

# Athletes' Commission Report <br> Proposals for the 2022 Congress <br> Modifications of the Rules 

The texts below are applicable on January 1st, 2023, unless mentioned otherwise.

## Article: 0.67

## P. 6

## Proposal from: Rules Commission

Motivation: Experience has highlighted the problems when you end up with pools of 6 and the absence of fencers on call. In order to ensure the fairness of the pools, the Rules Commission proposes the following text:

### 0.67

1. In all competitions for which the formula includes a round of pools, these pools consist of 7 fencers if the number of participants is divisible by 7 . Otherwise, the pools are of 7 and 6 . In no case may the pools be of fewer than 6 fencers.

If, however, as the result of the absence of one or more fencers, one or more pools were to be reduced to 5 or fewer fencers, the DT organisers must add to these pools one or more fencers from other pools of 7 fencers in the same round of pools, taking into account the initial ranking of the fencer(s) being replaced.

Depending on the number of participants, the pool round may take place over several rounds.
The DT must then provide for each pool round, pools of 7 and 6 (if applicable) in order to balance one or more pools in the event of fencers absent at roll call in pools of 6 .

## Proposal from: Rules Commission

Motivation: Supplementing o.108.1 c). The cancellation of many competitions during the 2020/2021 season has caused points allocation problems.

c) For both Senior and Junior rankings, the ranking is rolling.

FIE Athletes' Commission

The first Grand Prix event of the current year cancels out the first Grand Prix event of the previous year and so forth for the remainder of the Grand Prix events.

The first World Cup individual event of the current year cancels out the first World Cup individual event of the previous year and so forth for the remainder of the World Cup events in the season.

The first satellite competition of the current year cancels out the first satellite competition of the previous year and so forth for the other satellite competitions.

The points allocated for a competition cancel out the points attributed to the corresponding competition in the previous season.

If a competition does not take place in the current season, the points obtained at the same competition in the previous season are deleted on the anniversary of the competition.

The competitions are numbered in order of the dates provided in the calendar and by competition category (World Cup, Grand Prix or Satellite events).

The points awarded in event 1 of the current season replace the points awarded in event 1 of the previous season and so on.

If an event is cancelled during the current season, the points acquired during the corresponding event of the previous season will be deleted on the date assigned to this event in the calendar of the current season.

Proposal from: Tunisia, Morocco, Egypt, Senegal, Algeria,

Motivation: The continental competition (zone championship) is the 2nd most important competition after the world championships it is a great continental gathering very important for the fencers it allows to improve their FIE ranking, to have more chance to qualify to the Olympics, unfortunately by reducing the coefficient of the zone championship and make it at the level of a world cup has limited the chances to qualify to the Olympics for America, Asia, Oceania and Africa to the detriment of other continents which organize more than $75 \%$ of the competitions.

For all these reasons we propose to return to 1,5 coefficient of zone championship.

## Unwillingness to fight (Non-combativity)

There is unwillingness to fight when there is one minute of fencing without a hit or without a hit scored off the target.

When one or both fencers make clear theirln the event of unwillingness to fight, the Referee will immediately call 'Halt!' as a decision of "fact" (cf.t.136.2).

## 1 Individual events - Direct elimination

P-yellow cards and P-red Cards are awarded to each fencer separately to both fencers simultaneously, starting with a P-Yellow card, followed by a P-Red cards.and finally by a The P-Black card is awarded as described in 1c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one-or-both fencers with a P-yellow card.-as follows:
a) If the fencers are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-yellow card.
b) If the fencers are not equal: the Referee sanctions the fencer who has the lower score with a P-yollow card.
b) When, for the second and third-times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or-both fencers with a P-red card.-as follows:

If the fencers are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-red card. If the fencers are not equal: the Referee sanctions the fencer who has the lower score with a P-rod card.
c) When, for from the fourth third time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-black card is awarded as follows: ene or both fencers who have already received two P-red cards, receive a P-black card
ie) If the scores of the two fencers receive P-Black cards simultaneously and their scores-are equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. Tthe fencer with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the bout.
iif) If the scores of the two fencers receive-P-Black cards simultaneously, and their scores-are not equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower score with a P-Black card. The fencer with the higher score wins the bout.

## 2 Team events

P-Yellow,-and P-Red cards are awarded to the two each teams separately-simultaneously, starting with a PYellow card and followed by twoa P-Red cards. The P-Black card is awarded to the fencer. as described in 2c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or both teams with a P-yellow card. as follows:
a) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a $P$-yellow card.
b) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a P-yellow card.
b) When, for the second and third times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or both teams with a P-red card. as follows:
c) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a P-red card.
d) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team which has the lower score with a P-red card.
c) When, forfrom the fourththird time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-Black card is awarded as follows:a $P$-black card is given to the fencer on the piste of either or both teams which have already received two P-red cards.
i) If the scores for the two teams are equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. The team with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
ii) If the scores for the two teams are not equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a PBlack card. The team with the higher score wins the match.
e) A team in which a fencer has received a P-black card may use their reserve fencer, if they have one and if the replacement has not already been made previously for tactical of medical reasons. If a replacement is made following receipt of a P-black card, no further replacement may be made, even for medical reasons-

If no replacement can be made following receipt of a $P$-black card (because there is ne reserve fencer or because the reserve fencer has already been used previously), the team in which a fencer has been sanctioned by a P-black card loses the match.

Following the replacement of a fencer after the awarding of a P-Black card, the relay in question continues. Any further occurrence of unwillingness to fight results in a further P-Black card and the team in question loses the match.
f)-If a $P$ Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously and neither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are equal, the team with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
9) If a P-Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously and neither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are not equal, the team with the higher score wins the match.

## 3 In both individual and team competitions

In case of unwillingness to fight, it is up to the referee to call "Halt" as a decision of fact (cf. t.136.2).
a) The P-yellow (warning), P-red (penalty hit) and P-black (the possible losing of a bout or match) cards received during any one bout or match (during all 9 relays) are valid only for that bout or match. They are not transferable to the following bout or match.

No P-card (yellow, red or black) may be awarded in individual competitions at 14-14 or in team matches at 44-44.
b) In both individual and team competitions, fencers and teams who have lost the bout/match following the award of a P-Black card, will be ranked in the final results of the competition as having lost the bout/match. They receive the corresponding points.
c) In both individual and team competitions, the period/relay continues after the awarding of a PYellow or a P-Red card.
d) The minute starts again after each hit, each hit off the target, each hit annulled, each penalty hit and at the beginning of each period or relay.
e) The referee must record these P-yellow, P-red and P-black cards separately on the score sheet. The sanctions awarded for unwillingness to fight are not cumulative with any other sanction awarded.

f) In both individual and team competitions, if, at the end of the regulation time, there is equality of scores, article t .124 does not apply and articles t .40 .3 and t .41 .5 will apply.

## Modifications of the Statutes

## Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

## Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.

## Article 4.2.1

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluently and it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.

Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation.

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics Committee.

A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.

A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## I. Session plénière avec la FIE / Plenary session with the FIE

Le Comité d'Ethique a été connecté à la session plénière de la FIE et a entendu le mot de bienvenue $d u$ Président ad interim, $M$. Emmanuel KATSIADAKIS.

The Ethics Committee was connected to the FIE plenary session and was welcomed by the President ad interim, Mr. Emmanuel KATSIADAKIS

## II. Session Comité d'Ethique / Session Ethics Committee

1. Introduction et retour sur la séance du 22 janvier 2022 / Introduction and review of the meeting of 22 January 2022

2. Discussions en vue de l'organisation d'un séminaire/workshop sur l'éthique par comparaison avec d'autres fédérations / Discussions for the organisation of a seminar/workshop on ethics in comparison with other federations

## a. Séminaire/workshop en principe à Lausanne et pas virtuel / Seminar/workshop in principle in Lausanne and not virtual

Ce point n'est pas abordé de manière détaillée car il dépend de la décision d'organiser ou non un séminaire/workshop.

This point is not discussed in detail as it depends on the decision to organise a seminar/workshop or not.
b. Participation des responsables éthiques d'autres fédérations internationales (ex : FIG, UCI, IWF) Participation of ethics officers from other international federations (e.g. FIG, UCI, IWF)

OC présente l'idée d'organiser ce séminaire workshop fin 2022 / début 2023 avec, comme idée, de partager certaines vues sur l'éthique avec les membres de la Commission juridique, du Comité disciplinaire, du COMEX et du Comité d'Ethique.

Des personnes intervenant dans les comités d'Ethique d'autres fédérations internationales pourraient être invitées, comme certaines personnes de la Fédération Internationale de Gymnastique (ci-après FIG) qui a mis en place un concept très original avec la création d'une fondation suisse totalement indépendante de la Fédération internationale et disposant d'un pouvoir de sanction très important.

D'autres fédérations internationales comme la FIFA ont un système avec une chambre d'investigation puis une chambre de jugement.

Tout comme la FIG, le Comité d'Ethique de la FIFA dispose d'un pouvoir de sanction propre.

D'autres fédérations, comme l'Union Cycliste Internationale (ci-après UCI), ont également un système différent.

OC fait toutefois observer que ces fédérations sont d'une autre dimension que la FIE et, pour certaines, ont rencontré des problèmes majeurs sur le plan de l'éthique comme au sein de la FIG ou de la FIFA par exemple, alors que, du côté de l'escrime, la situation est beaucoup plus calme et il n'est peut-être pas nécessaire d'aller vers des systèmes trop complexes.

OC presented the idea of organising this workshop seminar at the end of 2022 / beginning of 2023 with the idea of sharing some views on ethics with the members of the Legal Commission, the Disciplinary Panel, the Executive Committee and the Ethics Committee.

People involved in the Ethics Committees of other international federations could be invited, such as some people from the International Gymnastics Federation (hereafter FIG) which has set up a very original concept with the creation of a Swiss foundation totally independent from the International Federation and with a very important power of sanction.

Other international federations such as FIFA have a system with an investigation chamber and then a judgment chamber.

Like the FIG, the FIFA Ethics Committee has its own power of sanction.

Other federations, such as the International Cycling Union (hereinafter UCI), also have a different system.

OC points out, however, that these federations are of a different size than the FIE and some of them have had major ethical problems, for example in the FIG or FIFA, whereas in fencing the situation is much calmer and there is perhaps no need to go into overly complex systems.

En effet, |'organisation d'un séminaire/ workshop pourrait servir de support au travail futur ou, dans un autre contexte, pourrait être une manière de présenter, une fois rédigé, un nouveau Code de procédure en matière d'éthique à un panel plus large dans le milieu de l'escrime.

De ce fait, cette question de séminaire /workshop est pour l'instant mise en attente.

Nevertheless, there are certainly improvements that can be made to the systems currently provided by the FIE.

After discussion within the Ethics Committee, it was decided that this idea was interesting but that it was perhaps appropriate to wait and see what would be decided and implemented concerning point 3 of the agenda, which was the drafting of a Code of Procedure to guide the Ethics Committee in its operation.

Indeed, the organisation of a seminar/workshop could serve as a support for future work or, in another context, could be a way to present a new Code of Procedure in the context of ethics to a wider panel in the fencing community once it has been drafted.

Therefore, this seminar/workshop issue is on hold for the time being.

3. OC fait observer que, même si le Comité d'Ethique au eu peu de travail, à chaque fois il doit créer ses propres règles pour gérer une situation.

Ces règles touchent à différents niveaux: These rules affect different levels:

- Comment démarrer une procédure et qui doit en être informé ?
- Les 5 membres du Comité d'Ethique doiventils participer à chaque cas ou faut-il sélectionner un panel de 3 membres pour gérer le cas?
- Si une sélection est faite, comment se faitelle ? Selon quelles règles?
- Comment procéder par rapport aux parties concernées : respect du droit d'être entendu, donner la possibilité à chacune des parties de s'exprimer par écrit, quels sont les délais qu'il faut impartir, les délais peuvent-ils être prolongés une fois ou plusieurs fois?
- Chaque partie peut produire des pièces mais peut-elle en produire dans un stade plus avancé de la procédure ou y a-t-il un délai limite à partir duquel plus aucune pièce ne peut être produite ? Ceci pour respecter l'égalité des chances entre les personnes

- Should all 5 members of the Ethics Committee participate in each case or should a panel of 3 members be selected to handle the case?
- If a selection is made, how is it done? According to which rules?
- How to proceed with regard to the parties concerned: respect for the right to be heard, giving each party the opportunity to express itself in writing, what deadlines should be set, can the deadlines be extended once or several times?
- Can each party produce documents, but can they produce them at a later stage of the procedure or is there a time limit after which no more documents can be produced? This is to respect equal opportunities between people
- Is it necessary to hold a hearing in certain cases? If so, how should the hearing be conducted? Can witnesses be heard? Can experts be called in?
- How should a hearing be conducted in an emergency?
- What language should be used?
- Once the case is over, should a report be written to decide whether to refer the case to the Disciplinary Panel or not?
- If the case is referred to the Disciplinary Panel, what form should it take? In other words, can the Ethics Committee write a report with a recommendation for a sanction as a prosecutor would do, or simply write a report and then let the Disciplinary Panel act on its own?

After discussion of all the above-mentioned points, the Ethics Committee is of the opinion that a mandate should be given to an external lawyer, specialised in sports law, to draft a Code of Procedure taking into account all these considerations and taking into account the opinions of the members of the Legal Commission as well as of the Ethics Committee, and even the Disciplinary Panel.

Another way of proceeding would be for the Legal Commission to draft this code.

The Ethics Committee is of the opinion that it is not its role to draft its own rules of operation.

Certains membres de la Commission juridique pensent que ce Code pourrait être rédigé par le Comité d'Ethique lui-même ou par la Commission juridique ou par un groupe de travail issu de ces deux comités et, qu'ensuite, ce travail pourrait être relu et corrigé par un avocat externe.

OC, au nom du Comité d'Ethique, pense qu'il est préférable de confier ce mandat à un avocat externe car il s'agit d'un gros travail et qu'il convient d'avoir un service professionnel pour cela.

Le Comité d'Ethique craint aussi que, si un texte était rédigé par un groupe de travail de la Commission juridique et du Comité d'Ethique pour le faire relire ensuite par un avocat externe, cela aboutisse à des complications car l'avocat externe serait enclin à refaire une partie du travail dans tous les cas de figure.

Il est ainsi préférable de mettre en place un petit groupe de travail composé de 1 ou 2 membres maximum de la Commission juridique, du Comité d'Ethique et, éventuellement du Comité disciplinaire pouvant émettre des idées afin de guider l'avocat externe qui serait mandaté.

Ledit avocat pourrait, au fur et à mesure de son travail, consulter ce groupe afin d'arriver avec un projet abouti qui ne soit pas remis en question par la Commission juridique, le Comité d'Ethique ou le Comité disciplinaire.

A discussion took place regarding the drafting of the Code of Procedure of the Ethics Committee.

Some members of the Legal Commission thought that this Code could be drafted by the Ethics Committee itself or by the Legal Commission or by a working group from these two committees and that this work could then be reviewed and corrected by an external lawyer.

OC, on behalf of the Ethics Committee, thinks that it is better to give this mandate to an external lawyer because it is a big job and it is necessary to have a professional service for this.

The Ethics Committee is also concerned that if a text is drafted by a working group of the Legal Commission and the Ethics Committee and then proofread by an external lawyer, this could lead to complications because the external lawyer would be inclined to redo some of the work in any case.

It is therefore preferable to set up a small working group consisting of no more than one or two members of the Legal Committee, the Ethics Committee and, possibly, the Disciplinary Panel, who could put forward ideas to guide the external lawyer who would be appointed.

The said lawyer could, as he or she worked, consult this group in order to come up with a finished project that would not be called into question by the Legal Committee, the Ethics Committee or the Disciplinary Panel.

Après avoir quitté la session conjointe avec la Commission juridique, le Comité d'Ethique a décidé de faire la proposition suivante au COMEX de la FIE qui se tiendra le 17 juillet 2022 pendant les Championnats du monde au Caire, à savoir:

- Un mandat est confié à un avocat externe pour rédiger ce Code : la proposition est de travailler avec Me Jorge IBARROLA, à Lausanne, spécialiste en droit du sport, qui a déjà travaillé avec la FIE et commence à bien connaître les problématiques de l'escrime.
- Un budget doit être établi préalablement avec cet avocat afin que la FIE puisse prendre des décisions en connaissance de cause.
- Un groupe de travail est mis sur pied en parallèle avec des représentants de la Commission juridique, du Comité d'Ethique, éventuellement du Comité disciplinaire qui sera l'interface pour l'avocat externe au cours de son travail.
- L'objectif est d'avoir un Code de procédure rédigé d'ici à fin 2022, voire avant le congrès qui se tiendra cette année.

Toutefois, I'acceptation de ce Code de procédure ne pourrait se faire sans doute qu'en 2023.

After leaving the joint session with the Legal Commission, the Ethics Committee decided to make the following proposal to the Executive Committee of the FIE to be held on 17 July 2022 during the World Championships in Cairo, namely:

- A mandate is given to an external lawyer to draft this Code: the proposal is to work with Me Jorge IBARROLA, in Lausanne, specialist in sports law, who has already worked with the FIE and is beginning to know the problems of fencing well.
- A budget must be drawn up in advance with this lawyer so that the FIE can make informed decisions.
- A working group is set up in parallel with representatives of the Legal Commission, the Ethics Committee and possibly the Disciplinary Panel, which will be the interface for the external lawyer during his work.
- The aim is to have a Code of Procedure drafted by the end of 2022, or even before the Congress to be held this year.

However, the acceptance of this Code of Procedure could probably only be done in 2023.
b. L'organisation d'un workshop/séminaire sur l'éthique / The organisation of a workshop/seminar on ethics

La Commission juridique n'est pas opposée à participer à l'organisation d'un tel évènement.

Après discussion au sein du Comité d'Ethique, il est toutefois décidé de mettre cette idée entre parenthèses jusqu'à la décision du Comité Exécutif quant à la rédaction du Code de procédure et du mandat qui pourrait être donné à un avocat externe.

En effet, si nous avançons dans cette direction, l'idée du séminaire/workshop pourrait être reprise ultérieurement afin de présenter le nouveau Code de procédure aux acteurs de la FIE.

The Legal Commission was not opposed to participating in the organisation of such an event.

However, after discussion within the Ethics Committee, it was decided to put this idea on hold until the Executive Committee decides on the drafting of the Code of Procedure and the mandate that could be given to an external lawyer.

Indeed, if we move in this direction, the idea of the seminar/workshop could be taken up again at a later date in order to present the new Code of Procedure to the FIE's stakeholders.

## c. Augmentation du nombre de membres du Comité d'Ethique de 5 à 10 / Increase in the number of members of the Ethics Committee from 5 to 10

OC explique que cette augmentation serait prématurée à l'heure actuelle dans la mesure où il convient d'abord de rédiger un Code de procédure.

En effet, s'il y a 10 membres participants au Comité d'Ethique, des règles de procédure devront être fixées pour savoir quels membres interviendront dans un cas dont le Comité d'Ethique sera saisi, comment les choisir, selon quelles règles.

Sur ce point, Sam CHERIS rassure le Comité d'Ethique en expliquant que, si la règle d'augmenter le Comité d'Ethique de 5 à 10 membres était acceptée lors du prochain congrès 2022, elle ne serait applicable qu'à partir du congrès 2024 lorsque les mandats des membres du Comité d'Ethique seront renouvelés.

Cela laisserait ainsi le temps de mettre sur pied le Code de procédure.

Le Comité d'Ethique est ainsi satisfait par cette réponse.

Il ne voit toutefois pas l'utilité de procéder à ce changement en 2022 alors qu'il ne s'appliquerait qu'à partir de 2024 et que la rédaction du Code de procédure pourrait encore apporter une vision différente du nombre de membres à prévoir.

Enfin, il ne semble pas utile d'aligner le nombre de membres sur celui des commissions car il s'agit de deux structures totalement différentes, le Comité d'Ethique ayant un rôle juridictionnel, ce qui n'est pas le cas des commissions.

En conclusion, sans être opposé à cette augmentation du nombre de membres, le Comité d'Ethique est d'avis de reporter cette question au Congrès qui se tiendra à fin 2023.

OC explained that this increase would be premature at this time as a Code of Procedure would first have to be drafted.

Indeed, if there are 10 members participating in the Ethics Committee, rules of procedure will have to be established to know which members will intervene in a case before the Ethics Committee, how to choose them, according to which rules.

On this point, Sam CHERIS reassured the Ethics Committee by explaining that, if the rule to increase the Ethics Committee from 5 to 10 members was accepted at the next 2022 Congress, it would only be applicable from the 2024 Congress when the mandates of the members of the Ethics Committee would be renewed.

This would give time to set up the Code of Procedure.

The Ethics Committee is therefore satisfied with this answer.

However, it does not see the point of making this change in 2022 when it would only apply from 2024 and when the drafting of the Code of Procedure could still provide a different view of the number of members to be provided for.

Finally, it does not seem useful to align the number of members with that of the commissions, as these are two completely different structures, the Ethics Committee having a jurisdictional role, which is not the case with the commissions.

In conclusion, without being opposed to this increase in the number of members, the Ethics Committee is of the opinion that this question should be postponed until the Congress to be held at the end of 2023.
d. Limitation des mandats de président, de membre du COMEX, de membres de Commissions ou de Comité à 3 au maximum, soit 12 ans selon proposition de la Suède/ Limitation of the terms of office of the President, COMEX members, Commission or Committee members to a maximum of 3 , i.e. 12 years as proposed by Sweden

Un échange de vues a lieu à ce sujet dont il ressort, selon le Comité d'Ethique, que la proposition suédoise n'est pas suffisamment précise ni élaborée.

En effet, il n'est pas clair de savoir si cette règle s'appliquera immédiatement et si les années passées par certains membres dans des commissions ou au COMEX vont compter.

L'exemple serait que des membres d'une commission depuis plus de 12 ans ou du COMEX pourraient devoir se retirer si cette règle était appliquée avec effet immédiat.

Sur cette question, la Commission juridique considère que la règle ne pourra s'appliquer que pour le futur.

Le Comité d'Ethique, de son côté, mentionne qu'il est à craindre que certains membres qui n'auraient pas été élus dans le passé demandent à ce que des personnes démissionnent car elles auraient déjà accompli des mandats de 12 ans ou plus.

De même, la règle ne prévoit pas ce qu'il en est pour les personnes qui sont élues en cours de mandat lorsqu'il faut remplacer une personne décédée ou démissionnaire ou exclue.

Dans ce cas, une personne qui aurait été réélue plusieurs fois pourrait être contrainte, lors de son dernier mandat, après avoir été élue pour 4 ans, de devoir démissionner après 2 ans comptetenu de la règle des 12 ans.

Enfin, s'agit-il de 3 mandats consécutifs?

Pour ces diverses raisons, le Comité d'Ethique est d'avis, en l'état, de ne pas recommander l'acceptation de cette modification.

An exchange of views took place on this subject from which it emerged, according to the Ethics Committee, that the Swedish proposal was not sufficiently precise or elaborate.

It was not clear whether this rule would apply immediately and whether the years spent by certain members in committees or on the Executive Committee would count.

The example would be that members of a committee for more than 12 years or of the COMEX might have to withdraw if this rule were applied with immediate effect.

On this issue, the Legal Commission considers that the rule can only be applied for the future.

The Ethics Committee, for its part, mentions that it is feared that some members who have not been elected in the past may request that people resign because they have already served 12 years or more.

Similarly, the rule does not provide for those who are elected during their term of office when a person who has died or resigned or been excluded has to be replaced.

In this case, a person who has been re-elected several times could be obliged, during his or her last term of office, after having been elected for 4 years, to resign after 2 years in view of the 12 year Rule.

Finally, are we talking about 3 consecutive terms?

For these various reasons, the Ethics Committee is of the opinion, as it stands, not to recommend acceptance of this amendment.
e. Position du Comité d'Ethique au sujet de la proposition $n^{\circ} 9$ de la Commission juridique de modifier l'article 4.3 des statuts, plus précisément l'article 4.3.1 $4^{\text {ème }}$ paragraphe / Position of the Ethics Committee on the Legal Commission's proposal No. 9 to amend Article 4.3 of the Statutes, more specifically Article 4.3.1 4th paragraph

Cette proposition vise à préciser le fait que les membres du Comité d'Ethique ne peuvent pas être membres du COMEX ou d'autres commissions de la FIE et inversement.

Le Comité d'Ethique estime cette proposition judicieuse et il l'approuve.

This proposal aims to clarify the fact that members of the Ethics Committee cannot be members of the Executive Committee or other FIE commissions and vice versa.

The Ethics Committee considers this proposition judicious and approves it.

## 6. Point de situation sur un dossier en cours / Update on a current case

Le dossier en cours est pour l'instant suspendu, dans l'attente de voir si un recours est décidé contre une décision d'un congrès.

Si aucun recours n'est déposé contre la décision d'un congrès, il est probable que les personnes qui ont saisi le Comité d'Ethique retirent leur procédure.

Il convient ainsi d'attendre le mois de juillet 2023.

The current case is suspended for the time being, waiting to see if an appeal is decided against a congress decision.

If no appeal is lodged against a decision of a congress, it is likely that the persons who have referred the case to the Ethics Committee will withdraw their proceedings.

It is therefore necessary to wait untid July 2023

On this point, it can be summarised the point of view of the Ethics Committee concerning the two proposed amendments to the statutes:
a. Limitation to 3 terms of office/ 12 years: for the reasons set out above, the Ethics Committee does not recommend acceptance of this proposal.
b. Extension of the number of members of the Ethics Committee from 5 to 10: the Ethics Committee recommends to postpone this issue to the 2023 Congress when a Code of Procedure for the functioning of the Ethics Committee will have been drafted.

Furthermore, the acceptance of this proposal is motivated by the fact that the Ethics Committee could have more room for manoeuvre with regard to problems of conflict of interest or recusal related to the nationality of certain members or language problems.
8. Fixation d'une prochaine réunion du Comité d'Ethique / Fixing a next meeting of the Ethics Committee

Cette question sera décidée lorsque le Comité d'Ethique aura eu une réponse du COMEX de la FIE au sujet de la question de la rédaction du Code de procédure.

This issue will be decided once the Ethics Committee has had a response from the COMEX of the FIE on the issue of drafting the Code of Procedure.

Expulsion and suspensions of a Member Federation is covered in the Disciplinary Code through an adjudicatory process and should not be made a political process with the vote being handled by the

Executive Committee. Additionally, the reason for expulsions and suspensions are overly broad and, in many cases, have nothing to do with the behaviour of the Member Federation. The issues of the consequences of the expulsion or suspension of a Member Federation are already covered in the Disciplinary Code.

## Proposal number 4 from the Legal Commission

Unanimously in favour of the proposal
No comments or corrections.

## Proposal number 5 from the Legal Commission

Unanimously in favour of the proposal
The Commission would like to add Candidates for the Executive Committee so the change would read:
In addition, candidates for the Executive Committee, the Commissions (other than the Athletes Commission) and for the Ethics Committee have the right to take part in Elective Congresses.

It is understood that the additional number of participants may be a burden on staff and would like them to propose fixes, such as moving up the date by which candidates must be nominated. The Legal Commission would be willing to delay this proposal until the 2023 Congress to evaluate means of preventing the organisation of the Congress from becoming unmanageable.

## Proposal number 6 from the Legal Commission

Unanimously in favour of the proposal
No comments or corrections

## Proposal number 7 from the Legal Commission

In favour of the proposal by a vote of 8-1.
The Commission would like to modify the text to permit Commission, Council or Committee members could speak with the agreement of the president of the Commission, Council or Committee so, the change would read:
3.4.4 At Congresses, for each point under discussion the-each president of a Member Federations or his/her representative, the Honorary Members each Member of honour and each member of the Executive Committee may express their opinion no more than twice, and for a maximum of three two minutes on each occasion. In addition, members of commissions, councils and committees concerned with the particular point under discussion may express their opinion once through that body's president or his/her representative or with the agreement of that body's president. This restriction does not apply to the presentation of commissions' reports, nor to the replies to questions addressed from the podium to any of the above persons, nor to the right to reply to an accusation.

## Proposal number 8 from the Swedish Federation

Unanimously opposed to the proposal.
The Commission feels that this artifice is undemocratic and is not in line with good governance. The Congress has the right to vote for whichever candidates it feels will best support the Vision and Mission
of the FIE. It appears to be an attempt to prevent certain candidates from being available to the Congress and has nothing to do with good governance.

It should be noted that this proposal has been made and defeated twice previously. Since retroactive provisions are improper, this would mean that current office holders could only have three additional terms starting with the elections at the 2024 Congress. It also does not deal with the issue of persons who take over the in the middle of a quadrennium for an officeholder who resigns and whether that counts as a term or not.

## Proposal number 12 from the Swedish Federation

Unanimously opposed to the proposal.
The issues raised here are handled effectively by Proposal number 4 from the Legal Commission.
This proposal is totally unworkable. One cannot come to a Congress with no agenda and then adopt one at the meeting for which appropriate documents may not be available and could not be provided to those attending the Congress for them to be able to study in advance. If additional items needed to be added to the agenda there are procedures for handling items that are not part of the agenda provided by the Executive Committee.

The Commission would like to modify the text to add Grand Prix in the last sentence so it will read as follows:

In addition, the members of the Bureau may not undertake the role of Supervisor at FIE World Cup or Grand Prix competitions.

## Proposal number 18 from the Legal Commission

c) The fencer who acquires a new nationality as a result of marriage may fence for that new country immediately, without waiting three years and without the approval of the national federation of the prior country s/he represented. Such application to fence for the new country must be filed with the FIE Head Office no later than the $1^{\text {st }}$ of August immediately following the date of receiving the new nationality through the marriage. However, If the person receives the new nationality through marriage in July, they shall have thirty (30) days from the date of such receipt to file their application.

## Supervisor's Report

Edina Czegledy presented her suggested revisions to the Supervisor's report to make it more useful. The revisions were reviewed and additional suggestions were made. The Supervisor's report will be updated and then send to staff and the Executive Committee. Once approved, a webinar for the use of the new Report will be scheduled.

## Composition and Election/Selection of the Referees' Commission

Marco Rioja presented a report on ways to improve the composition and election/selection of the members of the Referee Commission. The Commission discussed the issues presented and the possible improvements. M. Rioja will incorporate the comments and then the draft will be forwarded to the CEO and the Bureau to determine next steps.

## Joint Meeting with the Ethics Committee

The Legal Commission spoke with the members of the Ethics committee regarding the increase in the size of the Committee from 5 to 10 members starting with the election at the 2024 Congress and what the process would be to define the procedures that the Committee would have to develop to handle cases by panel rather than en banc. The Committee would also like to develop an ethics webinar and invite members of the Legal Commission to speak at it.

## Miscellaneous

The Commission members discussed the items to be worked on for next year and agreed to have draft proposals circulated by 15 November in order that we could discuss while at the Congress and then finalize for submission for the 2023 Congress.

Medical commission has reviewed proposed changes and has provided comments and revisions to consider.
Rationale: term "injury" is necessary for inclusion regarding t. 45 rule as this is the primary reason for medical evaluation within competition. Other medical reason "only" opens the rule to interpretation that any medical reason could warrant a medical timeout. Rule $t .45$ is a safety precaution to allow athletes the opportunity to have medical attention for injury or other medical reasons during a bout.

## Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

Swedish proposal on term limits: Discussion around term limits: Most group members thought that limiting the time spent on the Medical Commission to a maximum of 12 years would risk the loss of
valuable experience and knowledge. Some thought that there may be benefit in having a maximum number of terms (possibly 5 terms or 20 years) or with having a cutoff age (similar to how FIE referees have a cutoff age)

Maha agreed with the 3 term limit proposal - her rationale was 1) that it is important to get new people with new ideas and new perspectives onto the Commission and 2 ) the physical demands of acting as a Medical Delegate are quite significant.

Unfortunately Jeno has not been able to act as Medical Delegate in the last 3 Championships that he has volunteered to work at due to illness.

Jeremy: Given that the commission has to provide 8 Medical Delegates, 2 or 3 Antidoping Education Delegates and 3 reserve Delegates, it may be necessary to consider increasing the size of the Commission

Sabrina: The number of Commission Members is regulated by the IOC; it is probably not possible to increase the size of one Commission without similarly changing the others.

Lisa: There may need to be a change in the rules which will allow a member of the Local Medical staff to fulfill the role of a Medical Delegate (either on their own or under the supervision of one of the FIE Medical Delegates) - because many venues are set up with pistes in multiple locations, there are times that the 3 (or 2) delegates cannot provide adequate cover. The ability to do this would also allow for last minute need to cover delegates due to illness or unexpected unavailability.

Article 4.2.1 - A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Article 4.3.1 - A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms ( 12 years).

There may be a potential that some men may choose to transition to female specifically for the purposes of excelling in women's events.

- Sabrina: the \% of the population that is transgender is approximately $0.05 \%$ Currently there is one USA transgender female fencer. The commission members were unaware of any other transgender fencers competing in FIE events.
- Jeremy: Decision will have to be made based on fairness, because there is no actual safety data of the risks to cis female fencers when fencing males or transgender females. Males fencing females is very common worldwide in training, less so in some local/national events (generally youth/veteran) Having a mechanism which would allow anonymous reporting of injuries to the FIE would be beneficial. There was some discussion regarding issues around collection of data such as privacy, whether the data should be collected by the FIE or NFs
- Maha: It is important that the FIE have a robust process for collection of data
- Sabrina: a pyramid approach of data collection (local, NF, FIE involvement)

## Point 4 / Item 4 / Punto 4:

FIE Medical Commission Q\&A on UK Study Proposal
Questions/Comments:

- Caitin: Would there be an open tender process once the study design was finalized? What definition of "Elite Athlete" will be used? How will subject selection verify that the athletes studies mirror that diverse population that is involved in FIE events?
- Lisa: Data analysis should include correlation with FIE ranking to determine which variables have a significant effect on this specific performance rating.
- Georgina: Other sports are currently close to announcing their own policies regarding transgender athletes. This puts an onus on the FIE to begin data collection quickly; April 2023 may be too late.
- Iris: We should look at other combat sports to determine what data they used to make their decisions. Also, how many different countries should subjects in the planned study come from?
- Caitlin: A small pilot project would be appropriate before applying for IOC funds for a larger study.
- Sabrina: what would the number of subjects be in order to have adequate representation
- There was discussion regarding the feasibility of portable testing done at competitions suggestion was made to speak to the Athletes Commission regarding whether this would be something that athletes would be willing/able to undertake during their usual travel/training plans for a major competition


## Point 5 / Item 5 / Punto

[^0]a. There were no specific health concerns raised by the Medical Commission regarding these proposed changes
b. It was pointed out that an increase in the total number of events would require an increase in the number of Medical Delegates required to provide adequate coverage for the event.
c. There was some discussion regarding whether or not it would be appropriate for fencers who compete in Senior events to also compete at the Veteran World Championships. The suggestion was made that fencers must take 2 years off of Senior FIE events before being allowed to fence at the Veteran World Championships. This was felt to be contrary to the intention of adding the 40-49 year old category in order to allow fencers to remain in fencing as they age.

## Point 7 / Item 7 / Punto 7:

Rules commission proposal - Cramp, injury, illness with medical issue - please see attached adjustments to proposal.

- There was concern that this change in language would increase the number of athletes who would try to abuse the Medical Break allowance in order to rest or interrupt the flow of the match.
- Antonio: it is necessary to have objective signs that can be assessed.
- Jeremy: even if the Medical Delegate feels that there is no need for a medical break it could lead to a significant slowdown in tournaments. Unlike other sports, the rules of fencing allow for a pause in the competition if a participant is injured or ill; in most other sports an injured or sick athlete must either continue competing, or withdraw.
- As information was provided that there might be a further amendment on the wording by the Rules Commission, the decision was made to wait to see what terminology would be proposed.

Further discussion re: rules proposal:

- the wording "injury or medical issue" should be used throughout the relevant articles regarding medical breaks/medical withdrawals. Concern raised regarding fencers requesting medical breaks for "medical issues" that cannot be objectively assessed by the Medical Delegate/Event Medical staff. Rules should clarify that the break allowed by the referee is for the purpose of treatment. As rest may be considered a treatment, the terms "Intervention" or "recognized therapy" should be considered. If a fencer requests medical assessment due to a non-injury medical issue for which a specific treatment/appropriate assessment would be feasible on the strip, the athlete would have to decide whether to continue (unless the Medical staff feel this would not be safe - ie complaint of chest pain in a Veteran Fencer) or to withdraw from the tournament.


## Point 8 / Item 8 / Punto 8:

Women's and Fencing Council Joint Session - Discussion on Medical Commission views on IOC Framework on Fairness, Discrimination, and Inclusion.

- Jeremy: The medical Commission does not have data which would allow commentary to be made regarding safety. All FIE injury data is derived from FIE events, which are not mixed. The focus of Med Comm's discussion has been on the issue of fairness related to potential physical/physiologic advantages that transgender women would have related to pre-transition exposure to testosterone levels. The study proposed by Dr Bottoms would provide fencing-specific data regarding physical/physiologic advantage.
- Melissa: one of the Pan Am federations has announced that their fencers are allowed to compete in events based on their self-identified gender. Melissa has been contacted (in her role with CPE) by fencers who have expressed concerns. What can the FIE/CPE do to support fencers?
- Mirani: Austrian athlete in skiing transitioned in the 80 s, has spoken about everything that she needed to do in order to be allowed to participate in women's competition (including medical interventions). Is there a current process for transgender female fencers who wish to compete in women's events?
- Lisa: FIE Medical Commission is responsible for FIE events specifically, not clear what our role is regarding competitions run by National Federations. The FIE is currently following the 2015(?) IOC guidelines on transgender participation which include a threshold serum testosterone level which the athlete must maintain. When deciding on rules/regulations re: transgender female participation in female fencing events, it will be important to consider whether athletes who transition before/during puberty are subject to the same rules/regulations.
- Mike: South Africa had an experience with a transgender female athlete competing in a Senior Championship event. The South African Medical Commission provided guidance on the appropriate Medical documentation required to allow the athlete to fence (based on current FIE rules). However, there were concerns raised by fencers and parents of junior fencers at the event. The Doping Control Team were unprepared for sample collection from the fencer in terms of Chaperones/ location (Men's area vs Women's area) for sample collection.
- Caitlin: Proposed that the FIE test mixed events as a trial as well as to allow collection of data re: injury rates/patterns when men fence women. Unrelated: has any research been done which could provide guidance to fencers who are returning to training/competition post pregnancy?
- Helen: in the case of the CPE federation who has changed the rules - before admission into the FIE, a national Federation must demonstrate that their rules/statutes are in compliance with those of the FIE. Confederations/NFs should review their own rules/statutes regularly. The Executive Committee are looking for guidance from MedComm which is based on a scientific approach; there is no desire to make decisions quickly, but it will be important to provide ComEx with a plan for how to establish a scientific process/obtain data to assist in decision making.
- Georgina: suggest that no change be made to the current rules at this time, as a hasty decision without adequate rationale would lead to complaints and possible legal action
- Jeremy: the review paper written by Dr. Bottoms' associate contains a description of several studies looking at physiologic advantages (ie fairness), the FIE should start with survey work to determine the opinions of fencers/NFs regarding transgender fencers(inclusivity)

- WADA: Sabrina gave an update on participation in education seminars prior to the Junior/Cadet and Senior World Championships.
- Environment Working Group: Maha discussed goals of the WG to reduce plastic use and decrease CO 2 emissions associated with fencing. It is important to educate fencers/raise awareness. Some measures need to be thought out - for example providing reusable water bottles at a competition may not be beneficial if drinking water isn't also available at the venue. There is some interest in Athletes doing advertisements about environmental issues, plans to establish an annual "Fencing Environment Day". Sabrina suggested the WG use the IOC sustainability guidelines as a resource. The FIE gives hints to Organizing Committees regarding waste reduction tactics to lessen the volume of waste generated at FIE events.
- Safeguarding: Antonio has acted as a Safeguarding Officer at previous FIE events. Some of the MedComm members participated in the "Safeguarding for Supervisors training session June 23". Lisa suggested that at future seminars the Safeguarding Liasons may be able to act as resources during the "breakout sessions". There are no other education initiatives to report on.
- Medical Handbook: this was updated in 2021; Jeremy will distribute to medComm members. Hazem volunteered to do any ongoing work on Medical Handbooks; Clare may be able to assist him with this.
- SEMI: there is currently no member of the Commission who is acting in this role. Hazem volunteered to fulfill this role

- Jeremy: Work regarding the survey of the organizational structure has been put on hold due to deadlines for submission of injury data to the IOC in preparation for LA2028. The goal of this working group is to collect information on the organizational structure of other International Federations' Medical Commissions. There would be benefit in using this information to determine the roles/expectations of the Commission President. Antonio is a member of the Interfederal Commission of the International Federation of Sports Medicine and Hazem is a member of the Asian Fencing Confederation Medical Commission; both are happy to be part of this Working Group.
- Continuing Education:
a) Sabrina: discussed the IOC Sport Health/Sport Santé initiative. Specific areas include risk prevention, targeting obesity, Cardiovascular fitness through sport.
b) Antonio: there is value in using storytelling via the FIE Social Media outlets, as well as the publication of medical articles in the FIE newsletter. Antonio has a specific interest in
promotion of sports training for veterans with a goal of injury prevention. Unlike Senior athletes, many veteran fencers do fencing training only, with no sports/strength training.

Discussion re: strip call documentation.

- Jeremy explained that the IOC requested injury data from the FIE dating back to (2012?), and unfortunately only a small percentage of date regarding injuries at events is available to the FIE. Longitudinal tracking of time loss injuries has not been done for several years. This makes it very difficult to provide the IOC with the requested information. The injury reporting system must be improved to made the data collected more complete and more robust.
- Lisa presented a preliminary analysis of data from the 2022 World Junior/Cadet Fencing Championships in Dubai. Forms based on the IOC Injury/Illness Surveillance framework were used to document strip calls as well as medical withdrawals. By standardizing the injury descriptions, it was possible to enter the data into a spreadsheet. In Dubai this was done using pen and paper; and electronic format would be more user-friendly. The forms used did not capture handedness and which limb was affected, which is important as fencing is an asymmetrical sport. Other data collected could be modified to provide more useful data (specifying if contact with the opponent's weapon was the cause of the injury, as well as what part of the weapon - blade, tip, bell)
- Antonio: he developed a form used during the 2017 World junior/Cadet Cahmpionships which documented the times for the medical delegate to arrive on the strip, the time for assessment of the athlete etc(the factors that determine the time from when the referee requested the Medical Delegate to the time the fencers were able to resume the bout). Emailed to Jeremy for distribution to MedComm members
- Erika: are injuries that occurred during warmup documented?
- Jeremy: the local medical team would generally deal with these injuries. The Medical Delegate would only be aware of them if they led to medical withdrawal, or if during a strip call the athlete disclosed that the initial injury occurred during warmup. Local Medical teams are required to submit a record of all injuries and medical consultation during the event. Having the local medical team use forms based on the IOC surveillance framework would allow easier collation of data. The Medical Withdrawal form includes all the data required to complete the "IOC form". Key is to obtain contact information for the athlete in order to obtain follow up on loss of time injuries.
- Antonio: can the information be sent directly to the medical Commission (from Supervisor/DT/Local medical team)?
- Lisa: is it possible for a specific email address to be established for MedComm (would be accessible by the President of MedComm)
- Elena: can look into email address, but privacy concerns regarding emails containing personal health information, etc


## Head injuries :

- Jeremy: discussion regarding head injury assessment/concussion protocol - SCAT 5 should be used for a complete assessment. On the strip a quick "Mini-mental" exam plus gross assessment of balance can be done. Glasgow Coma Scale not sensitive enough to pick up mild deficits caused by minor head injury. Delegates should be familiar with the SCAT 5 assessment
- Sabrina: several IFs/NFs have programmes for monitoring athletes who have experienced head injuries. These include management/ return to sport protocols.
- Jameleddine: who's responsible for the assessment of a fencer with a head injury. Assessment should be done by skilled practitioners who are aware of the appropriate precautions to take (for example cervical collar should be applied if there was loss of consciousness associated with the injury)

## Proposal from: Rules Commission

Motivation: The current organization rules only list injuries and medical reasons such as cramp, illness, trauma. The term medical reason should take into account all the possibilities.

### 0.21

1 The functions of the medical delegates include the strict and complete organization of the medical aspect. They have the obligation to see that the Rules are adhered to and cannot themselves decide on any departure from the Rules except in circumstances in which it is absolutely impossible to apply them.

2 Hence, medical delegates:
a) Verify the medical services and oversee their operation.
b) Supervise the anti-doping control.
c) Evaluate the medical situation and supervise the intervention or recognized treatment of any injury or other medical reason eramp in accordance with t. 45

### 0.61

1 The entry of the names of the fencers and all possible replacements, and the entry of teams, must be made via the FIE website 7 days before the competition at the latest (midnight Lausanne time).

For team entries, the names of the fencers making up the teams may be changed, by informing the organizers, up to the day before the competition, at the latest at the end of the quarter finals of the individual competition. However, a replacement can be made after this stage, and at the latest at the end of the individual event, in the case of injury or other medical reason illness duly certified by the competition medical doctor.

## 2 Withdrawal of a fencer or team

After the closing deadline for entries, no named fencer or team may be withdrawn except for reasons of, injury, other medical reason or force majeure: the national federation must inform the FIE and the organizers.

If a team does not begin a match they will be disqualified from the competition and thus will not receive any World Team Cup points，unless this is because of an injury or any other medical reason illness，duly attested by the duty doctor

2 d）Each team may request，before a given bout，the substitution of a fencer．However，in case of injury or other medical reason trauma duly recognized by the medical delegate，the substitution can be immediate，even during the relay．

3 A fencer who has been replaced because of an injury or other medical reason may not fence again during that match．If both a fencer and the reserve，if any，are forced to retire，or if a fencer is excluded，their team is deemed to have lost the match．

Injuries and other medical reason，withdrawal of a competitor Injury or－cramp or other medical reason，withdrawal of a competitor

1．For a any sport trauma／injury or cramp or other acute medical incident other medical reason which occurs in the course of a bout and which is properly attested by the delegate of the FIE Medical Commission or，in his／her absence，by the doctor and／or medical provider on duty，the Referee will allow a break in the fight lasting no longer than 5 minutes．Only the doctor and／or medical provider on duty can determine the length of time of treatment required when a medical time－out is granted．This break should be timed from the point when the delegate of the FIE Medical commission or，in his absence，the doctor gave his opinion．This break should be strictly reserved for the requisite treatment． If the delegate of the FIE Medical Commission or，in his absence，the doctor on duty considers，before or at the end of the 5 minute break，that the fencer is incapable of continuing the fight，he／she will decide that the fencer should retire（individual events）and／or be replaced，if possible（team events） （cf．o．99．6．a／b）．If the athlete retires and a medical withdrawal is determined，the FIE Medical delegate or，in his／her absence，the doctor or medical provider on duty must fully complete and submit the FIE Medical Withdrawal form to the DT for its inclusion into the FIE supervisor＇s final report．

All breaks for a sport trauma，cramp，or an acute medical incident medical reason must be noted on the score－sheet for the bout，the pool or the match．

2．During the remainder of the same day，a fencer cannot be allowed a further break unless as a result of a different injury or other or cramp or acute medical incident medical reason．

## Medical Commission:

Medical commission has reviewed proposed changes and has provided comments and revisions to consider.
Rationale: term "injury" is necessary for inclusion regarding t. 45 rule as this is the primary reason for medical evaluation within competition. Other medical reason "only" opens the rule to interpretation that any medical reason could warrant a medical timeout. Rule t. 45 is a safety precaution to allow athletes the opportunity to have medical attention for injury or other medical reasons during a bout.


## Proposals for the 2022 Congress

## Modifications of the Statutes

Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

## Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.

## Article 4.2.1

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluently and it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.

Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation.

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics Committee.
A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.

A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Article 4.2.1 - A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Article 4.3.1 - A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Article 4.4.1 - A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Article 4.7.1 - A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Modifications of the Rules

The texts below are applicable on January 1st, 2023, unless mentioned otherwise.

## Article: 0.108.2

## Proposal from: Tunisia, Morocco, Egypt, Senegal, Algeria

Motivation: The continental competition (zone championship) is the 2nd most important competition after the world championships it is a great continental gathering very important for the fencers it allows to improve their FIE ranking, to have more chance to qualify to the Olympics, unfortunately by reducing the coefficient of the zone championship and make it at the level of a world cup has limited the chances to qualify to the Olympics for America, Asia, Oceania and Africa to the detriment of other continents which organize more than $75 \%$ of the competitions.

For all these reasons we propose to return to 1,5 coefficient of zone championship.

b) Points obtained in an individual World Cup competition and a Zonal Championship are multiplied by a factor of 1.
c) Points obtained in a Grand Prix and a Zonal Championship competition of the FIE are multiplied by a factor of 1.5.

## Motivation:

## Unwillingness to fight (Non-combativity)

There is unwillingness to fight when there is one minute of fencing without a hit or without a hit scored off the target.

When one or both fencers make clear theirln the event of unwillingness to fight, the Referee will immediately call 'Halt!' as a decision of "fact" (cf.t.136.2).

## 1 Individual events - Direct elimination

P-yellow cards and P-red Cards are awarded to each fencer separately to both fencers simultaneously, starting with a P-Yellow card, followed by two a P-Red cards.and finally by a The P-Black card is awarded as described in 1c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions ene or-both fencers with a P-yellow card.-as follows:
a) If the fencers are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-yellow card.
b) If the fencers are not equal: the Referee sanctions the fencer who has the lower score with a P-yellow card.
b) When, for the second and third-times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or-both fencers with a P-red card. as follows:

If the fencers are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-red card. If the fencers are not equal: the Referee sanctions the fencer who has the lower score with a P-rod card.
c) When, for from the fourth third time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-black card is awarded as follows: one or both fencers who have already received two P-red cards, receive a P-black card
ie) If the scores of the two fencers receive P-Black cards simultaneously and their scores are equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. Tthe fencer with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the bout.
iif) If the scores of the two fencers receive-P-Black cards simultaneously, and their scores-are not equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower score with a P-Black card. The fencer with the higher score wins the bout.

## 2 Team events

P-Yellow,-and P-Red cards are awarded to the two each-teams separately-simultaneously, starting with a PYellow card and followed by P-Red cards. The P-Black card is awarded to the fencer. as described in 2c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or both teams with a P-yellow card. as follows:

a) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a P-yellow card.
b) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a P-yellow card.
b) When, for the second and third times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or both teams with a P-red card. as follows:
c) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a P-red card. d) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team which has the lower score with a P-red card.
c) When, forfrom the fourththird time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-Black card is awarded as follows: a P-black card is given to the fencer on the piste of either or both teams which have already received two P-red cards.
i) If the scores for the two teams are equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. The team with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
ii) If the scores for the two teams are not equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a PBlack card. The team with the higher score wins the match.
e) A team in which a fencer has received a P-black card may use their reserve fencer, if they have one and if the replacement has not already been made previously for tactical of medical reasons. If a replacement is made following receipt of a P-black card, no further replacement may be made, oven for medical reasons.

If no replacement can be made following receipt of a $P$-black card (because there is ne reserve fencer or because the reserve fencer has already been used previously), the team in which a fencer has been sanctioned by a P-black card loses the match.

Following the replacement of a fencer after the awarding of a P-Black card, the relay in question continues. Any further occurrence of unwillingness to fight results in a further P-Black eard and the team in question loses the match.
f)-If a $P$-Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously and neither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are equal, the team with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
g) If a P-Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously and neither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are not equal, the team with the higher score wins the match.

## 3 In both individual and team competitions

In case of unwillingness to fight, it is up to the referee to call "Halt" as a decision of fact (cf. Ł.136.2).
a) The P-yellow (warning), P-red (penalty hit) and P-black (the possible losing of a bout or match) cards received during any one bout or match (during all 9 relays) are valid only for that bout or match. They are not transferable to the following bout or match.

No P-card (yellow, red or black) may be awarded in individual competitions at 14-14 or in team matches at 44-44.
b) In both individual and team competitions, fencers and teams who have lost the bout/match following the award of a P-Black card, will be ranked in the final results of the competition as having lost the bout/match. They receive the corresponding points.
c) In both individual and team competitions, the period/relay continues after the awarding of a P Yellow or a P-Red card.
d) The minute starts again after each hit, each hit off the target, each hit annulled, each penalty hit and at the beginning of each period or relay.
e) The referee must record these P-yellow, P-red and P-black cards separately on the score sheet. The sanctions awarded for unwillingness to fight are not cumulative with any other sanction awarded.
f) In both individual and team competitions, if, at the end of the regulation time, there is equality of scores, article t .124 does not apply and articles t .40 .3 and t .41 .5 will apply.

iii) Teams: Senior World Cup team competitions and Senior Zonal

They must be identical for all fencers of the same federation for the competitions i) and iii) above.

t. 74 For all official FIE competitions, every fencer must appear on the piste with clothing conforming to the rules as follows:

2 Wearing his national uniform and logo (cf. m.25.3).
m.25.3.g) For the following events, For all official FIE competitions the wearing of national strips (logos) is compulsory on both legs, optional on the arm(s) (cf. t.45.4). All the logos worn by any one fencer must be identical for all fencers of the same federation for the competitions.
i) Senior Junior and Cadet World Championships: all bouts, whether in a pool, in the direct elimination of during a team match;
ii) Individual Senior World Cup competitions and in individual Senior Zonal Championships: all bouts, whether in a pool or in the direct elimination bouts;
iii) Teams: Senior World Cup team competitions and Senior Zonal

Championships: all bouts in every match.
They must be identical for all fencers of the same federation for the competitions i) and iii) above

## Modifications of the Statutes

## Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

## Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.

## Article 4.2.1

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluently and it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.

Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation.

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics Committee.

A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.

A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years)

Article: 0.18.4

## Proposal from: Refereeing Commission

Motivation: The growing number of participants and up to 5 events per day make difficult to serve competitions for one Refereeing delegate
o.18.4 Veterans World Championships

One Two Refereeing delegate, one SEMI delegate and two Medical delegates are appointed by the FIE Executive Committee following the recommendations of the respective commissions.

## Proposal from: Rules Commission

Motivation: The current organization rules only list injuries and medical reasons such as cramp, illness, trauma. The term medical reason should take into account all the possibilities.

### 0.21

1 The functions of the medical delegates include the strict and complete organization of the medical aspect. They have the obligation to see that the Rules are adhered to and cannot themselves decide on any departure from the Rules except in circumstances in which it is absolutely impossible to apply them.

2 Hence, medical delegates:
a) Verify the medical services and oversee their operation.
b) Supervise the anti-doping control.
c) Evaluate the medical situation and supervise the treatment of any injury or other medical reason cramp in accordance with t .45

### 0.61

1 The entry of the names of the fencers and all possible replacements, and the entry of teams, must be made via the FIE website 7 days before the competition at the latest (midnight Lausanne time).

For team entries, the names of the fencers making up the teams may be changed, by informingthe organizers, up to the day before the competition, at the latest at the end of the quarter finals of the individual competition. However, a replacement can be made after this stage, and at the latest at the end of the individual event, in the case of injury or other medical reason illness duly certified by the competition medical doctor.

## 2 Withdrawal of a fencer or team

After the closing deadline for entries, no named fencer or team may be withdrawn except for reasons of injury, medical reason or force majeure: the national federation must inform the FIE and the organizers.

### 0.101

If a team does not begin a match they will be disqualified from the competition and thus will not receive any World Team Cup points, unless this is because of an injury or any medical reason illness, duly attested by the duty doctor

### 0.103.

2 d) Each team may request, before a given bout, the substitution of a fencer. However, in case of injury or other medical reason trauma duly recognized by the medical delegate, the substitution can be immediate, even during the relay.

3 A fencer who has been replaced because of an injury or other medical reason may not fence again during that match. If both a fencer and the reserve, if any, are forced to retire, or if a fencer is excluded, their team is deemed to have lost the match.

Injuries Medical reason, withdrawal of a competitor Injury or cramp Medical reason, withdrawal of a competitor

1. For a any sport trauma/injury or cramp or other acute medical incident medical reason which occurs in the course of a bout and which is properly attested by the delegate of the FIE Medical Commission or, in his absence, by the doctor on duty, the Referee will allow a break in the fight lasting no longer than 5 minutes. Only the doctor and/or medical provider on duty can determine the length of time of treatment required when a medical time-out is granted. This break should be timed from the point when the delegate of the FIE Medical commission or, in his absence, the doctor gave his opinion. This break should be strictly reserved for the requisite treatment. If the delegate of the FIE Medical Commission or, in his absence, the doctor on duty considers, before or at the end of the 5 minute break, that the fencer is incapable of continuing the fight, he will decide that the fencer should retire (individual events) and/or be replaced, if possible (team events) (cf. o.99.6.a/b).

All breaks for a sport trauma, cramp, or an acute medical incident medical reason must be noted on the score-sheet for the bout, the pool or the match.
2. During the remainder of the same day, a fencer cannot be allowed a further break unless as a result of a different injury or cramp or acute medical incident medical reason.

The Refereeing Commission is responsible for ensuring "good refereeing in the competitions of the FIE" according to the Statutes of the FIE (0.6.5.3 a)). According to the principles of good governance this commission should also be responsible for the designations. The Executive Committee members are not required to be experts on refereeing.

Refereeing at World Championships is carried out by referees chosen by the Executive Committee of the FIE at the proposal of the Refereeing Commission.

### 0.26 .1

Refereeing at Veteran World Championships is carried out by referees appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE, selected by the Refereeing Commission on indication of the Organizing Committee and Veterans

Council.
Referees must attend the refereeing meeting that takes place the day before the World Championships.

### 0.26 .2

For Senior World Cup, Grands Prix and World Cup team competitions, 8 referees, proposed by the Refereoing Commission, will be designated by the Executive Committee Refereeing Commission and delegations will not have to provide any referees. The additional referees required (not less than 5) will be provided by the organising committee. All the referees will be at the expense of the organisers who in return will keep the entry fees.

The referees appointed by the Executive Committee-Refereeing Commission of the FIE.
o.54.4 Neutral referees: At least two international referees from countries outside the region of the Games, appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE at the proposal of the Refereeing Commission.

Refereeing Commission: NOT IN FAVOUR as all commissions incl. RC commission are technical and advisory bodies which have the right to make proposals and recommendations which must be approved by COMEX who takes the final decision and responsibility of it.

Rationale: The amendment giving a second distance of 1.5 meters could be read as a maximum, this could be a problem when setting up finals for major competitions, anyway makes sense to have also a maximum distance.

a) He The Referee calls the roll of the competitors (cf. t.114, t.118, t.119).
b) He The Referee directs the bout.
c) Before each bout, he the Referee must check the weapons, clothes and equipment of the fencers, according to the regulations below.
d) He The Referee superintends the proper functioning of the electrical apparatus. Either on his own initiative or when asked to do so by a team captain or competitor, he the Referee implements tests necessary to check the apparatus and locate any faults which may be found. He the Referee will prevent the competitors from hindering the tests by unplugging or changing their equipment prematurely.
e) He The Referee directs the judges, time-keepers, scorers, etc
f) He The Referee positions himself and moves in such a way as to be able to follow the bout while always being able to see the illumination of the signal lamps.
g) He The Referee penalises faults (cf. t.164).
h) He The Referee awards the hits (cf. t. 54ss).
i) He The Referee maintains order (cf. t.137).
j) Whenever he Referee considers it necessary, he the Referee should consult the experts concerning the electricalapparatus (cf. o.28).
k) The Referee should also supervise the state of the conductive piste; he must not allow the bout to commence or to continue if the conductive piste has holes in it which might affect the proper registering of hits.

## Motivation:

## Unwillingness to fight (Non-combativity)

There is unwillingness to fight when there is one minute of fencing without a hit or without a hit scored off the target.

When one or both fencers make clear theirln the event of unwillingness to fight, the Referee will immediately call 'Halt!' as a decision of "fact" (cf.t.136.2).

## 1 Individual events - Direct elimination

P-yellow cards and P-red Cards are awarded to each fencer separately to both fencers simultaneously, starting with a P-Yellow card, followed by two a P-Red cards.and finally by a The P-Black card is awarded as described in 1c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or-both fencers with a P-yellow card.-as follows:
a) If the fencors are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-yollow card. b) If the fencers are not equal: the Referee sanctions the fencer who has the lower scorewith a P-yollow card.
b) When, for the second and third-times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one orboth fencers with a P-red card. as follows:

If the fencers are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-red card.If the fencers are not equal: the Reforee sanctions the fencer who has the lower scorewith a P-rod card.
e) When, for from the fourth third time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-black card is awarded as follows: one or both fencers who have-already received two-P-red cards, receive-a-P-black card
ie) If the scores of the two fencers receive P-Black cards simultaneously and their scores-are equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. The fencer with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the bout.
iif) If the scores of the two fencers feceive P-Black cards simultaneously, and their scores-are not equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower score with a P-Black card. Tthe fencer with the higher score wins the bout.

## 2 Team events

P-Yellow, and P-Red cards are awarded to the two each teams separately-simultaneously, starting with a PYellow card and followed by twoa P-Red cards. The P-Black card is awarded to the fencer. as described in 2c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one of both teams with a P-yellow card. as follows:
a) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a $P$-yellow card.
b) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a P-yellow card.
b) When, for the second and third times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or both teams with a P-red card. as follows:
c) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a P-red card.d) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team which has the lower score with a P. red card.
c) When, forffom the fourththird time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-Black card is awarded as follows: $P$-black card is given to the fencer on the piste of either or both teams which have already received two P-red cards.
i) If the scores for the two teams are equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. The team with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
ii) If the scores for the two teams are not equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a PBlack card. The team with the higher score wins the match.
e) A team in which a fencer has received a P-black card may use their reserve fencer, if theyhave one and if the replacement has not already been made proviously for tactical or medicat reasons. If a replacement is made following receipt of a P-black card, no further replacement may be made, even for medical reasons.

If no replacement can be made following receipt of a P -black card (because there is no reserve fencer or because the reserve foncer has already been used proviously), the toam in which a foncor has been sanctioned by a $P$-black card loses the match.

Following the replacement of a fencer after the awarding of a P-Black card, the relay in question continues. Any further occurrence of unwillingness to fight results in a further P-Blackeard and the team in question loses the match.
f) If a $P$-Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously andneither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are equal, the team with thehigher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
g) If a P-Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously andneither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are not equal, the team with the higher score wins the match.

## 3 In both individual and team competitions

In case of unwillingness to fight, it is up to the reforee to call "Halt" as a decision of fact (cf. t.136.2).
a) The P-yellow (warning), P-red (penalty hit) and P-black (the possible losing of a bout or match) cards received during any one bout or match (during all 9 relays) are valid only for that bout or match. They are not transferable to the following bout or match.

No P-card (yellow, red or black) may be awarded in individual competitions at 14-14 or in team matches at 44-44.
b) In both individual and team competitions, fencers and teams who have lost the bout/match following the award of a P-Black card, will be ranked in the final results of the competition ashaving lost the bout/match. They receive the corresponding points.
c) In both individual and team competitions, the period/relay continues after the awarding of a P - Yellow or a P-Red card.
d) The minute starts again after each hit, each hit off the target, each hit annulled, each penalty hit and at the beginning of each period or relay.
e) The referee must record these P-yellow, P-red and P-black cards separately on the score sheet. The sanctions awarded for unwillingness to fight are not cumulative with any other sanction awarded.
f) In both individual and team competitions, if, at the end of the regulation time, there is equality of scores, article t. 124 does not apply and articles t .40 .3 and t .41 .5 will apply.

## Modifications of the Statutes

## Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

## Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.

## Article 4.2.1

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluentlyand it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable
that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.
Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation.

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics

Committee.A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.

A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

a) Verify the medical services and oversee their operation.
b) Supervise the anti-doping control.
c) Evaluate the medical situation and supervise the treatment of any injury or other medical reason eramp in accordance with t. 45

### 0.61

1 The entry of the names of the fencers and all possible replacements, and the entry of teams, must be made via the FIE website 7 days before the competition at the latest (midnight Lausanne time).

For team entries, the names of the fencers making up the teams may be changed, by informing the organizers, up to the day before the competition, at the latest at the end of the quarter finals of the individual competition. However, a replacement can be made after this stage, and at the latest at the end of the individual event, in the case of injury or other medical reason illness duly certified by the competition medical doctor.

2 Withdrawal of a fencer or team
After the closing deadline for entries, no named fencer or team may be withdrawn except for reasons of injury or other medical reason or force majeure: the national federation must inform the FIE and the organizers.

If a team does not begin a match they will be disqualified from the competition and thus will not receive any World Team Cup points, unless this is because of an injury or any other medical reason illness, duly attested by the duty doctor

2 d) Each team may request, before a given bout, the substitution of a fencer. However, in case of injury or other medical reason trauma duly recognized by the medical delegate, the substitution can be immediate, even during the relay.

3 A fencer who has been replaced because of an injury or other medical reason may not fence again during that match. If both a fencer and the reserve, if any, are forced to retire, or if a fencer is excluded, their team is deemed to have lost the match.

1. For a any sport trauma/injury or cramp or other acute medical incident or other medical reason which occurs in the course of a bout and which is properly attested by the delegate of the FIE Medical Commission or, in his absence, by the doctor on duty, the Referee will allow a break in the fight lasting no longer than 5 minutes Only the doctor and/or medical provider on duty can determine the length of time of treatment required when a medical time-out is granted. This break should be timed from the point when the delegate of the FIE Medical commission or, in his absence, the doctor gave his opinion. This break should be strictly reserved for the requisite treatment. If the delegate of the FIE Medical Commission or, in his absence, the doctor on duty considers, before or at the end of the 5 minute break, that the fencer is incapable of continuing the fight, he will decide that the fencer should retire (individual events) and/or be replaced, if possible (team events) (cf. o.99.6.a/b).

All breaks for a sport trauma, cramp, or an acute medical incident medical reason must be noted on the scoresheet for the bout, the pool or the match.
2. During the remainder of the same day, a fencer cannot be allowed a further break unless as a result of a different injury or-cramp or acute medical incident other medical reason.

> i) Senior Junior and Cadet World Championships: all bouts, whether in a pool, in the direct elimination or during a team match;
ii) Individual Senior World Cup competitions and in individual Senior Zonal Ghampionships: all bouts, whether in a pool or in the direct elimination bouts;
iii) Teams: Senior World Cup team competitions and Senior Zonal Championships: all bouts in overy match.

The logos They-must be identical for all fencers of the same federation. for the competitions i) and iii) above.

Urgent decision 2, proposal from the Executive Committee, after the proposals of the working group on the calendar and the modifications of the Administrative Rules:

Motivation: When the Junior Team World Cup was created, the number of four events was proposed as a starting point. However, the success of this event with organisers and young people makes its development necessary. In addition, the Junior Team World Cups allow the preparation of the team events of the Junior World Championships.
Currently, only four out of eight individual junior competitions are associated with a Junior Team World Cup. This situation is disadvantageous to organizers which do not have a Junior Team World Cup and restricts the participation of athletes and teams to certain competitions.
Increasing the number of Junior Team World Cups will provide more choice for athletes, level the conditions of organizers, but will not increase the number of competitions taken into account in the rankings or the costs for delegations.

It should be noted that Article 0.41 .2 a) duplicates the provisions of the Administrative Rules for Junior and Senior Team Events in the Calendar section. This duplication does not exist for individual events.

## TEAM WORLD CUP COMPETITIONS

## 2 Principles

a) The Senior Team World Cup tournament is composed of a maximum of five integral competitions (through to the first place) spread, if possible, across all continents. Points will be allocated at the end of each competition.

The Junior Team World Cup tournament is composed of four eight integral competitions and points will be awarded at the end of each competition.

1 Official team ranking of the FIE Principle
a) The official Senior team ranking of the FIE takes into account a team's best four results in the Senior Team World Cup competitions, irrespective of continent, plus the Senior World Championships or the Olympic Games and the Zonal Championships.

The official Junior team ranking of the FIE takes into account a team's best four results in the Junior Team World Cup competitions, irrespective of continent, plus the Junior World Championships and the Zonal Championships.

NB : The English version of this article does not need a modification as it already mentions "best four results" for the junior team ranking, while it is not the case in the French and Spanish versions.

## TEAM COMPETITIONS

## A. SENIOR AND JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS, ZONAL GHAMPIONSHIPS

At each weapon teams consist of three fencers, with or without a reserve.
A team may begin a match only if it is complete.

## Video Refereeing

0.105

Video-refereeing is compulsory at all three weapons at Grand Prix, Senior World Cup individual and team competitions, the Junior and Cadet World Championships, the World Championships and Olympic Games, Zonal Championships and qualification events for the Olympic Games. It is optional at the Veteran World Championships.

1 For World Cup individual, Grand Prix competitions, Zone Championships and qualification events for the Olympic Games, video-refereeing is compulsory and must be used as soon as the timetable allows the competition to be run on 4 pistes or 8 pistes, and in any case, from the table of 64.

2 For World Cup team competitions, video-refereeing is compulsory as soon as the timetable allows the competition to be run on only 4 pistes including the match for 3rd place, but excluding the other ranking matches.

3 For individual and team competitions of the Senior World Championships, video-refereeing is obligatory as soon as the timetable allows the competition to be run on a maximum of 8 pistes, all equipped for video-refereeing, including ranking matches table 5-8.

4 For individual competitions of the Junior and Cadet World Championships and Zonal Championships video-refereeing is compulsory as soon as the timetable allows the competition to be run on a maximum of 8 pistes, all equipped for video-refereeing and in any case, from the table of 32.

For team competitions in the conventional weapons, video-refereeing is compulsory from the table of 16, including ranking matches table 5-8.

In epee, video-refereeing is compulsory from the table of 8 , including ranking matches table 5-8.

5 For individual and team events at the Olympic Games, the video-refereeing system is mandatory in all three weapons, at all stages of the competition.

Examination of the proposals for the 2022 Congress
The proposals were discussed and the result of the SEMI Commission votes is recorded on the proposals document.

## Point 2 /Item 2 / Punto 2:

Joint Proposal SEMI/RULES Commissions Re-organisation and renumbering of the Material Rule Book A joint meeting with the RULES Commission was held to discuss the progress of the re-organising of the Material rules. It was decided that the complete reorganization proposal should be presented to the 2023 Congress. A joint meeting will be arranged in the September to finish the documentation, so that the documents can be translated and ready for March 2023

JH has sent out the documents showing the work achieved so far to all the members of the SEMI Commission

## Point 3 / Item 3 / Punto 3:

Joint meeting SEMI and VETERANS Council

Veterans Council is putting a proposal to include the 40 's age group to the World Championships. This would greatly increase the number of fencers for weapon control to a possible 200 per day.
Discussion followed concerning the number of Armourers and volunteers that would be needed to provide both Weapon Control and Call Room, also if call room for veterans could be limited to the finals and semi-finals.

## Point 4 / Item 4 / Punto 4:

Report of the Junior and Cadet World Championships Dubai

BB Explained that problems occurred at the Junior and Cadet World Championships in Dubai

Weapon Control problems included

- When SEMI Delegates arrive Weapon Control had already started. (SEMI Delegate Janet Huggins was scheduled to arrive earlier but had to cancel due to Covid)
- Weapon Control room not big enough
- Insufficient staff
- Insufficient testing equipment
- Inadequate items for marking passed equipment. (ink not permanent, no engraver for blades) Use of ordinary yellow cable ties (easily transferable, copied or confused with ones from previous competitions)
- No tags or labels for marking failed equipment
- Gabarits not accurate
- Staff and volunteers not trained and changed day by day
- Weapon Control software did not work and paper system had to be used (Provider said laptop was broken)
- Information for statistics was not available

CALL Room problems included

1. Testing from L32 Insufficient testing equipment (weapon control was still running and the testing equipment had to be shared) this improved when DT decided to use Call Room from L16
2. Insufficient staff or untrained volunteers, so much of the testing was done by the SEMI Delegates themselves
a) A discussion about the improvement of the preparation of weapon control and call room came to the following conclusions

- Weapon Control Software or written systems, must be able to input the fencers equipment, providing receipt for fencer, either paper or electronic information for weapon controllers and complete a printed report on failures for the fencer
- Usage of weapon control software to speed up and organize the process and should be able to provide statistical information.
- Existing systems to be validated
- Training for Weapon Control staff should be given especially if the federation does not have a technician training program. Any such training should be included in the SEMI report. INTERNATIO

- Use of suitable items for marking passed equipment (tamperproof cable ties or with a unique marking (use of plastic ties discouraged unless unique and tamperproof as it is not environmentally friendly, paper stickers can be used as an alternative) permanent ink for clothing)

- President of SEMI and or Senior Delegate should be in contact with the competition organisers to confirm requirements for Weapon Control and Call Room

- Video compiled by Gamil Elysaid (weapon control) guide for fencers

## Motivation :

## MARAGING BLADES IN SABER

The work started at the beginning of July 2020 with 20 sabre blade samples collected from 6 brands. To have a comparison 2 normal blades StM and Dynamo (branded Allstar) were purchased.

The tests were carried out by Franchini Blades in Brescia under the supervision of Alberto Franchini, Giandomenico Varallo e Giovanni Rivolta.

Alberto Franchini is a blade manufacturer, past good foilist, owner of one of the well-known steel forges in Europe (see https://www.franchiniacciai.com/)
Giovanni Rivolta is the former chief of the Breda Laboratory for steel, he worked by the US and Italian Army long time and is one of the best experts in Maraging Steel in Italy, and now is an independent consultant.

All the blades have been weighed, measured, checked in their flexibility and in the shape of the curl of the tip according to the rules of the materials rulebook.

2 brand-new Sofranel machines were used for the fatigue test and the calibration. Each test needs about 8/9 hours and the constant assistance from a person when the machine is running.

The machine is stopped after a fixed number of cycles to measure if the resistance point (the maximum of the bending) is changed from the normal condition.
After the first attempts we decided to cease the measuring because the table shows that, the results are not significant.

As per rules, the distance of the fracture from the tip was detected.
Some abnormal breakage in the blade were registered.
A letter should be sent to all manufacturers asking for the process concerning the curl of the point, because, as
above, some abnormal breakages were found in blades done by Leon Paul and Blaise Freres. The breakage is to near to the curl and can be very dangerous for the fencers. It is strongly suspected that they do make the curl on the finish blade with another thermic treatment that can change the quality of the heated steel.

FIE SEMI Commission

During the investigations some mistakes in the Rulebook were found, probably due to later and sometimes misunderstood transcripts, so some corrections are needed.
In order to better understand the changes for fencers, for the moment we are not considering the changing of the flexibility of the blade.

Last year the Congress already approved the following proposal that it was included in the project done the first voice of the checkbox

The blades, after the first homologation remain valid, under the condition that the manufacturers send the blades for a periodical test at least once every two years. These periodical tests have to be carried out at least once every two years in simplified mode: 3 blades will be tested for the following:

Fatigue resistance (by bending) quality of the steel
Chemical test
Traction test
Tensile test
Test of fracture resistance $\left(\mathrm{K} 1^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right)$
If the periodical tests are not done for 4 years, the blade will be scratched from the FIE official blades list. The

This requirement is only found at the beginning of the list of the blades, official FIE document, but not expressly into the Rulebook and with a strange formulation that can be ambiguous (2 times in 5 years).

## Proposals for the 2022 Congress <br> Modifications of the Statutes

## Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.

## Article 4.2.1

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluently and it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.

Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation.

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics Committee.

A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.
A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## 2. DR. GENNADY TYSHLER, PRESIDENT OF COACHING COUNCIL REPORT.

Dr. Gennady Tyshler has delivered the report regarding the Council work in 2022.
It is a pity that we do not meet in person. It is nice to meet with the colleagues to discuss all matters related to our profession. But we do the best we can under the circumstances. The agenda was circulated before the meeting. I did not receive many proposals from the council members, but I included points that needed to be discussed and that I thought were important to discuss. I encourage the members of the council to be more active and send their proposals and comments to the Council.

The Coaching Council had a small meeting in Dubai, during the Junior World Championship. The Minutes of the meeting were sent to all council members.

Questions regarding the report were discussed.

## 3. MR. HAIBIN WANG EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBER REPORT.

Mr. Haibin Wang, appreciates the efforts of the coaches, taking part in this meeting during the preparations for the World Championship in Cairo. He informed the members about matters discussed at COMEX meetings. Special thanks to Greg Marssialas who took part in the work of the FIE calendar working group. It was not easy work. There is special concern about fencers and coaches from Russia. It is a difficult situation and nobody knows what will happen in the future.

## 4. Mr. GREG MASSIALAS REPORT ON THE FIE CALENDAR WORKING GROUP

We had three meetings. Different members represent different parts of the world, athletes, coaches, referees. Everybody agreed that fencing events, 8 world cups/Grand Prix of men and women of one weapon should be held together.
Problems with future competitions are expected because even those competitions are in the calendar, different countries have different Covid regulations and vaccine approvals.
FIE ranking has a problem.
Due to Covid each weapon has had very different number of WC, GP, or total events that would count for World Rankings making it a big mess. It's a rather simple way to clean up the current mess with all the weapons.

This proposal simplifies and keeps the same number of events to count for World Rankings as it has always done. Currently, the number of GP/WC events that are counted for each weapon varies from 5 (MF) to 8 (ME), and the other weapons vary in between. This proposal simplifies and includes the last 3 GP's and 5 WC's (plus Olympic Games and Zonals) for all the individual events. The same is done for the Team events that also vary between 3-5 WC Team events depending on the weapon. This way all weapons would use the best 4 out of the last 5 WC Team events plus the Olympics and Zonals.

I'm writing up the proposal but the data is listed below as to what events should be counted going into the World Championships. This makes the World Rankings fair, equal, and with the same number of World Cups/Grand Prix events across the board with all the 6 weapons (Individual and Team) going into 2022 Worlds.

It maintains the best 5 results out of the most current 3 GP and 5 WC , plus the Olympic Games and Zonals standard that has always been used for individual rankings. For teams it's the best 4 out the past 5 WC Team results, plus Olympic Games and Zonals.







This proposal was sent to the FIE office by Mr. Don Anthony, to be discussed as an urgent item for the last COMEX meeting in May. It addressed the current problem of World Rankings that we discussed earlier today. The FIE Sport Director, Mr. Tsuhklo, had rejected it, so I don't believe that it was ever presented at the COMEX meeting. It seems like a logical proposal that reflects what FIE rankings should be, rather than what we now have going into the Cairo World Championships. For individual events, in addition to the Olympic Games and Zonal championships, I included the most recent 8 events ( 3 Grand Prix and 5 World Cup events). For Team events, the Olympic Games, Zonals, and the most recent 5 World Cup Team events.
Proposals of the working group:

- In all weapons men and women competitions should be held together at the same place
- Competitions for the year 6 world cups with team events and 2 Grand Prix
- Junior world cups will be 7 , men and women together, all 7 with team events.
- Locations. 3 Europe, 2 Asia, 2 Americas, 1 Africa for seniors. 2 Europe, 2 Asia, 2 Americas, 1 Africa for juniors
Working Group finished the work, proposals been sent to COMEX. COMEX decided to come back to this matter after Paris Olympics. It is disappointing as this group was created in order to make calendar for Olympic qualification circle.
Mr. Bela Somlai mention that FIE should have the solutions for the competitions that can possibly be canceled before it can happen.


## 5. PROPOSALS FOR FIE CONGRESS

Proposals were discussed. Coaches opinions on the proposals are attached in a separate document.

## 6. FIE WORKING GROUPS

The Council discussed the situation with different working groups that were created for the last few years. The Council needs to approach the FIE to clarify the situation with the groups.

## 7. THE AGE OF PARICIPANTS AT CADETS AND JUNIOR EVENTS

The age of participants at Junior and Cadet competitions during the Junior and Cadet season was discussed. All coaches have the same vision on the cadets and junior participation. The rule o. 30 should be strictly applied. The Council decided to approach the rules commission and legal commission to clarify the definition of the Junior and Cadets season.
"It is unfortunate, but every few years we have a problem with the age of participants at the junior and cadet local competitions in different countries.
Age of participants: $0.29,0.30$
We discussed the matter at the coaching council meeting and all coaches agree with the rule o. 30

However, we have parents and fencing officials who have never fenced and interpret the rules differently.
Please help with correcting the interpretation of the rules or help us to find the place in the rules that clarifies the situation.

Maybe we need to add a definition for Junior fencing season to the rules. From Junior WC to the next Junior WC, or from April to April, or that the junior fencing season starts from the first Junior competition after the World championship.
Your help will be greatly appreciated."
"First of all I want to thank everybody who is taking part in this discussion. Special thanks to Bruno Gares for the time he spent on putting together all pieces of the "Age of participants" matter from different parts of the rules into one document.
The FIE is not a closed corporation or business. The FIE is a Sports Federation and the main aim of the FIE is "to promote the development of fencing in the world" and "to improve the practice of our sport in every way". The Federation should look not only after fencers who have paid the license, but for all fencers in the world including those, who are between 13 and 15 years old, with parents as their representatives.

Dear Nathalie, you are absolutely right in what you've written, taking extracts from the FIE rules. But this is the problem that we are talking about.

- Request to look at this matter is not coming from the amateurs or volunteers, but from the FIE Coaching Council, the FIE experts committee, that represents the fencing community from professionals at the international level and coaches working with the fencers on the ground. We have discussed the matter with other coaches from different countries and discussed it during the FIE Coaching Council meeting in June 2022. All members of the Council have the same opinion on the matter.
- Sport season. I am not going to talk about other sports, but in fencing, season is the period from one main FIE competition of the year, World Championships (Olympic Games) to the next one the following year. From July of one year to July of the next year, for example. A Sport season is divided into periods. The transitional period (in our case it is August), the preparation period, the pre competition period and the competition period. Periods are divided in to macro cycles and then micro cycles. The Senior fencing season is from July to July. The Junior and Cadet fencing season is from April to April. Please do not mix the competitions Calendar with the fencing season.
- Calendar. Junior FIE competitions calendar is from November to April. This does not mean that juniors do nothing for the rest of the year. Fencers are training, having training camps, different kinds of competitions and other events. Cadets FIE competitions calendar has only one competition. But it does not mean that
fencers, cadets, do not fence during the year or do not have a fencing season. Cadets and Juniors can take part in Senior competitions as well.
- The most serious cheating in the sport is doping and manipulating with age. This is absolutely clear to anybody who fenced as a cadet and a junior, or fencers and their representatives (coaches, parents of fencers) who took part in "ranking" and "selection" competitions. It is especially important in fencing, where we have direct elimination system, seeding before competitions and after the pools.
- Dear Nathalie, you are absolutely right o. 30 rule is correct. o.30. Only fencers who are of an age to qualify for the next Junior World Championships may fence in the official FIE Junior competitions, individual or team, of the current season. This is exactly what we're all talking about, but we need to clarify this rule clause for the WORLD FENCING community, especially for people who learned fencing "from the book" and have never fenced cadet or junior competitions themselves, that we have a Senior season AND a Junior and Cadets season, And that the fencer, who moved to the senior category after his last Junior World Championship in April, should not take part in any Junior ranking and selection competitions any more. New cadets and junior age groups should start training and competing together, preparing for the next major event.
- The Current situation is unfair for the younger kids and does not meet safeguarding requirements. The situation is opening possibilities for "manipulation of results" and "corrupt conduct". As participants who are "over age" (not eligible for selection for the next world championship) can manipulate the ranking, results and selection. To make it straight forward, they can sell their bout to fencers who need the ranking and selection.

We need to and can help Confederations, Federations, THE WORLD of fencing by putting a few words in the FIE rules to make this absolutely clear. This will not have any impact on the current FIE procedures and will not harm anybody. I think that the FIE rules and legal committees can find the right way to address the problem.

## Example:

o.30. Only fencers who are of an age to qualify for the next Junior World Championships may fence in the official FIE Junior competitions, individual or team, of the current JUNIOR season (1st May to 31st of April next year).

## 8. JUNIOR AND CADETS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION PROGRAM

Coaches discussed the program for the Cadets and Junior World Championships. All agreed that the Cadets event should be organized before the Junior event.

## 9. HALL SET UP AT MAJOR FIE EVENT

The most important person in sports is the athlete. During competitions everything should be done to help the fencers compete comfortably and achieve the best possible results. It has come to our attention that at the last few competitions, organizers, during the preliminary stage of the competition, blocked all competition areas with a fence, not allowing fencers access to their coaches between the bouts during preliminary pools stages. This situation is unacceptable. Fencers should have easy access to their coaches advice between their bouts during pools. Additionally, the blocked area was very big and the lights on the scoring apparatus were not visible from all directions. We want to mention that pools are the preliminary stage of the event and the official competition will start only after the opening ceremony with direct elimination and spectators.
A coach usually has 4 fencers competing in the pools. Easy passage should be organized from one side of the arena to another.

We think that the matter is clear, competitions should be organized according to the rules, handbook of regulations and traditions of our sport.

Another solution may be to allow the coach at the piste during the bout of his fencer as is during direct elimination.

## 10. JOINT MEETING WITH THE FIE WOMEN AND FENCING COUNCIL

Meeting went very well. Many issues were discussed in friendly conversations.

- Coaching mentoring programs should be established for the women coaches
- Coaching shadow programs should be established for women coaches
- Coaches education programs should include the safeguarding subjects
- Interviews should be organized with famous women coaches and athletes to promote women in fencing
- FIE should help women to find jobs as fencing coaches
- Women coaches should be included in FIE training camps as part of the mentoring program

Both Councils agree to have more cooperation in the future.

## Decisions:

- Mr. Haibin Wang and Dr. Gennady Tyshler will communicate decisions and information on the Council Meeting to FIE COMEX and relevant FIE commissions.


## CONCLUSION

Dr. G. Tyshler thanked everybody for the work done. A draft of the minutes will be circulated by the president to all members for comments. The date for the next meeting will be announced. Meeting closed.


## Proposals for the 2022 Congress

## Modifications of the Rules

The texts below are applicable on January 1st, 2023, unless mentioned otherwise.

## Article: 0.67

## Proposal from: Rules Commission

Motivation: Experience has highlighted the problems when you end up with pools of 6 and the absence of fencers on call. In order to ensure the fairness of the pools, the Rules Commission proposes the following text:

### 0.67

1. In all competitions for which the formula includes a round of pools, these pools consist of 7 fencers if the number of participants is divisible by 7 . Otherwise, the pools are of 7 and 6 . In no case may the pools be of fewer than 6 fencers.

If, however, as the result of the absence of one or more fencers, one or more pools were to be reduced to 5 or fewer fencers, the DT organisers must add to these pools one or more fencers from other pools of 7 fencers in the same round of pools, taking into account the initial ranking of the fencer(s) being replaced.

Depending on the number of participants, the pool round may take place over several rounds.
The DT must then provide for each pool round, pools of 7 and 6 (if applicable) in order to balance one or more pools in the event of fencers absent at roll call in pools of 6 .

Coaches Council: In favor.

## Article: 0.108.1

## Proposal from: Rules Commission

Motivation: Supplementing o.108.1 c). The cancellation of many competitions during the 2020/2021 season has caused points allocation problems.
0.108 .1
c) For both Senior and Junior rankings, the ranking is rolling.

The first Grand Prix event of the current year cancels out the first Grand Prix event of the previous year and so forth for the remainder of the Grand Prix events.

The first World Cup individual event of the current year cancels out the first World Cup individual event of the previous year and so forth for the remainder of the World Cup events in the season.

The first satellite competition of the current year cancels out the first satellite competition of the previous year and so forth for the other satellite competitions.

The points allocated for a competition cancel out the points attributed to the corresponding competition in the provious season.

If a competition does not take place in the current season, the points obtained at the same competition in the previous season are deleted on the anniversary of the competition.

The competitions are numbered in order of the dates provided in the calendar and by competition category (World Cup, Grand Prix or Satellite events).

The points awarded in event 1 of the current season replace the points awarded in event 1 of the previous season and so on.

If an event is cancelled during the current season, the points acquired during the corresponding event of the previous season will be deleted on the date assigned to this event in the calendar of the current season.

Coaches Council: In favor, but it should be always the correct number of the competitions in the rolling system.

## Article: 0.108.2

P. 9

Proposal from: Tunisia, Morocco, Egypt, Senegal, Algeria,

Motivation: The continental competition (zone championship) is the 2nd most important competition after the world championships it is a great continental gathering very important for the fencers it allows to improve their FIE ranking, to have more chance to qualify to the Olympics, unfortunately by reducing the coefficient of the zone championship and make it at the level of a world cup has limited the chances to qualify to the Olympics for America, Asia, Oceania and Africa to the detriment of other continents which organize more than $75 \%$ of the competitions.

For all these reasons we propose to return to 1,5 coefficient of zone championship.

## Proposal from: Executive Committee

## Motivation:

## Unwillingness to fight (Non-combativity)

There is unwillingness to fight when there is one minute of fencing without a hit or without a hit scored off the target.

When one or both fencers make clear theifln the event of unwillingness to fight, the Referee will immediately call 'Halt!' as a decision of "fact" (cf.t.136.2).

## 1 Individual events - Direct elimination

P-yellow cards and P-red Cards are awarded to each fencer separately to both fencers simultaneously, starting with a P-Yellow card, followed by a P-Red cards and finally by a The P-Black card is awarded as described in 1c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or both fencers with a P-yellow card. as follows:
a) If the fencers are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-yellow card.
b) If the fencers are not equal: the Referee sanctions the fencer who has the lower score with a P-yellow card.
b) When, for the second and third-times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions one or both fencers with a P-red card. as follows:

If the fencers are equal: the Referee sanctions both fencers with a P-red card. If the fencers are not equal: the Referee sanctions the fencer who has the lower score with a P-rod card.
c) When, for from the fourth third time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-black card is awarded as follows: one or both fencers who have already received two P-red cards, receive a P-black card
ie) If the scores of the two fencers receive P-Black cards simultaneously and their scores are equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. Tthe fencer with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the bout.
iif) If the scores of the two fencers receive-P-Black cards-simultaneously, and their scores-are not equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower score with a P-Black card. The fencer with the higher score wins the bout.

## 2 Team events

P-Yellow,-and P-Red cards are awarded to the two each teams separately simultaneously, starting with a PYellow card and followed by woa P-Red cards. The P-Black card is awarded to the fencer. as described in 2c) below.
a) When, for the first time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions ene or both teams with a P-yellow card.-as follows:
a) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a $P$-yellow card.
b) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a P-yellow card.
b) When, for the second and third times, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, the Referee sanctions ene of both teams with a P-red card. as follows:
6) If the teams are equal: the Referee sanctions both teams with a P-red card. d) If the teams are not equal: the Referee sanctions the team which has the lower score with a P-red card.
c) When, forfrom the fourththird time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-Black card is awarded as follows:a P -black card is given to the fencer on the piste of either or-both teams which-have already received two P-red cards.
i) If the scores for the two teams are equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, with a P-Black card. The team with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
ii) If the scores for the two teams are not equal, the Referee sanctions the team with the lower score with a PBlack card. The team with the higher score wins the match.
e) A team in which a fencer has received a P-black card may use their reserve fencer, if they have one and if the replacement has not already been made previously for tactical of medical reasons. If a replacement is made following receipt of a P-black card, no further replacement may be made, oven for medical reasons.

If no replacement can be made following receipt of a $P$-black card (because there is no reserve fencer or because the reserve fencer has already been used previously), the team in which a fencer has been sanctioned by a P-black card loses the match.

Following the replacement of a fencer after the awarding of a P-Black card, the relay in question continues. Any further occurrence of unwillingness to fight results in a further P-Black eard and the team in question loses the match.
f)-If a P -Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously and neither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are equal, the team with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the match.
FIE Coaches Council
g) If a P-Black card is given to the fencers on the piste in both teams simultaneously and neither of the teams can make a replacement and their scores are not equal, the team with the higher score wins the match.

## 3 In both individual and team competitions

In case of unwillingness to fight, it is up to the referee to call "Halt" as a decision of fact (cf. t.136.2).
a) The P-yellow (warning), P-red (penalty hit) and P-black (the possible losing of a bout or match) cards received during any one bout or match (during all 9 relays) are valid only for that bout or match. They are not transferable to the following bout or match.

No P-card (yellow, red or black) may be awarded in individual competitions at 14-14 or in team matches at 44-44.
b) In both individual and team competitions, fencers and teams who have lost the bout/match following the award of a P-Black card, will be ranked in the final results of the competition as having lost the bout/match. They receive the corresponding points.
c) In both individual and team competitions, the period/relay continues after the awarding of a PYellow or a P-Red card.
d) The minute starts again after each hit, each hit off the target, each hit annulled, each penalty hit and at the beginning of each period or relay.
e) The referee must record these P-yellow, P-red and P-black cards separately on the score sheet. The sanctions awarded for unwillingness to fight are not cumulative with any other sanction awarded.
f) In both individual and team competitions, if, at the end of the regulation time, there is equality of scores, article t .124 does not apply and articles t .40 .3 and t .41 .5 will apply.

Coaches Council: not in favor.

NON - COMBATIVITY rule was discussed by different FIE commissions and councils for 2 years. Special working group was established to help making the correct decision, from top epeeist. If we give P cards to both fencers, then we can just cancel the $P$ - cards. No changes should be made to this rule without new working group be established.


## Proposals for the 2022 Congress

## Modifications of the Statutes

## Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

## Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.

## Article 4.2.1

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluently and it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.

Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation.

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics Committee.

A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.
A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Coaches Council: Not in favor

Only President of the FIE, the Presidents of Confederations, and the chairpersons and the Presidents of the commissions and councils can serve not more than 12 years.

The technical specialists and professionals should be able to serve in the commissions and councils without of time limit.

## Meeting minutes

1. Opening by the president. Bert van de Flier opens the meeting with greetings.

## PROPOSAL BY SWEDEN RE A LIMITATION OF 3 TERMS OF OFFICE FOR THE FIE PRESIDENT, THE COMEX AND MEMBERS OF COMMISSIONS, COUNCILS \& COMMITTEES

The Council continued their discussion from the previous meeting. A number of points were raised, identifying both advantages and disadvantages of the proposal in its current form.

For most council members the fact that the "council memory" should be preserved, which in general is most present with the longest serving member was the deciding factor. This is combination with the fact that a member that does not live up to the expectations can and should be replaced by the electoral process. It was agreed by all that the disadvantages outweighed the advantages, and there was a unanimous vote against the proposal in its current form.

FAIR PLAY AWARENESS PROGRAM
a) Inclusion of Fair Play Oath in Opening Ceremony

The finalising of the wording of this proposal was postponed until the next meeting, as several Council members were not present.

## b) Proposal by Eyad Maghayreh for an Ambassador programme

Eyad had previously circulated an outline proposal which was discussed at length. The proposal is based on creating an Ambassador group from those fencers attending the training camp leading up to the Junior \& Cadet World Championships.

The idea was approved in principle. Hilary Philbin and Jennifer Yamin had a number of questions about how the programme would work in practice. These topics included (but are not limited to):

- How to involve national federations and acquire their approval and support
- What budget is required, and where it would come from
- How to source the items needed (eg - centrally, or independently in each athlete's own nation)

It was recognised that there is a lot of preparation to be done, and that a detailed proposal needs to be developed step by step, with each significant phase being put to the Council members for approval.

Nigora Karimova said that she and Osmonzhan Kasymov would be happy to work with Eyad on preparing the next document, which would be circulated to the Council. A Zoom meeting would then be arranged to take it further forward.

Bert van de Flier said that we should aim for implementation at the Junior \& Cadet World Championships in 2024. 2023 would be too soon, as related budget requests would need to be submitted the previous September (ie next month).

## Article: 4.2.1; 4.3.1; 4.4.1; 4.7.1

## Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.

## Article 4.2.1

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluently and it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.
Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics Committee.

A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.

A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

Fair Play Council: Unanimous vote against the proposal in its current form.

- Presentation of the new member Peter Brigola

The new member, Peter Brigola, introduced himself and expressed his happiness to work with the group.

- Discussion on general working methods (email, zoom meeting,...), meeting reports

After the question who writes the minutes, Benoit determines Peter. Reports will be sent out via email. Peter suggested short-term zoom meetings to make more flexible decisions - will be organized according to Benoit 's instructions
Marja-Liisa will install a WhatsApp Group for the Council to have a quicker communication.

Point 2 /Item 2 / Punto 2: World Veterans Championships in Zadar Oct 5th to 12th 2022

- Comments on website https://fencingzadar.com/

All participants find the website comfortable and clear. Even the version for the mobiles is clearly arranged and good usable for veterans

- Confirmation of DT members, IT staff, referees

Benoit already sent to the Council members the names of the people in charge of the DT, IT, Medical, SEMI as well as the names of the referees. It has been considered as a quite efficient team.

- Who from the Council will be attending? Dates?

It is agreed to hold an unofficial council meeting as part of the gala dinner. Mirna confirmed the date of the dinner. It is on Saturday Oct $8^{\text {th }}$.

- Who wants to have a special function (as Francis and Rita in Kairo)?

- How to promote the participation, particularly of North of Africa, close to Croatia?

Benoit simulations of participation to Zadar, leading to a forecast of 800/900 individuals and 50/60 teams shows that the event is doable and easy to manage. This competition will be held on 7 days and will require 21 pistes.
There had been a good participation of Nations from North Africa during the former Championships in Cairo. It would be good to continue this growth.

Point 3 / Item 3 / Punto 3: Main recent activities of veterans in the Confederations

- European Team Championships (Power Point presentation of Benoit)

Benoit made a brief report about the ECH Team Hamburg. More than 100 teams and 500 fencers out of 20 Nations were attending. He emphasizes that the relay format did not cause any restrictions. There were no complaints from the fencers and organizers. As a conclusion, this format seems well accepted by Veterans. According to his simulation the possibility of a significant increasing of the number of teams at the WCH is quite possible. Benoit pointed out that this format is only introduced in Europe and recommends the other confederations to follow this example.

- Other activities in America, Asia, Africa

Rita reported about the activities in America on the upcoming summer nationals were the fencers have the possibility to qualify for Zadar. She also talks about the habit of women fencers to meet weekly via zoom and exchange ideas. The group of 80-year-olds has grown and is viewed more in the younger groups due to the zoom activities. The Canadian and South American groups are also very active.
Kovacs tells that due to the pandemic, there have been very big problems, and this has mainly affected the veteran fencers. Especially CHN, JPN, THA and HKG could not travel. The Asian Committee decided not to host any veteran competition this year. But in 2023 the Asian championships will be in Dubai and in 2024 in

Hong Kong. There are also no qualifying tournaments in Asia. Except for JPN, obviously no other nation will participate in Zadar. He also reports on the huge cost for Asian veterans to come to Zadar.
Mohamed reported that Veterans are not seriously considered yet in North Africa. So, it's difficult at the moment to get some help from federations or sponsors.
Out of meeting: Luis reported from the 2017 Pan American Championships in Veteran Fencing held in the Virgin Islands, where 112 fencers from 33 nations participated. This shows the very positive development in this region. From August $22^{\text {nd }}$ to August $28^{\text {th }}$ the same tournament will take place in Lima / Peru.

## Point 4 / Item 4 / Punto 4: The introduction of the 40's

- "Road map" to present the project at the Congress at the end of November

As a matter of fact, the introduction of the 40's would lead to a significant increase in participation, of course in individual, but also in team due to the creation of two sub-categories. In total, there could be a total of about 1300 fencers in the individual and 160 teams. This seems high, but according to the simulations Benoit made and sent to the COMEX, this would require a total of 25 pistes and about 35/40 referees in a 7-day format. This is finally rather close to what currently exists.
To get further approval from the Congress, the Council proposed to make a short presentation of the project before their vote. This presentation must be submitted to the COMEX for approval during its mid-September meeting. Thereafter it has to be sent to the national federations for information.

- Discussion requested with the Rules, Medical, and SEMI Commission

Benoit explained the possibility of getting the 40+ motion approved at Congress. That's why he arranged meetings with the rules, women, medical, SEMI and promotion commission to convince them of the usefulness of the application and to discuss possible objections.

- Meeting with the SEMI Commission (Pres. Giandomenico VARALLO)

Introducing the 40's implies that about 200 fencers per day would have their equipment to be controlled. This should not be a problem while using computerized systems (barcode, QR code), Varallo said. This would require 20/30 volunteers.
Benoit asked if it's necessary to make controls in the call room at the beginning of the tableau, like for the seniors. Varallo answered: maybe not, but at least for the finals. In conclusion, SEMI is in favor of the introductions of the 40's

- Meeting with the Medical Commission (Pres. Jeremy SUMMERS)

The Council mainly asked if the Medical Commission felt that the 45-hit relay could be risky. When asked by Jeremy Summers whether the formula had been tested, Benoit confirmed that it had already been used at 2 events. There was not a single serious injury in Hamburg with more than 100 teams and over 300 matches. Furthermore, the possibility was discussed whether fencers may continue to compete in senior competitions after receiving the veteran license and if it's necessary to have an additional Medical Delegate. Both topics need to be clarified separately.
In conclusion, the Medical Commission is in favor of the introductions of the 40's.

- Meeting with the Rules Commission (Pres. Ziad FERIANI)

Note: Nathalie RODRIGUEZ was present during this meeting Rules/Veterans.
Benoit explained the 40+ project and answered the questions of the participants of the Rules Commission. The Rules Commission has doubts as to whether the 7-day format is sufficient for the additional categories. Giuseppe Cafiero suggested a test event. Nathalie thinks that the introduction of the new rules after the bid means big problems for the organizers and for the FIE. Daytona 2023 has only planned 6 days due to the current rules and cannot extend that.
The Veteran's Handbook does not provide for a pre-visit. Benoit proposes to change this after submission of the other handbooks. Nathalie suggests 2 changes in the handbook - regulating the pre-visits and setting
the tournament days (7 or 8). By the end of July, the Veterans Council will provide a proposal of changes to the handbook.
After lengthy discussion, it was finally concluded that the Rules Commission is in favor of the introduction of the 40's but will not come into effect until 2025. Nathalie agrees with this conclusion.

- Meeting with the Woman and Fencing Council (Pres. Georgina USHER)

Rita asked how to increase the number of women veteran fencers. She reports on the increasing number in US and the situation in Egypt. Georgina Usher takes the UK as an example, where the veterans are in their own group and organize themselves. Furthermore, programs are running to convey the health effects of fencing in old age. Interviews by older women fencers published on social media can encourage people to practice the sport in old age.
Mirani Fernandes suggests doing interviews in Zadar to show female fencers that the veteran's group has fun and desire with fencing. In addition, a small catalog of questions can be used to analyze what national federations need to increase the number of veteran fencers. One possibility is to organize more tournaments.

- Meeting with the Commission for Promotion, Communication and Marketing (Pres. Nikolay MATEEV)

Benoit asks the Promotion Commission what to do to encourage veterans to attend tournaments. Using Zadar as an example, he explains that three quarters of the fencers come from Europe. On the other hand, only a few come from Asia and Africa.
Mateev says that not only national federations but also confederations should promote veteran fencing. In addition, there must also be more advertising on the official FIE channels. Mateev also proposes an "International Veterans Fencing Day". The idea of generating sponsorship based on published photos also came up. These photos must come from the national federations or from tournament organizers.
Mohamed tells of the situation that veteran fencers in Africa are not taken seriously and in addition have hardly any material at their disposal. David Baker thinks a charity like FIE's can help. Mirna will install a "Donate your Equipment" option in Zadar to help selected countries.
Mateev will prepare a "joint statement" together with the Veterans Council.

Point 5 / Item 5 / Punto 5: World Veterans Championships in Daytona October 2023

- Preliminary visit: Who? When?

After much discussion, members agreed that Benoit should have an additional visit to Daytona if necessary and agreed with Nathalie Rodriguez.

Peter proposes changing the name from Veteran to Master. After some discussion it was decided not to consider this proposal as a top priority.

Motivation: The growing number of participants and up to 5 events per day make difficult to serve competitions for one Refereeing delegate

One Two Refereeing delegate, one SEMI delegate and two Medical delegates are appointed by the FIE Executive Committee following the recommendations of the respective commissions.

## Motivation:

The Council considers that the time is now right to make some bold and exciting changes to the Veteran World Championships that will respond to what the fencers are seeking but that will also invigorate the event itself. Introducing the 40-49 age category and changing the team format are two things that deliver this solution and which the Council has considered in detail.

## Individuals

Introducing the new age category significantly increases the number of participating fencers. The attached documents demonstrate how these might be incorporated without requiring huge numbers of pistes. This is an important criteria to enable maximum flexibility to attract potential host nations.
The Criterium de Paris taking place in July 2022 will provide an opportunity for observers to see and even experience this level of competition for all categories from 40 upwards.

## Teams

The current team format at the World Championships, while hard fought, is not particularly popular with fencers who feel that it does not provide the best representation of team fencing.
The introduction of the new age category means that each Nation will be able to enter a Veteran Team $(40+50)$ and a Grand Veteran Team $(60+70)$, using the 45 hits relay format. This, more realistic format, while increasing the number of team matches delivers less haphazard strategy and spectacle. It also enables participation from those nations who may not have the full range of age groups for current teams.
This format has worked very successfully at the European Championships and the forthcoming European Team Championships in Hamburg in May will provide an opportunity for observers to see and even experience competition in this format.

## Conclusion

The inclusion of 40 year olds in the Veterans ranks is overdue, desirable and reasonable to implement. Fencers, organisers and the FIE will profit from it and the sport will be in step globally.

## Rule changes required in the World Veteran Fencing Championships Handbook

6 The age groups in veteran competitions are:
a) Age group 50-59: Must be at least 50 years old and less than 60 years old in the year of the competition.
b) Age group 60-69: Must be at least 60 years old and less than 70 years old in the year of the competition.
c) Age group $70+$ : Must be at least 70 years old in the year of the competition
a) Age group 40-49: Must be at least 40 years old and less than 50 years old in the year of the competition.
b) Age group 50-59: Must be at least 50 years old and less than 60 years old in the year of the competition.
c) Age group 60-69: Must be at least 60 years old and less than 70 years old in the year of the competition.
d) Age group 70+: Must be at least 70 years old in the year of the competition

### 0.39

1 The programme of the Veteran World Fencing Championships comprises twenty-four thirty-six events, eighteen twenty-four individual - three four categories for each weapon - and six twelve team - male foil, female foil, male epee, female epee, male sabre and female sabre (two categories for each weapon and gender). The programme must be arranged in such a way as to allow any fencer to participate in all weapons. Team events must be held on the day following the last championship of the three-corresponding two individual categories of each weapon
2. No changes of dates are allowed for any competition, after the release of the programme.

3 Each competition must be held in one single day, except for team events for which the round of poules may be achieved the day before direct elimination avoiding long periods of inactivity

1 Participation
Each country may enter one team per category (Veterans and Grand Veterans) per gender and per weapon, thus giving a total of 6 twelve competitions.

2. The rules for team competitions are applicable with the following exceptions:
a) For each weapon, the teams are composed of three fencers of the same nationality, one from category "A", one from " B " and one from " C ", with or without a reserve for each category. A team cannot begin the match if it is not complete.

Veterans : teams of three composed of fencers belonging to either age group 40-49 or to age group 50-59, with at least one fencer belonging to age group 50-59, plus up to two reserves

Fencing mode is 45 hits relay described in 0.99 with application of passivity rule at any bout.

d)There can only be one substitution per team per match. There can be up to two substitutions of reserves per match but must maintain compliance with the age category representation requirement

4 The relay system is always applied. The three fencers of a team fence against their opponent of the same eategory. Each fencer fences his/her opponent twice giving a total of 6 bouts. The bouts are for 5 hits (5-10-15-20-etc.). Exceptionally, a relay may end at more than 5,10,15-etc. if a fencer scores a valid last hit of the relay and is at the same time awarded an additional penalty hit: in this case both hits will be counted; the maximum time for each bout is 3 minutes.

To be candidate for the presidency a person must hold a licence from his Member Federation, except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 25 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.
A person can be elected to be president a maximum of three terms (12 years). Besides, a candidate for the Presidency must speak one of three working languages of the FIE fluently and it would be desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages.
The President of the FIE cannot hold any position within his national federation or in any Zonal Confederation.

## Article 4.3.1

To be candidate to the Executive Committee a person must:

- hold a licence from his Member Federation except for Members of Honour
- be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections
- enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs
- be able to understand and speak one of the three working languages of the FIE and it is desirable that he should be able to understand and speak one of the two other working languages
- Commit to respect the principle of sports autonomy applicable within the Olympic Movement
- Commit to actively take part in all activities resulting from the function of Executive Committee member.

A person can be elected member of the Executive Committee a maximum of three terms (12 years).

It is desirable that he or she has experience as a leader (President, Vice-President, Secretary General, Treasurer or any other similar function) in his national federation, his National Olympic Committee or any entity.

A member of the Executive Committee, elected as such, cannot be president of a zonal confederation.

Members of the Executive Committee (according to articles 5.2.1 and 5.2.4 definitions), cannot be member of a Commission of the FIE, one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. Furthermore, members of commissions cannot be members of one of its Councils or of its Disciplinary Panel. An individual can only be a member of one of the following at any point in time - the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council or the Disciplinary Panel.

Being a member of the Executive Committee is incompatible with the national roles of technical director, referee, chief of delegation and team captain. Being a member of the Bureau is incompatible with the role of Fencing Master.

Once elected, the Executive Committee member shall send to the FIE head-office a letter of commitment signed by both the Executive Committee member and his/her national federation

## Article 4.4.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one permanent commission plus the Ethics Committee.

A person can be elected member of a Commission a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## Article 4.7.1

Nobody may be candidate for more than one of the Councils.

A person can be selected to be member of a Council a maximum of three terms (12 years).

## The Council noted:

- This proposal related to improving governance practice.
- Some members of the council had a conflict, under the proposal they would not be able to re-stand.
- Common in many countries to have term limits for elected/appointed positions across different sectors not just sport, although options to re-stand after a break
- Issue with small number of available people with suitable expertise for positions - limiting their involvement can be a hindrance. Council and Commission members undertake work for the FIE therefore this proposal could place a burden on FIE executive. Other alternative structures/methods to include volunteers would need to be considered
- Decision to support proposal with amendments on re-standing.
- Drafting to be continued offline following meeting.

## Point 3 / Item 3 / Punto 3: Meeting with Medical Commission

## IOC Framework for Transgender Inclusion

- Medical commission has been asked to review IOC framework and provide a recommendation
- Working toward a solution for transgender athlete inclusion
- Presentation from Dr Lindsay Bottoms covering the latest research on fairness accompanied by a comprehensive narrative review of existing research looking at data relating to physical components of fencing performance: which concludes "there is a 17-30\% difference between physical components related to fencing performance between genders. In addition, the literature highlights that once males have gone through puberty testosterone suppression does not reduce all the physiological advantages such as lean mass, strength, power and stature. Therefore, the literature suggests that there is an unfair physiological advantage of transwomen participating in women's fencing".
- Discussion on potential further research opportunities specifically focusing on fencing. Noted consideration of diversity to ensure performance factors are fully evaluated across performance athlete community.
- Discussion on athlete safety, current reporting of injury and suggested improvements.
- Agreed to set up a joint cross Commission/Council working group (including representatives from Legal and Athlete) to review the existing/proposed further research in detail and prepare a full response to the FIE regarding the IOC framework.


## Other

- Commence discussions with the Athletes' Commission and Media to discuss opportunities to facilitate and encourage safe return to sport post-partum


## Point 4 / Item 4 / Punto 4: Meeting with Referees Commission

Discussion on shared objective to increase opportunities, diversity and quality of refereeing in fencing:

- $30 \%$ threshold for female referees is now a requirement at FIE events that Referee Commission has to uphold
- Work together to identify long-term solutions (not online seminars) with intensive opportunities with realtime feedback
- Explore opportunities for active involvement (vs. reviewing video) on the piste to learn at Grand Prix, World Cups alongside Junior events. Consult with NFs to see whether they would financially support opportunities. for developing referees to receive mentoring/shadowing opportunities at major events. Agreement to jointly prepare communication to NFs.
- Potentially opportunities to run more referee training/seminars in conjunction with NFs

Point 5 / Item 5 / Punto 5: Meeting with Coaches Council

- Discussion of a mentorship program (supported by national federations) for female coaches to be exposed to high level coaching at major events, agreement to jointly prepare communication to NFs.
- Agreement to jointly develop content to use for the coaching academy regarding safeguarding, coaches are best placed to create welcoming and inclusive environments for all fencers.
- Agreement to work together on a social media content (possibly a podcast) interviewing high level female coaches to inspire others.

## Proposal from: Swedish Fencing Federation

Motivation: The FIE should be in line with the principles of good governance. It has been made very clear that it is not beneficial to any organisation to allow individuals to stay for a very long time in office. This is a clear recommendation in all guidelines for good governance in sport organisations. Already at the FIE Congress in 2007, there was a proposal for introducing time limits which did not pass. It is time that the FIE adopts this principle.
