SUMMARY OF DECISIONS

1. VALIDATION OF ATTENDANCES AND PROXIES

136 federations took part in the Congress, of which **107** were present and **29** were represented.

2. RATIFICATION OF NEW FEDERATIONS

The affiliation of the Fencing Federation of Montenegro (MNE) was ratified by the Congress.

3. APPROVAL OF THE REPORT OF THE 2022 CONGRESS HELD IN LAUSANNE (SUI)

The report of the 2022 Congress held in Lausanne (SUI) was approved.

4. APPROVAL OF THE REPORT OF THE 2023 EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS HELD ONLINE

The report of the 2023 Extraordinary Congress held online was approved.

5. APPROVAL OF THE 2022 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The 2022 annual report of the Executive Committee was approved.

6. 2022 FINANCIAL REPORT, AUDITORS' REPORT, APPROVAL OF THE ACCOUNTS, DISCHARGE OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AND OF THE AUDITORS

The 2022 financial report, the accounts and the Auditors' report were approved.

Discharge was granted to the Executive Committee and the Auditors.

7. BUDGET 2024

The budget for 2024 was approved.

SUMMARY OF DECISIONS

Amendments to the FIE Statutes

The texts below are applicable from January 1, 2024, unless otherwise indicated.

Article 3.3

COMPOSITION AND REPRESENTATION

- 3.3.1 The FIE member Federations may be represented at a FIE Congress by 2 delegates, ~~whose names must be made known to the FIE Head Office one month before the Congress in writing.~~ Members of the Executive Committee, the Commissions, ~~and~~ the permanent councils ("Councils") ~~and of the Ethics Committee~~ have the right to take part in the Congress.

At FIE Elective Congresses, the FIE member Federations may be represented by 2 delegates. In addition, the following individuals have the right to take part in FIE Elective Congresses:

- current members of the Executive Committee
- current presidents of commissions, councils and committees
- candidates to elected positions

All participants in the FIE Congresses must be registered by their national federation, 40 calendar days before the opening day of the Congress and using the platform or tool that will be made available by the FIE.

Article 4.1

GENERAL RULES

- 4.1.2 Candidates for the Executive Committee, a Commission, a Council, the Ethics Committee or the Disciplinary Panel may be proposed by an FIE Member Federation, subject to the following conditions ~~and requirements~~:

- only one candidate may be proposed by each Member Federation for each post
- a candidate can only be presented by the Member Federation (treated in 4.4.1, 4.6.2 and 4.7.1) whom the candidate has nationality.

- ~~4.1.3~~ - ~~A~~ all the candidatures ~~must be received on the FIE platform or tool~~ ~~shall reach the FIE Head Office~~ no later than 00:00 hrs Lausanne time ~~40~~ 50 calendar days before the opening day of the Elective Congress.

- ~~the~~ the candidatures submitted on the FIE platform or tool must include a CV (maximum length of one page of A4 format) stating ~~must be presented by means of a form provided by the FIE (one single page of A4 format) which must include~~ the languages spoken as well as the degrees or other qualifications for the particular ~~commission~~ position. A photocopy of an identity document stating the candidate's date of birth and nationality (passport, identity card, driving licence) must be provided with the candidature.

- 4.1.3 The ~~administrative office of the FIE will include the~~ list of all the candidates as well as the CVs that have been received ~~will be included~~ in the documents relating to the Congress.

- 4.1.4 The FIE Bureau rejects candidatures which do not respect the FIE Statutes or the IOC Code of Ethics. Each national federation can contest the list of the candidates communicated by the Bureau. All questions will in the last instance be considered by the Executive Committee, after advice from the Legal Commission and the persons concerned. In case of urgency an opinion can be obtained by fax or e-mail.

Article 4.4.2

To be candidate for a permanent commission or the Ethics Committee a person must hold a licence from his National Federation except if he is a Member of Honour, be at least 21 years of age on the date of the elections and enjoy the full civic rights of the country to which he belongs.

~~It is desirable that the candidates for various Commissions have specific professional knowledge or credentials as follows:~~

A candidate for the Medical Commission **must** have completed the educational requirements for being an MD, DO or DC ~~or have practiced~~ and hold a valid and active licence, or **be qualified and be practicing as a physiotherapist or have been a member of this Commission for at least two mandates.**

A candidate for the Legal Commission **must** have the educational requirements or ~~be practising~~ **have practiced** as a lawyer, judge or notary **or have been a member of this Commission for at least two mandates;**

A candidate for the Promotion, Communication and Marketing Commission **must:**

- have a college or university degree in Marketing, Communications or Media
 - or have professional experience in Marketing, Communications or Media
 - or have been a member of this Commission for at least two mandates.
-

A candidate for the Refereeing Commission **must:**

- be or have been an FIE category B or A referees in at least two weapons; and
 - be a current member **or have been a member for at least two mandates** of the Refereeing Commission, or have refereed in official FIE competitions in at least two weapons in at least two (2) of the 4 fencing seasons (1 September to 31 August) preceding his candidature; and
 - have refereed, at least once, in one weapon, in the table of eight **or** semi-final or final of the individual or team event of a senior World Cup, or a Grand Prix, or a World Championships or the Olympic Games of the 4 fencing seasons preceding his candidature,
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A candidate for the SEMI Commission **must** have a college degree in engineering or ~~science~~ **in a subject relating to the work of the SEMI Commission** or be practising as an engineer **or have been a member of this Commission for at least two mandates.**

Article 4.4.3

~~a)~~ For the elections to the permanent commissions **and the Ethics Committee**, the 10 candidates with the most votes are elected subject to the fact that they must be of different nationalities.

~~b) For the election to the Ethics Committee, the 5 candidates with the most votes are elected subject to the fact that they must be of different nationalities.~~

Application: Next elective Congress (2024).

Article 4.4.4

a) If the 10 candidates to a Commission **or the Ethics Committee** who have obtained the most votes do not include at least 3 persons of each gender, the Commission will consist of the 3 candidates of the under- represented gender who have obtained the greatest number of votes and the 7 candidates of the other gender who have obtained the greatest number of votes.

~~b) For the Ethics Committee, if the 5 members who have obtained the most votes do not include at least 2 persons of each gender, the Committee will consist of 2 candidates of the under-represented gender who have obtained the greatest number of votes and 3 candidates of the other gender who have obtained the greatest number of votes~~

Application: Next elective Congress (2024).

Article 4.5

ELECTION OF THE ATHLETES COMMISSION.

4.5.1 The elections for the Athletes Commission are held at the ~~Open~~ **Senior** World Championships in the year following the Olympic Games.

4.5.2 All athletes who, in the weapon in which they fence, have been entered to compete in either one of the last two Olympic Games or at least one of the ~~Open~~ **Senior** World Championships held over the last 5 years can be a candidate for the Athletes Commission.
If the fencer has fenced several weapons during such competitions, he must choose only one of those weapons for this candidature.

Each member federation can nominate one single athlete ~~for~~ **to** the Athletes Commission

4.5.3 Each member federation shall indicate to the FIE the name of its candidate two months before the first day of the ~~Open-Senior~~ **Senior** World Championships in the year following the Olympic Games.

4.5.4 One month before the **Senior** World Championships, the FIE shall send to each member federation the list of the candidates.

4.5.5 The athletes who will participate in the ~~Open~~ **Senior** World Championships in the year following the Olympic Games will elect ~~six-seven~~ **six** representatives (always among the athletes nominated by the member Federations) ~~for a four year term~~.

4.5.6 A list of candidates will be established, all weapons combined, and each participant shall vote for ~~6~~ **seven** athletes maximum, whatever weapon the athletes are applying for.

4.5.7 The voting athletes will personally go to the **voting** office of the FIE at the competition site **in order to proceed with the vote** ~~to fill in their voting slip and deposit them in the ballot box~~, after having verified their identity by presenting their accreditation.

The athlete's accreditation will be scanned or the athlete will sign ~~and having signed~~ the attendance sheet.

4.5.8 **Voting may be conducted electronically. If the vote is not organised by electronic means but by means of paper ballots,** ~~o~~ **One** single ballot box will be provided for all weapons.

- 4.5.9 The voting will be open for all weapons and will begin on the first day of the **Senior** World Championships and will end at noon local time on the last day of the World Championships.
- 4.5.10 The **seven** candidates who have received the greatest number of votes will be elected, without distinction of weapon.
- 4.5.11 In case of a tie, the candidate who has the highest placing in the world Open ranking on the date of the opening of the **Open Senior** World Championships will have the preference.
- 4.5.12 The Executive Committee, at its first meeting after these **Open-Senior** World Championships, will nominate up to **6 five** athletes among the list of athletes submitted by their national federations. ~~The athletes are nominated for a four year term.~~ If the submitted candidacies allow it, all 6 weapons and four zones – Europe, America, Africa and Asia/Oceania – must be represented within the commission.
- 4.5.13 The federations will be informed of the result of the athletes' votes at the closing ceremony of the **Open Senior** World Championships. ~~and t~~The complete list of **elected and appointed athletes names** will be **sent to the federations provided by the Executive Committee** with as little delay as possible.
- 4.5.14 The Athletes' Commission thus formed shall remain in office until the Senior World Championships held after the next Olympic Games.

Application: next elections of the Athletes Commission (2025).

Article 6.9

THE ETHICS COMMITTEE

The Ethics Committee is made up of **five ten** voting members elected by the Congress.

Application: Next elective Congress (2024).

Chapter 13, Safeguarding Officer

During the Junior/Cadet and Senior and Veterans World Championships, incidents of harassment/abuse/neglect can be reported to the FIE Safeguarding Officer on site.

During Open World Cups and Junior World Cups, incidents of harassment/abuse/neglect can be reported to the FIE Supervisor, acting as the FIE Safeguarding officer. This responsibility shall be added to the list of responsibilities of Supervisors.

The FIE shall designate Safeguarding Officers to other official FIE events, for example, training camps.

The FIE shall ensure that the FIE Safeguarding Officers receive appropriate training and support for carrying out their responsibilities under this policy.

Zonal Confederations shall appoint at least one person to serve as a Safeguarding Officer at each Zonal Championship. All safeguarding reports which are not resolved through mediation must be reported to the FIE in accordance with the underlying safeguarding rules of the FIE.

Chapter 13, added paragraph at the end

It is recommended that Member Federations and Confederations develop and implement similar policies and procedures to safeguard and promote the welfare of all participants in fencing activity held under their respective jurisdictions.

Amendments to the FIE Organisation Rules

The texts below are applicable from January 1, 2024, unless otherwise indicated.

Article o.10

- 1 The Organising Committee is the group of persons responsible for organising the competition.
- 2 The Organising Committee must take note of the instructions in the Specifications ('Cahier des Charges') specific to each category of competition.
3. If possible, both genders should be represented in the Organising Committee.

Article o.15

FIE Directoire Technique and delegates for official events

- 5 The day before an individual or team competition, the DT must download the entry file, the day before the competition, from 12:00 noon local time from the FIE website.
 - In individual competitions, the DT must publish and send to the FIE the pools and the relevant schedules, as well as the list of exempt fencers for senior competitions, no later than 4:00 p.m. (local time). No addition may be made to pools already published unless they come from pools starting at the same time (cf o.67.1).
 - In team competitions, the DT must publish and send to the FIE the table and the relevant schedules no later than one hour after the end of the quarter finals of the individual event. No addition may be made to the published list.

Article o.16

The **Directoire Technique** is composed of people **who have the experience and competence to organise competitions**.

1 World Championships and Olympic Games.

- a) **For the Olympic Games** the Directoire Technique is composed of **six** members of different nationalities, one of whom must represent the country where the competition is held. **There must be at least one member from each gender.**
- b) **For the World Championships**, the Directoire Technique is composed of **8** members of different nationalities, one of whom must represent the organising country. **There must be at least two members from each gender.**

2 World Cup and Grands Prix competitions.

The Directoire Technique is composed of three qualified persons from the country where the competition is held or invited by them. **There must be at least one member from each gender.**

~~**3 Veterans World Championships**~~

~~The Directoire Technique is composed of four members of different nationalities, one of whom must represent the country where the competition is held.~~

Article o.18

Designation of refereeing, SEMI, and medical delegates

Refereeing delegates must be members of the FIE Refereeing Commission.

SEMI delegates must be members of the FIE SEMI Commission.

Medical delegates must be ~~a~~ members of the FIE Medical Commission.

When all delegate designations are taken together (across all types of competitions and all weapons in one season) there must be a minimum of 20% representation of both genders, should the availability of the delegates and continental representation allow it.

Should the availability of the delegates and continental representation allow it, there must be at least one delegate of each gender from each of the Refereeing, SEMI and Medical Commissions designated at World Championships.

~~4 — Veterans World Championships~~

~~Two Refereeing delegates, one SEMI delegate and two Medical delegates are appointed by the FIE Executive Committee following the recommendations of the respective commissions.~~

Article o.25

- 3 In addition, the FIE Supervisor of junior World Cup competitions is required to report on gender diversity of the registered referees through the FIE Supervisor's report.

Article o.26

- ~~1. Refereeing at Veteran World Championships is carried out by referees appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE, selected by the Refereeing Commission on indication of the Organizing Committee and Veterans Council.
Referees must attend the refereeing meeting that takes place the day before the World Championships.~~

Articles o.29

- 3 Fencers taking part in all the official FIE Junior competitions, individual or team, must be under 20 years old at midnight on 31st December of the year preceding the year in which the competition takes place ~~(cf e.30)~~.

To be eligible to compete in the current season's official events, including the current season's World Junior Championships, fencers must be under 20 years of age at midnight on 31 December of the current season.

Application: from season 2024-2025

~~6) The age groups in veteran competitions are:~~

- ~~a) Age group 50-59: Must be at least 50 years old and less than 60 years old in the year of the competition.~~
- ~~b) Age group 60-69: Must be at least 60 years old and less than 70 years old in the year of the competition.~~
- ~~c) Age group 70+: Must be at least 70 years old in the year of the competition.~~

~~Application: during the test at the 2025 World Championships (not applicable in 2023 and 2024).~~

~~6 — The age groups in veteran competitions are:~~

- ~~a) Age group 40-49: Must be at least 40 years old and less than 50 years old in the year of the competition.~~
- ~~b) Age group 50-59: Must be at least 50 years old and less than 60 years old in the year of the competition.~~
- ~~c) Age group 60-69: Must be at least 60 years old and less than 70 years old in the year of the competition.~~
- ~~d) Age group 70+: Must be at least 70 years old in the year of the competition.~~

Article o.30

~~Only fencers who are of an age to qualify for the next Junior World Championships may fence in the official FIE Junior competitions, individual or team, of the current fencing season.~~

Application: from season 2024-2025

VETERAN WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Article o.39

- ~~1 — The programme of the Veteran World Fencing Championships comprises twenty-four events, eighteen individual — three categories for each weapon — and six team — male foil, female foil, male epee, female epee, male sabre and female sabre. The programme must be arranged in such a way as to allow any fencer to participate in all weapons. Team events must be held on the day following the last championship of the three categories of each weapon.~~
- ~~2 — No changes of dates are allowed for any competition, after the release of the programme.~~

~~3— Each competition must be held in one single day, avoiding long periods of inactivity.~~

~~1— The programme of the Veteran World Fencing Championships comprises thirty-six events, twenty-four individual— four categories for each weapon— and twelve team— male foil, female foil, male epee, female epee, male sabre and female sabre (two categories for each weapon and gender). The programme must be arranged in such a way as to allow any fencer to participate in all weapons. Team events must be held on the day following the last championship of the corresponding two individual categories of each weapon.~~

~~2— No changes of dates are allowed for any competition, after the release of the programme.~~

~~3— Each competition must be held in one single day, except for team events for which the round of pools may be achieved the day before direct elimination avoiding long periods of inactivity.~~

~~Application: during the test at the 2025 World Championships (not applicable in 2023 and 2024).~~

Article o.42

4 The formulae of the competitions are specified in the ~~administrative~~ rules (~~see art. 9.4.3~~) and in the following articles: o.100, o.101 and o.102 (o.102.1 first sentence and o.102.2).

Article o.50

Veterans

~~1— Any proposed candidature for organising the Veteran World Championships must be studied at the venue concerned by an ad hoc delegation designated by the Executive Committee, at the invitation of the candidate federation.~~

~~2— The organising committee, who will receive all the entry fees from the participating delegations, must, at their own expense, invite the following international officials (tourist class return air fare, accommodation and daily allowances):~~

~~a) — The President of the FIE or his representative, who presides over the World Championships and, in particular, controls the smooth running of the Directoire Technique.~~

~~b) — Four members of the Directoire Technique appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE, one of whom must belong to the organising country.~~

~~c) — One member of the SEMI Committee, appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE.~~

~~d) — One member of the Refereeing Committee, appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE.~~

~~e) — Two members of the Medical Committee, appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE.~~

~~f) — The referees appointed by the Executive Committee of the FIE.~~

~~The officials a) to e) should preferably be selected from the Zone in which the Championships are being held.~~

Article o.63

~~Entries to competitions~~

~~1— Entries must be sent to the organisers by the competitors' national federation. Entries must be sent not later than one month before the beginning of the championships.~~

~~2— However, up to two days before the competition at noon (local time), fencers may be added by their national federation after payment to the Organizing Committee of a penalty equal to 100 % of the registration fee.~~

~~3— Entries for team championships must be forwarded to the Directoire Technique not later than 4.00 pm (local time) of the day before the competition.~~

~~4— At the Veterans World Championships, entries for the individual events are limited to four fencers in each category per gender, per weapon and per nation. The names must be the same as those on the FIE licences.~~

Article o.68

Composition of pools

- 1 The pools are composed taking account of **the initial seeding in the competition, which is based on** the latest official FIE ranking and by drawing lots among any fencers who are not in the ranking. The pools are composed using the following method:

~~4— If in any category there are fewer than ten competitors, the competition is held as a poule unique followed by direct elimination.~~

~~5— If in any category there are fewer than 6 competitors, they will fence with the next lower age category. A separate ranking for that category will be extrapolated from the combined categories' final rankings at the end of the competition.~~

~~6— If in any category there is only one competitor, the event in that category is cancelled.~~

~~7— No fencer is eliminated after the pools, all are entered into the direct elimination.~~

Article o.85

1 The competition consists of **two phases**, a preliminary phase and a main phase, each of which are run on one day.

~~2— The day before the competition, the organizers must publish and send to the FIE the pools and relevant schedules, as well as the list of exempt fencers, at the latest by 4:00 pm (local time). To do so, they must download the entry file from the FIE web site the day before the competition at or after 12h00, local time. No addition may be made to pools already published unless they come from pools starting at the same time (cf o.67.1).~~

However, in no case, teams which have already fenced each other in the pools should meet again immediately in the direct elimination. To avoid this, the lower ranked of the two teams in question may be moved:

- in the case of a tableau of 16, the team ranked 9 may change places only with the team ranked 10, the team ranked 11 may change places only with the team ranked 12, the team ranked 13 may change places only with the team ranked 14 and the team ranked 15 may change places only with the team ranked 16.
 - in the case of a tableau of 8, the team ranked 5 may change places only with the team ranked 6 and the team ranked 7 may change places only with the team ranked 8.
- 8 If fewer than 6 teams participate in the competition, they all fence in a pool unique; a match for the 3rd and 4th places is then held, followed by a match for the first place between the teams who came 1st and 2nd in the pool.
 - 9 Ranking matches from 5th place onwards will not be fenced and teams will be ranked, in each round of the table, according to their ranking after the pools.

1. Participation

Each country may enter one team per category (Veterans and Grand Veterans) per gender and per weapon, thus giving a total of twelve competitions.

The teams shall be composed of fencers who participated in the individual competition of the corresponding weapon, but c.f. o.103.2 b below.

2. The rules for team competitions are applicable with the following exceptions:

Veterans: teams of three composed of fencers belonging to either age group 40-49 or to age group 50-59, with at least one fencer belonging to age group 50-59, plus up to two reserves.

Grand Veterans: teams of three composed of fencers belonging to either age group 60-69 or to age group 70 and over, with at least one fencer belonging to age group 70 and over, plus up to two reserves.

Fencing mode is 45 hits relay described in o.99 with application of non-combativity rule at any match.

The competition begins with a round of pools of 3 and 4 teams -established according to o.103 c) - and followed by a direct elimination phase according to o.103 7.

Particular cases depending on the number of teams:

- only 1 team: the organisers must inform all nations that there will be no competition at that weapon.
- 2 teams: only one match between these two teams.
- 3 teams: one poule of three followed by D.E. from an incomplete tableau of 4.
- 4 teams: one poule of four followed by D.E. from a tableau of 4.
- 5 teams: one poule of five followed by D.E. from an incomplete tableau of 8.

The losers of the semi-finals have to fence for the bronze medal.

- a) In the case of a team being short of a fencer in any of the weapons, the team may use a fencer who has competed in the individual championships at another weapon or who is registered but has yet to compete, but his/her ranking will be deemed to be last in the individual competition at the weapon of the team in which he is going to fence plus 1.
- b) The teams are placed in the pools according to the ranking of the three fencers in the individual championship. The number 1 team is the one with the least points. All the fencers registered for the team event must be present at the piste before the start of each match.
- c) Each team may request, before a given relay, the substitution of a fencer. However, in case of injury or other medical reason, duly recognized by the medical delegate, the substitution can be immediate, even during the relay.

There can be up to two substitutions of reserves per match but must maintain compliance with the age category representation requirement.

Application : during the test at the 2025 World Championships (not applicable in 2023 and 2024).

SUMMARY OF DECISIONS

Amendments to the FIE Technical Rules

The texts below are applicable from January 1, 2024, unless otherwise indicated.

Article t.1

Definition of the fencer's salute

In competition, the fencer's salute is a gesture of civility towards the opponent, the referee and the spectators. To perform the fencer's salute, the two fencers:

- face each other
- stand still on their on-guard line
- place the mask under the non-sword arm
- lift the guard to the chin
- then lower the blade to the ground

Application: Starting from 26 September 2023.

Article: t.18.2

The piste is 14 metres long, with a total tolerance on the whole length of 4 cm, so that each competitor, being placed at 2 metres from the centre line, has at his disposal for retreating a total distance of 5 metres without it being necessary for him to cross the rear limit of the piste with both feet.

Article t.23

- 6 The Referee may not allow a fencer to **leave the piste**, save in exceptional circumstances. If a competitor does so without permission, he is liable to incur the penalties enumerated in Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, for the offences of the 1st group.

Article t.25

- 2 **At all three weapons** it is forbidden for a fencer to **cause corps à corps intentionally** to avoid being hit, or to jostle his opponent. Should such an offence occur, the Referee will penalise the fencer at fault as specified in Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, for the offences of the 1st group and any hit scored by the fencer at fault is annulled.

Article t.26

- 1 The 'flèche ending systematically in a corps à corps' referred to in this article must not be confused with the 'flèche resulting in a shock which jostles the opponent', which is considered as an act of **intentional brutality** at all three weapons and is punished as such (cf. t.121.2, t.170), for the offences of the 2nd group.

Article t.27

- 2 It is forbidden to **turn one's back** on one's opponent during the bout. Should such an offence occur, the Referee will penalise the fencer at fault as specified in articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, **for the offences of the 1st group** and any hit scored by the fencer at fault is annulled.

Article t.29

- 1 The use of the **non-sword hand** and **arm** to carry out an offensive or defensive action is forbidden (cf t.158-162, ~~t.165~~, **t.166**, t.170). Should such an offence occur, the hit scored by the fencer at fault is annulled and the latter will be penalized as specified for offences of the 2nd group (red card).
- 2 If a fencer **substitutes a non-valid part of his target for a valid part**, either by covering it or by any abnormal movement, the Referee must penalise him by applying the penalties specified in Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, **for the offences of the 1st group** and any hit scored by the fencer at fault is annulled.
- 3 During the fight, the fencer must not, under any circumstances, **take hold of any part of the electrical equipment** with his non-sword hand; **the referee imposes him/her the penalties for the offences of the first group** (cf. t.158-162, t.165, t.170); any hit scored by the fencer at fault is annulled.

Article t.35

- 3 A competitor who crosses one of the lateral boundaries of the piste with both feet — e.g. when making a flèche — **to avoid being hit** will be penalised as specified in Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, **for the offences of the 1st group. Any hit made by the offending fencer is annulled.**

Article t.41

- 2 The first two opponents fence until one **or both** ~~of them~~ **have** scored five hits, within the time limit of 3 minutes.

The next two opponents fence until one **or both*** of their scores has reached ten hits, within the time limit of 3 minutes, and so on with successive bouts, cumulatively, of five hits.

**(Correction in English only).*

Article t.43

- 2 Any fencer who attempts improperly to **cause or to prolong interruptions** to the bout is penalised as specified in Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, **for the offences of the 1st group.**

Article t.45

- 3 Should a fencer **demand a break** which is deemed by the delegate of the Medical Commission or, in his absence, by the doctor on duty to be **unjustified**, the Referee will penalise that fencer as specified in Articles t.158-162, t.166, t.170 **for the offences of the 2nd group.**

Article t.55

- 2 A competitor who, **intentionally**, causes the apparatus to register a hit by placing his point on the ground or on any surface other than **that of his opponent** will be penalised as specified in Articles t.158-162, ~~t.165~~, **t.166**, t.170, **for the offences of the 2nd group**.

Article t.56

3. A competitor who makes any modification in or who changes his equipment without being asked by the Referee to do so, before the Referee has given his decision, loses all right to the annulment of the hit ~~(cf. t.47.2.d)~~.
11. A competitor who, intentionally drops his/her weapon during the fencing phrase will be penalised as specified in Articles t.166, t.170. However, a hit scored by the opponent is valid, provided that the action was started before the 'Halt!'.

Article t.61

- 1 **In the individual events**, the fencer has:
- in **pools**, one possible appeal during each bout; (Cf. o.105, zonal qualification events for Olympic Games).
 - in **direct elimination bouts**, two possible appeals.
Should **the referee agree with the fencer** who appealed for the video-refereeing, the latter is entitled to retain the right of appeal.

Article t.70

Non-standard equipment

In whatever circumstances a fencer on the piste is found to be in possession of equipment which is **non-regulation or defective** (~~cf.m.8, m.9, m.11, m.12, m.13, m.16, m.17, m.23~~ according to Material Rules), the referee confiscates the equipment and submits it to the experts on duty for examination. The equipment in question will only be returned to the owner after the measures necessitated by this examination have been completed and, if appropriate, after the payment of any expenses for repairs. The equipment must be rechecked before it is used again.

Article t.71

If a fencer appears on the piste:

- with only **one** regulation **weapon** (cf. t.114, 115); or
- with only **one** regulation **bodywire**; or
- with only **one** regulation **mask wire**; or
- with **a weapon or a bodywire which does not work** or which **does not conform** with the Rules; or
- without his **protective under-plastron** (cf. t.64.5); or
- with a **conductive jacket** which does not fully cover the valid target; or
- with a mask whose 2nd security device is not securely fixed to the body of the mask; or
- with **clothing** which does not conform with the Rules;

the Referee will apply the penalties stipulated in Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, for the offences of the 1st group.

Article t.73

- 3 If, when a fencer appears on the piste or during a bout, it is established that the equipment used by the fencer:
 - a) **does not bear the marks** applied at the preliminary check, the Referee will:
 - annul the last hit, if any, scored by the fencer at fault.
 - penalise him as specified in Articles **t.158-162, t.166, t.170**, for the offences of the 2nd group.
 - b) does not conform to the rules in a way **not covered by the preliminary check**, the Referee will:
 - penalise him as specified in Articles **t.158-162, t.166, t.170**, for the offences of the 2nd group.

Article t.76

- 2 **Pushing or letting drag** the point of the electric weapon on the electric piste is forbidden during the actual bout (between 'Play!' and 'Halt!'). Placing the weapon on the piste at any time to **straighten** it is also forbidden. Any breaking of these rules will be punished according to Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, for the offences of the 1st group.

Article t.77

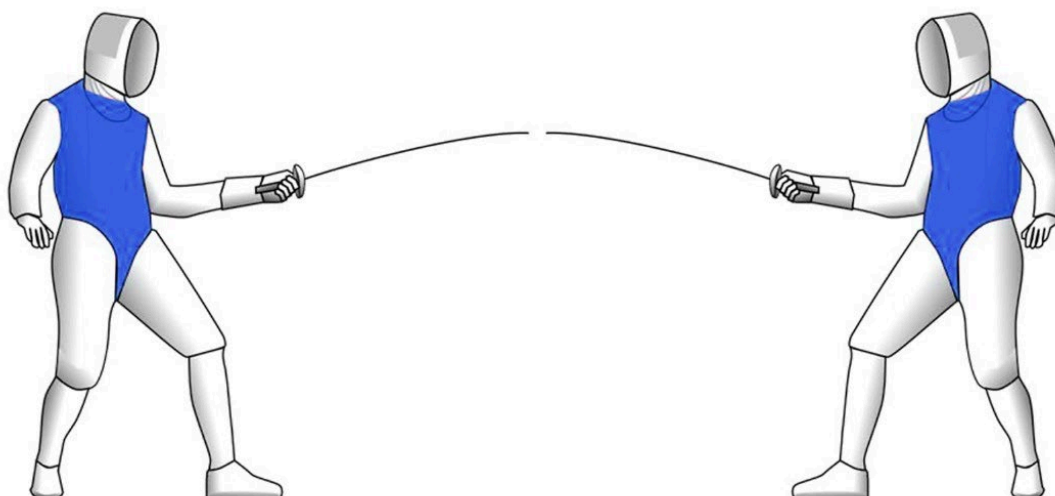


Figure 4 Valid target at foil

Article t.90

- 2 **Pushing** or letting the point of the electric weapon **drag** on the electric piste is forbidden during the actual bout (between 'Play!' and 'Halt!'). Placing the weapon on the piste at any time to **straighten** it is also forbidden.
Any breaking of this rule will be penalised according to Articles t.158-162, t.165, t.170, [for the offences of the 1st group](#).

Article t.91

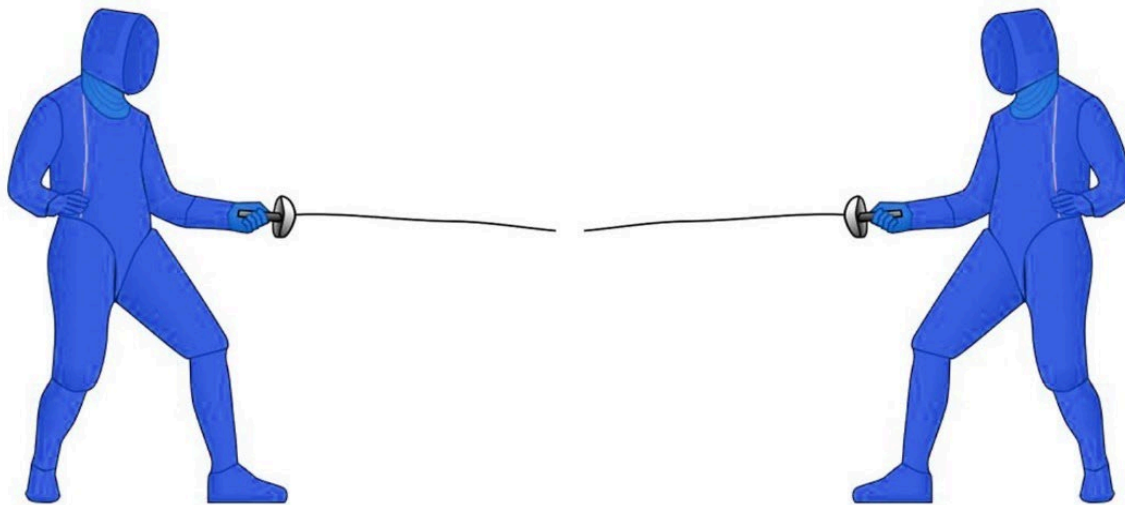


Figure 5 Valid target at épée

Article t.96

- 3 It is forbidden to **hit with the guard**. Any hits registered by hitting with the guard must be annulled, the fencer so hitting being penalised as specified in Articles t.158-163, t.165, t.170, [for the offences of the 2nd group](#).
- 6 5 **Placing the weapon on the piste at any time to straighten it** is forbidden. Any breaking of this rule will be punished according to Articles t. 158-163, t.165, t.170, [for the offences of the 1st group](#).

Article t.97

- 1 Only hits which arrive on the target are counted as valid.

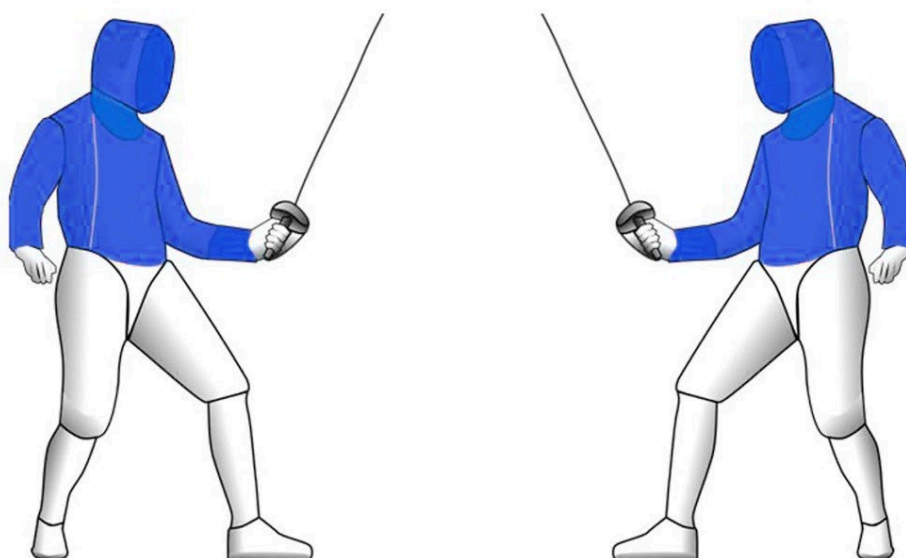


Figure 6 Valid target at sabre

The target comprises any part of the body above a horizontal line drawn between the top of the hip bones and then horizontally round the fencer's trunk (see Figure 6).

- 2 At sabre, it is forbidden to **protect** the target area or to **substitute** another part of the body for the target area, by covering it (cf. t.158-162, t.165, t.170); any hit scored by the fencer at fault is annulled.

a) If, during the fencing phrase, there is protection or substitution of a valid surface, the fencer at fault will be penalised as specified for offences of the 1st group (cf. also t.29).

~~b) If, during the fencing phrase, as a result of protection or substitution of a valid surface, a hit correctly given is registered as not valid, the fencer at fault will be penalized as specified for offences of the 1st group (cf t.158—162, t.165, t.170) and the hit will be awarded.~~

Article t.98

Article t.109

Everybody taking part in or present at a fencing competition **must respect the FIE statutes and rules, including but not limited to the FIE Ethical Code and Safeguarding Policy. They must remain orderly and must not disturb the smooth running of the competition.** During bouts no one is allowed to **go near the pistes**, to **give advice to the fencers**, to **criticise the Referee** or the judges, to insult them or to attempt to influence them in any way. Even the **team captain** must remain in the space assigned to him and he may only intervene in the

situations and in the manner provided for in Article t.130 of the Rules. The Referee must stop immediately any activity which disturbs the smooth running of the bout which he is refereeing (cf. t.137.1–3). Any person who, for any reason, threatens or insults an official commits an offence of the 4th group and is penalised according to article t.169.

Any person present who witnesses a breach of the FIE Ethical Code or the Safeguarding Policy must report this to the Safeguarding Officer if present, or to the Supervisor or to the Directoire Technique.

Article t.110

Smoking in competition halls is forbidden. Smoking will be considered as a disturbance of the smooth running of the competition (cf. t.111).

Any breach of these rules will be punished as laid down in Articles **t.158-162, t.167, t.168, t.170**, for the offences of the 3rd group.

Article t.111

The Referee and/or the Directoire Technique, on their own authority or at the request of an official delegate of the FIE or of the Organising Committee, can decide to expel from the competition venue, with or without a warning, any person who by his/her gestures, attitude, or language or by breaching the FIE Safeguarding Policy disturbs the good order or smooth running of the event.

Article t.116

Under no circumstances should the fencers **dress or undress in public** except in the case of an accident duly recognised by the doctor on duty or by the representative of the Medical Commission (cf. **t.126, t.158-162, t.165, t.170**). Any infringement will be sanctioned for the offences of the 1st group.

Article t.120

Should a fencer **abandon a bout** by leaving the piste (cf. **t.23.6**), he will be penalised as specified in Articles **t.158-162, t.165, t.170**, for the offences of the 1st group.

Article t.122

Before the beginning and at the end of a bout, the two fencers must perform the **fencer's salute** to their opponent, to the referee and to the spectators, as defined in article t.1.

When the final hit of the bout has been scored, the two fencers stand still on their on-guard line while the referee is making his/her decision.

The two fencers then perform the **fencer's salute** (cf. t.1) to their opponent, to the referee and to the spectators.

The bout has then ended.

~~Before the beginning of each bout, the two fencers must perform a fencer's salute to their opponent, to the Referee and to the spectators. Equally, when the final hit has been scored, the bout has not ended until the two fencers have saluted each other, the Referee and the spectators: to this end, they must remain still while the referee is making his decision; when he has given his decision, they must return to their on-guard line, perform a fencer's salute and shake hands with their opponent.~~

If either or both of the two fencers refuse to comply with these rules, the Referee will penalise him/her/them as specified for offences of the 4th group (cf. t.158-162, t.169, t.170).

Application: Applicable until the end of the 2023-2024 season

Article t.123

During or after a bout, even if the fencer has already left the piste, any act against the spirit of sportsmanship such as violently or dangerously throwing one's mask or any other piece of equipment will be penalised as specified in article **t.169** (c.f. **t.108.1, 2 and t.109**), for the offences of the 4th group.

Article t.124

Unwillingness to fight (Non-combativity)

There is unwillingness to fight when there is one minute of fencing without a hit or without a hit scored off the target.

In the event of **unwillingness to fight**, the Referee will immediately call 'Halt!' as a decision of "fact" (cf.t.136.2).

Unwillingness to fight is sanctioned as follows (t.170):

0.5	Unwillingness to fight: the sanctions imposed are shown by specific P-cards which are not cumulative with any other sanction awarded.	t.124	1 st time P-Yellow	2 nd time P-Red	3 rd time Penalisation
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1 Individual events – Direct elimination

- c) When, for the third time, there is one minute of unwillingness to fight, a P-black card is awarded as follows:
 - i) If the scores of the two fencers are equal, the Referee sanctions the fencer with the lower initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking and by drawing lots among any fencers who are not in the ranking, with a P-Black card. The fencer with the higher initial seeding in the competition, which is based on the FIE ranking, wins the bout.

Article t.125

The fencer, whether on or off the piste, must **keep his mask on** until the Referee calls 'Halt!' He may under no circumstances address the Referee until the Referee has made his decision (cf. **t.158- 162, t.165, t.170**), Any infringement will be sanctioned for the offences of the 1st group.

Article t.128

Competitors must **fence to their utmost ability** in a sportsmanlike manner until the end of the competition in order to obtain the best possible classification, without giving away hits or seeking to be favoured by being given hits by anyone (cf. **t.158-162, t.169, t.170**). **Any infringement will be sanctioned for the offences of the 4th group.**

Article t.133

Spectators are obliged not to **interfere with the good order** of a competition, to do nothing which may tend to influence the fencers or the Referee, and to respect the decisions of the latter even when they do not agree with them. They must obey any instructions which the Referee may deem it necessary to give them (cf. **t.109-110, t.167-168, t.170, penalties for the offences of the 3rd group**).

Article t.147

Although a competitor may in fact have hit his opponent on the target, **this hit may be disallowed**, either because it did not arrive during the period of time during which fencing is allowed, or because the competitor had crossed the boundaries of the piste, or because of defects in the electrical equipment, or because violence was involved in the making of the hit, or because of other reasons as laid down in the Rules (cf. **t.25.2, t.27.2, t.28.2, t.29, t.33.2/4, t.35.3, t.44.2, t.56.1, t.73, t.79, t.80, t.89.2, t.93.1, t.94, t.95, t.96.3, t.97.2, t.99.1-2, t.101.5, t.106, t.121.2, t.137.2, t.161, t.170**) according to the Technical Rules).

Article t.148

A competitor may have a hit awarded against him which he has not in fact received, either because he has crossed the rear limit of the piste (cf. t.34), or because he has committed an offence which has prevented his opponent fencing (a flèche attack which jostles the opponent, the use of the unarmed hand while fencing, etc. (cf. **t.137.2, t.162.1/2, t.165, t.166, t.167.1, t.170**), according to the Technical Rules.

Article t.172

- 2 If a fencer infringes this principle, **casting doubt** on the decision of the Referee **on a point of fact** during the bout, he will be penalised according to the rules (cf. **t.158-162**, **t.165**, **t.170**), **for the offences of the 1st group**. But if the Referee **is ignorant of or misunderstands a definite rule** or applies it in a manner contrary to the Rules, an appeal on this matter may be entertained. A point of fact includes, but is not limited to, any ruling by the referee analysing what happened on the piste, such as the validity or priority of a hit, whether a fencer left the side or end of the piste or if a person's behaviour is a Group 3 or Group 4 offence.

Article m.25.3.h

A World Champion has the right to have his/her name and the abbreviation of his/her national federation printed in red **for the following season**.

An Olympic Champion has the right to have his/her name and the abbreviation of his/her national federation printed in gold **until the end of the next Olympic Games**.

Article m.30.1

RULES SPECIFIC TO EPEE

Mask

1. The mask must not be covered, in whole or in part, by **conductive material or** material which can **cause the point to glance off** (cf. m.25).

2. The mask must be so shaped that the **bib** reaches below the prominences of the collar bones (clavicles).

Article: Annex A 4 Label of quality, Material Rules

2 Chip and label installation requirements **are suspended**.

Amendments to the FIE Publicity Code

Article: p.12.2

Fencing clothing and equipment

a) If a federation and/or a fencer have signed a **sponsorship contract** with a commercial or other company, the logo of that sponsorship partner may be fixed **at a rate of maximum of 3 logos, with a maximum area of 85 cm² each;**

In foil and epee: at the top of the sleeve of the non-sword arm of the fencing jacket; **in sabre:** at the top of the thigh of the non-sword side of the fencing breeches and clearly separated from the national logo.

Application: From the 2023 Junior and Cadet World Championships.
