Rivera, from Mexico, has been appointed by the FIE to teach this seminar, attended by 21 referees, including some coaches, demonstrating that they are aware they are also educators for the fencers of the region improving their technique with the guidance of arbitration, making of the mastery of competition regulations a combat weapon that maximizes their chances of winning in combat. This

seminar was formalized with the outline of morning and evening sessions, the use of multimedia material designed for the critical situational analysis in the three weapons.

At the end of the study sessions, the 21 participants took the already traditional rigorous assessment of knowledge for referees of each weapon, with a target on the FIE arbitration examinations. The Pan American Fencing Confederation and the FIE jointly plan and develop their management and dissemination of knowledge activities in the affiliated countries, and on this occasion, the valuable collaboration of the Ecuador Fencing Federation provided excellent facilities for the realization of this event for which we express our gratitude. The CPE and

the FIE have planned to conduct fifteen training seminars for national referees in as many countries in the region to complete their great goal of 20 countries visited by the end of 2018, in this development program that will benefit all the fencers of the Pan-American region.



Course for trainers of Ecuador

Held from February 15 to 23, the coaches course focused on developing knowledge of psychological processes, planning, teaching methods, technique, tactics and their execution, with the fundamental objective of getting coaches to improve their ability for planning and design viable strategies, goals and objectives to achieve in the future.

From School to Olympic Games, Town Hall Event in Ecuador

In the city of Quito on February 22, two introductory fencing events were held in 2 schools, one of

primary education and the other of secondary level, with an influx of spectators of between 150 and 200 children aged between 4 and 16 years old totalling 350 students. Both events were supported by high performance athletes and Ecuador's national team members, using the innovative teaching gear designed by ABSOLUT FENCING. Capturing the attention of the attendees towards the practice of fencing in the different clubs and schools in Quito, so the Ecuadorian Fencing Federation requested that more of these promotional events be held in the different cities of the country. The continuity of this project is

complemented by specialized technical advice to schools, and physical education teachers with the

basic knowledge of instruction so that they can teach the fundamentals of fencing.
