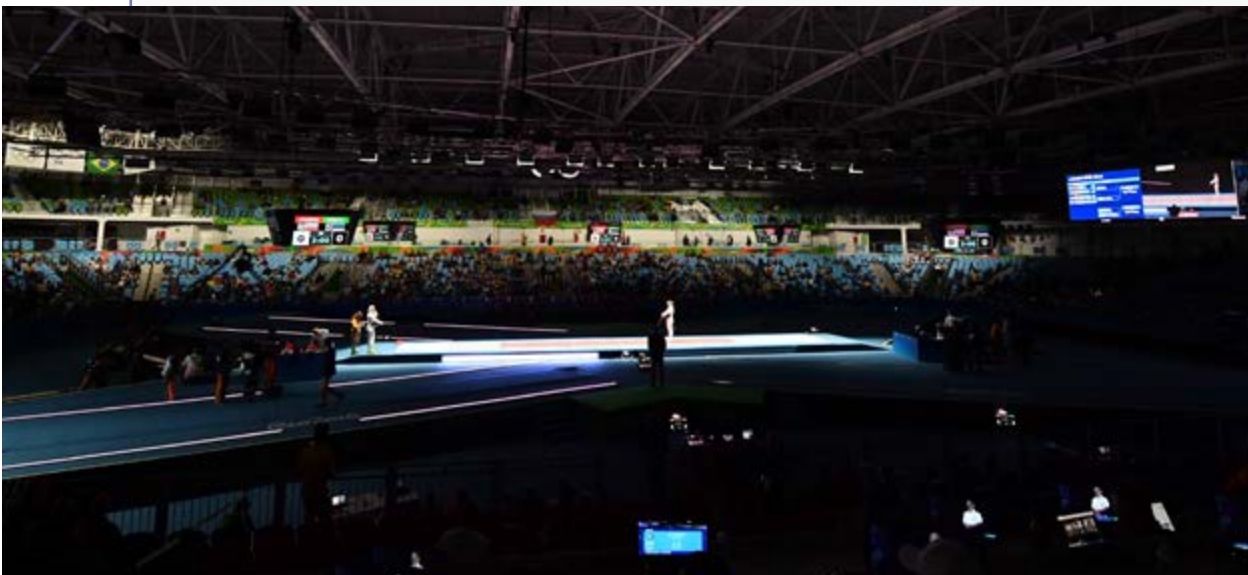

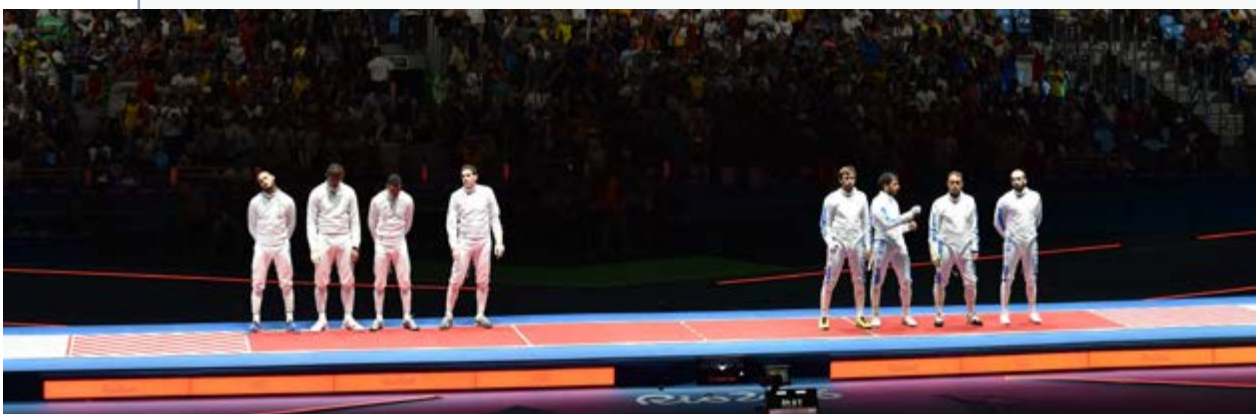
