OBITUARY

The International Fencing Federation has been affected by the loss of several friends and it is with deep sadness that the FIE has learned of the passing of:

Olga Orban-Szabo 1938 – 2022

Olga Orban-Szabo (ROU), multiple-time Olympic medallist and world champion and a member of the FIE Hall of Fame, passed away on January 5, 2022.

Born on October 9, 1938, in Cluj, Ms. Szabo was the first Olympic medallist and world champion for Romania, and competed in five Olympic Games (Melbourne 1956, Rome 1960, Tokyo 1964, Mexico City 1968 and Munich 1972). She earned her first Olympic medal, a silver in women's individual foil, in Melbourne, and then a bronze in women's team foil in both the Mexico City and Munich Games.

She became individual women's foil world champion at the 1962 Buenos Aires World Championships. As part of the Romanian women's foil team (including Maria Vicol, Ileana Gyulai, Ecaterina Stahl, and Ana Pascu), she took a gold medal at the 1969 Havana World Championships, another first for her country.

In all, Ms. Orban-Szabo earned 11 Olympic and World Championships medals in women's foil, including three from the Olympic Games and eight at the World Championships between 1961 and 1970. Prior to that, she was a junior world silver medallist in 1959.

She also won three medals at the Universiade, including individual silver and team gold in 1961 and team silver in 1965.

As member of the army club "Steaua Bucharest", she won the Romanian national championship seven times, and was awarded the national title of "Emeritus Master of Sport" as well as numerous Romanian orders and titles. She graduated from the Babes-Bolyai University in Cluj-Napoca and was also a fencing master. Following her retirement from competition in 1972, she worked as a youth fencing coach at her club in Bucharest.

"She was a distinguished Lady of the Romanian fencing team", stated Marius Florea, Romanian Federation President. "The Romanian Fencing Federation would like to express its deep gratitude for Mrs. Olga Orban-Szabo's contribution to the foundation of the Romanian fencing family."

José VALARINHO 1935 - 2022

José Valarinho (POR), member of the FIE Hall of Fame, passed away on March 30, 2022, at the age of 87. He was a member of the FIE Disciplinary Commission from 1996 to 2004.

He was awarded a special FIE gold medal three times for his academic work on fencing as well as organising the 1988 FIE Congress in Madeira and the 2002 Lisbon World Championships. He also received the Olympic Order of the Portuguese Olympic Committee and the Medal for Sports Merits by the Portuguese government.

Mr. Valarinho was president of the Portuguese Fencing Federation for two terms beginning in 1992. He joined the organisation in 1969 as president of the Technical Commission, and over several decades he had a significant impact on the growth and

development of fencing in Portugal. He participated in a “Plan for the Development of Sports” with a special programme, “500 Foils”, and worked to support Portugal becoming more active in international fencing.

Mr. Valarinho took part in organising the first European Championships in Lisbon, 1983, as well as multiple other continental and world competitions held in Portugal during the 1980s and 1990s. His vision for Portuguese becoming a strong participant in world fencing was realised fully when his country’s men’s foil team won the gold medal at the 2000 European Championships in Madeira. After his departure from the presidency, he successfully organised the 2002 Lisbon Fencing World Championships.

Having a traditional Portuguese military education, Mr. Valarinho ultimately became an Army officer, and it was during his schooling where he first experienced fencing along with becoming a skilled equestrian. He graduated with honours as a maître at the Military Sports Centre in Mafra, where he was a competitive fencer and took part in the 1959 Universiade as a member of the men’s sabre team. Following school, he became a fencing master, specialised in recruiting and developing young fencers.

He was the author of two books on the history of Portuguese fencing and was in the process of preparing a third edition.

“He was a fencer to his dying day”, said his son, Frederico Valarinho, who has been a member of the Portuguese Fencing Federation since 2006.

Ana PASCU (MH) 1944 - 2022

Ms. Ana Pascu (ROU), FIE Member of Honour and Hall of Fame member, passed away in Bucharest on April 6, 2022. She was born on September 22, 1944.

Elected in 2000, Ms. Pascu served as a member of the FIE Executive Committee, including being vice president from 2004 to 2021. Prior to that, she was a member of the FIE Rules Commission from 1984 to 1988 and of the FIE Refereeing Commission from 1988 to 1996. She was also an FIE international referee in foil and epee.

She holds the record as the longest-serving president of a Romanian Fencing Federation. From 1982 to 2013, Ms. Pascu headed the Federation, contributing to the sporting achievements of Romanian fencers who won 134 medals during her tenure, including nine at the Olympic Games, 57 at the World Championships and 68 at the European Championships. Following her retirement as president, she was appointed honorary president of the Romanian Fencing Federation. She was also vice president of the Romanian Olympic and Sports Committee.

As an athlete, Ms. Pascu was a five-time Olympic foilist, and in team foil she won a bronze medal at the 1968 and 1972 Olympic Games and the gold medal at the 1969 Havana World Championships. In individual foil, she won the Junior World Championships in 1963 as well as the bronze medal at the 1971 World Championships. As part of the Romanian Women’s Foil Team, she won the team foil silver medal at the 1970 World Championships and bronze medals at the 1961, 1967, 1971, 1973, 1974 and 1975 World Championships. In 1961 and 1965, her team won gold and silver, respectively, at the World University Games (“Universiade”).

Ms. Pascu also had a career as a fencing coach and physical education teacher until 1982, having earned a doctorate in physical education and sport. Her doctoral thesis was titled The Strategy for Enhancing Sports Preparation in Competitions. She also held a “Doctor Honoris Causa” from Vasile Goldis University in Romania. She authored numerous scientific and sports publications and was awarded several titles and decorations, including the National Order of Merit in the rank of Officer and Knight.

Ms. Pascu dedicated her entire life to fencing, fencers, Romanian Fencing and the FIE, and the many successes resulting from this are testament to her incredible talent and passion for our sport. In the words of Emmanuel Katsiadakis, FIE Interim President, “She tirelessly, generously and with infinite kindness helped, supported, and motivated all those who sought her help and advice. She was an outstanding mentor and role model for athletes, officials, and leaders in fencing, as well as for girls and women in sport. The fencing family has lost a great lady and an emblematic personality with rare and invaluable

human and professional qualities. She will remain in our memories, in our hearts and in our history."

Mark RANCE 1963 - 2022

Mark Rance (NZL), on May 3, 2022, passed away in Christchurch, New Zealand. He was the current president of the FIE Veterans Council until his passing and had been a member since 2016. Mr. Rance was elected to the Oceania Fencing Confederation board in 2020 and then elected vice president by the board, serving from 2020 until now. He was president of Fencing New Zealand from 2017 until October 2021.

In 2016, Mr. Rance was the chair of the organising committee for the Christchurch Commonwealth Veterans Fencing Championships, named as a finalist in the Canterbury Sports Awards. He also took a silver medal as part of the men's epee team at the same event.

"Mark combined his love of fencing and sound business skills when working with the Veterans Council to get the best outcomes for veteran fencing worldwide", said Rita Comes (USA), on behalf of the FIE Veterans Council. "His presence will be missed."

Originally from England, and born on February 7, 1963, Mr. Rance was a competitive swimmer before discovering fencing at the age of 10. He fenced at the Reading Club and then at the London Thames Fencing Club for several years, achieving strong results in both regional and national events, and later participated in European tournaments and finished in the top 12 epeeists in the 1983 Junior World Championship. In the 1980s, he was considered for being a member of the British Olympic team, although several issues and an injury prevented him from attaining that goal.

Mr. Rance moved to New Zealand in the 1990s, where he lived in the South Island town of Ashburton. After a hiatus from fencing, in 2008 his passion for the sport reignited after attending an epee tournament in Christchurch; he shortly thereafter made the podium at the New Zealand Men's National Championships. From there, he went on to represent New Zealand in both senior and veteran events globally, and in 2010 won a bronze medal in veteran individual men's epee and silver in veteran men's team epee at the Commonwealth Fencing Championships in Melbourne, Australia.

"Mark was always a man who was willing to help, particularly with the young people of our sport who he coached and mentored for several years", stated David Elder, Fencing New Zealand president. "Many young fencers will sorely miss his advice and expertise."

According to Mr. Elder, for a significant period Mr. Rance was the highest-ranked men's veteran epeeist in Australasia (Australia and New Zealand).

Daniel R. DECHAINE Jr 1934 - 2022

Daniel R. DeChaine, Jr. (USA), was a member of the FIE SEMI Commission for more than 30 years.

Born on October 29, 1934 in California, USA, he was best-known for his extensive work as a fencing armorer. He was elected to the SEMI Commission in 1985, serving until 2016. In that role, he was the chief armorer/technician and SEMI Commission representative at numerous world fencing events, including the Pan American Games; Junior, Cadet and Senior Fencing World Championships; and numerous other events. At the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games, he was the technical manager of fencing and the manager of armorers.

In addition to armoury, Mr. DeChaine invented, designed, and constructed test devices for fencing, including ones used at the 1976 and 1984 Olympic Games.

"For decades, Team USA athletes put their trust in Dan DeChaine", said David Arias, chair of the USA Fencing Board of Directors. "With Dan in their corner, our athletes knew they were in good hands. Through his work with the SEMI Commission of the FIE, Dan helped design rules for fencing equipment and invent the test devices that ensured all fencers had an even

playing field. With the passing of Dan DeChaine, the international fencing community has lost a legend of the sport. His legacy will be felt at local, regional, national, and international fencing tournaments for generations.”

In 2007, Mr. DeChaine was inducted into the USA Fencing Hall of Fame, in part for his extensive contributions as the national team armorer at the Olympic Games, World Championships, World University Games and Pan American Games dating back to 1967. He was also the official fencing armorer for the Modern Pentathlon World Championships as well as a consultant to many national fencing federations on armoury, equipment and equipment selection. He served terms as the chairman and co-chairman of the National Technical Commission of the United States Fencing Association and authored numerous articles on equipment repair, maintenance and troubleshooting.

Mr. DeChaine earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Zoology from Pomona College in 1956.

Ahmad Akbari JAVID 1947 – 2022

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Mr. Ahmad Akbari Javid (IRI), on Oct. 17, 2022. He was a member of the FIE Veterans’ Council from 2012 – 2016.

Mr. Javid was born on Feb. 10, 1947 and spent seven decades of his life in fencing. He competed for Iran in individual and team foil and team sabre events at the 1976 Montreal Summer Olympic Games. At the 1974 Asian Games, held in Tehran, Iran, he was a gold and bronze medallist in foil and sabre. In addition to many other achievements in international and Asian competitions, he also received bronze medals in individual men’s foil and the team sabre event at the 2017 Asian Veterans’ Championships.

He served as secretary-general of the Iranian Fencing Federation from 1993 to 1998 and 2009 to 2011, and was a member of the Veterans’ Commission of the Asian Fencing Confederation. He worked for many years as an international foil referee.

Mr. Javid founded the fencing department in the Iranian Ministry of Sports and was responsible for it from 1991 to 2009, and was the director of the Tehran Province Fencing Department from 1989 to 1999. During his life, he also held numerous other roles in Iranian fencing, including being the head of the Iranian University Sports Department. He worked as a sports professor at the Amir Kabir Polytechnic University from 1993 to 2009, chaired the Iranian Training Committee from 2010 to 2017 and was the Iranian national foil coach.

In a statement from the Iranian Fencing Federation, Mr. Javid “...was a coach who contributed all his life to fencing and sport” and “tirelessly, generously and with infinite kindness helped, supported and motivated all those who sought help and advice in fencing and sport”.

Alexey KUZNETSOV 1967 - 2022

Mr. Alexey Kuznetsov (CAN) passed away on Nov. 1 of 2022, born on September 2, 1967, in Luhansk, Ukraine. He was an FIE international referee.

As an FIE foil and epee referee since 1999, Mr. Kuznetsov served at many World Cups, Grand Prix events, Zonal Championships and Games, World Championships and the University Games as well as the Rio 2016 Olympic Games.

He was president of the Pan American Fencing Confederation Federation Refereeing Commission since 2016.

For Canada, Mr. Kuznetsov was a member of the Canadian Fencing Federation Refereeing Committee and the Canadian national coach for the senior men’s foil team from 2013 to 2016. Since 1996, he coached athletes in both Canada and the USA, achieving national and international results. He also was a technical adviser for national and international competitions in Canada, for numerous years providing coaching and refereeing mentorship for the CFF.

Mr. Kuznetsov held a bachelor's degree as a fencing coach and in physical education from the Pedagogical University in Ukraine (1988).

Semen RIKHTMAN 1946 - 2022

Semen Rikhtman (RUS) passed away on Dec. 6, who retired last year from the FIE SEMI Commission. He was born on August 6, 1946.

Mr. Rikhtman was president of the SEMI Commission from 2012 to 2021 and had been a member since 1992. A frequent SEMI delegate to FIE events, he worked at multiple Fencing World Championships as well as the London 2012, Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.

From 2000 to 2012, Mr. Rikhtman was a member of the European Fencing Confederation SEMI Commission.

Mr. Rikhtman graduated with a university degree in radio electronics and was an expert in radio technology. He began developing referee and information systems in 1976 and took part in designing equipment used at major sports events, including at the Olympic Games. Over the course of his career, Mr. Rikhtman was awarded numerous patents and copyrights under his name.

Igor TŠIKINJOV 1961 - 2022

Igor Tšikinjo (EST) passed away on December 8, at the age of 61. Born on June 26, 1961, in Kohtla-Järve, Estonia, he was a renowned Olympic and national coach and former fencer.

Mr. Tšikinjo participated in four Olympic Games as an epee coach, including Sydney 2000, Athens 2004 and Beijing 2008 for the Swedish national team, and Rio 2016 for the Estonian national team.

He was the senior coach of the Estonian women's epee team from 1991 to 1992, after which he was the head coach of the Swedish fencing team from 2003 to 2012. He coached the Estonian epee team from 2013 to 2018, and then from 2020 to 2021. In-between those periods with Estonia, he coached the Uzbekistan fencing team from 2018 to 2019.

His athletes won numerous international medals in epee, including Oksana Jermakova, individual world and two-time Olympic team champion; Erika Kirpu, world, and Olympic team champion; Nikolai Novosjolov, two-time world champion; and Peter Vanky, who competed in four Olympic Games and won numerous international medals. In 2015, his Estonian women's epee team won the European Championships, and the Swedish and Uzbekistan teams also achieved medals in major competitions under his coaching.

Mr. Tšikinjo began fencing in 1973. As an athlete, he became Estonian team champion in 1981 in epee and 1984-1985 in foil.

We express our sincerest condolences to the bereaved families and federations of the deceased.

1.3 Antidoping

1.3.1 CONTROLS

Antidoping measures were continued throughout the period and one antidoping rule violation occurred.

Under the FIE Testing Authority, 395 in-competition tests and 85 out-of-competition were performed. 474 urine tests and 6 blood tests were performed.

1.3.2 CLEAN SPORT EDUCATION

In cooperation with International Testing Agency, the FIE provided one-hour, interactive anti-doping webinars available to all athletes, coaches, and officials, prior to the Junior and Cadet World Championships and prior to the Senior World Championships.

The webinars took place respectively:

on March 12 and March 26, 2022 (total number of participants: 118)

on June 28 and June 29, 2022 (total number of participants: 69)

The programmes were presented in English, French and Spanish and covered key clean-sport topics including prohibited substances, medications and supplements and therapeutic-use exemptions (TUEs).

The webinars were presented by the ITA, by Jeremy Summers, President of the FIE Medical Commission and Dr Sabrina Halaimia, Member of the FIE Medical Commission. Attendees received an official certificate of participation as well as a PDF of the presentation and links for useful related resources.

Furthermore, the International Testing Agency (ITA), in partnership with the FIE, presented five multi-language webinars addressing anti-doping and Clean Sport principles, information and practices for athletes, coaches and federations. These Clean Sport webinars were part of the FIE educational programmes, and all FIE athletes and coaches have been highly encouraged to participate in all sessions; for those who attended, a certificate of completion was awarded. A total of 124 participants registered and participated in the webinars.

The programmes, presented in English with simultaneous interpreting in Arabic, Spanish, French, Russian and Chinese, included the following topics at the following dates and times:

1.4 Media - Digital, TV and Magazine

1.4.1 FIE MEDIA IN 2022

During 2022, the FIE continued to increase its communication through multiple media platforms include its website, magazine (both online and printed issues) and social channels of Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube. The media coverage on signature events (Senior World Championships and Grand Prix) resulted in fruitful outcomes that guaranteed the continuous growth of digital channels.

The FIE Grand Prix staged six events in 2021-2022 season, including 11-13 November 2021 in Orleans, 28-30 January 2022 in Doha, 04-06 March 2022 in Budapest, 29 April 01 May 2022 in Cairo, 13-15 May 2022 in Incheon and 20-22 May 2022 in Padua.

The partnership with Eurosport and collaboration with global rightsholders has driven the growth of our global audience and media exposure.

1.4.2 DIGITAL CHANNELS

2022 was the first year following the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, and some metrics experienced anticipated post-Olympic decline to some degree. However, as the Senior World Championships (Cairo 2022) were held for the first time since the pandemic, as well as six Grand Prix events being staged, the FIE managed to keep all the digital channels growing robustly by fully leveraging these events. In addition, some initiatives such as World Fencing Day and Donate Your Fencing Gear also brought abundant content for non-competition coverage.

Through a promotional collaboration with Eurosport, the FIE digital campaign on the Eurosport website and application generated 39.3 million impressions.

During Cairo 2022, the videos produced by ICARUS provided with high-quality content for the event coverage.

Below are some key facts:

Website

In 2022, the FIE website reached 8.9 million page views, increasing by 48.3% (six million in 2021); it was visited by 850K million new users (1.1 million in 2021) and received 2.5 million sessions, increasing by 25% (2 million in 2021).

Among all countries/regions, USA (13%), Hong Kong China (9.6%), China (8.6%), France (7.6%) and Italy (5.5%) were the top five with the most users. The ranking was the same for new users.

YouTube

In 2022, the FIE YouTube channel experienced 4.6 million views, 21% more than 2021. The viewing time was 557K hours, a 46% increase. Even while the 767K video views represented 49% less than 2021, the 3.9 million live views were 66% more for the same period.

With 10K new subscribers added, the subscriptions reached 84,854 by the end of 2022, a 13% increase.

Facebook

In 2022, the FIE Facebook account received 29 million impressions and a reach of 11 million, a decrease of 19% and 53%, respectively. But the engagement reached 641K, a 21% increase. The number of followers reached 131,569, with 5.4K new followers added.

Twitter

In 2022, the FIE Twitter account received 1.47 million impressions (a 66% decrease) and engagements of 55K. The number of followers reached 22,426 with 1.6K new followers added.

Instagram

In 2022, the FIE Instagram account experienced 11 million impressions, 8.9 million reach and 872K engagements, a decrease of 26%, 29% and 31.5%, respectively. With 26K new users added, the total amount reached 98K by the end of 2022.

During the Cairo 2022 World Championships

The FIE website had 684K page views and 213K sessions, with 68K new users visiting the site.

The YouTube channel had 1.7 million views and 2.8K new subscribers. "The FIE YouTube channel aired by far the most content – 362 hours of broadcast time", according to Nielsen analytics.

- Facebook received 5.1 million impressions, a 2.3 million reach with 158K engagements
- Twitter had 244K impressions and 12K engagements
- Instagram received 1.7 million impressions, 1.4 million reaches with 144K engagements

The decline of some metrics, such as impressions and engagements, was expected due to the expected post-Olympic period, but there were still some surprises from Facebook, YouTube and the FIE website –for example, livestreaming on YouTube obtained more views than 2021. In general, growth was observed on all the channels, and the strategy of focusing on the commitment and interaction of athletes and the public on social media continues.

1.4.3 TELEVISION

Grand Prix Events

(* for the Grand Prix, the metrics of the "2021-2022 season" include Orleans GP in Nov 2021 but not the Orleans GP in Dec 2022)

The rightsholders include the Olympic Channel, Eurosport (tv) and PCCW (streaming).

FIE Grand Prix broadcasting accumulated an audience of 18.24 million viewers, including the top-five markets by cumulative audiences: France (8.3 million), Hungary (5 million), Germany (2 million), Russia (0.7 million) and South Korea (0.6 million). Grand Prix events total broadcast time reached 984.5 hours while visibility reached 478 hours. Eurosport channels across European countries top 10: Estonia, Iceland, Sweden, Finland, Denmark, Belgium, Hungary, Norway, France, and Switzerland contributed to the major segments.

Grand Prix events received 256 million impressions, with 62 million of them coming from France (the most among all countries) and France 3 (57.3 million), the most of all TV channels.

Cairo Senior World Championships

Cairo 2022 received nearly 148 million audience views via the FIE's YouTube channel, Olympic Channels and rightsholders in multiple countries (Brazil, China, Colombia, Egypt, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Japan, Poland, Russia, South Korea, Spain, Ukraine, USA). The top five markets by total audiences included Italy (50.2 million), China (27.7 million), France (24.8 million), Japan (15.7 million) and South Korea (10.29 million). China's CCTV5 topped all TV channels as it contributed a 27.7 million total viewing audience.

Cairo 2022's total broadcast time reached 1633 hours, while visibility reached 3410 hours. The top five countries/regions, in terms of total broadcast time, included Italy (56.5 hours), Belgium (56 hours), Malaysia (47 hours), Pan-Asia (47 hours) and Hungary (44 hours).

The event obtained 1.91 billion impressions in total, with Italy (303.5 million) accounting for the largest share, followed by China (93 million), Hungary (84 million), France (63 million) and Egypt (59 million). Among all TV channels, Rai Sport+ HD and CCTV5 were the top two contributors, providing 153 million impressions and 93 impressions, respectively.

Eurosport

In the 2021-2022 season, FIE events (Grand Prix events, European Championships, World Championships) had a duration of 157 hours, 6 minutes for global TV broadcasts on Eurosport 1, Eurosport 2 and Eurosport Asia. 150 TV spots recorded 56.1 million impacts on Eurosport 1&2, reaching 13.6 million unique viewers.

1.4.4 OFFICIAL 2022 FIE PRESS RELEASES

In 2022, the FIE continued direct communication with the press and other interested parties subscribing to official FIE news, publishing and distributing with more than 50 press releases to media and press worldwide. This represents more than 168,000 individual emails sent with FIE news and information about events, projects, and other newsworthy bulletins.

1.4.5 DIGITAL MAGAZINE – ESCRIME XXI

In 2022, with three issues (No.120-122) published, the online magazine received 3.6K page views, a slight decrease compared with 2021 (3.9K). The average time on each page was 1min 30s, an increase of 1 minute, 19s from 2021.

1.4.6 CHANGES & EVOLUTION

In 2022, the FIE started to consider improved ways to utilise media content as well as protecting our rights. As a result, it was decided to launch in 2023 a new image hub that will be a library for all FIE photos, including a monetising feature, and to launch an OTT platform that will be the hub for displaying and storing FIE videos. Both programmes are in process.

By the end of 2022, about it was decided to consider an alternative to the digital magazine to increase exposure and reach to readers worldwide, and this programme is in process.

The sixth-annual World Fencing Day, which took place on Saturday, September 10, has given fencers and everyone in the global fencing family the opportunity to celebrate this year's theme, "Fencing is for Life". By reaching out to people and communities worldwide, members of fencing have communicated its timeless and enduring qualities—a sport that fills the heart, mind and soul with a positive and powerful energy that becomes forever motivational and illuminating.

Every member of the Fencing Family had the opportunity on World Fencing Day, to convey how being involved in fencing becomes a natural and essential part of one's personal identity, giving strength and shaping each person's life and future.

With global support for World Fencing Day, more than 4,500 media tags across multiple social media platforms expressed a diversity of fencing perspectives, activities, and postings from 65 countries and reaching more than 130,000 accounts, using their favourite platform with the following tags:

The "Fencing is for Life" theme resonated around the world as a message of inspiration and life experience, a perennial sport that has endured the ages and will continue to do so.

1.7 FIE Safeguarding trainings

1.7.1 WEBINAR FOR MEMBERS OF THE FIE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, COMMISSIONS, COUNCILS AND COMMITTEES.

As part of ongoing work to implement its safeguarding policy, the FIE organised a safeguarding training webinar that took place on June 23 on Zoom.

The training programme was led by the FIE safeguarding officers Georgina Usher (GBR), president of the FIE Women and Fencing Council and Samuel Cheris (USA, MH), president of the FIE Legal Commission. The objective of the event was to provide members of the Executive Committee as well as the commissions and councils and the FIE staff with a thorough understanding of safeguarding concepts and the different tools the FIE puts at the disposal of all its members to provide a sport environment free from harassment/abuse/neglect.

The session included an introduction to safeguarding in sport, an overview of the legal framework in place and a focus on the FIE safeguarding policy and procedures, with a specific emphasis on the responsibilities of the supervisors at World Cups and Grand Prix competitions to manage and report disclosures.

The webinar consisted of three parts:

- A main session
- Discussion groups
- Q&A final session

About 70 people took part in the webinar.

WEBINARS FOR NATIONAL FEDERATIONS

The FIE hosted two Safe Sport webinars to help federations implement, review, and improve safeguarding policies at the national level. They took place on Tuesday, Dec. 13 at 1400 CET and Wednesday, Dec. 14 at 2000 CET to provide the widest-possible reach around the world. Simultaneous interpretation in French and Spanish was provided.

Approximately 60 people attended the webinars, which were organised by the FIE and led by Georgina Usher, president of the FIE Women and Fencing Council, FIE safeguarding officer and certified IOC International safeguarding officer in sport.

The presentations included two parts:

- The definition of safeguarding, the definition of the different kinds of abuse and harassment and practical references and examples of the impact the different kinds of abuse and harassment can have and FIE, IOC and international organisations and members.
- Thorough guidelines and practical steps presented to support drafting safeguarding policies, including preparation, development, content, application, and implementation.

The FIE is committed to ensuring fencing is practiced in a safe environment, where athletes harmoniously and all the members of the FIE family are granted respect and protected from all forms of harassment and abuse.

2.3 Oceania Fencing Master Academy (OFMA)

Oceania Fencing Confederation (OFC) Coaching Commission

- The Commission met monthly via Zoom technology and phone during 2022 to plan and progress various OFMA projects.
- A 2022 Coach Education Plan was developed to assist the post Covid-19 restart of Fencing activities in Oceania. Two of the planned activities were an online Level 1 Foil Course and supporting Fencing New Zealand with their Olympic Solidarity Technical Course for Coaches (Foil).
- The Commission continued development of the OFMA Coach Assessor Training Course and continues to administer the operational activities of OFMA.

OFMA Coach Education

- Under the auspices of OFMA, the OFC partnered with Global Fencing Masters (GFM) to advertise and conduct an online Level 1 Foil Course. Using a web-based learning platform, a phone app and Zoom technology, the Course was presented over 3 months to 25 Coaches from Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Guam, and Papua New Guinea.
- With Covid-19 restrictions being lifted, the Regional Development Officer was able to travel to Guam, Brisbane, and Melbourne to conduct face-to-face review of the course content and assessments for most participants in the online Course. Coaching Commission members in New Zealand also conducted reviews and assessments at four locations.
- Fencing New Zealand (FeNZ) received funding from the IOC and New Zealand Olympic Committee for an Olympic Solidarity Technical Foil Course for Coaches. This course was also supported by the FIE. The Course was held in Christchurch from 12-20 December 2022. OFMA assisted with planning and delivery. Maître Zoltan Bernat of the FIE Coaching Academy, Budapest was the Head Coach for this extremely successful event. 33 student coaches enjoyed the benefits of his high-level fencing knowledge & experience.
- OFMA established a panel including Maître Bernat and representatives of the OFC Coaching Commission to conduct Level 2 Foil Assessments. 14 coaches chose to be assessed and were successful in gaining their Level 2 Foil accreditation. Each received a Level 2 Certificate from OFMA.
- The IOC provided FeNZ with a certificate template for the Course & all 33 participants received a personalised copy.

All 2022 Class students successfully finalised Academy programme and received their FIE recognised Fencing Coaching Diploma. Diplomas were delivered by the FIE Sport and Technical Director Mr Dieter Lammer.

At the graduation Ceremony each student received a complete set of the coaching equipment donated by the FIE.

2.4.2 BUDAPEST

Budapest Coaching Academy 2022 returned after two years of no activity due of Covid-19 Pandemic. The Academy strategy, as decided on 2016, is to open education center for coaches, where coaches from all over the world could come to learn and improve their level, so they can return home with updated and first level knowledge.

During 2022, three 3-month courses were organized:

Sabre: from January 17th to April 18th 2022, attended by 8 selected students (4 from Asia, 3 from Europe and 1 from Pan America), we had 2 women and 6 men.

Epee: from April 25th to July 26th 2022, attended by 8 selected students (6 from Europe, 1 from Asia, and 1 from Pan America), we had 3 women and 5 men.

Foil: from August 1st to November 1st 2022, attended by 8 selected students (6 from Asia and 2 from Europe), we had 1 woman and 7 men.

The training sessions were scheduled from Monday to Friday, 6 hours per day, for 12 weeks.

The Hungarian University for Physical Education joined the program and provided theory lessons on psychology, physiology, biomechanics and theory of sports. As part of this agreement, the University acknowledges the Academy training and awards internationally-recognized Level 2 diplomas to those Academy students who pass the final exam.

At the end of the program both practical and theoretical exam were done to demonstrate and proved learned knowledge.

The experts selected to provide the specific fencing training are renowned fencing coaches:

2.6 Equipment aid

The criteria used to perform the analysis and allocate the equipment were as follows:

- Specific requirements: participation in FIE competitions or competitions other than the FIE ones.
- Federations in need of equipment for organising important competitions (Olympic Games, World Championships, Grand Prix, World Cup, Continental Championships, Regional Games, Universiades).
- Special cases.

The budget for 2022 was 600'000 CHF.

The FIE awarded equipment to be received by 103 federations: 25 in Europe, 25 in Asia, 3 in Oceania, 25 in the Americas and 25 in Africa. The federations received equipment worth CHF 6000.

The operations for the equipment distribution started in August 2022.

2.7 Donate your fencing gear.

After a stop of two years, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the FIE was able to resume the solidarity programme "Donate your fencing gear".

Two collection events were carried out in Dubai during the Junior and Cadet World Championships and in Cairo during the Senior World Championships.

In total, over 300 pieces of equipment were collected and examined by the dedicated SEMI delegates, respectively Samer Hashem (EGY) and Baiba Brandule (LAT).

5 countries, having previously presented solidarity and grassroots projects, received equipment:

- Brazil
- Colombia
- Guam
- Kenya
- Paraguay

All the donors received a certificate in recognition of their contribution and generosity and their pictures, when permitted, were published on the FIE social media.

2.8 Assistance with athletes' participation programme 2022

Since 2009, the FIE has implemented a special aid programme for the athletes from federations participating in senior regional championships and the World Championship (junior and senior).

For each national federation taking part, all the confederations received a subsidy intended to cover expenses (plane ticket and hotel) for an athlete entering for:

- The Junior and Cadet World Championships
- The Senior Zonal Championships
- The Senior World Championships

2.9 Assistance for Confederations

All confederations received an annual subsidy and a subsidy for their administrative expenses.

The confederations employing a sport director received an additional subsidy to pay this director's salary.

2.10 Assistance for competition organisers

National federations having organised an FIE competition (senior World Cup, Grand Prix) and applying, received a subsidy of CHF 3 000 to cover the cost of video refereeing.

The FIE subsidised the cost of the Swiss Timing equipment for the Grand Prix events and Senior World Championships.

2.11 Fencing Equipment Repair Course in South Africa

A workshop focused on fencing weapons repair was held at the FIE Coaching Academy in Johannesburg, South Africa from Sept. 22 – 26, with attendees participating from five African nations. The FIE invited Mr. Gilles Martinage (FRA) to lead the course.

Some of the topics covered in the programme included: an overview of electrical signalling systems (e.g., in cables, reels, scoring apparatus, pistes); general basics regarding electricity and electrical equipment; specifics of electrical circuits in epees and foils; diagnosing and localising various systemwide failures, from weapon to scoring machine; fitting weapons with new blades and ensuring they are secure, wired and operating correctly; details about foil and epee points, including proper weights, connections and operation as well as how to diagnose problems; and weapons control operations and logistics at a competition, including rules, organising weapons control and ensuring safety measures.

“The trainees were particularly attentive and eager to learn”, said Mr. Martinage. “They made the most of the numerous practical exercises to acquire the initial know-how necessary for the maintenance of the various types of equipment.”

The topics covered included theoretical and practical elements and included recalls in connection with FIE rules.

2.12.2.1 FIE COMPETITIONS IN ASIA

Also, in Kuwait, U23 was successfully organised where more than 23 countries participated.

2.12.2.2 CONFERENCES AND SEMINARS IN THE ASIAN REGION

With new initiatives and framework for the development and promotion of fencing globally, the Fencing Confederation of Asia successfully organised significant events in 2022:

- FCA General Assembly in Dubai, where important decisions were taken for the growth and development of the FCA
- Intercontinental Conferences in Tashkent, where a cooperation between 3 Confederations; Pan- American, African, and Asian was signed.

2.12.2.3 NEW REFEREES IN ASIA FOR FCA IN INTERNATIONAL CATEGORY

From 1st to 6th of October 2022, Kuwait City welcomed 70 candidates from 14 countries, who were entered in the FIE refereeing exam.

2.12.2.4 2022 FCA REFEREES' EXAMS CATEGORY C IN DUBAI

50 participants from 11 Asian countries took part in these seminars and exams. 11 female referees also took part in these seminars and exams.

Referees successfully received category C- In foil - 21 licenses, In epee - 29 licenses and in sabre - 10 licenses.

2.12.2.5 INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR IN MALAYSIA, 2022, WITH FOCUS ON EMBRACING WOMEN AS FENCING REFEREES

In August 2022, the International Women's Judicial Seminar and Group C Exams were held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, which was attended by more than 61 potential women referees. This proved to be major progress in the education of a new courts in the Asian continent as well.

2.12.2.6 FIE COACHING COURSES

The main goal of these seminars is to increase the level of knowledge in the preparation of top-level athletes. It is very important for the Asian Fencing Confederation to increase the quality of the training system for the developing National Federations/ Associations and have more high-level athletes in the region. The following courses were organised:

- EPEE - September 18-28, 2022, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia
- SABRE - October 17-27, 2022, Bangkok, Thailand
- FOIL - October 24 – November 2, 2022, Tashkent, Uzbekistan

More than 70 coaches from several developing countries in Asia participated in these international courses.

2.12.2.7 INTERNATIONAL PHILANTHROPIC MISSION

FIE maraging blades, fencing bags, and FIE masks were awarded to 17 Asian countries. This mission was a vital support for the development of National Federations.

The President of the Asian Fencing Confederation H.H. Engr. Sheikh Salem Sultan Al-Qasimi, presented the fencing equipment to the National Fencing Federations during the JCAFC 2022 in Tashkent.

2.12.2.8 DEVELOPMENT OF FIE AID PROGRAMME

In the framework of FIE AID programme 2022, 25 Asian Fencing Confederation countries were selected to receive the equipment for fencing as per FIE competition standards. Some of the countries received pistes for competitions upon their request while some received the FIE maraging blades and others received FIE full competition uniforms.

2.12.3 PAN AMERICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

2.12.3.1 PAN AMERICAN CADET AND JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS 2022

They were held in the city of Lima, Peru, from 21 to 27 March 2022. After two years without holding this event due to the pandemic, the activity was resumed with the dynamic participation of young athletes from our continent. The competitions were held in the National Sports Village (VIDENA) and had more than 300 athletes in the cadet and junior categories.

2.12.3.2 PAN AMERICAN SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIP 2022

In the city of Asunción, Paraguay, from 2 to 8 June 2022, the 2022 Pan American Senior Championships were held, which was also the qualifying event for the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games. The competitions took place in the facilities of the central sports centre of the Olympic Park in Asunción.

2.12.3.3 PAN AMERICAN CHILDREN'S AND VETERANS' CHAMPIONSHIP 2022

From 22 to 26 August 2022, the Pan American Children's and Veterans' Championships took place in Lima, Peru,. After 2 years, the competitions in these categories were resumed. The participation was massive in this event.

2.12.3.4 2022 COACHES' COURSES

During 2022, 3 coaches' courses were held in the Pan American zone. All 3 were held in Lima, Peru.

SABRE: From 9 to 20 August the sabre coaches' course was held with master Zoran Tulum (USA), the venue on this occasion was the Punta Roca complex in Lima. Twenty-one coaches took part and made the most of the teachings and experiences of an Olympic coach.

FOIL: from 6 to 17 October the course for foil coaches was held in the city of Lima, on this occasion the venue for the activities was in the VIDENA (National Sports Village of Peru), 19 coaches saw activity from the hand of the master Petru Kuki (ROU) with his extensive experience in the training of athletes and coaches.

EPEE: From 10 to 20 December 2022, the epee course was held at the Club Terrazas, Lima. For this last course the presentation was given by master Jerzy Konczalski (POL), with a long record as a coach and now as a teacher; he shared with all the participants his experience at competitive and training level. There were 20 participants who had the opportunity to acquire the master's knowledge.

2.12.3.5 CPE 2022 CONGRESS

In Panama City, Panama, the annual Pan American Congress was held on 22 October 2022, at the Hotel Las Americas Golden Tower, where the presidents and delegates of the affiliated national federations met. An atmosphere of friendship, cordiality and enthusiasm reigned to prepare for the upcoming activities. The president, Mr. Vitaly Logvin interacted with all delegates to work together on all projects and challenges for 2023.

2.12.4 OCEANIA FENCING CONFEDERATION

2.12.4.1 DEVELOPING NEW FEDERATIONS IN THE PACIFIC

The OFC currently has six full members (American Samoa, Australia, Guam, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, and Samoa) and two Associate Members (Tahiti and New Caledonia).

Post-COVID travel restrictions, we have continued to support the Fiji Fencing Federation by including two coaches in our coach education activities and assisting with future planning.

2.12.4.2 DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES AFTER THE ARRIVAL OF COVID-19

- Due to the Covid-19 pandemic in the first half of the year, the OFC adapted its mode of delivery to online activities as it did in 2020 and 2021.
- The OFC Annual General Meeting was held in July on Zoom and attended by the Mr Katsiadakis, Interim President of the FIE. Five OFC Board meetings were also held on Zoom.
- OFC Administration was carried out on email, Skype, and phone, with regular meetings between the OFC President, Regional Development Officer and the OFC Secretary/Finance Officer.
- The OFC Coaching Commission met online fourteen times using Zoom.
- As the Regional Development Officer was not able to travel to carry out his usual activities face-to-face with member federations, the OFC and the Oceania Fencing master's Academy (OFMA) partnered with Global Fencing Masters (GFM) to carry out a three-month trial of the GFM Level 1 Online Foil Course in order to investigate remote learning opportunities for coaches. 25 student coaches from Australia, New Zealand, Guam, PNG, and Fiji participated and the trial was deemed to be very successful.
- The online trial was followed up in the second half of 2022 with face-to-face content review and assessments of the trainee coaches which were funded by a grant obtained from the Organisation for Sports Federations of Oceania (OSFO).
- A very successful Referee Development Seminar was held in Auckland, New Zealand from 18 to 20 October, delivered by the President of the FIE Refereeing Commission, Ms Irina Knysch. Thirty-nine (39) people participated across three sessions, plus 16 participated online. About 20 of the referees were coached and mentored by Irina during the championship that followed the seminars. This had a very positive effect on the expertise and knowledge of the participants and will be very important in lifting the level of refereeing in Oceania.
- Thanks to the IOC, New Zealand Olympic Committee and the FIE, an extremely successful Olympic Solidarity Technical Course for Coaches in Foil was hosted by Fencing New Zealand in Christchurch from 11 to 20 December. The course was delivered by Maître Zoltan Bernat, Head Coach at the FIE Coaching Academy in Budapest and 33 coaches from Australia, New Zealand and Guam participated.

2.12.4.3 OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The Oceania Cadet Championships were held in Sydney, Australia from 1 to 2 July.
- The Oceania Veteran Championships were held in Auckland, New Zealand from 22 to 24 October.
- The Oceania Senior Championships were held in Adelaide, Australia from 25 to 30 November.

The events were attended by fencers from Tahiti, New Zealand and Australia, but we are hoping that more of our member federations will be able to compete in 2023, with the return to travel around the Pacific.

2.12.4.4 PARTICIPATION IN FIE EVENTS INCLUDING THE ASIA-OCEANIA OLYMPIC QUALIFICATION TOURNAMENT

OFC President Helen Smith, Mr Vince Elias (Australia) and Mr Matthew Baker (New Zealand) were appointed in 2022 to the FIE Working Groups on the FIE Competition Calendar, the Review of the Olympic Qualification System and Fencing and the Environment respectively.

Fencers from Oceania participated in the World and Asian Junior, Cadet and Senior Championships, the World Veteran Championships, as well as in many other FIE events and the Commonwealth Championships.

Fencers from New Zealand participated in the FIE Training Camps held before both the Junior and Senior World Championships in Dubai and Cairo.

Three Oceania referees were successful in the FCA C Licence Referee examinations held in 2022. All are hoping to continue along this path to become FIE B Category referees.

With the help of a travel subsidy from the FIE, all Oceania federations were represented either by a Delegate or Proxy at the FIE Congress held in Lausanne on 26 November.

2.12.4.5 SUPPORT FROM FIE

The OFC appreciates the invaluable and generous administrative and technical support it receives from the interim President, the CEO and all the staff at the FIE office.

The OFC acknowledges the important financial support it receives annually from the FIE. The OFC greatly appreciated the additional support received during the Covid crisis.

Unfortunately, with a substantial cut to FIE funding as of 2023, it may be difficult in the future to maintain the same number and quality of OFC development activities.

2.12.5 AFRICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

2.12.5.1 TOURNAMENTS

- 1.** Organisation of the African Cadet-Juniors Championships: The African Cadet-Juniors Fencing Championships were organised by the Fencing Federation of Nigeria in Lagos (Nigeria) from February 22nd to 27th, 2022.
