OBITUARY

The International Fencing Federation has been affected by the departure of several friends:

NOUREDDINE ROBBANA (TUN) - 1949-2018

Born on February 9, 1949, he fenced on the Tunisian national epee team from 1960 to 1969.

Noureddine Robbana was voted as a member of the FIE Promotion, Communication and Marketing Commission at the 2016 Elective Congress.

Prior to that, from 2012 to 2016, he was a member of the FIE Legal Commission.

As a member of the Tunisian Fencing Federation, he was Treasurer from 2002 to 2006; a member of the Federal Bureau from 2006 to 2012; President from 2012 to 2016; and a member of the Tunisian Federation's Executive Committee since 2016.

He served as Treasurer for the Mediterranean Fencing Confederation from 2012 to 2016.

ÁNGEL MARTÍNEZ VASSALLO (ESP) - 1952-2018

The Spanish fencing master Ángel Martínez Vassallo passed away on April 5.

Born in San Sebastián on January 20, 1952, he was a member of the national junior and senior men's foil teams until 1978, when he began working as a weapons master of the Royal Spanish Fencing Federation. After several years as national coach in Seville and Madrid, in clubs such as the Fencing Club Maestro Cervantes, Fencing Club of Madrid and the Fencing Hall Palacio de los Deportes, he was appointed Head of the National Teams in 1990, a position he held until 2013.

He was a member of the Fencing masters' sabre team that became World Champion and foil bronze medal in 1978, along with Joaquín Campomanes Grande, Luis Sánchez-Elvira Jiménez and Antonio Solivera González.

Mr. Vassallo was also part of a team of coaches who developed fencing in Spain and led the country to the successes culminating gold medals of Manuel Pereira in 1989; the female epee team of Rosa Castillejo, Taymi Chapé, Carmen Ruiz and Cristina Vargas in 1994; and the Olympic bronze medal of José Luis Abajo in Beijing 2008.

Ángel Martínez Vassallo lived fencing and life with passion and made it his reason for being until the end of his days.

AUSTIN EDISON THOMAS (ARU) - 1939-2018

Austin Edison Thomas, President of the Aruba Fencing Federation, born on March 25, 1939, participated in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games in individual foil and epee.

His entire life was dedicated to fencing and he trailblazed the sport in Aruba. Mr. Thomas worked tirelessly and with extraordinary perseverance to develop and promote fencing in Aruba and beyond.

DR OMAR ALEJANDRO VERGARA (MH) OLY (ARG) - 1943-2018

Dr Omar Alejandro Vergara (ARG, MH) OLY, renowned epeeist and foilist, was an Argentinian and South American champion and individual Pan American Games champion (1975) in Mexico. A three-time Olympian, he competed in Mexico City (1968), Munich (1972), and Montreal (1976). He was also a category "A" international referee at the three-weapons.

Omar Vergara also worked as member of the Directoire Technique (DT) at several World Championships.

He was President of the Argentinian Fencing Federation from 1986-1990, 1996-2000, 2004-2008, and 2012-2016.

He served as President of the South American Fencing Confederation and Vice-President of the Pan American Fencing Confederation.

Omar Vergara was an FIE Executive Committee member from 2008 to 2012.

He has served on the FIE Legal Commission since 1992 and was a permanent member of the Argentinian Olympic Committee. At the 2017 FIE Annual Congress, he was inducted as a Member of Honour of the FIE.

Omar Vergara was motivated by the sole objective of developing fencing and love for the sport, ceaselessly giving the best of himself to its mission and purpose.

RASHID MUFTAWU (GHA) - 1971-2018

Mr. Muftawu Rashid, Vice President of the Ghana Fencing Federation, passed away recently in his home country. "It is with deep sorrow I report the sudden death of the Vice President of our federation," said Ghana Federation President Mohammed Mahadi. Mr. Rashid was elected to the federation in January 2017.

MAX GEUTER (MH, GER) - 1937-2018

Born on September 16, 1937 in Aachen, Germany, Max Geuter served as a member of the FIE Executive Committee from 1993 to 2016, and Vice President of the organization from 2000 to 2004.

He had also served as a member of the FIE Refereeing Commission from 1985 to 2004.

He was also elected as a Member of Honour by the 2000 FIE Congress.

From 2013 to 2016, he represented the Executive Committee on the FIE Veterans Council. In 2016 he was then nominated as a member of the same council, and then elected President by the Council itself.

From 1996 to 2005, Max Geuter was the First Vice President of the European Fencing Confederation, and became its Secretary General from 2005 to 2017.

A fencer in all three weapons (foil, epee and sabre), Max Geuter took part in five Fencing World Championships and three Olympic Games. He competed at the 1964 Tokyo Olympic Games under the Unified Team of Germany, and again at the 1968 Mexico City and 1972 Munich Games on the epee team from West Germany.

Max Geuter loved sports. He began his life with gymnastics, athletics and handball, only later to begin fencing in 1954 when he moved to Frankfurt. In his club, Frankfurter TV 1860, he benefited from various fencing masters who pushed him to become German epee champion in 1963.

He then moved to the United States for more than a year in the mid-1960s, where he was permitted to fence in two United States fencing championships; he won the 1966 U.S. foil championships and finished fifth in epee.

When Max Geuter retired from competitive fencing, he took on multiple roles as a member of the German Fencing Federation: he was responsible for referees; he oversaw the men's epee team; and was Vice President of elite sports and foreign affairs. Together with many top coaches, Max Geuter achieved 284 medals for Germany at the Olympic Games as well as World and European Championships.

Max Geuter became an international fencing referee in all three weapons after successfully passing the examination in Mexico City, and he officiated at multiple Olympic Games and World Championships. He also participated as a delegate of the Refereeing Commission at the Olympic Games, World Championships and Asian Games, and over the years was the examiner for hundreds of referee candidates.

He served as a member or president of the *directoire technique* at multiple World Championships, took an active role in the renaissance of the European Championships and was responsible for the organization of several other events, including the 10th Arab Games. He managed and directed numerous referee examinations and seminars. One of his most impressive achievements was the creation of veteran fencing in the FIE, beginning with a men's epee-only championship in Cape Town, South Africa in 1997, and increasing over the years to include all weapons and both genders, as well as multiple categories and age groups.

Max Geuter's motivation was inspired in part by the following: "Not one hour in your life you spent with sport is lost." Derived from a quote from Sir Winston Churchill, these words fit him in his active time as a sportsman as well as in his later years as an official.

Max Geuter dedicated his entire life to sports and fencing, performing a remarkable number of functions and roles, and achieving outstanding results for fencing worldwide. He continually gave the best of himself and devoted his extraordinary talents to the cause of fencing.

ADA WILD-GENTINZON (SUI) - 1933-2018

Swiss Fencing has informed that Mrs Ada Wild died on 1st September 2018, in her 85th year.

Mrs Wild worked passionately for the world of fencing. She was President of the Cercle des Armes de Lausanne (CAL), President of the Swiss Fencing Federation (1989-1992), as well as organizer of the Junior World Championships in Lausanne in 1981 and the Senior World Championships in Lausanne in 1987.

GYÖZÖ KULCSÁR (HUN) - 1940-2018

Born on October 18, 1940 in Budapest, the Hungarian epee fencer Gyöző Kulcsár, four-time Olympic and three-time world champion, started fencing at the age of 15. He was a member of the FIE Hall of Fame.

Gyöző Kulcsár was one of the most famous Hungarian athletes, who did not only excel as a fencer, but has also been one of the finest coaches in Hungary - his career had been longer than half a century: 52 years.

He won team gold at the 1964 (Tokyo), 1968 (Mexico City), and 1972 (Munich) Olympic Games; he also earned an individual gold medal in 1968 (Mexico City) as well as two bronzes (Munich 1972 and Montreal 1976).

Gyöző Kulcsár earned an engineering degree in 1968, but focused the majority of his life on fencing. After finishing his competitive career, he was the Secretary General of the Hungarian Fencing Federation between 1979 and 1980.

He was also Member and later Board member of the Hungarian Olympic Committee.

In 1988 he moved to Italy and worked as a fencing master in Vercelli, where he trained Olympic and World Champions like Maurizio Randazzo, Paolo Milanoli and Elisa Uga.

He moved back to Hungary in 2001 and he became the master of several fencers that later became Olympic and World Champions. He was also the head coach of the Hungarian National Epee team from 2006 to 2012.

Among others he trained Tímea Nagy, Krisztián Kulcsár and Gábor Boczkó. The last champion of his career was Emese Szász, who took the gold medal at the Rio Olympic Games in 2016.

Besides the number of merits and awards, Győző Kulcsár was also elected to join the Association of Immortal Hungarian Athletes, a very illustrious company which consists of 21 sportsmen, in 2000. In 2004, he was elected among the sportsmen of the nation, while in 2010, he was awarded the Hungarian Order of Merit, Commander's Cross.

GEORGE KOLOMBATOVICH (USA) - 1946-2018

George Kolombatovich was President of the FIE Refereeing Commission from 2004 to 2008, Member of this very same commission from 2000 to 2004, and also member of the US Fencing Hall of Fame.

Born on the 29th August 1946 in New York, he became FIE referee at the three weapons.

He was an official and referee at numerous world events: three Olympic Games (Los Angeles 1984, Barcelona 1992 and Atlanta 1996), three Pan American Games, seven Senior World Championships, three Junior World Championships, three Paralympic Games and several world cups.

He was First Vice president of the Panamerican Fencing Confederation from 1988 to 2005.

He was also Member of the US Commission of fencing officials for more than 30 years and was named chief of mission and team captain for the U.S. team at several Senior, Junior and Cadet World Championships as well as at the World University Games and the Pan American Games.

He attended New York University and was their fencing coach before moving to Columbia University in 1978. He began as assistant coach in 1978 and then in the following year became head coach of the Columbia University fencing team for a remarkable 32 seasons (1979-2011).

George Kolombatovich's Columbia University fencers won 17 individual NCAA titles and several qualified for and fenced at the Olympic Games, including 2008 silver medallists James Williams and Erinn Smart.

In all, his coaching produced 158 All-Ivy League honourees and 152 All-American athletes.

US Fencing had published his Refereeing Handbook, a pedagogical work.

VIKTOR KIRPU (EST) - 1955-2018

Viktor Kirpu, born on October 31, 1955, esteemed Estonian fencing coach, father and coach of World Championship epee bronze medallist Erika Kirpu, began practicing fencing in 1966 under Coach Tiit Räni. He competed as a member of the Estonian fencing team between 1973 and 1980, and became a "Grand Master" in 1980. He was a member of the Tartu LNSK since 1984, later the sports club Escrime and since 2007 was a trainer at Tartu Sports Association Kalev.

He served as a member of the Board of the Estonian Fencing Association, and, in addition to Erika Kirpu and many other fencers, notably coached Estonian epeeist Sergei Vaht. Mr. Kirpu also coached at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games.

RENÉ ROCH (MH, FRA) - 1929-2018

René Roch was President of Honor of the FIE since 2008, President of the FIE from 1992 to 2008 and a Member of Honour of the FIE since 1989.

René Roch was born on the 28th of June, 1929, in Paris. He studied at Paris-Sorbonne University where he obtained a degree in law, followed by a diploma as a chartered accountant.

He practised as an auditor and was a member of the Paris Appeal Court.

A former foilist and sabreur, in 1949 he was French university senior and junior champion in sabre and, the same year, French university junior champion in foil. As a member of the French national team between 1950 and 1961, he took part in many international competitions, including the Coupe Santelli, World Championships and Student Games. Several times, he was French senior sabre champion and French junior foil champion.

In 1951, René Roch limited his sports activities to focus on his studies and fulfill his military obligations. From 1956, the year he was the military champion of France, until 1961, he again became a member of the French national team. In 1957, he was selected for the World Student Games and, that same year, took third place in the "Spartakiades" in Moscow in the sabre team competition. In 1959 he was selected to take part in the Senior World Championships. He competed in the Coupe d'Europe from 1970 until 1975.

It was in the 1980s that his career began as a sports administrator. He was the General Treasurer of the French Fencing Federation (FFE) from 1980 until 1984, then Vice-President of that Federation from 1988 until 1992. From 1992 forward, he was a Member of Honour of the FFE.

At the same time, he was Treasurer of the FIE from 1984 until 1992 and President of the FIE's Promotion Commission from 1984 until 2000.

In 1999, René Roch was awarded Chevalier of the Order of the Legion of Honour and, that same year, the Republic of Senegal promoted him to the rank of Officer in the National Order of the Lion of Senegal in recognition of the impetus he provided for the development of fencing in Africa. In collaboration with the Senegalese Fencing Federation, he created the first International Fencing Masters' Academy in Africa in Dakar. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) awarded him the Olympic Order in 2009.

René Roch's contribution to the universality and development of fencing was incalculable. Under his presidency, the first FIE Veteran World Championships were organised in 1998 and, in 1999, women's sabre became part of the Fencing World Championships.

Wireless fencing debuted at the Olympic Games in Athens in 2004. He introduced video-refereeing at the Senior World Championships in Turin in 2006 and at the Olympic Games in 2008. In 1996, women's epee was introduced into the Olympic programme in Atlanta and women's sabre joined in 2004 in Athens.

Throughout his career, he passionately defended the values of the sport of fencing that were initially created in France, worldwide. He instigated numerous modifications to the FIE's rules and organisation of competitions.

BRIGITTE DUMONT-GAPAIS (FRA) - 1944-2018

Brigitte Dumont-Gapais was born on 25 April 1944 in Saint-Fargeau-Ponthierry and was the pupil of Maîtres Ernest Revenu and Guy Sommier.

Precociously gifted, she was junior world champion in 1964, winning her first title as individual French champion at the age of 19. This was followed by four other titles in 1968, 1969, 1974 and 1976.

Brigitte Dumont took part in 4 Olympic Games and secured the Holy Grail of the Olympics when she won the silver medal in Montreal with the French team in 1976.

She became a manager once her sporting career came to an end. In the beginning she was Vice-President of the French National Olympic Committee from 1976 to 1981 then, in 1985, she became Secretary General of the French Fencing Federation, occupying this post for over 15 years.

As an international referee, and with a Fencing Master's Diploma, she was also an honorary member of the FFE.

Brigitte Dumont-Gapais died at the age of 74 after a long illness.

CHRISTINE MUZIO (FRA) - 1951-2018

Born on 10 May 1951 in Creil, Christine Muzio was the pupil of Maître Guy Sommier. She was a member of the great women's foil team from 1970-1980.

Christine Muzio tasted the delights of the Olympic podium for the first time when she won the silver medal with the French team in Montreal in 1976.

The following year the foilist, sporting the colours of the Paris Université Club, became individual French champion. But it was in 1980 that Christine Muzio had her finest hour. With the French team (alongside Véronique Brouquier, Pascale Trinquet, Brigitte Gaudin and Isabelle Boéri) Christine Muzio managed to win the gold medal in the 1980 Olympic Games. This remarkable achievement still remains the only Olympic gold won by a French women's foil team.

VLADIMIR BAEV (KGZ) - 1923 – 2018

Vladimir Baev was a veteran of the Second World War, a mythical athlete who was 13 times fencing champion of the Republic of Kyrgyzstan. He was a former leader of the Sports Committee of Frunzé, a post he occupied for many years, and Honorary President of the Kyrgyzstan Fencing Federation.

He was born on August 12th 1923 in Barnaul. When war broke out, Vladimir Baev was working as a mechanic in a factory. He was only 17 when all the men were called up. He hid his identity documents and, lying about his age, managed to be accepted at Barnaul military school, together with a friend. That was in 1942. The situation around Stalingrad was complex. After a mere three months' training, instead of the usual two years, he landed in Stalingrad, in the inferno of the war. There, as a military intelligence officer, he received his first award, the medal for "Courage". After the war, Vladimir Baev gained his diploma at the "P. Lesgaft" Sports Institute of Leningrad, and was assigned to the city of Jalal-Abad, where, in 1951, he was appointed President of the Regional Committee of Physical Education and Sport. He began his task with the construction of the city stadium. With the support of the first Secretary of the Regional Party Committee, Mr. Bayan Alamanov, the city stadium was built in only six months. In 1959, after unification of the Jalal-Abad and Osh regions into one single region, the region of Osh, he led the Regional Sports Committee of Osh.

From 1964 Vladimir Baev worked on the Sports Committee of the Kyrgyz SSR. Later, for 15 years, from 1970 to 1985, he was President of the local Committee of Frunzé. After 1985 he received a pension of merit of the Republic for special services rendered. He was Honorary President of the National Fencing Federation, an excellent representative of Physical Culture and Sport for the USSR, and an honored cultural worker in the Kyrgyz SSR.

He was national fencing champion of Kyrgyzstan 13 times. At that time, he had to compete with many famous fencers: Galina Alexandrova, Zoya Logvinenko, Eduard Mustafin, Ravil Orazgeldiev, and many others. As one of the main representatives of fencing within the USSR, he frequently took the national team to international tournaments. The names of Soviet best fencers have resounded throughout the world. They include Alexander Abushakhmetov, Yuri Lykov, Vladimir Donin, Leonid Dunaev, the brothers Nicholas and Alexander Ivanenko, Anatoly Verulsky and many others, members of the URSS team, who mounted the highest step on the podium in Union-wide and international competitions. He was an ardent proponent of the sport and a dedicated ambassador of fencing, contributing to its development throughout the country. He also initiated the Union-wide "Pearl of Ala-Too" tournament where future champions of the USSR, Europe and the whole world were able to earn their stripes.

GÖRAN ABRAHAMSON (SWE) - 1931-2018

Fencing became for him a lifelong history of love and he was coaching at his club until his last year.

Göran's fencing career took a hard blow when he was infected by polio in 1953 and lost the function of one of his legs. With the support of the Italian coach Sigfrido Motolese and considerable amounts of training he managed to continue with fencing, although the damage caused by the infection would affect his physical ability for the rest of his life.

He took part in the Olympic Games in Rome 1960 and Tokyo 1964 with a 9th place individually in 1964. In the World Championships he participated from 1957 until 1965 and was placed 6th in 1961 and 5th in 1963 – remarkable results for someone hit by polio paralysis.

When he stopped fencing on international level, Göran had a long and very successful refereeing career and refereed several Olympic finals.

Göran was a member of the SEMI commission 1984- 2004. He took an active part in the successful work by this commission to increase safety for the fencers. In this role, he also had numerous assignments as SEMI-delegate at Olympic Games and World Championships and as supervisor at official FIE competitions. He was president of the SEMI-commission 1992-94. He also became member of the Executive Committee of the European Fencing Confederation in 2002.

On national level, he was vice president of the Swedish Fencing Federation 1988-2001 and president of his club Göteborgs Fäktklubb 1974-2000. As a competition organizer, he played an instrumental role in the senior World Championships in 1973 and the World Cadet Championships in 1990, both held in Göteborg. He was also the organizer of the Coupe de Göteborg, a World Cup competition in ladies' epee.

Göran's work was always characterized by a meticulous attention to detail. He could easily communicate in six different languages and with his vast experience from all aspects of fencing, he handled difficult situations with ease.

We express our sincerest condolences to the bereaved families and federations of the deceased.

1.3 ANTIDOPING

1.3.1 CONTROLS

Antidoping measures were continued throughout the period and **no** case of doping occurred in any competitions organized by the FIE.

390 tests during competitions and 133 out-of-competition controls were performed by anti-doping agencies using the ADAMS system (Anti-Doping Administration & Management System).

507 urine tests and 16 blood tests were performed.

1.3.2 ANTIDOPING EDUCATION

Competition: Junior and Cadet World Championships, 1st to 9th April

City: Verona, Italy

Dates: April 2 to 8, 7 days - 2 days more than in 2017 due to changing the calendar, with all the epee competitions first, followed by the sabre and then the foil. The objective was to raise the fencers' awareness of all 3 weapons.

Cecilia Iacolucci and Chiara Vari from the Italian National Anti-Doping Organization joined the stand for the day on 6th April and added their advertising boards "There are so many reasons for fair play - What are yours?" to the activities.

PROMOTION

Some posters were put up all around the competition venue on 1st April and others later on, but the area was huge so it was difficult to guarantee sufficient advertising.

The educational area, which this year included the "Safe Sport", "Donate Your Fencing Gear", Fair Play and Antidoping stands, was very well configured with a lot of space and partitions that could be used for posters, etc. However it was somewhat outside the traffic flow and as the competition venue was huge, the fencers did not pass through automatically. This may have partly affected the figures.

PARTICIPATION

Participating countries - 54

However, there were 13 countries that had still never taken part in the program.

Total number of participants - 389

Coaches accounted for 10% of the total (7.7% in 2017)

The fencers who took part in the quiz enjoyed it and showed a lot of interest. They were often in groups or with a friend. Coaches were still thin on the ground - 2018 - 39; 2017 - 43; 2016 - 36.

REWARDS

The free USB keys were once again highly appreciated, as was the possibility of winning the draw for the cash prizes offered by the FIE. We began with only 2 x 50 euros, but after the 3rd day we decided to change to 4 x 25 euros.

The 23 winners (one prize was shared) were extremely grateful.

All those who obtained a score of 9 or 10/10 in the quiz also won a small chocolate Easter egg - it was just symbolic but was a great success.

The wall of signatures was also very popular.

1.4 FAIR PLAY EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

Over the first 9 days of April, the Fair Play Council had a stand near the "Clean Sport", "Safe Sport" and "Donate your fencing gear" stands.

The stands were located in the main hall and were easily accessible for the participants and the public.

A total of 438 athletes from 57 countries visited the stand. As 105 countries were taking part, clearly more effort needs to be made with promotional work. We noticed that the cadets were more interested than the juniors.

A much higher number of athletes benefited from the opportunity to have their photo taken next to the banner for the first winner of the Fair Play Trophy, Jiri Beran.

A letter jointly signed by the President of the Coaches Council and the Fair Play Council has been finalized, asking all the officials to provide a good example of the correct behavior to adopt when it comes to accepting referees' decisions.

Forms were distributed to the referees, to fill out should they notice an exceptional act of fair play, worthy of mention.

1.5 SAFE SPORT

An educational stand was set up in Wuxi from 19th to 26th July.

The stand was equipped with a Wi-Fi connection and a laptop to display the educational resources approved by the IOC on the subject.

This action was welcomed by the IOC Safeguarding Officers and planned in accordance with their recommendations.

Tools Used

Management

The stand was located near the “Donate your fencing gear” collection point and the commercial aisle for all the suppliers, so that the athletes could find it easily.

The stand was open not only to athletes but also to coaches, national officials and volunteers.

People were invited to give 10 minutes of their time to watch the IOC-approved video. They watched it alone or in small groups.

At the end of the video, a USB key with a one-page document listing useful links provided by the IOC Safeguarding Officer was given to participants, so that they could easily retrieve the information if necessary.

1.6 INTERNET SITE, SOCIAL MEDIA, MAGAZINES

1.6.1 FIE MEDIA REPORT 2018

During 2018, the FIE developed its digital communication platforms and significantly increased its on-line audience both on TV channels and on social media and streaming platforms.

The FIE has developed several promotional campaigns covering major fencing events, from Grands Prix to the World Championships, as well as world fencing day and development programs prepared with the athletes, addressing a variety of content reflecting the functions of each online platform.

What is more, ESCRIME XXI, the FIE’s digital review telling fans our news, has been updated to reach a wider public via the mobile version. The Grand Prix fencing Series, whose brand identity has been updated, has been broadcast on 54 channels worldwide.

1.6.2 SOCIAL MEDIA

The FIE media team developed a dynamic social media strategy during 2018, via all its digital platforms. With the development of Instagram being the highlight of the year, the FIE continues to manage five social media platforms every day, i.e. Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Google+ and YouTube.

The on-line content of the Escrime channel on YouTube obtained 17.8 million hits, compared with 14.5 million in 2017. The number of YouTube subscribers also increased by 16% reaching 51,650 subscriptions, against 43,300 in 2017. During 2018, with the World Championships in Wuxi, the fencing Grands Prix and the World Cups organized all over the world plus weekly videos, the FIE achieved a 6.3% average increase in followers on Facebook, 17% on Twitter and 62% on Instagram. The commitment and interaction between athletes and the public on social media have been significant. Athletes and fencing events organizers have used the FIE platforms as a showcase during World Cups and Grands Prix and have shared their personal viewpoints with the public online.

1.6.3 DIGITAL MAGAZINE - ESCRIME XXI

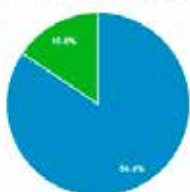
In 2012, ESCRIME XXI became the first interactive digital magazine published in five languages amongst the international federations. In 2018, with three languages, the digital magazine was printed 302 852 times. This significant increase can be explained by the diversity of its content, with fencing stories from all over the world, and the effective cross-disciplinary communication on social media and the national federation platforms. According to our measurement indicators, the magazine aroused most interest in the USA, Italy, the United Kingdom, Spain and Russia. The magazine reaches a wide population all over the world, increasing the awareness of fencing by broadcasting a positive image of our sport.

1.6.4 THE FIE SITE FIE.ORG

In 2018, the website fie.org was viewed 10,151,801 times, with 842,493 new users and 2,145,359 sessions in total. Visitors mainly used the English version of the site fie.org (32.90%).

Demographic data showed that 30.67 % of visitors were aged 25 to 34, and 20.60 % from 18 to 24. 63.52% of visitors were men and 36.48% were women.

1.6.5 TV FACTS AND FIGURES 2018

FENCING GRANDS PRIX

In total, 9 Grands Prix were broadcast by EUROSPOORT (FR), NBC (USA), CCTV (CHINA), MATCH TV (RUS), RAI (ITA), MTVA (HUN), EER (EST); OLYMPIC CHANNEL. Facebook.com/FIE and the YouTube fencing channel also contributed to broadcasts using media streaming.

Cumulative audience: from 28th November to 30th May, events generated a cumulative audience of 10.42 million people, with China being the market in first place with 2.15 million. High audience levels were also recorded on the free chain KBS South Korea. The valuable news coverage in programs such as KBS News reached a cumulative audience of 2.09 million.

WORLD FENCING CHAMPIONSHIPS IN WUXI 2018

The World Championships were broadcast on television in China, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Russia, South Korea, Spain, France and Switzerland.

Russia represents the biggest market in terms of TV coverage with the largest share of broadcasting time. The Russian channels Match Arena and Match Planeta broadcast 116 hours of the competition. In addition, chains such as Canale 5 (Italy - several news broadcasts won over a cumulative viewing audience of 19.69 million), France 2 & 3 (France) and KBS South Korea were significant driving forces in terms of volume.

Broadcasting time: from 19th to 27th July, the World Fencing Championships 2018 generated a cumulative TV audience of 250.11 million viewers, including 169.29 million in China, the host country and principal market. Live broadcasts and the broadcasting of highlights on CCTV5 have occupied a lead role since they made a 67 % contribution to the total world audience.

Multimedia coverage of the World Fencing Championships in Wuxi was very satisfactory. 77 channels in 49 countries worldwide broadcast information about the World Championships.

1.6.6 FIE SWORDPLAY

The FIE Swordplay game was launched in July 2016. This is a worldwide first for mobile telephone games, incorporating the real rules and techniques of fencing with fabulous 3D graphics, phenomenal animation, and ultra-realistic laws of physics, officially supported by the FIE. The countries where it is most popular with the majority of downloads are China, Russia, Brazil and the United States.

1.9 WORLD FENCING DAY

The second-annual World Fencing Day, Sept. 8 2018, took place worldwide bringing the fun, thrill, and experience of the sport of fencing to people of all ages, skills and athletic abilities. With International Fencing Federation (FIE) member organizations alongside athletes and coaches, fencing is actively reaching communities and individuals everywhere.

The FIE provided World Fencing Day branding guidelines to its 153 member federations to enable marketing and promotion with posters, diplomas, t-shirts, Web sites and social media—the logo was even flown on kites flying above Kabul, Afghanistan!

On World Fencing Day, Olympic and World Championship athletes, local fencing clubs, national fencing federations, and fencing masters and coaches all join to demonstrate fencing in their regions. More than 6500 social media tags about World Fencing Day were published on the social media.

On World Fencing Day, federations from every corner of the planet conducted a variety of activities, and federation, clubs, athletes, individuals, fans who love fencing, and manufacturers joined in the festivities. Some of the countries

participating included: Afghanistan, Belgium, China, Spain, USA, Russia, Uzbekistan, Puerto Rico, Cyprus, New Zealand, France, Italy, Egypt, Chile, Costa Rica, India, Iran, Algeria, Turkmenistan, United Kingdom, Japan, Greece, Germany, Korea, Hungary, South Africa, Tunisia, Turkey, Lithuania, Singapore, Venezuela, Argentina, Poland, Belarus, Ukraine, Ivory Coast, Canada, Guatemala and Slovenia.

1.10 FAIR-PLAY TROPHY 2018

The Fair-Play Trophy 2018 was awarded to Mr Christian Bauer (FRA), Mr Marco Fichera (ITA), and Mrs Katharine Holmes (USA), on the proposal of the FIE Fair-Play Council.

1.11 AFFILIATION

The Congress 2018 approved the affiliation of American Samoa (ASA).

1.12 105 YEARS OF THE FIE

The FIE was founded on 29 November 1913 in Paris (FRA) by the representatives of nine nations: the United Kingdom, Belgium, Germany, Italy, France, Hungary, the Netherlands, the Czech Republic and Norway. In 2013, the FIE had celebrated its centenary in Paris.

In 2018, still in Paris, the FIE held its 97th Congress at the Pavillon d'Armenonville and the Congress dinner was celebrated during a cruise on the Seine.

A gala dinner held at the Grand Palais on the occasion of the 105 brought together 700 guests and personalities from across the world.



2. ASSISTANCE OF THE FIE IN SPORT DEVELOPMENT

2.1. TRAINING CAMPS FOR ATHLETES

Two training camps were organized in 2018 on the occasion of the Junior and Cadet World Championships in Verona (ITA) and the Senior World Championships in Wuxi (CHN). The FIE paid all the expenses associated with these camps (air tickets, local transport, hotel, meals, experts, entry fees).

After these camps the FIE continued to pay the athletes' expenses until the end of the individual competitions in the World Championships.

These camps were organized for the following purposes:

- to encourage and facilitate the participation of all the national federations in the World Championships.
- to offer a week of intensive preparation to fencers who sometimes do not have sufficient training partners to allow them to aim for a top international level.
- to introduce these young talents to the structure and entire content of a modern training session.
- to allow them to benefit from advice from highly experienced maitres d'armes, and acquire the determination to put this advice into practice.
- to offer them contact with the global fencing elite under the best possible conditions, encouraging them to redouble their efforts and inspiring them to serve as examples once they return to their training halls.

2.2 OCEANIA FENCING MASTER ACADEMY (OFMA)

OFMA COACHING COURSES

A number of coaching development courses and seminars were organised & held in Oceania this year under the auspices of OFMA. A number of designated courses were held in Australia, and a Beginner (Level 0) Coaching Course was conducted in American Samoa in February with 4 participants. Ongoing development of coaches was

facilitated in American Samoa, Guam and Samoa.

During 2018 Fencing New Zealand hosted an Olympic Solidarity Technical Course for Coaches, which was overseen by OFC Regional Development Officer Leon Thomas. This activity comprised two courses (Epee in April/May and Foil in October) involving seventeen coaches, twenty-nine athletes and four local established experts who assisted with the delivery of the training. The standard of student coaches was high and provided significant benefit to the training and development of coaches in New Zealand.

COACHING PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Both Australia and New Zealand are continuing to review and update their coach accreditation systems to align with OFMA standards, with input from the Oceania Fencing Confederation. Australia refined its system for coach reaccreditation and continuing professional development, while New Zealand continued to develop its overall coaching framework to assist with the development and accreditation of coaches. The other member countries of the Confederation continue coach education under the direct supervision of the OFC Regional Development Officer.

OFMA COACH ASSESSMENTS AND COACH ACCREDITATIONS

During 2018 several assessments for coaches at Level 2 and Level 3 were conducted on the basis of recognition of prior learning as well as practical assessments of candidates involved in coach training courses.

TOTAL NUMBER OF COACHES CURRENTLY HOLDING ACCREDITATION WITH OFMA.

The total number of accredited coaches in Oceania for 2018 was 280, as indicated in the table below. This number has decreased slightly from 2017 due to changes to the accreditation process in Australia (which has by far the largest number of coaches) which means that some coaches previously listed are no longer included. However, there has been a significant increase in the number of coaches from other countries, especially from New Zealand and American Samoa.

2.3 TRAINING ACADEMY FOR COACHES IN BUDAPEST

The strategic aim of the FIE is to open educational centers for coaches.

In accordance with this aim, in 2016 the decision was taken to open a Training Academy for coaches in Budapest, Hungary.

The Academy received the support of the local authorities from the 13th administrative district of Budapest from whom we rent suitable premises for the FIE Academy. The premises for student accommodation and catering, as well as the fencing hall, are on the same site. The financial conditions are advantageous.

The FIE also benefits from the support of the Université Hongroise d'Éducation Physique (Hungarian University for Physical Education) which joined the program and provided theory lessons on psychology, physiology, teaching and coaching methodology. As part of this agreement, the University acknowledges our training and awards internationally-recognized Level 3 diplomas to those Academy students who pass the final exam.

In 2018, one 4-month training camp was organized.

It took place from 1st February to 30th May 2018 and was attended by 22 selected students (10 from Europe, 8 from Asia and 4 from the Americas).

The schedule of the training sessions was as follows: from Monday to Friday, 6 hours per day, for 16 weeks. In total: 480 classes.

At the end of the program, the University asked them to take a final examination.

The experts selected to provide the training are renowned fencing coaches, jointly selected with the University and approved by the Hungarian Fencing Federation:

Epee: Maître Bela KOPETKA

Sabre: Maître Ioan POP

Foil: Maître Zoltan BERNAT

- According to 22 feedback forms received out of 22, all the FIE Academy students were former fencers (100%).
- 73% of the participants had coaching experience before registering with the Academy.

CURRENT PROFESSIONS:

- 82% of the students are active coaches: 41% full time and 41% part time.
- Distribution in terms of working environment is currently as follows: 68% work at a fencing club, 59% (also) work in a university, a school or in another educational establishment, 32% are employed by their national Federation.
- Levels of fencer trained: 14% work with international standard fencers, 45% work with national level fencers, 54% work with beginners and children.

2.7 ACP

Prior to the start of the 2018 Wuxi (China) Fencing World Championships this month, an IOC Athlete Career Program (ACP) was held for 16 fencers and two coaches taking part in an official FIE training camp. Educators at the camp included two-time Olympian Maria Ntanou (GRE) and IOC lead educator Renkai Yip (SIN).

The one-day workshop covered modules such as how to manage a dual career and work on it in advance; networking skills for developing careers; behavioral attributes of career development; creating a career game plan; turning the dream of career results into reality; and how to use social media as part of athlete career development.

Athletes expressed great interest in the program and found it very engaging for building their long-term vocational interests and future. Feedback from the program educators were they perceived fencers already have a remarkably solid foundation balancing sport and education as most were already involved in combining work or studies with their sport.

2.8 DONATE YOUR FENCING GEAR

The «Donate your fencing gear!» program, launched in 2017 was reconducted in 2018, at the occasion of the 105th anniversary of the FIE, the programme will be continued, with a special focus on new and developing federations.

The program had been promoted on the social networks and the official FIE site, as well as through communications ad hoc to the Athletes Commission, Coaches Council and Fencing Manufacturers.

Second-hand equipment was collected in the course of two FIE events:

- Junior and Cadet World Championships, Verona (ITA)
- Senior World Championships, Wuxi (CHN)



DONORS:

- In Verona, 29 athletes and 2 manufacturers gave a total of 500 pieces of equipment, distributed among 8 countries;
- In Wuxi, 39 athletes donated a total of 183 pieces of equipment, distributed among 8 countries.

All the donors received a certificate of participation and an "I donated my fencing gear" bracelet. In addition, an ad hoc album was created on the FIE Facebook page, with photographs of the donors.

The equipment was distributed to 8 countries which submitted 7 fencing solidarity and development projects:

- Benin
- Morocco
- Philippines
- Samoa and American Samoa
- Ecuador
- Mexico
- Paraguay

At each event, a SEMI delegate was responsible for checking the donated equipment to ensure that the items are safe to use.

2.9 EQUIPMENT AID

Aim of the Sports Department: to assist the National Federations to develop and promote fencing.

The criteria used to perform the analysis and allocate the equipment were as follows:

- Participation in FIE competitions or other competitions;
- Federations in need of equipment for organizing important competitions (Olympic Games, World Championships, Grand Prix, World Cup, Continental Championships, Regional Games, Universiades),
- Special cases.

The budget for 2018 was CHF 600,000. The FIE received requests from 98 national federations.

After analysis, the FIE awarded equipment to 98 federations: 25 in Europe, 22 in Asia, 22 in the Americas, 25 in Africa and 4 in Oceania. The federations received equipment worth CHF 5000 or CHF 7000.

This program allows the FIE to work actively for the national federations.

2.10 PRIZE FOR THE WINNERS OF THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Thanks to a private initiative of the FIE President begun in 2009, prizes are awarded to the athletes who win the World Championships. In 2018 the international charity Foundation "For the future of fencing" awarded prizes to the winners and medalists in the competitions listed below, organized under the auspices of the FIE.

2.11 ASSISTANCE WITH ATHLETES' PARTICIPATION PROGRAM

Since 2009, the FIE has implemented a special aid program for NF athletes participating in senior regional championships and the World Championship (juniors and seniors).

For each national federation taking part, all the confederations received a subsidy intended to cover expenses (plane ticket and hotel) for an athlete entering for:

- the World Championships- juniors and cadets 2018
- the Continental Championships - seniors 2018
- the World Championships - seniors 2018

2.12 ASSISTANCE WITH PRESIDENTS' PARTICIPATION

As a result of the subsidies program (plane ticket, hotel and meals) for all Presidents of Federations, they were able to contribute to the work carried out by the FIE Congress 2018, which is very important for the global development of fencing. 135 national federations participated in the FIE Congress in Paris.

2.13 ASSISTANCE FOR CONFEDERATIONS

All confederations received an annual subsidy for their administrative expenses.

The confederations employing a sport director received an additional subsidy to pay this director's salary.

2.14 ASSISTANCE FOR COMPETITION ORGANIZERS

Each national federation organizing an FIE competition (senior World Cup, Grand Prix) and submitting an application, received a subsidy of CHF 3000 to cover the cost of video refereeing.

Grands Prix organizers received a subsidy of CHF 20,000 from the FIE to cover organization and promotion.

The FIE subsidized the cost of the wireless system for the Grands Prix events.

The organizers of junior and senior Zonal Championships, on all continents, received a subsidy of CHF 10,000.

2.15 VETERANS FENCING SUPPORT ENDOWMENT

Veterans Fencing Support Endowment (hereinafter – "VSE"), was founded by the decision of the Founder of the International Charity Fund "For the Future of Fencing", Mr. A. B. Usmanov, (hereinafter – "ICF") and established by ICF decision N° 1 dated October 08, 2012, Certificate of the Ministry of Justice of the Russian Federation on State Registration of November 12, 2012.

At the expense of donations of ICF, the Target Capital (hereinafter – "TC") of the VSE was formed in the amount of USD 10,000,000 and was transferred to the Managing Company "VTB Capital" for Trust Management. The Income from Trust Management of the VSE TC is directed by the VSE to provide social support (assistance) to veterans of world fencing.

During 2018, the assets of the VSE under the Managing Company brought a stable income sufficient to provide financial assistance to all veterans of fencing who applied to the VSE.

During 2018, VSE withdrew USD 176,451 from the Trust Management of the Management Company in favor of veterans of world fencing.

During this period, the VSE TC was spent on providing targeted financial assistance to veterans of world fencing who applied to VSE with the relevant applications directly or through National Federations – USD 139,731.

The balance of funds withdrawn from the Trust Management in favor of assistance to veterans of world fencing on December 25, 2018 was USD 36,720 and will be used in 2019 for further applications.

The amount of VSE assets under the Trust Management of the Management Company on December 25, 2018 corresponds to the amount of initially formed assets and equals to USD 10,100,000.

The total yield of the VSE portfolios is 10.53% per annum.

All requests (24 in total) for direct support for fencing veterans all over the world which were received by the VSE in 2018 were accepted and the requested assistance was provided.

Veterans from Puerto Rico, Bulgaria, Belarus, FYROM, Germany, Aruba, Moldova, Austria, El Salvador, Honduras, Hungary, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, Kyrgyzstan, Ukraine, South Africa, Romania requested assistance either directly or via their national federation. In total they received: 139 731.00 USD.
