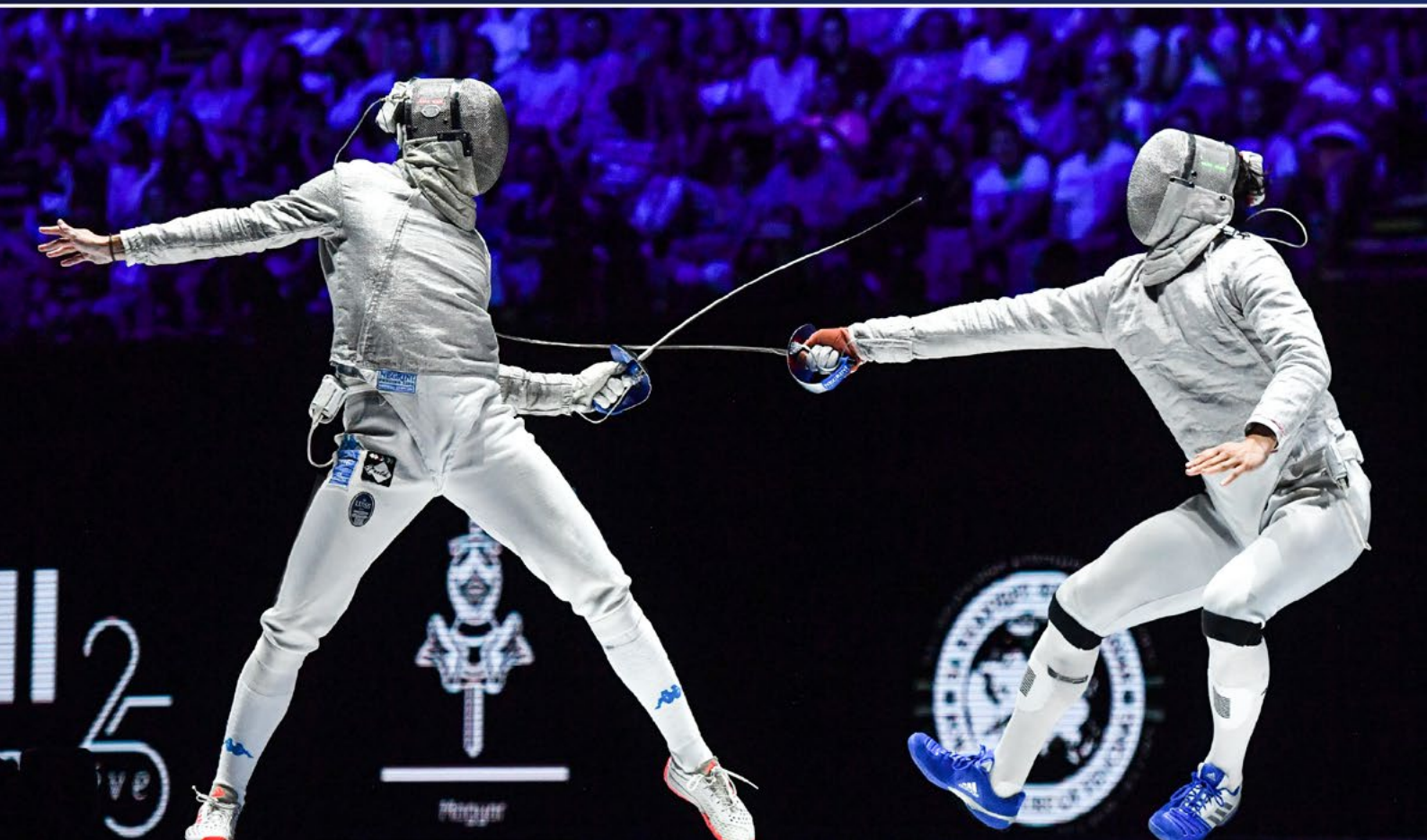

OBITUARY

The International Fencing Federation has been affected by the departure of several friends:

Luis Alberto Moreno Silva (CHI), 1922-2019

Luis Alberto Moreno Silva was born in 1922 in the city of Talcahuano, Chile and passed away on 13 January 2019. He devoted his life to Chilean fencing, as coach and sports executive, holding a number of positions. Luis Alberto Moreno Silva is considered to be "the trainer of champions", "the gentleman of the piste" and "the creator of a Chilean sporting heritage".

Moreno Silva was the first Chilean to graduate as a Fencing Master from the Fencing and Swimming Course at the National Institute of Paris, in France, going on to complete his studies between 1947 and 1956.

For 20 years he was Coach of the Chilean National Team in all three weapons and also worked as a professor of Physical Education and Fencing at the Military School. Luis Alberto was also a founder member of clubs such as the Saint George, Stade Francés, Providencia y Famae.

Over his 97 years, Moreno Silva held a variety of positions within Chilean and continental fencing, with some of the most prominent having been:

- President of the Círculo de Maestros de Armas in Chile, for five years.
- President of the Chilean Fencing Federation (FECHE), from 20 December 1982 to 28 April 1988.
- President of the South American Fencing Confederation (CSE), for four years (1988 – 1992).
- Vice President of the Chilean Olympic Committee for eleven years (1988 -1999).

André Pinelli (FRA) 1922-2019

André Pinelli was a great lover of fencing who devoted a huge part of his life to the development of his sport.

His commitment as a sports leader began in the South of France where he was President of the Ligue de Provence from 1973 to 1993. Then, from 1977, he took on responsibilities within the Fédération française d'escrime (French Fencing Federation) of which he was vice-president from 1984 to 2005.

André Pinelli always had the unanimous support of those who were lucky enough to know him and he will continue to leave his trace on the world of fencing, responsible for the construction of both the Cabriès fencing hall and the CREPS (Regional Physical Education and Sports Centre) fencing hall in Aix-en-Provence.

Born in 1922, he played an active part in the liberation of France, landing in Saint-Tropez at the end of the Second World War and receiving the Legion of Honour in 2005. He passed away on the 25th of March at the age of 97.

Gregorio Lima (PUR) 1938-2019

Gregorio Lima, who passed away on July 25 in San Juan, at the age of 80, was an FIE Veteran's Council member since 2016. A member of the Puerto Rico Fencing Federation since 1980, he served as its vice president for 25 years and president from 2010 to 2017. He was a lawyer by profession with a doctorate in law.

Mr. Lima ceaselessly gave the best of himself, devoting all his energy to the cause of our sport. He was an outstanding leader who contributed significantly to the expansion of fencing.

Shlomi Eyal (ISR) 1959-2019

Born June 20, 1959, Mr. Eyal represented Israel in the 1984 Olympic Games, and then afterwards coached in the USA. In 1988, he returned to Israel, where he established a fencing club at kibbutz Yizrael. Over many years in fencing, he produced numerous successful athletes and served as national coach.

Uwe Neder (GER), 1965-2019

Neder was introduced to the sport as a "fencing father", bringing his daughters to trainings and competitions. However, he quickly wanted to get more involved and in 2001 he started his training to become a referee. Neder became a successful referee on both national and international level, with the 2015 Military World Games in South Korea as his biggest achievement. In 2016 Neder was elected "épée referee of the year" by the German Fencing Federation.

Besides refereeing, Neder was very involved in his hometown fencing club, FC Offenbach, amongst others as tournament organiser.

We express our sincerest condolences to the bereaved families and federations of the deceased.

1 ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

1.1 Management

1.3 Antidoping

1.3.1 CONTROLS

Antidoping measures were continued throughout the period and **no** case of doping occurred in any competitions organized by the FIE.

440 tests during competitions and 243 out-of-competition controls were performed by anti-doping agencies.

215 urine tests and 19 blood tests were performed.

1.3.2 FIE ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION OUTREACH PROGRAM

Competitions:

- Cadet and Junior World Championships, 1-9 April, Torun (POL). Program: 2-8 April, i.e. 7 days.
- Senior World Championships, 15-23 July, Budapest (HUN). Program: 16 -20 July, i.e. 4 and a half days. This was the first time that the "Clean Sport" educational program was presented at the Senior World Championships.

Educators:

- Cadet and Junior World Championships: Sabrina Halaimia (ALG); Lisa Huzel (CAN). Maria Luisa Doig (PER) (Member of the FIE Athletes' Commission) was present at the stand as a volunteer for one day.

Participation

- Cadet and Junior World Championships

Number of participants: 338 over five days, average participation of 67.6 participants per day, i.e. 12.7% additional participants per day compared with 2018.

Number of fencers: out of the 1,376 participating fencers, 293 (21.5%) took part in the Quiz.

Number of coaches: 41 coaches, i.e. 12% of the participation to the quiz this year. In previous years, coaches represented 10% of participants in 2018 and 7.7% in 2017.

Number of countries: Participants represented 49 countries (51% of the 96 countries participating at this World Championships)

- Senior World Championships

Number of participants: 288 over 4 days, average participation of 72 participants per day. 67 per day participated in the Cadet and Junior World Championships, which was already an increase on 2018.

Number of fencers: out of the 1044 fencers competing from 115 countries, 221 (21.5%) did the Quiz.

Number of coaches: 22 coaches participated.

Number of countries: Participants represented 50 countries (44% of the 115 countries participating at this World Championships).

Participation for 2019 totaled 626 participants.

The Quiz:

This year, we had two versions of the anti-doping Quiz: the updated WADA Quiz, and a youth version of the WADA Quiz. For younger athletes and athletes who may not have received a great deal of anti-doping education in the past, the Youth Quiz was often more appropriate.

Rewards

Everyone who took part in the Quiz received a free flash drive containing WADA educational information (including the two versions of the anti-doping Quiz and reference documents such as the List of prohibited substances 2019). These were very popular, as was the chance of winning the FIE lucky draw cash prizes.

The souvenir pins for the 105 anniversary of the FIE definitely won over the participants, encouraging numerous athletes to stop at the stand.

In Torun we gave 4 prizes of 25 euros each day. In Budapest, we gave 6 prizes of 50 euros. All the winners were extremely grateful.

Signing the pull up banner was also very popular in Torun. The fencers were happy to add the name of their country and say "no" to doping in their own language. This highlighted the international nature of the World Championships. They were also delighted to see their photos on the FIE Facebook page.

1.4 Fair Play educational program

The activities took place at the Cadet and Junior World Championships 2019 in Torun, Poland. Together with the stands of Clean Sport, Safe Sport and Donate your Fencing gear, the Fair-Play stand was placed on the landing at the top of the escalators to the second floor of the Sports Arena. The clear advantage was that we had more inter-action with the athletes and somewhat less with the public, which mainly stayed on the ground floor.

Almost all the work was now done by Daniel Koszegi from the CIFP.

Fair Play counted around 60 athletes a day that took part in our games and discussions about Fairness in Sport and the role they could play in it. The inter-action with the athletes was in general good and meaningful. Sometimes, there were significant language barriers but the games were made to prevent participants being hindered by them. With 4 full days, approx. 240 athletes came to the stand, although there were some that came more than once.

Given a start that is the second day of the Championship, 4 days is enough, since it reaches all fencers, because those that compete in the last events have arrived by day 4.

A bracelet with a USB key integrated including the information on the different program has been distributed to all the participants.

b. Educational program

During the Cadet and Junior World Championships (Torun – POL) and the Senior World Championships (Budapest – HUN), an educational stand was set up, from the first to last competition day. The stand was run by the following Safeguarding Officers appointed for the World Championships:

- Cadet and Junior World Championships: Georgina Usher (GBR); Sam Cheri (USA, MH);
- Senior World Championships: Edina Czegledy (HUN), Antonio Fiore (ITA).



The stand had a Wi-Fi connection and several tablets to display the relevant IOC-approved educational resources.

The stand was located close to the other FIE educational stands (Clean Sport, Fair Play and the “Donate your fencing gear” collection point. It was open for athletes as well as coaches, national officials and volunteers.

At the end of the video, a flash drive with a document listing useful links supplied by the IOC Safeguarding Officer was given to participants, so that they could easily retrieve the information if necessary.

No one requested neither immediate medical assistance nor legal advice.

c. Awareness-raising by Officials

Following established procedures, Safeguarding Officers held meetings with the officials, referees and volunteers to draw their attention to the FIE’s policy and safeguarding procedures.

1.6 Social media, magazines

1.6.1 FIE MEDIA REPORT 2019

During 2019, the FIE developed its digital communication platforms and significantly increased its on-line audience both on TV channels and on social media and streaming platforms.

Several promotional campaigns, digital and on-site, covered major fencing events: Grand Prix, World Championships, the Olympic Test Event in Tokyo, the World Fencing Day and development programs prepared with the athletes, addressing a variety of content reflecting the functions of each online platform.

1.6.2 SOCIAL MEDIA

A dynamic social media strategy was implemented during 2019, on all the FIE digital platforms. With the growth of followers on each digital platform, the FIE continues to manage four social media platforms every day, i.e. Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, and YouTube.

The on-line content of the Fencing channel on YouTube obtained 4,6 million views, compared with 2,6 million in 2018. The number of YouTube subscribers also increased 11.4K by 20% reaching 59,914 subscriptions. During 2019, with the World Championships in Budapest, the fencing Grand Prix and the World Cups organized around the world plus weekly videos, the FIE achieved a 6 % average increase in followers on Facebook with a total of 1,4K posts, 39% on Twitter after 574 posts and 70% on Instagram with total number of posts 389.

The commitment and interaction between athletes and the public on social media have been significant. A series of digital features, such as winner interviews, IOC Athlete career+, event news, Behind the Mask videos, educational programs, World Fencing Day and athletic-centric unique stories have been part of the continuous content plan on the FIE channels. Athletes and fencing events organizers have used the FIE platforms as a showcase during World Cups and Grands Prix and have shared their personal viewpoints with the public online.

1.6.3 DIGITAL MAGAZINE - ESCRIME XXI

In 2012, ESCRIME XXI became the first interactive digital magazine published in five languages amongst the international federations. It has been updated to reach a larger audience via the mobile version. In 2019, with three languages, the digital magazine was viewed 250,023 times. This significant increase can be explained by the diversity of its content, with fencing stories from all over the world, and the effective cross-disciplinary communication on social media and the national federation platforms. According to our measurement indicators,

the magazine aroused most interest in the USA, the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Spain and Russia. The magazine reaches a wide population all over the world, increasing the awareness of fencing by broadcasting a positive image of our sport.

1.6.4 TV FACTS AND FIGURES 2019

Fencing Grand Prix

9 Grand Prix in total were broadcasted by EUROSPORT (FR), NBC (USA), ALKASS (QATAR), MATCH TV (RUS), RAI (ITA), MTVA (HUN), SPORTV (KOREA); OLYMPIC CHANNEL. Streaming media panels were also facebook.com/FIE and fencing YouTube channel.

Broadcast time: 57 channels around the world reported on the FIE Fencing Grand Prix 2019. Almost 1616 hours of broadcast time were aired during the event -TV as well as streaming media. The federation's own YouTube channel represents the most important channel in terms of coverage and accounts for the highest share of broadcast time (14%). Eurosport Italy 2 comes second in that list, followed by Eurosport 2 Russia.

Cumulative audience: from January 22nd until May 29th, the event has generated a cumulative audience of 20.54 million viewers, to which China has contributed 15.48 million as the top market. A high audience level was also achieved on free-to-air channel Rossiya 24 – valuable news coverage in programmes such as Vesti have gained a cumulative audience of 1.61 million.

Fencing World Championships Budapest 2019

The world championships were broadcasted in China, USA, France, Japan, Poland, South Korea, Spain, Brazil, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Russia and Estonia.

Broadcast time: From July 15th until July 23rd, the Fencing World Championships 2019 has generated a cumulative TV audience of 199.57 million of TV spectators, to which the host country Hungary has contributed with 7.25 millions as the fifth best market. A high audience level was also achieved on Russian channel Rossiya1 –several news broadcasts have gained a cumulative audience of 23.13 million of TV spectators.

In general, the Fencing World Championships in Budapest has delivered a strong media penetration. 68 channels in 50 countries around the world reported on the World Championships. Russia represents the most important market in terms of TV coverage and accounts for the highest share of broadcast time. The Russian channels aired 123 hours of the event. Moreover, channels such as Rai Sport (Italy), M1 (Hungary) as well as CCTV 5 were main drivers in terms of sheer volume.

1.6.5 FIE SWORDPLAY

The FIE Swordplay game was launched in July 2016. This is a worldwide first for mobile telephone games, incorporating the real rules and techniques of fencing with fabulous 3D graphics, phenomenal animation, and ultra-realistic laws of physics, officially supported by the FIE. The countries where it is most popular with the majority of downloads are China, Russia, Brazil and the United States.

The number of downloads from ios in 2019 are 194'672 and from Android are 279'501, 474,173 in total.

1.9 ———— **World Fencing Day**

The third-annual World Fencing Day took place worldwide September 7, 2019.

On World Fencing Day, the “Fencing for our Planet” theme meant to be a call to action for the worldwide fencing family to show that fencing and fencers care for people and the world.

As part of its basic principles and mission, the FIE encouraged athletes, coaches, fencing clubs and federations worldwide to demonstrate not only their love of the sport of fencing, but also to use their talents and dedication to sport for the betterment of their communities and our shared environment.

Demonstrating the importance of fitness and nutrition to youth groups in disadvantaged areas and to the elderly, joining volunteer groups to help clean beaches and environmentally endangered places, and providing help for the most vulnerable in our society, are some of the ways that fencers, fencing clubs and federations can use the vast energy network in fencing to the betterment of those around them.

The aim of this initiative is that fencers can show the world that fencing is not just a sport, but a positive state of mind that can benefit both the individual and the communities in which they live. The FIE provided World Fencing Day branding guidelines to its 153 member federations to enable marketing and promotion with posters, diplomas, t-shirts, Web sites and social media.

The staff of the FIE Headquarters in Lausanne collectively decided to plan a beach cleaning near the office and along the shores of Lake Geneva.



1.10 Challenge « Chevalier Feyerick » 2019

The Challenge « Chevalier Feyerick » 2019 was awarded by the 2019 Congress to Thomas Bach (MH, GER), President of the International Olympic Committee for:

- his outstanding professional achievements since his brilliant results as a fencer.
- his dedication to the cause of sport, with a view to its development and its global outreach.
- his visionary programs for ensuring the protection of rights, aspirations and interests of all athletes.
- his actions in favour of peace and the rapprochement of peoples through sport.
- his personal contribution to strengthening ties of friendship in international sport.

2 ASSISTANCE OF THE FIE IN SPORT DEVELOPMENT

2.1 Training camps for athletes

Two training camps were organized on the occasion of the Junior and Cadet World Championships in Torun (POL) and the Senior World Championships in Budapest (HUN). The FIE paid all the expenses associated with these camps (air tickets, local transport, hotel, meals, experts, visa fees, entry fees) until the end of the individual competitions in the World Championships.

These camps were organized for the following purposes:

- to offer a week of intensive preparation to fencers who sometimes do not have sufficient training partners to allow them to aim for a top international level.
- to introduce these young talents to the structure and entire content of a modern training session.
- to allow them to benefit from advice from highly experienced maitres d'armes, and acquire the determination to put this advice into practice.
- to offer them contact with the global fencing elite under the best possible conditions, encouraging them to redouble their efforts and inspiring them to serve as examples once they return to their training halls.

2.2 Oceania Fencing Master Academy (OFMA)

OFMA Coaching Courses

Coaching development courses and seminars were organised & held in Oceania this year under the auspices of OFMA. Designated courses were held in Australia and New Zealand, and a Level 1 (Group) Coaching Course was conducted in Papua New Guinea in February with 10 successful candidates. Ongoing development of coaches was facilitated in American Samoa, Guam and Samoa, and initial training of coaches was undertaken in Fiji.

Coaching Program Development

Both Australia and New Zealand are continuing to review and update their coach accreditation systems to align with OFMA standards, with input from the Oceania Fencing Confederation. The other member countries of the Confederation continue coach education under the direct supervision of the OFC Regional Development Officer.

OFMA Coach Assessments and Coach Accreditations

During 2019 several assessments for coaches at Level 2 and Level 3 were conducted based on recognition of prior learning as well as practical assessments of candidates involved in coach training courses.

Total number of coaches currently holding accreditation with OFMA.

The total number of accredited coaches in Oceania for 2019 was 315, as indicated in the table below, which is an increase of 35 from last year.

2.3 Training Academy for coaches in Budapest

The strategic aim of the FIE is to open educational centers for coaches.

In accordance with this aim, in 2016 the decision was taken to open a Training Academy for coaches in Budapest, Hungary.

The FIE received the support of the local authorities from the 13th administrative district of Budapest from which suitable premises for the FIE Academy were rented. The premises for student accommodation and catering, as well as the fencing hall, are on the same site.

The FIE also benefits from the support of the Hungarian University for Physical Education, which joined the program and provided theory lessons on psychology, physiology, biomechanics and theory of sport. As a part of this agreement, the University acknowledges the Academy training and awards internationally-recognized Level 2 diplomas to those Academy students who pass the final exam.

In 2019, three 3-month training camps were organised.

They took place as follows:

- Epee: from 20th January to 19th April 2019, attended by 7 selected students (3 from Europe, 3 from Asia and 1 from the Americas).
- Sabre: from 21st April to 21st July 2019, attended by 7 selected students (3 from Europe, 3 from Asia and 1 from the Americas).
- Foil: from 22nd July to 21st October 2019, attended by 8 selected students (6 from Europe, 1 from Asia and 1 from the Americas).

The training sessions were scheduled from Monday to Friday, 6 hours per day, for 12 weeks.

At the end of the program, the University asked them to take a final examination.

The experts selected to provide the training are renowned fencing coaches:

Epee: Maître Bela KOPETKA

Sabre: Maître Akos BODOKY

Foil: Maître Zoltan BERNAT

- According to 14 feedback forms received out of 22, all the FIE Academy students were former fencers (100%).
- 100% of the participants had coaching experience before registering with the Academy.

Current professions:

- 100% of the students are active coaches: 50% full time and 50% part time.
- Distribution in terms of working environment is currently as follows: 93% work at a fencing club, 57% (also) work in a university, a school or in another educational establishment, 43% are employed by their national Federation.

- Levels of fencers trained: 36% work with international standard fencers, 93% work with national level fencers, 79% work with beginners and children.

2.6 Athlete 365 Career+

Prior to the start of the 2019 Budapest Fencing World Championships on July 11, an IOC Athlete 365 Career+ Outreach Workshop was held for 20 fencers taking part in an official FIE training camp. Two-time Olympian Maria Ntanou (GRE) led the program. The one-day workshop covered modules such as how to manage a dual career and work on it in advance; networking skills for developing careers; behavioural attributes of career development; creating a career game plan; and how to use social media as part of athlete career development. Athletes expressed great interaction during the workshop. In addition, at the end of the session, they were able to translate their strengths to the business language. Feedback from the educator was that fencers of that group have a remarkable foundation of combining studies and training at this particular stage of their career.

2.7 ——— Donate your fencing gear

The «Donate your fencing gear! » program, launched in 2017 was reconducted in 2019.

The program had been promoted on the social networks and the official FIE site, as well as through communications from the Athletes Commission, Coaches Council and Fencing Manufacturers.

Second-hand equipment was collected in the course of three FIE events:

- Junior and Cadet World Championships, Torun (POL)
- Asian Zonal Championships, Tokyo-Chiba (JPN)
- Senior World Championships, Budapest (HUN)

Donors :

- In Torun, 38 athletes and 5 manufacturers gave 227 pieces of equipment
- In Tokyo, 16 athletes and 1 club gave 115 pieces of equipment
- In Budapest, 32 athletes gave 160 pieces of equipment.

2.8 Equipment aid

The criteria used to perform the analysis and allocate the equipment were as follows:

- Specific requirements: participation in FIE competitions or competitions other than the FIE ones;
- Federations in need of equipment for organizing important competitions (Olympic Games, World Championships, Grand Prix, World Cups, Continental Championships, Regional Games, Universiades);
- Special cases.

The budget for 2019 was 600'000 CHF.

The FIE awarded equipment to 100 federations: 25 in Europe, 24 in Asia, 22 in the Americas, 24 in Africa and 5 in Oceania. The federations received equipment worth CHF 5000 or CHF 7000.

The operations for the equipment distribution started in June 2019.

This program allows the FIE to work actively for the national federations.

2.9 Prize for the winners of the World Championships

Within the year of 2019 the International Charity Fund "For the Future of Fencing" was conducting its charitable activity in the framework of the programs aimed at development of fencing as high-performance sport and mass sports at the global sports scene.

1. The Fund conducted the charitable programs aimed at motivation of the fencers achieving the top results at some major international fencing tournaments, i.e. the World Championships, the European Championships, the tournament of the World Cup "Foil of Saint-Petersburg", the Grand-Prix "Moscow Sabre", the World Championships (Cadet and Junior). The total amount of these prizes exceeds 900 thousand US-dollars.

The most substantial prize-money payments were set for the medallists of the World Championships, i.e. each gold medalist in the individual competitions got the prize in the amount of 18 thousand US-dollars, each silver medalist –14 thousand US-dollars, each bronze medalist –10 thousand dollars. The athletes - prize-winners of the team competitions received the prizes in the amount of 6 thousand US-dollars - for each gold medal, 5 thousand US-dollars - for each silver medal, 4 thousand US-dollars - for each bronze medal, accordingly.

Within the year of 2019 the Fund made more than 300 prize-money payments in the framework of the charitable programs of fencing development as high-performance sport.

2. The international charitable programs aimed at development of fencing as mass sport, performed by the Fund within the expiring year were purposed to charitable aid to:
 - International Fencing Federation (FIE);
 - Continental fencing confederations (Pan American Fencing Confederation, Oceania Fencing Confederation, Central Asian Fencing Confederation);
 - National fencing federations/associations of the countries of all continents which have minor budgets but doing active work aimed at fencing development at the national level (Moldova Fencing Federation, Ukraine Fencing Federation, Bulgaria Fencing Federation, Cyprus Fencing Federation, Tajikistan Fencing Federation, Togo Fencing Federation, Uganda Fencing Federation, Nicaragua Fencing Federation and others). In the framework of the charitable support of national fencing federations and associations, the Fund performed more than 20 charitable programs.
 - International fencing events (the Nordic Fencing Union Camp, the International congress devoted to fencing development in Asia and introduction of the latest innovations into fencing).

The total amount of the donations, aimed at development of fencing as popular sports at the international scene, the Fund made within the year of 2019 exceeds 400 thousand USD.

2.10 Assistance with athletes' participation program

Since 2009, the FIE has implemented a special aid programmer for NF athletes participating in senior continental championships and the World Championship (junior and senior).

For each national federation taking part, all the confederations received a subsidy intended to cover expenses (plane ticket and hotel) for an athlete entering for:

- the World Championships- junior and cadet 2019
- the Continental Championships - senior 2019
- the World Championships - senior 2019

2.11 Assistance with Presidents' participation

As a result of the subsidies program (plane ticket, hotel and meals) for all Presidents of Federations, they were able to contribute to the work carried out by the FIE Congress 2019, which is very important for the global development of fencing. 135 national federations participated in the FIE Congress in Lausanne.

2.12 Assistance for Confederations

All confederations received an annual subsidy and a subsidy for their administrative expenses.

The confederations employing a sport director received an additional subsidy to pay this director's salary.

2.13 Assistance for competition organizers

Each national federation organizing an FIE competition (senior World Cup, Grand Prix) and submitting an application, received a subsidy of CHF 3000 to cover the cost of video refereeing.

GP organizers received a subsidy of CHF 20,000 from the FIE to cover organization and promotion.

The FIE subsidized the cost of the wireless system for the Grand Prix events.

The organizers of junior and senior Zonal Championships, on all continents, received a subsidy of CHF 10,000.

2.14 Veterans Fencing Support Endowment

Within the year of 2019 the Fencing Veterans Support Endowment established by the IChF "For the Future of Fencing" was continuing its activity aimed at support of fencing veterans in the following fields of concern:

Targeted material aid in coverage of expenses connected with the medical screening and diagnostics; Targeted material aid in coverage of expenses connected with treatment of chronic diseases, immediate and planned surgeries; Targeted material aid in purchase of medicines in the framework of the provided treatment and post-hospital rehabilitation;

Targeted material aid in coverage of the expenses of the health-resorts treatment;

Social support to fencing veterans who have complicated life situations and difficult straits;

Reimbursement of expenses connected with burial and perpetuation of the memory which immediate family members or trainees of deceased fencing veterans have borne;

Facilitation of development of the fencing veterans movement.

In the framework of the above-mentioned lines of activities, the Fencing Veterans Support Endowment granted support to the fencing veterans of Belarus, Ukraine, Romania, Tajikistan, Honduras, Russia, Turkmenistan as well as to Slovenia Fencing federation.

The total amount of material aid granted by the Fund to the above described activity lines within the expiring year exceeds 200 thousand US-dollars.

The Fencing Veterans Support Endowment plans further expansion of its activity aimed at aid to fencing veterans. The Fund turns to FIE with the kind request of intensive informing the global community of fencing veterans regarding the facilities of the Fund aimed at support of fencing veterans.

2.15 Confederations activities

2.15.1 EUROPEAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS 2019:

- The 13th European Cadet and 27th European Junior Championships 2019, organized in Foggia (ITA) from 22nd February to 3rd March.
Participants:
Cadet: 504 and 99 teams from 41 countries.
Junior: 454 and 94 teams from 38 countries.
- The 32nd Senior European Championships 2019 in Dusseldorf (GER), from 17th to 22nd June 2019.
Participants: 446 and 87 teams from 41 NF-s.

CIRCUIT CADET CUPS 2018/2019 SEASON:

We can state that number of participants in EFC CC increased again from 8885 in 2017-2018 reaching 8900 in 2018-2019! The number of countries came to 66 (40 from Europe, 16 from Asia, 7 from America and 3 from Africa) and special record of participation was one more time registered in Bratislava where the inscriptions in men's epee reached 360 fencers in individual competition and 72 teams! Traditionally big tournament was running in Budapest and also in Moedling as the message of the federations that logistic seems to be easier when they are travelling to Central Europe. It can be also stated that the tendency with decreasing number of some team tournaments due to their replacement by complementary U14 competitions was kept. After few years we got new organizer in sabre – Istanbul (TUR), which succeeded to have quite nice participation despite its first edition.

Total of fencers on pistes in 2018 – 2019 season: 9280 fencers.

Every year we award Circuit Cadet Cup winners during team medal ceremony on Cadet European Championships. Winners receive a prize coupon in amount of 300 EUR for fencing equipment which can be redeemed in all fencing stores.

REFEREES EFC C-CATEGORY PROJECT

This category should allow federations in the future to send those selected ones to the FIE examinations for the B-category. We registered on all CC cups 1009 referees (339 in sabre, 448 in epee, 222 in foil) who have been evaluated In last two seasons.

At the end of the 2018/2019 season 46 referees have been awarded EFC C license: 11 in sabre, 16 in foil and 27 in epee.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT OF PRESIDENT STANISLAV POZDNYAKOV (PRESIDENTIAL FOUND)

With the financial support of the EFC President in all annual activities, the EFC was able to support the more needy countries to pay for fencers and teams entry fee at the European Championships in all age categories in 2019. 16 countries benefited from this assistance. Additionally, thanks to his donations, each organizer of the European Championship in 2019 received financial subsidy to cover the organization costs of the Championships, TV production and other costs, which definitely influenced the quality of the European Championship's organization and thus the development of fencing in Europe and in the world.

LAUNCHING A NEW PROJECT - SABRE REFEREES

In recent years a lack of young sabre referees, who can perform a function of referee at European Championships in all age categories, was noticed. Responding to the problem EFC Executive Committee created a new project aimed at increasing the number and quality of sabre referees.

There is a general lack of the required number of referees to respond to changes in the international calendar and the rising quantity of international competitions in Europe. At each of these competitions EFC designates one or two experienced supervisors (Vasil Milenchev and Vladislav Shamis). They will observe and select referees with potential for development. The EFC will recommend National Federation to support these referees in their international career for a period of one year. During this year the selected referees will work closely with the supervisors.

Basic assumptions:

- Motivation: Increasing the quantity and quality of young and talented sabre referees in Europe.
- Expected result: After each season, 3 – 6 sabre referees who are not currently members of the FIE Master List, with the support of the EFC and the elite referees from the zone should be given a chance to participate in FIE competitions for Junior and Satellite World Cups.

REFEREES EFC MASTER LIST

The EFC Master List is constantly updated, which is useful in the process of appointing referees for the European Championships. Based on experience from last year and the fencing global tendency to increase the number of women referees, EFC Executive Committee decided that EFC Master List should be amended accordingly.

New criteria in the process of selecting referees to the EFC Master List:

Master List

- Proposal sent by the NF, ranked for each weapon;
- Maximum 9 referees in all weapons but no more than 3 referees per each weapon and no more than 2 with one license.
- FIE category ("A" or "B");
- Gender equality (Maximum 6 referees of one gender).
- In exceptional situations EFC Refereeing Commission can propose changes in the applications, after consulting with a federation and obtaining its consent.

SOCIAL MEDIA WORKSHOP

On the occasion of the organization of the Senior Fencing European Championships in Düsseldorf, an EFC Workshop of Sponsorship and Social Media for National Federations was organised, where all federations had a chance to attend and share opinions about sponsorships and social media issues. Workshop was carried out by EFC P&M Commission and media team.

2.15.2 ASIAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

COMPETITION MANAGEMENT SEMINAR

The Competition Management Seminar was held in Taipei City from August 14 to 16, 2019 with 28 participants representing 13 countries in Asia. The seminar covered a wide area of topics essential to equip participants with the knowledge of running a fencing competition. Such topics covered were on DT functions, weapons control, protocol functions, scheduling events and an extensive explanation on the features of the competition software of Fencing Time.

FCA Technical Commission chair Dr Abbas Faryabi was assisted by Ms Marilee Estampador to handle the first day of the seminar covering the topics which provided the general functions of competition management, while Mr Daniel Berke spent the whole second day to give a detailed demonstration of the features and use of Fencing Time software. The third day was devoted for the practical demonstration where participants were asked to be observed the running of the Asian Cadet Circuit and the Asian Veterans Championships.

Certificate of Accomplishment were awarded by FCA President Celso L. Dayrit. This is the second such competition management seminar organized by the FCA in Asia, the first being in 2013, then using Engarde software for training.

FCA COACHING COURSES IN ASIA

The newly approved development program launched by the Fencing Confederation of Asia has elicited wide interests among some federations in the continent. So far six federations have availed of this opportunity in the first year of implementation. Among the federations which have completed their courses were:

- Jordan which had a Foil Course by Petru Kuki (ROU) on July 25 to 29
- Lebanon which had a Foil Course by Bernat Zoltan (HUN) on August 1 to 6
- Chinese Taipei which had a Foil Course by Christophe Omnes (FRA) on September 11 to 15
- Philippines which had a Foil Course by Petru Kuki (ROU) on September 16 to 20
- Malaysia which had a Foil Course by Petru Kuki (ROU) on September 22 to 26
- Vietnam which had a Foil Course by Petru Kuki (ROU) on December 10 to 14

The FCA covered the stipend of the expert and his air ticket, while the requesting federations covered the accommodation and meals of the expert as well as the organization requirements for the course.

Some more federations have requested for a similar Coaching Course to be held in 2020.

ASIAN REFEREEING SEMINAR AND EXAM

The sixth Asian Refereeing Seminar was held under the auspices of the FCA in Taipei City and completed after 5 days from August 13 to 17. The seminar was followed by a C-License Refereeing Exam to prepare aspiring referees in Asia and Oceania for a career as licensed referees under the FIE. FCA Refereeing Commission Chair Dr. Eyad Maghayreh (JOR) and FIE Refereeing Commission Member Kim Chang Gon (KOR) were assisted by Howard Hao Chih Huang (TPE) in dealing with a total of 51 candidates coming from 19 countries in Asia and Oceania.

A total of 70 individual exams were held as some candidates tried their luck of a multiple number of weapons.
CADET ATHLETES PROMOTIONS

To encourage the promotion of fencing among the youth in Asia, the FCA recently approved a program that would provide federations in Asia a subsidy towards the participation of at least one Cadet fencer in the upcoming 2020 Asian Juniors and Cadets Fencing Championships that will be held in Jakarta Indonesia.

This is the first time that the FCA will provide subsidies to its member federations aimed exclusively for the participation of a cadet fencer in its annual AJCFC. The FCA has given emphasis to youth development with its introduction of the Asian Cadet Circuit competitions which started in 2017 and now considered as among the most sought-after competitions in the continent.

COMPETITIONS

Annual FCA Competitions

In the 2019 Asian Junior and Cadet Fencing Championships held in Amman Jordan, Korea led all federations in the medal tally after winning 11 gold medals, 7 silvers and 10 bronzes. The Korean fencers scored the highest in the Junior events, while it tied with Japan in the Cadet events with 6 gold medals each.

A total of more than 700 fencers representing 30 countries from Asia and the Oceania participated in the biggest ever Asian youth fencing competitions.

Nearly 400 fencers from all over Asia and Oceania participated in the Chiba Port Arena in Japan for the 2019 Asian Fencing Championships. A total of 369 fencers from 30 countries were recorded in this important competition which is relevant to the ranking for the 2020 Olympic Games to be held in Tokyo. The Koreans once again dominated the competitions finishing with five gold medals, 3 silvers and 4 bronzes. Japan was not far behind with four gold medals, 3 silvers and 6 bronzes, while China won 3 gold medals, 4 silvers and 3 bronzes.

The 5th edition of the Asian Veterans Fencing Championships was successfully completed in Taipei City from August 16 to 19, 2019. The 4 days competitions attracted competitors from 12 countries with 107 females and 327 male fencers making a total of 434 entries. The countries that took part were Australia, China, Chinese Taipei, Japan, Hong Kong, India, Iran, New Zealand, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Uzbekistan. Japan came with the biggest delegation followed by Chinese Taipei, Hong Kong and China.

The 2019 Asian Under 23 Fencing Championships were held at the Fashion Island Mall in Bangkok Thailand from October 23 to 28, 2019. A total of 302 fencers representing 22 countries from Asia and Oceania participated in the 12-event competition. Emerging as overall champion was Korea garnering a total of 7 gold medals, 4 silvers and 7 bronzes. Japan was second overall with 3 gold medals and six bronzes, while Vietnam and the Philippines salvaged a gold medal each.

Regional Games

The oldest biennial regional competition in Asia had its 30th edition held in Philippines with the sport of fencing competed from December 3 to 8, 2019. This year's edition Southeast Asian Games was the biggest so far having 56 sports and 530 events in its calendar. Nine countries participated in the fencing competitions, namely: Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam.

The South Asian Games were held in Katmandu Nepal from December 1 to 10, 2019. SAF Games fencing competitions saw the participation of countries like Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and host country Nepal.

The Central Asian Fencing Championships were held in Tashkent, Uzbekistan from September 7 to 9, 2019. Participating fencers represented Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and host Uzbekistan.

FIE Ranking Competitions

As in the past years, some countries in Asia actively contributed to the FIE calendar of competitions hosting events under the FIE Grand Prix or World Cup events. These countries include Bahrain, China, Iran, Japan, Korea, Qatar, Thailand, and Uzbekistan.

Asian Cadet Circuit

For the Asian Cadet season 2019-2020, ten countries organized competitions in Asia showing the growing popularity of this youth programme. These countries were Malaysia, Jordan, Japan, China, Chinese Taipei, Singapore, Thailand, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia and Hong Kong.

Around 1,500 cadet fencers registered and participated in the competitions for this season, definitely showing a growing number of cadet fencers patronizing the circuit programme.

2.15.3 PANAMERICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

2 refereeing seminars were held in 2019, the first of which took place in Ciudad de Panamá (Panama City), Panama, from 8 to 10 March 2019; with a total of 22 participants who worked on basic refereeing topics. The aim was to train and monitor national referees in preparation for the continental examination in the future. A refereeing seminar was also held in Antigua & Barbuda on 8 and 9 November 2019, within the context of the Federation's national championship. 10 participants used the facilities of the Antigua & Barbuda Union of Teachers conference room, where for the first time they had the opportunity to take part in a refereeing seminar covering the basic concepts. This will help them to organize more national competitions and have their own FIE referees in the future. These seminars were led by Juan Carlos Rios Rivera, a well-known, experienced FIE referee with whom the Confederación Panamericana de Esgrima has been organizing these activities to the benefit of the national federations on our continent.

In October (7 to 22 October) the Pan American Training Course for epee coaches took place, run by the renowned fencing master Jerzy Konczalski and the sport director of the CPE, Jose Benavides. 31 participants from 26 national federations were involved. The venue chosen for this course was the city of San Salvador, whose strategic location and facilities have made it the center for these courses, ensuring the most suitable activities to the participants.

In 2019 the zonal championships also took place in all categories: Cadet, Junior, Youth, Veterans and Senior; Colombia, Bolivia and Canada, respectively, were the national federations that hosted these competitions. The smooth running of the schedule of events and massive attendance fills us with satisfaction and at the same time challenges us to continue working and promoting our sport to all corners on our continent

2.15.4 OCEANIA FENCING CONFEDERATION

DEVELOPING NEW FEDERATIONS IN THE PACIFIC

The Oceania Fencing Confederation continued its expansion in 2019 with Papua New Guinea (PNG) becoming a member of the FIE following a visit by two members of the FIE Executive Committee to review the growth and development of Fencing Papua New Guinea. Following a successful review, Papua New Guinea was granted membership of the International Fencing Federation in November 2019.

The OFC currently has six full members (American Samoa, Australia, Guam, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea and Samoa) and two Associate Members (French Polynesia and New Caledonia).

DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

The Regional Development Officer carried out activities in Papua New Guinea (February, May & August), American Samoa & Samoa (April), Guam (May-June) and Fiji (October).

Highlights included the training of ten new coaches and organizing a fencing demonstration for the IOC President on Olympic Day in PNG, training athletes participating in the Oceania Championships in New Zealand and Australia and staging demonstration events and learn to fence courses in Suva, Fiji for the first time ever.

OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2019 Oceania Cadet Championships were held in Wellington, New Zealand in April. There were 115 competitors from Guam, French Polynesia, Australia and New Zealand. The 2019 Oceania Senior Championships were held in Canberra, Australia in November. There were 239 participants from Australia, New Zealand, Guam, French Polynesia and New Caledonia.

INAUGURAL ALL-SAMOA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Regional Sport Director and Regional Development Officer travelled to Apia, Samoa for a combined training camp for junior athletes from Samoa and American Samoa, culminating in the inaugural All-Samoa Championships with 11 athletes competing in team and individual foil events.

PARTICIPATION IN FIE EVENTS

Fencers from Oceania participated in many international events during 2019, including Asian and Oceania Zonal Championships and World Championships, as well as World Cups, Team World Cups, Grand Prix and other regional events.

REFEREE DEVELOPMENT

The OFC financially supported its referees to attain international accreditation. Three referees attained FIE Accreditation at the FIE Examinations in Bangkok. There are now 13 Referees from Oceania countries with FIE accreditation. Referees from Oceania were invited to officiate at Oceania and Asian Zone Championships in 2019.

SUPPORT FROM FIE

The OFC acknowledges the important financial and administrative support it receives annually from the President, Secretary-General and staff of the FIE. Without this support, many of the OFC development activities would not be possible.

2.15.5 AFRICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

TOURNAMENTS

Cairo, Egypt hosted the 2019 Veteran Fencing World Championships, featuring 593 fencers in their 50s, 60s and 70s-plus from 45 countries from October 5 to 10. USA led the medal count with six golds.

From February 20 to 22, the African Junior Championships took place in Algiers (Algeria) with Egypt taking 10 of the 12 gold medals; 113 fencers participated from 11 nations. The African Senior Championships were held in Bamako, Mali from June 21 to 25. Egypt and Tunisia shared the gold-medal lead with five each of 12, with 168 athletes from 21 countries fencing.

The 2019 African Games were held in Rabat, Morocco from August 19 to 31. In total, 98 fencers competed from 14 countries, with Egypt earning eight of the 12 gold medals, followed by Tunisia with three.

PROGRAMS

After a decision by the FIE Executive Committee in 2018, two academies for coaches were established for the African continent. Both programs last nearly a year and include training in three weapons. Algiers, Algeria hosted one of the academies, from January 20 to December 2 with 14 coach students from seven nations and the other was held in Johannesburg, South Africa from February 1 to November 30 with nine students from five countries.
