OBITUARY

The International Fencing Federation has been affected by the loss of several friends and it is with deep sadness that the FIE has learned of the passing of:

Chaba M. PALLAGHY (USA) 1933 - 2021

Mr. Pallaghy, aged 88, is a member of the FIE Hall of Fame and served as an FIE Executive Committee member from 1981 to 1992, and as FIE vice president from 1993 to 1996. He was also president of the FIE Refereeing Commission from 1992 to 1996 and an international "A"-rated referee in three weapons.

A native of Hungary, Mr. Pallaghy emigrated to the United States in 1957, becoming one of the top sabre fencers in the country. At the 1963 Pan American Games, he won the bronze medal in men's sabre and was a member of the gold-winning U.S. men's sabre team. After retiring from competition due to an injury, he refereed and served on the directoire technique at multiple Olympic Games from 1972 to 1996. He was vice president of the Amateur Fencers League of America (AFLA, which is now USA Fencing) from 1972 to 1976.

Mr. Pallaghy worked tirelessly to develop referees around the world, helping to provide opportunities for them at national and international competitions. In particular, his dedicated and significant efforts were instrumental in promoting and increasing the number of women as referees at international events. Over several generations there have been numerous accounts of Mr. Pallaghy inspiring and mentoring fencing athletes, coaches, referees, and administrators. In 2003, Mr. Pallaghy was recognized for his achievements by USA Fencing with the Jack Baker Award for Service to USA Fencing.

Jean Claude BLONDEAU (MH, FRA) 1934 - 2021

FIE Member of Honour (2007) and FIE Hall of Fame member (2014). Born on June 15, 1934, in Rueil-Malmaison, France, he served as a member of the FIE Executive Committee (1996-2004), as FIE Secretary-Treasurer (1996-2000) and on the FIE Scale of Votes Commission (1988-1996). He participated actively in the 2018 FIE Congress in Paris and the FIE 105th Anniversary at the Grand Palais.

Mr. Blondeau's academic background included a degree in management from the Business School of Paris before working in various financial services positions including being chief accountant and financial director for Bull SA, a group of French companies specialized in computer science.

Jean-Claude Blondeau was a lifelong member of the world fencing family with a deep passion for the sport. He took part in the Military World Championships and was a recipient of the French Gold Medal of Youth and Sport decoration. He was the French Fencing Federation (FFE) Deputy Secretary-General from 1981 to 1984 and FFE Vice-President from 1984 to 1996. He was licensed in the FFE since 1947, a fencing club president from 1971 to 1979 and president of the Versailles Fencing League from 1981 to 2004. He was a founding member of the Île-de-France Ouest Fencing League in 1977, and then became its honorary president.

Jean-Claude Blondeau devoted himself selflessly to fencing and to the FIE, inspired by the purest sporting spirit and his willingness to contribute to the development of his beloved sport and community.

Keith SMITH (GBR) 1962 - 2021

Keith Smith (MBE), aged 58, was a former member of the FIE Refereeing Commission and FIE referee.

Keith Smith led a dedicated career in fencing, playing numerous roles over many years.

He was a member of the FIE refereeing Commission from 2004 to 2012, and served as an examiner in 2005 and 2006, an FIE refereeing delegate at the 2008 and 2012 Olympic Games, Junior & Cadet and Senior World Championships, and several editions of the World University Games African Games, Zonal Championships and Grand Prix events.

As an FIE referee in foil, epee, and sabre, he officiated at the 1992, 1996, 2000 and 2004 Olympic Games, at the World Championships (1990 to 2004) and in multiple additional events.

He was Vice-President of the European Fencing Confederation from 2005 to 2009 and a member of its Refereeing Commission.

Keith Smith was President of British Fencing Association from 2000 to 2012, the organizer of the 2009 Belfast Junior & Cadet Fencing World Championships and co-organiser of the 2011 European Championships in Sheffield.

A schoolteacher by profession, Mr. Smith was a teacher and head of the History and Politics Department at the Whitgift School in Surrey since the 1980s.

Celso L. DAYRIT (MH, PHI) 1951-2021

Occurred on April 28, 2021, following complications related to Covid-19.

Born on December 19, 1951, in Manila, Philippines, Celso L. Dayrit was President of the Asian Fencing Confederation since 2004 and Member of the FIE Executive Committee.

In 2008, he was named Member of Honour of the FIE by the Congress and installed into the FIE Hall of Fame in 2014. He was also the Representative of the Executive Committee within the FIE Veterans Council.

Celso Dayrit started fencing at the age of six, coached by his father who was the first fencing Master in the Philippines and the founder of the Philippine Amateur Fencers Association. He practiced all three weapons and was a member of the Philippine national team from 1979 to 1988. He was elected "Fencer of the Year" for Epee in 1984, won numerous competitions, including a bronze medal at the Southeast Asian Games in 1987.

He was Treasurer of the Olympic Committee of the Philippines from 1985 to 1988 before becoming its Vice-President from 1989 to 1992, then its President from 1999 to 2004. He was a member of the Olympic Council of Asia, then its Vice-President from 2003 to 2007, CEO of the Southeast Asian Games Federation from 2002 to 2005, then its President in 2004 and 2005.

He founded the Olympic Academy of the Philippines and the Philippine Association of Olympians. In 1993 he was appointed member of the Philippine Sports Commission and was the founder of the Philippine National Games program.

He gave seminars in several Asian countries and the Philippines and was accredited as the International Course Director of the Olympic Solidarity Itinerant Sports Administration School for sports leaders.

He was Secretary-Treasurer of the Amateur Fencers Association of the Philippines in 1969, then its Vice-President

in 1983 and its President from 1989 to 2008. He was the first Treasurer of the AFC in 1988.

After a Bachelor's in Business Management, a Master's in Business Administration (MBA) and then a Doctorate Degree, Celso Dayrit began his professional career in the banking industry in 1973. A pioneer in the bank card industry, he held various management positions and became Vice-President and General Manager of BPI Credit Corporation.

For his valuable contribution to sport, the Association of National Olympic Committees rewarded him in 2006 with the Olympic Merit Award and in 2007, he was awarded by the Olympic Council of Asia. He also twice received the Leadership Award from the Philippine Sportswriters Association.

Celso Dayrit is the author of "The Olympic Movement in the Philippines" and "Wisdom of the Sword" published in 2003 and 2019 respectively.

David DUSHMAN (RUS) 1923-2021

Aged 98,

Mr. Dushman became the top Soviet fencer in 1951 after his studies in medicine and sport, followed by being appointed coach of the elite Spartak Moscow club. He led the Soviet national team until 1988, with many Olympic and world champions attending his school. His best-known fencer was Valentina Sidorova, who won more than 11 medals. During the 1972 Munich Olympic Games, Dushman's fencers earned two gold, two silver and three bronze medals.

A major in the army during the Second World War, Mr. Dushman was the last living soldier who liberated the Auschwitz concentration camp on January 27, 1945.

Until the age of 94, Mr. Dushman was still coaching actively three times weekly in Munich, where he lived.

During his 2015 meeting with Mr. Bach and Mr. Usmanov, Mr. Dushman said, "My biggest dream and hope for future generations is to live in a world where there is no war. I urge Thomas Bach and the IOC to do everything they can to use sport as a way to spread peace and reconciliation around the world. War is something that should never happen again."

Valentina SIDOROVA (RUS) 1954-2021

Valentina Sidorova passed away on June 9, 2021. She was 1976 Montreal Olympic Games women's team foil champion and FIE Hall of Fame member. She also won the World Championships nine times between 1974 and 1986, seven times in team and two times individually (1977, 1978).

Born May 4, 1954, in Moscow, Ms. Sidorova represented an important era in the evolution of Russian women's foil fencing and was a member of the Soviet women's team for nearly 15 years. At 16, she joined the national team and quickly became its leader, continuing a series of gold medals and traditions of Soviet women's foil who achieved success in world competition in the late 1950s and early 1970s.

Ms. Sidorova was "Honoured Master of Sports of the USSR". As a young fencer, she won the Junior World Championships in individual women's foil in 1973 and 1974. In Senior, she was the first fencer in history to win the World Cup four years in a row (1977 – 1980). In addition to her World Championship and Olympic victories, she was a 1980 Moscow Olympic Games team silver medallist, four-time World Cup winner, six-time champion of the USSR and four-time winner of the USSR Cup. She also took team silver, individual silver, and team bronze medals at three World Championships. At the World University Games, Ms. Sidorova took one individual gold

medal (1973) as well as one gold and two silver medals in team foil (1973-1979).

Of note is her coach, the fencing master David Dushman (RUS), who passed away just a few days before her on June 5 at the age of 98.

Gillian DONALDSON, born SHEEN (GBR) 1929-2021

Gillian Donaldson passed away on July 5 at the age of 92. An Olympic gold medallist in women's foil at the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games, she competed in three Olympics (Helsinki 1952, Melbourne 1956, and Rome 1960). She won a bronze medal in team women's foil at the 1950 Monte Carlo Senior World Championships. In 1949, she won her first of 10 British national championship titles.

Gillian Donaldson began fencing in Great Britain while attending the North Foreland school in Kent as a young girl, winning the 1945 "schoolgirls" title. She won the individual gold medal at the 1951 Summer International University Sports Week in Luxembourg and then a silver medal at the 1954 British Empire and Commonwealth Games in Vancouver, Canada. She went on to victory in the Scandinavian championship in 1957 and won a gold medal in 1958, at the British Empire and Commonwealth Games in Cardiff, Wales. She competed until 1963, winning her final British championship in 1960, the same year she defended her Olympic title in Rome.

She maintained a lifelong love of sports, especially fencing but also tennis, golf, and others, and worked as a referee, volunteer, and coach. She was a YMCA board member in Auburn, NY, and active in community civic and charitable programmes. Her work, *Instructions to Young Fencers*, was published in 1958.

Cesare SALVADORI (MH, ITA) 1941-2021

Occurred on August 8, 2021.

Born in Turin on Sept. 22, 1941, Cesare Salvadori studied at the Polytechnic University of Turin, where he graduated in chemical engineering; he worked for several companies in his field while practicing fencing.

In men's team sabre, he won a gold medal at the Munich 1972 Olympic Games and two Olympic silver medals in Tokyo 1964 and Mexico City 1968.

Mr. Salvadori also earned a silver medal in men's team sabre at the 1965 World Championships and bronze medals at the same event in 1971 and 1973. In 1961, he was the individual men's sabre champion at the "Duisberg Junior World Criterium".

At the World University Games, he won an individual silver medal (1967) as well as gold (1967) and two bronze medals (1963, 1970) in men's team sabre. He was Italian national champion 11 times in individual and team sabre.

Mr. Salvadori was appointed FIE Member of Honour by the Congress in 2007, after having brilliantly and very successfully organised the 2006 Senior World Championships in Turin. He became a member of the FIE Hall of Fame in 2014.

As an administrator, he chaired the Filadelfia Foundation between 2013 and 2017 to reconstruct the Philadelphia, the "Stadium of Grande Torino". He was also the president of the Promotion and Organisation Committees for the 2006 Turin Fencing World Championships and worked as an adviser to the Turin and Padua fencing clubs.

Anthony LEACH (USA) 1959-2021

Occurred on August 14, 2021. Anthony “Buckie” Leach, aged 62, was a USA Fencing Hall of Fame member and national women’s foil coach. He led U.S. women’s foil at the 1996, 2000, 2004, 2016 and 2020 Olympic Games and his athletes took four senior team medals at the Senior World Championships, including a gold in 2018 in Wuxi, China.

Mr. Leach devoted his life to fencing and was the first U.S. coach to produce an American world champion. After beginning the sport at age 12, he became a coach at age 20. He earned his fencing master’s certificate from the American Fencing Academy in 1979.

In 1981, Mr. Leach built the Rochester, New York Fencing Centre producing national, world and Olympic athletes. In 2001, he joined Fencers Club in New York City, where he continued to develop world fencers. In 2016, he also joined the Notre Dame University fencing team staff, coaching its foil team to multiple NCAA U.S. national titles in individual and team events. His students included recent Tokyo 2020 foil medallists Lee Kiefer (individual women’s gold) and Nick Itkin (team men’s bronze).

Over the past 30 years, Mr. Leach coached numerous athletes and the U.S. team, including Iris Zimmermann, who became the first U.S. fencer to win a World Championship title in any weapon with a gold in individual cadet women’s foil in 1995, followed by winning the Junior World Championship title in 1999. Also, in 1999 under Mr. Leach’s coaching, Ms. Zimmermann earned the first-ever Senior World Championship medal (bronze) for a U.S. fencer. In 2011, his student, Nzingha Prescod, won the individual junior women’s foil gold medal at the Junior and Cadet World Championships, and then a bronze medal at the 2015 Senior World Championships.

Hoang Vinh GIANG (VIE) 1946-2021

Occurred in Hanoi on September 11. Prof. Dr Hoang Vinh Giang aged 75, was president of the Vietnam Fencing Federation. He served as vice-chairman of the Vietnam Olympic Committee since 1998 and was secretary-general from 1998-2012, executive board member of the Olympic Council of Asia since 2007, council member of the Southeast Asian Games Federation since 1998 and president of the World Federation of Vietnam Vo-Co-Truyen since 2015.

As an athlete, Prof. Giang was Vietnamese high-jumping champion in the 1960s, maintaining a national record he broke himself while studying in Kyiv in the 1970s.

Prof. Giang brought fencing to Vietnam in 1981 and is credited with helping Vietnam become a strong participant in Southeast Asian and world fencing. He was known as the “Architect of Vietnam’s Sport”. A leader in the Vietnamese Olympic movement, he headed the 22nd Southeast Asian Games (2003) organising board and led organising committees helping Vietnam’s host the 3rd Asian Indoor Games (2009) and 5th Asian Beach Games (2016). He chaired the organising committee for the 31st SEA Games.

In 2006 Prof. Giang was honoured as “Hero of Labour”, the highest award given by Vietnam for achievements in labour.

Viktor PUTYATIN (UKR) 1941-2021

Occurred on November 2. Viktor Putyatin, aged 81, (UKR) was two-time Olympic medallist and five-time World Champion. He was elected to the FIE Hall of Fame in 2013.

As an athlete, Mr. Putyatin won Olympic silver medals in Mexico 1968 and Munich 1972, both in the men's team foil event.

At the 1967 Montreal World Championships, he won individual men's foil. He also took World Championship gold medals as a member of the Russian men's foil team in Paris (1965), Moscow (1966), Havana (1969) and Ankara (1970). His earliest major success was in 1965, winning the silver medal in individual foil and bronze in men's team foil at the Budapest Summer Universiade. Throughout his competitive career, he also won numerous other titles, including 12 "A"-category international tournaments and a World Cup.

In 1967, he was awarded the title "Honoured Master of Sports of the USSR" for his achievements.

Following his athletic career, Mr. Putyatin was a member of the FIE Executive Committee from 1981 to 1984. He also served on the FIE Rules Commissions.

In 1991, he was elected as the first president of the Ukraine Fencing Federation.

Beginning in 1992, he worked as a fencing coach in Italy, training 15 Italian champions before returning to Ukraine in 2006. There, he worked at Sport School Dynamo from 2007 to 2013. He was also part of the Ukraine Fencing Federation's Coaching Council.

Carl VON ESSEN (SWE) 1940-2021

Occurred on November 11, 2021. Carl von Essen born 18th October 1940 in Jönköping; Sweden died.

Carl von Essen was manager and fencer in the team that won gold for Sweden in men's épée at the Olympic Games in Montreal in 1976. As an inspirer and organizer, he played a crucial role in Swedish fencing which enabled the country to assume a leading position in épée in the 1970s.

A skilled and tactical fencer, he was awarded with three individual Swedish Championships during his long career (1967, 1970 and 1978). In team épée he won seven Swedish Championships for his association Djurgårdens IF in Stockholm. The individual breakthrough came with a World Championship bronze individual in Havana in 1969.

In team, Carl von Essen won a total of two World Championship golds (1974, 1975) and four World Championship bronzes (1966, 1969, 1971, 1978). The highlight of his career was of course Olympic gold in team épée in 1976.

Carl von Essen was from 1969 until the 1980s a federal captain for the national fencing team – all the while being an active fencer. In his leadership role, he managed to create a performance-focused environment where strong individualists came together to achieve common goals. After ending his long career, Carl von Essen continued his leadership work on the Swedish Fencing Association's board and was, among other things, responsible for the educational activities.

In his private life, Carl von Essen was educated as Forester. For several years, he was head of the Swedish Hunters' Association's education facility at Öster Malma, which under his leadership was modernized and developed. He was also the principal of the game master training there. In terms of hunting, Carl von Essen was a well-known profile on a national level and was regarded as one of Sweden's foremost authorities in the field.

Jahangir SAFAROV (AZE) 1968-2021

Occurred on November 12. Jahangir Safarov (AZE) was a coach of the Azerbaijan national fencing team as well as a national referee. He was born on March 9, 1968.

Safarov began fencing at age 10. He became a medallist at numerous USSR competitions and participated in World and European Championships and was named a USSR Master of Sports in 1985.

He became a coach of the Azerbaijan national team in 2001, producing several national champions as well as medallists at international and regional competitions, and was the head coach for cadet women's sabre. Safarov's student, Zarifa Huseynova, took the bronze medal in individual cadet women's sabre at the 2021 Cairo Junior and Cadet Fencing World Championships. His son, Javanshir Safarov, whom he also coached, took silver in men's sabre at the Tehran Junior World Cup in December 2013.

Alex ORBAN (USA) 1939-2021

Occurred on December 2. Alex Orban (USA), aged 82, born on August 25, 1939 in Budapest, Hungary, began fencing when he was 14 and was a three-time Olympic sabreur. By age 16 he was the youngest fencer ever to have achieved a first-class ranking in Hungary and labelled the "coming star of the Magyar squads".

Mr. Orban moved to the USA and after serving three years in the U.S. military, he trained and competed in fencing. He became a member of the U.S. Olympic fencing team at the 1968 (Mexico City), 1972 (Munich) and 1976 (Montreal) Olympic Games.

He was U.S. national sabre champion in 1965 and every year from 1969 to 1972, and individual sabre champion at the 1971 Pan American Games in Cali, Colombia. Mr. Orban also won men's team sabre silver medals at the Pan American Games in 1971 and 1975 (Mexico City). He was the first U.S. sabre fencer to win an international "A"-rated event in 1968 in Lodz, Poland.

Mr. Orban was inducted into the USA Fencing Hall of Fame in 1999.

Tony RADEMEYER (RSA) 1946-2021

Born 27/12/46 in Pretoria and died 29/12/21. Mr Rademeyer went to University of Pretoria (known as Tukkies) in 1964 at the age of 17 where he started fencing and was involved in all aspects of the university club, whilst studying towards a Bachelor of Science in Industrial Engineering, and later a Master in Business Administration. Mr Rademeyer was primarily a foilist, but his name is on many old South African fencing trophies, including the Master at Arms, for best all-round finish at the National Championships. Mr Rademeyer was awarded his national colours in 1977 and again in 1978 when he was part of one of the first South African multi-racial teams in any sport to compete outside of South Africa.

Mr Rademeyer worked in the tool industry and later started his own successful businesses which he ran until his death.

Later when Mr Rademeyer stepped back from competitive fencing he served on his provincial executive (Gauteng province) first as Secretary, then as Treasurer and later as Chairman. Mr Rademeyer was the Head of the LOC for the Epee World Cup held in Johannesburg in 2015. Mr Rademeyer was appointed Chair of the FFSA Competition commission in 2016 until 2020. Mr Rademeyer was elected unopposed to the FFSA Executive Committee as Treasurer in 2017 and was re-elected in 2021 where he served until his death.

As Treasurer, Mr Rademeyer ensured that the financials were well kept and put substantial volunteer hours into the sport. He personally administered the South African development fencer programme which focuses on introducing and funding previously disadvantaged persons to the sport.

Ali Youssef HUSSAIN (KUW) 1938-2021

Occurred on December 26, 2021. Born in 1938, Ali Youssef Hussain (KUW) was FIE Member of Honour and member of the Hall of Fame.

Mr. Hussain was a member of the FIE Executive Committee (from 2001 to 2008) and was made a Member of Honour by the Congress in 2008. From 1985 to 2004, he was a member of the FIE Propaganda Commission (now named the Promotion, Communication and Marketing Commission).

In 1977, he was elected as a member of the Kuwait Amateur Fencing Association, serving over time as their president for eight years as well as a member of the Board of Directors and Technical Committee, and the organisation's manager of products. Mr. Hussain was a member of the Kuwait National Olympic Committee Board of Directors, serving as its secretary-treasurer from 1994 to 2014.

Involved in several sports from a young age, Mr. Hussain was for many years a member of the Yarmouk Sports Club beginning in 1965, the year it was founded. He was a member of its board of directors for 10 years and served as its secretary-general and president.

Among various educational programmes, Mr. Hussain attended an academic international Olympic course in sports management in 1987. He also studied management and sports science under the supervision of the Arab Sports Federation, which as of 1988 enabled him to pursue his career in sports administration.

The fencing family has lost some very dear friends who dedicated their entire lives to fencing and the development of the sport.

The human, cultural and sporting heritage they leave behind is immense, and we express our deepest gratitude and respect to them.

We express our sincerest condolences to the bereaved families and federations of the deceased.

1.3 — **Antidoping**

Antidoping measures were continued throughout the period and no case of doping occurred in any competitions organized by the FIE.

113 tests during competitions and 186 out-of-competition controls were performed, including 286 urines and 13 blood tests.

1.4 — **Social media, magazines**

1.4.1 **FIE MEDIA REPORT 2021**

During 2021, the FIE developed its digital communication platforms and a complementary web portal dedicated to Olympic qualification. The production of an athlete-focused digital content “On the Road to Tokyo” and the “Tokyo Loves Fencing” promotional campaign generated strong digital engagement.

Additionally, a successful partnership was secured with Eurosport and CNN to promote FIE digital content before and during the Games. ESCRIME XXI, the FIE digital magazine that keeps fans up to date on our news, was published three times during the year.

1.4.2 **WEBSITE AND SOCIAL MEDIA**

Although events were limited around the world due to the pandemic, the FIE continued to manage four social media platforms every day, including Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and YouTube and it grew as a result of the Tokyo Olympics.

The FIE developed a series of digital features through 2021 in preparation of the “Road to Tokyo 2020”, including 40 short video interviews with qualified athletes from all continents, which featured playful insights of their personalities and 42 videos presenting each qualified country and their athletes with Japanese “manga” style. Our promotional collaboration with Eurosport benefited 124,7 million contacts from advertising activation, 32,8 million impressions home page banner and 12,1 million reaches in nine ‘my Olympic journey’ videos with athletes.

During the Tokyo Olympics, FIE Facebook account received 25,3 million impressions – 21,1 million reach and 1,9 million engagements. Instagram account received 11,8 million impressions and 1,9 million reaches. Respectively, Twitter account reached 2,54 million tweet impressions.

FIE Facebook and Instagram were found, by Nielsen Analytics, the most active accounts during the Games period.

The on-line content of the Fencing channel on YouTube obtained 3,8 million views in 2021. Despite the global situation and the significant impact on video content and video streaming, the number of YouTube subscribers increased by 18% +10.5k reaching 74,958 subscriptions.

FIE website reached 6 million page views from its visitors; it was visited by 1,1 million new users and received 2 million sessions in total in 2021.

The commitment and interaction between athletes and the public on social media have been significant. A series of digital features, such as winner interviews, event news, “Behind the Mask” videos, educational programs, World Fencing Day, and athletic-centric unique stories have been part of the continuous content plan on the FIE channels. Athletes and fencing event’s organizers have used the FIE platforms as a showcase during World

Cups and Grands Prix and have shared their personal viewpoints with the public online.

1.4.3 Television - Grand Prix Events in 2021

The Grand Prix Events in 2021 took place in Qatar (March 26-28) - the takers were Olympic Channel, Match TV, Alkass TV (Qatar), Orleans (Nov.11-13) - the takers were Olympic Channel and French TV. For all GP Events the News and Highlights were sent to Eurovision for distribution.

TV Facts and Figures for the Tokyo Olympic Games 2021:

In total, the Olympic fencing competitions in Tokyo reached a broadcast time of over 514 hours. 82 channels in 15 markets worldwide showed coverage of the competitions, with the two streaming channels 'Olympic Channel' and 'Olympic Channel 2' accounting for by far the largest share (40% combined). The share of actual playing time of the total broadcast time is 82% across all programs. In addition to the IOC's two official streaming channels, the Russian channel Match! Strana in particular showed extensive live coverage of the event. During the monitoring period, a total cumulative audience of 1.2 billion was achieved. China (28%) accounted for the largest share, followed by Russia (22%) and Italy (17%). Altogether, the Olympic fencing competitions generated almost 20.5 billion event impressions. Approximately 43% of the total event impressions are attributable to broadcasts in South Korea and Russia.

1.4.4 Fencing Digital Magazine - ESCRIME XXI:

The magazine aims to reach out to a large global population and to increase fencing awareness, but also to spread a positive image for our sport. Based on our metrics, the most popular regions interested in the magazine are the United States, France, Russia and the United Kingdom. 3 editions were published.

1.7 World Fencing Day (WFD)

World Fencing Day, which has a fixed day since its inception, takes place every year on the second Saturday of September. In 2021, therefore, WFD was held on Saturday 11 September, and celebrated all the people of fencing who form the essence of our sport. The “Fencing Nation” includes everyone, regardless of their role: volunteer, supporter, athlete, parent, appointed or elected official, administrator, official, coach or referee. Everyone is important.

Every individual or group who gives to fencing is appreciated and valued, and is an ambassador for the sport, representing and conveying a positive message about fencing to the world.

Each “citizen” of the Nation of Fencing can claim our sport as part of their personal identity, as a “nationality” and as a banner.

“We are Fencing” reflects how inclusive and global our sport is, without barriers or borders, and the last year has been a testament to the tremendous unification and friendship of world fencing.

World Fencing Day 2021 also represents a new era of Olympic fencing, with a full complement of 12 gold-medal events for the first time in history. The newest Olympic champions have had the opportunity to share their experiences with newcomers and celebrate the Nation of Fencing’s global reach as a fun, spirited and compelling sport for all people.

The call-to-action to be active on fencing day was the following:

No matter where you live, whatever weapon you favour, whoever you are, you are part of fencing.

1.8 — Webinars for Africa's Federations Administrators

A webinar for the administrators of the National Federations was held on the Zoom platform on 15 and 16 February (respectively for the French and English-speaking federations).

Some features of the FIE website, such as those related to licences, competition entries and payments, were explored.

A total of 36 national administrators and 19 countries participated in the online session.

2.2 — Oceania Fencing Master Academy (OFMA)

Coaching Commission

The Commission met monthly via Zoom technology during 2021 with various projects being undertaken:

- OFMA Coaching Courses were mapped against the FIE Coaching Academy Course in South Africa and documentation has been forwarded to the President of the FIE Coaches Council.
- Continued development of the OFMA Coach Assessor Training Course.

OFMA Coach Education

- Due to Covid-19 restrictions the Regional Development Officer has been unable to travel in the zone to conduct coach education, assessments, and accreditation.
- Presentation of a 16-part Level 1 Foil Coaching Webinar Course. There were 17 participants (6 female, 11 male) who successfully completed the course.
- Presentation of a 12-part Beginner Foil and Epee Refereeing Webinar Course. 34 participants (11 female, 23 male) successfully completed the course.
- The FIE provided the OFC with a participation certificate template & all participants received a personalised electronic copy of it.
- The above-mentioned Refereeing and Coaching Webinars, funded by the FIE, enabled OFMA to reach out to member federations and coaches during this time of extensive travel restrictions.
- With the increase in vaccination rates and an easing of travel restrictions, a return to face-to-face education and training is being planned for 2022.

2.3 — Training Academy for coaches in Africa: Johannesburg (RSA)

The FIE Academy SA mission is ensuring the training of coaches and to provide successful students with two degrees:

- HIGHER CERTIFICATE IN COACHING SCIENCE, Level 5 Qualification registered on the Higher Education Qualification Sub Framework. This qualification is internationally recognized through the REPSSA individual registration and provides the ability for employment as a coach, physical education teacher, personal trainer etc.

- FIE COACHING DIPLOMA.

The class of 2021 took the Fencing Academy exams in a specific cycle to adapt to the different weapons. The first exam took place on 5 November (general warm-up, special warm-up, footwork, pair exercises, etc.), then on 12, 19 and 21 November.

Course duration: 1st February – 30th November 2021.

The courses program was prepared and organized in all three weapons by:

- Dr Gennady Tyshler (Ph.D. in Pedagogy and Ph.D. in Sport Science, Moscow University), Lecturer for all three weapons.
- Dr Mikhail Galukhin (Ph.D. in Sport Science, Moscow University), Visiting Lecturer.
- Dr Alek Movshovitch, Professor of the Russian University of Physical Education, External Consultant for the Academy Program.

2.5 — Equipment aid

The criteria used to perform the analysis and allocate the equipment were as follows:

- Specific requirements: organisation in FIE competitions or competitions other than the FIE ones.
- Federations in need of equipment for organizing important competitions (Olympic Games, World Championships, Grand Prix, World Cups, Continental Championships, Regional Games, Universiades).
- Special cases.

The amount allocated for material aid in 2021 was CHF 556,000. The FIE awarded equipment to be received by 100 federations: 25 in Europe, 27 in Asia and Oceania, 25 in the Americas, 23 in Africa. The federations received equipment worth 5000 CHF or 7000 CHF.

The operations for the equipment distribution started in June 2021.

2.6 — Information on the activity of the International Charity Fund “For the Future of Fencing” in the year 2021

During 2021, the international charity fund “For the Future of Fencing” continued its charitable activities aimed at the development of fencing worldwide, taking into account the expansion of the pandemic of COVID-19, which influenced the international fencing movement and resulted in the cancellation of a majority of international fencing tournaments.

The total amount donated by the international charitable foundation “For the Future of Fencing” to the charitable programmes described below was USD 747,700.

The charitable programs were aimed at support of:

- The Fencing Confederations: European Fencing Confederation, Pan American Fencing Confederation, Central Asian Fencing Confederation, African Fencing Confederation, Oceania Fencing Confederation. The Fund’s donations were purposed to support the statutory activities of the fencing confederations. Performance of their fencing development programs in the corresponding regions of the globe targeted aid to the fencing federations and associations of which the fencing confederations are composed.
- The national fencing federations and associations that have low budgets or financial hardships arising out of the expansion of the COVID-19 pandemic and, namely, the fencing federations/associations of Bangladesh, Oman, Lebanon, Mongolia, Palestine, Nigeria, Ghana, Uganda, Togo, Georgia, Greece, Cyprus, Croatia, Moldova, Estonia, Costa Rica, Honduras, Canada and other countries;
- International fencing events included the elective congresses of the continental fencing confederations (Asian Fencing Confederation, African Fencing Confederation, Pan American Fencing Confederation) and the international conference “Innovative Methods of Fencing Development in Asia and other Continents”.
- The Fund performed more than 50 charitable programs aimed at developing fencing as a popular sport in 55 countries with the total amount of the donations being USD 656,200.

The international charitable fund “For the Future of Fencing” performed its traditional charitable program by awarding medallists of the 2021 Junior and Cadet World Championships in Cairo with a total amount of USD 91,500.

2.7 — Assistance with athletes' participation program

In 2021, for each national federation taking part in the Junior and Cadet Fencing World Championships, the confederations received a subsidy intended to cover expenses (plane ticket and hotel) for one athlete.

2.8 — Assistance for Confederations

All confederations received an annual subsidy and a subsidy for their administrative expenses.

The confederations employing a sport director received an additional subsidy to pay this director's salary.

2.9 — Veterans Fencing Support Endowment

In 2021, the Veterans Fencing Support Endowment established by the international charity fund "For the Future of Fencing" continued its activities supporting all the fencing veterans that requested help, including the fencing veterans from South Africa, Germany, Belarus, Bulgaria, Georgia, Hungary, Kazakhstan, Mexico, Moldova, Russia, Romania, Tajikistan, and Ukraine.

The fund has provided financial assistance in the following situations:

- to cover expenses connected with the medical screening and diagnostics; the treatment of chronic diseases, and also immediate and planned surgeries; the purchase of medicines as part of the provided treatment and post-hospital rehabilitation;
- to national fencing federations to cover expenses related to the purchase of individual insurance policies for veteran fencers.

The Fund also provided social support of fencing veterans who experience hardship in their lives. The total amount of material aid granted by the Fund in 2021 exceeds USD 300,000.

2.10 — Fencing Equipment Repair Course in Togo

The Togolese Fencing Federation hosted a fencing equipment repair course from December 14-18, 2021, with 14 trainees from four fencing leagues in the region. The course, held at the request of Federation President Victor Laméga, was funded by the FIE, which provided equipment and tools and who also sent an expert, Mr Gilles Martinage (FRA), who led the preparation and training.

Theoretical and informational content was provided about electrical scoring systems, technical aspects of weapons operation and current equipment regulations. Topics covered included fault detection, complete weapon repair and assembly, verification of piste installations and proper personal gear verification (e.g., lames, body wires, masks, etc.).

The course overall was interactive and hands-on, focused on developing and practicing technical skills. Daily content addressed the individual interests, skills and expectations of the trainees and focused on ensuring they developed the ability to consistently reproduce the techniques they learned. Practical exercises took place using the equipment provided by the FIE: 12 basic repair kits, three armourer cases and a special kit for repairing cable spools. The focus of these exercises was to effectively recondition competition weapons, standardizing body wires, spool repair, managing piste cables and repairing/managing scoring apparatus and associated remote controls. Trainees learned to test all equipment, test, and detect faults and determine proper and necessary repairs and apply the repairs, including soldering, bonding wires to blades and restoring metallic threads for proper conductivity.

The results of the course included trainees being able to effectively assess and repair virtually all FIE competition weapons, test and repair body cords and cable spools, repair remotes for scoring systems and craft cables designed to connect cable spools to weapons.

2.11.1.2 EFC REFEREES MASTER LIST - 2021

Creation of the EFC Master List is useful in the process of selecting referees for European Championships. Based on our experience from last years and the fencing global tendency, the EFC Executive Committee decided that EFC Master List should be updated every year. In last season, the EFC Executive Committee selected 64 referees to the Master List.

2.11.1.4 CREATION OF THE EFC ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

In 2021 the EFC Executive Committee established a new regulation in the EFC which is **EFC Administrative Rules**. The main motivation was to gather and integrate all decisions, processes, and regulations currently in force at the EFC, which until now have been embedded in separate documents.

2.11.1.5 CREATION OF THE NEW BIDDING PROCESS

The EFC encourages Member Federations to organise high quality events. To streamline the bidding process and to bring the bidding process to a higher standard, the EFC has developed the EFC Bidding Guide. This document is a guide that aims to provide Member Federations and Local Organisers with the framework for bidding while the present Handbook is aimed at assisting a Member Federation and LOC to organise EFC events.

2.11.1.6 SPECIAL ASSISTANCE FUND

Due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, President of the EFC Stanislav Pozdnyakov allocated additional funds in amount of 90 000 EUR. This support was aimed to minimize losses related to the consequences of the global pandemic. In practice, each fully paid member of the EFC has a deposit with the EFC bank for the amount of 2 000 EUR that can be used as:

- a deposit to pay the EFC membership fee for next year.
- a deposit to pay for EFC licenses for the next season.
- a deposit to pay for the 2021 European Championships entry fees.
- source to refund the purchase of equipment for fencers.

2.11.1.7 ORDINARY AND ELECTIVE CONGRESS

On 11 September, in Sochi (RUS) Ordinary and Elective Congresses were held. During the Elective Congress, Stanislav Pozdnyakov was unanimously re-elected as President.

2.11.2 ASIAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

The year 2021 brought sadness to the FCA for the loss of FCA great leader Mr. Celso L. Dayrit. The Asian Fencing Community, with new hopes and new leadership that will stretch the Asian Fencing family to an optimistic future, continues its work. In framework of the preparation to the Olympic Games 2020, but with limited activities due to the current pandemic situation all over the world, were organized:

2.11.2.1 FCA REFEREEING WEBINAR

1st session October 23-25 and October 30-November 1, 2020

2nd session December 4-6 and December 11-13, 2020

The 1st session of the FCA Refereeing Webinar led by Dr Eyyad Maghayreh (JOR) with the help of Mr. Medhat El Bakry (EGY) and Mr. Madr Vilem (CZE) attended by 18 Asian and Oceania countries.

The 2nd session of the FCA Refereeing Webinar led also by Dr Eyyad Maghayreh (JOR) with the help of Mr. Kim Chang Gon (KOR) and Mr. Katsumi Yamaguchi (JPN) attended by 17 Asian and Oceania countries.

2.11.2.2 FIE COMPETITIONS IN ASIA

Fencing Confederation of Asia actively wants to increase the amount of the FIE Competitions in Asia. In 2021 in Asia Region were organized following competitions:

Senior Foil Grand Prix in Doha (QAT)– March 26-28, 2021

For the most part of 2021, like the Zonal Championships that was supposed to be held in Korea last June, the FIE suggested to postpone after the Olympics, however, after consultation with the FCA Executive Board Members, we have decided the best decision is to cancel the competition.

In Tashkent (UZB) were successfully organized 5 International competitions:

Satellite for individual men& women’s foil - September 25-26, 2021

Junior’s Sabre Women World Cup Tashkent, 20-21 November 2021

3 Men’s World Cups for sabre, foil, and epee – 9-13 December 2021.

2.11.2.3 OLYMPIC GAMES STATISTICS

Tokyo (JPN)

Venue: Makuhari Messe July 24 to August 1, 2021

The 4 Asian powerhouses again delivered in the recently concluded Summer Olympic Games in Tokyo, Japan. The Korean Team ranked number 3 in the over-all standing, while China, Hong Kong and Japan all tied in the 7th place. The race continues for the Asian Countries to prosper in the next Summer Olympic Games that will be held in Paris.

2.11.2.4 CONFERENCES AND SEMINARS IN ASIA REGION

In framework of development and promotion fencing in Asia, were organized following events:

Tashkent (UZB), September 5, 2021

The Central Asian Fencing Confederation organized an International Conference themed 'Innovative Methods for Development of Fencing in Asia and Other Continents', which was held in Tashkent, Uzbekistan. The conference was attended by participants from Asia, Africa, and Pan-American countries. Various presentations and discussions were held to propose ideas on how to implement technological advancement in fencing to enhance the current system. The conference concluded with the three confederations (Asia, Africa, and Pan-America) mutually signing an agreement to help and support one another for the development of fencing.

2.11.2.5 FCA ELECTION ASSEMBLY IN TASHKENT

Tashkent (UZB), October 9, 2021

Election General Assembly of the Asian Fencing Confederation was held in Tashkent with the support of the International Foundation for the Future of Fencing and with the organizational assistance of the Central Asian Fencing Confederation.

This Assembly was attended by more than 53 people from 39 countries of the Asian region with the invitation of the Presidents of the Fencing Confederations of Africa, Pan-America.

At this General Assembly, reports on the work of the Asia Fencing Confederation were heard. Then elections were held for the President, the Executive Committee, and members of the FCA Commissions. National fencing federations that were unable to attend physically were given the opportunity to participate and vote via ZOOM. The General Assembly was a success. The new President of the Asian Fencing Confederation, Engr. Sheikh Salem Bin Sultan Al Qasimi, was elected. And also new Vice Presidents, Secretary General, and other members of the Executive Committee and commissions were elected.

2.11.2.6 NEW REFEREES IN ASIA WITH INTERNATIONAL CATEGORY

Tashkent (UZB) October 14-19, 2021

The FCA has been working very actively to increase the representation of referees of the international category at International Competitions.

On October 14-19, 2021, in Tashkent was held an international exam for the Asian region for three types of weapons:

The international category B in foil, epee and sabre was confirmed by 9 representatives from Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Cambodia, Jordan, UAE, Kazakhstan, and Uzbekistan.

2.11.2.7 FIE CONGRESS

November 27, 2021. Lausanne (SUI)

As part of the 2021 Elective Congress, delegates elected members of the FIE Executive Committee and various FIE Commissions until 2024.

It is very important to note that representatives of the National Federations of the Asian continent were elected to the Executive Committee and to the FIE Commissions and Councils.

The Executive Committee is currently represented by 4 representatives of Asia.

2.11.3 PAN AMERICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

In 2021, the Pan American Fencing Confederation continued holding online virtual events to keep up activity among the fencing community, given the cancellation of the Zonal Championships:

2.11.3.1 ONLINE PAN AMERICAN JUNIOR AND CADET CUPS

Foil: 20 and 21 February 2021

Épée: 13 and 14 March 2021

Sabre: 3 and 4 July 2021

Athletes were assessed by a panel who rated their technique and movements. The winners were given awards by the event sponsor. The competition welcomed junior and cadet athletes from the 33 federations affiliated to the Pan American Fencing Confederation.

2.11.3.2 SPECIALIST ONLINE REFEREEING SEMINAR

This was held in English and Spanish, with federations attending in groups. The Spanish version was run by FIE referee Juan Carlos Rios Rivera (MEX) and the English version by Irina Knysch (RSA), an FIE Refereeing Commission member, and Alexey Kuznetsov (CAN), FIE referee.

These events were held on different dates throughout the year to ensure that the national referees and any referees hoping to take the international exam could keep their refereeing knowledge up to date.

2.11.3.3 JUNIOR PAN AMERICAN GAMES CALI 2021

From 1 to 6 December 2021, the first Junior Pan American Games were held in Cali (COL). 96 junior competitors from all over the continent came to Cali for this competition promoted by Panam Sports, in which the winners of each discipline gained direct entry into the 2023 Pan American Games in Santiago (CHI).

2.11.3.4 2021 ELECTIVE CONGRESS

The Pan American Fencing Confederation held its elective congress virtually on 9 October 2021, electing authorities for the 2021-2024 period. Mr Vitaly Logvin was unanimously re-elected by the participating affiliated federations.

2.11.4 OCEANIA FENCING CONFEDERATION

2.11.4.1 DEVELOPING NEW FEDERATIONS IN THE PACIFIC

The OFC currently has six full members (American Samoa, Australia, Guam, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, and Samoa) and two Associate Members (Tahiti and New Caledonia).

The OFC was approached by a female coach currently living in Saipan, the largest island of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), asking for assistance to start up fencing.

The President of the Guam Fencing Federation, the OFC Regional Development Officer & the OFC President had a Zoom meeting with the coach and planning has started to begin fencing activities when pandemic restrictions allow.

2.11.4.2 DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES AFTER THE ARRIVAL OF COVID-19

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the Regional Development Officer was not able to travel to carry out his usual activities face to face with member federations. As happened after April in 2020, the OFC had to adapt its mode of delivery to online activities.

- The OFC Annual General Meeting (April) and four OFC Board meetings (February, May, September, and November) were held on Zoom.
- OFC Administration was carried out on Skype, with the OFC President & Regional Development Officer meeting nineteen times.
- The OFC Coaching Commission met online twelve times using Zoom.
- In December 2020, the OFC received a grant from the FIE to develop and run OFC Refereeing Webinars and OFC Coaching Webinars.
- A 16-part Level 1 Foil Coaching Webinar Course was delivered. There were 17 participants (6 female, 11 male) who successfully completed the course.
- A 12-part Beginner Foil and Epee Refereeing Webinar Course was delivered. There were 34 participants (11 female, 23 male) who successfully completed the course.
- The FIE provided the OFC with a participation certificate template & all participants received a personalised electronic copy of it.
- With the increase in vaccination rates and an easing of travel restrictions, a return to face-to-face education and training is being planned for 2022.

2.11.4.3 PARTICIPATION IN FIE EVENTS INCLUDING THE ASIA-OCEANIA OLYMPIC QUALIFICATION TOURNAMENT

Fencers from Oceania were not able to participate in most international events in 2021, as international travel was generally not possible.

No-one from Oceania was able to participate in the Junior and Cadet World Championships in Cairo, Egypt in April.

The Asia/Oceania Olympic Qualification Tournament was held in Tashkent (UZB) from 25 to 26 April. Funds requested by the OFC were received from the FIE President's International Charity Fund for the Future of Fencing which enabled seven Oceania athletes (6 AUS, 1 NZL) to participate in the tournament. Travel to the tournament from Oceania was extremely long and the airfares were very expensive. Unfortunately, none of our athletes was successful in winning their event & therefore, Oceania was sadly not represented at the Olympic Games in Tokyo. The OFC President felt privileged and honoured to attend the Fencing events at Tokyo 2020 in July/early August as a member of the FIE Executive Committee. The Japanese organisers & volunteers did a wonderful

job, supported by the FIE & the international technical officials. The venue was excellent & the standard of the performances exceptionally high. It was inspiring to see how happy the athletes were to be participating in the Games, after waiting for an extra year.

2.11.4.4 PARTICIPATION IN THE FIE CONGRESS

The FIE Elective Congress was held in Lausanne on 27 November. With the help of a travel subsidy from the FIE, all Oceania federations were represented either by a Delegate or Proxy at the Congress

2.11.4.5 SUPPORT FROM FIE

The OFC acknowledges the important financial and administrative support it receives annually from the President, Secretary General and staff of the FIE. The OFC has greatly appreciated the additional support received during the COVID crisis. Without this support, many of the OFC development activities would not be possible.

2.11.5 AFRICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

2.11.5.1 TOURNAMENTS

- 3 to 11 of April 2021: Egyptian Fencing Federation organised Junior and Cadet World Championships.
- 23 of April 2021: Egyptian Fencing Federation organised Zonal (African) Qualifying Event.
- 24 of July to 1 of August 2021: Olympic Games: 5 teams from Africa participated (ME, MF, MS, WF & WS). All team fencers participated in individual competitions with additional (WE) fencer from Senegal.

2.11.5.2 ACTIVITIES

- September 2021: the CAE President participated in the meeting of three confederations (Asia, Africa & Pan America) in Tashkent (UZB).
- 27 September 2021: the CAE Elective Congress was organised in Dakar (SEN).
- 26 November 2021: the CAE Extraordinary Congress was organised in Lausanne (SUI) and new CAE Constitution was approved.
- 27 November 2021: African National Federations participated in the FIE Elective Congress.

2.11.5.3 WEBINARS

A webinar for the administrators of the National Federations was organised by the FIE via Zoom on 15 and 16 February (respectively for the French and English-speaking federations).

Some features of the FIE website, such as those related to licences, competition entries and payments, were explored.

A total of 36 national administrators and 19 countries participated in the online session.
