WELCOME

On behalf of the Paris 2024 Organising Committee, I am delighted to present the series of International Federations' Guides for the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad.

At Paris 2024, we are proud to organise the first Games under the New Norm of the Olympic Agenda 2020, which focuses on economic, social and environmental efficiency and sets a precedent in the organisation of sports events. Our ambition is to present the first carbon-neutral Games, the first gender-balanced Games and the first Games open to all with the mass participation marathon. Paris 2024 aims to deliver responsible Games whether by using 95 percent of existing or temporary venues and 100 percent renewable energy during the Games, or by favouring a circular economy, sustainable food, and clean mobility, and by preserving the biodiversity on venues. By taking climate and environmental issues into account well before the event, we are breaking new ground in the history of the Games.



One hundred years since the last summer Games in France, Paris 2024 has huge ambitions for the Games in 2024. Our aim is to offer a new event model that is in tune with people's aspirations, especially those of the younger generations, for example by introducing four additional sports such as breaking, sport climbing, skateboarding or surfing.

As athletes are the heart of Paris 2024 Olympic Games, we are committed to offer them an exceptional experience, with unique competition venues in iconic sites of Paris and France, such as the foot of the Eiffel Tower, the Château de Versailles or Teahupo'o in Tahiti.

Paris 2024 will leave a positive and lasting impact on the lives of residents by making long-anticipated investments, especially in Seine-Saint-Denis, such as the Olympic Village and the Aquatics Centre. All the facilities that will be used by athletes and delegations during the Games are designed with their legacy in mind so that they can be repurposed as public facilities, housing and offices based on local needs.

We hope that this guide, produced in collaboration with IOC Sport and International Federations, will provide you with the information you need to prepare for your Games.

We are looking forward to welcoming you to the City of Lights in the summer of 2024 for what we hope will be revolutionary Games.

RULES

The Fencing competition will be held in accordance with the editions of the following documents that are in force at the time of the Games:

- → FIE Statutes and Rules (<u>www.fie.org</u>) available in French.
- → IOC Olympic Charter available on the website https://olympics.com/ioc/olympic-charter.

In accordance with Rule 46 of the IOC Olympic Charter, the FIE will be responsible for the control and direction of the Fencing competition at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

DURATION AND SCORING: INDIVIDUAL EVENTS (ÉPÉE, FOIL AND SABRE)

All bouts in the individual events will consist of three (3) periods of three (3) minutes, with one (1) minute between periods, or until one fencer has scored 15 hits. As an exception, in the sabre events, the first period will end when one fencer's score reaches eight (8) hits. If the third period is completed before either fencer has scored 15 hits, the fencer with the most hits will be declared the winner.

If the scores are tied after the third period, there will be one (1) further minute of Fencing time. One fencer will be randomly selected through an electronic draw and given priority. The winner will be the first fencer to score a valid hit; if no hits are scored, the winner will be the fencer with priority.

DURATION AND SCORING: TEAM EVENTS (ÉPÉE, FOIL AND SABRE)

In the team events, each match will consist of nine (9) bouts, to a maximum of 45 hits. Each bout will last at least three (3) minutes, or until one team's score has reached the next multiple of five (5) hits: a score of five (5) hits after the first bout, a score of 10 hits after the second bout, a score of 15 hits after the third bout and so on. If the ninth bout is completed before either team has scored 45 hits, the team with the most hits will be declared the winner.



If the scores are tied after the ninth bout, there will be one (1) further minute of Fencing time. One (1) fencer will be randomly selected through an electronic draw and given priority. The winning team will be the one whose fencer scored first a valid hit; if no hits are scored, the winning team will be the one with priority.

ELECTRONIC REFEREEING SYSTEM

The output of the video refereeing system will be shared with the public (spectators) during the sessions.

LATE ATHLETE REPLACEMENT (LAR)

Late Athlete Replacement (LAR) will be allowed up until 48 hours prior to the Team Leaders' meeting on 25 July 2024 at 14:00. Any athlete for which an accreditation application has been submitted by the accreditation deadline may be used as a replacement provided that he/she is eligible.

CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

Clothing and equipment used by fencers and other participants in the Fencing competition must comply with the following documents:

The prohibition of any advertising and publicity in and above Olympic sites (as expressed in the Olympic Charter) is one of the aspects that differentiate the Olympic Games from other international events. This principle is reflected in the Bye-law to Rule 50 of the Olympic Charter. Detailed information on the implementation of Rule 50 to clothing, equipment, accessories and other items is detailed in the IOC's Guidelines Regarding Authorised Identifications for the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad, Paris 2024, which has been distributed by the IOC to all NOCs, IFs and sporting goods manufacturers.

COMPETITION FORMAT

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

All events will be fenced in a direct elimination format throughout.

Individual competitions at Paris 2024 will comprise a maximum of 37 fencers per weapon and will be run as an incomplete direct elimination tableau of 64.

The initial order of fencers will be established according to the updated FIE Official Ranking (www.fie.org/results-statistic/ranking). If there are fencers qualified who do not appear in the FIE Official Ranking, and/or if there are fencers equally ranked in the FIE Official Ranking, the FIE will carry out a preliminary drawing of lots as follows:

- → First, a drawing of lots for any fencers equally ranked
- → Then, a drawing of lots for any fencers who do not appear in the FIE Official Ranking

Once all fencers have an initial ranking, there will be a drawing of lots in pairs to establish the direct elimination tableau.

The individual events will be run by direct elimination throughout and the bout for third place will be fenced.

TEAM EVENTS

All teams are composed of three (3) athletes and there can be a substitute. Teams will be seeded according to the FIE Official Team Ranking at each weapon (www.fie.org/results-statistic/ranking). Where teams are equally ranked, a drawing of lots will be carried out.

Teams will be placed in a complete direct elimination tableau of eight (8).

The teams will retain their initial ranking without a drawing of lots. If there is a host country team, it will be placed in the direct elimination tableau according to its place in the current FIE Official Team Ranking at the weapon concerned.

All team events will be run by direct elimination format throughout. Bronze medal and places five (5) to eight (8) will be fenced.

→ OLYMPIC GAMES REPLACEMENT PROCEDURES FOR TEAM EVENTS

The teams will have the possibility of replacing one fencer in the two following cases:

- 1) For injury.
- 2) For tactical reasons.

Once a replacement has been made for any of the above reasons, no further replacements may be made for any reason whatsoever.

PROCESS FOR ACCREDITATION OF REPLACEMENT ATHLETES

NOCs may name a replacement athlete for each team event for which they are qualified. NOCs who are entitled to a replacement athlete must submit to Paris 2024 an Application for Accreditation form for each replacement athlete, which must be received according to the deadline established by Paris 2024, with a copy also being passed to the FIE.

Replacement athletes will receive an Accreditation Card in the 'Ap' category as P Alternate Athletes, which only provides access to the training venue (Olympic Village) and the competition venue (Grand Palais).

NOCs must confirm all athletes to fill their qualified positions to the FIE by 25 June 2024. NOCs must also confirm all replacement athletes to which they are entitled for Team events before 8 July 2024.



VENUE ACCESS FOR REPLACEMENT ATHLETES

P Alternate Athletes accredited as an 'Ap' category have access to the training and competition venue of a single sport only (fencing).

During the match, P Alternate Athletes are in their national team box.

P Alternates Athletes take part in the presentation of the team.

'Ap' accredited persons will be eligible to enter the Olympic Village and to use the athlete transport service.

ACCOMMODATION FOR REPLACEMENT ATHLETES

P Alternate Athletes accredited as a 'Ap' category will not be accommodated by Paris 2024 and no beds will be reserved at the Olympic Village. NOCs must therefore organise arrangements for their accommodation. The beds allocated to the NOC may, however, be assigned as they wish and may be used to accommodate an alternate athlete if there are extra beds.

REPLACEMENT DUE TO INJURY

The circumstances under which a team member may be replaced for injury are described in the article 0.99.6 of the FIE Organisation Rules, **but the following describes the applicable special rules for the substitution of athletes injured in the Team Events of Olympic Games, Paris 2024:**

An injured athlete may be replaced either by an already accredited athlete or a replacement athlete duly appointed by his/her NOC under the process outlined in 1) above. The replacement will be made through the following process which will be managed by the FIE:

- → a) Verification of the accredited athlete's injury: At the venue, the FIE Medical Delegate(s) personally and physically examine the athlete after the injury, before the athlete leaves the venue. At least one medical officer must be present constantly at the venue during the competition to be able to perform this task in a timely fashion.
 - Away from the venue, a report signed by the medical officer responsible for the site where the injury happened (e.g. training site or village) must be submitted by the team captain to the FIE Medical Delegate(s) as soon as possible after the incident. After carefully verifying the type and extent of the injury, the FIE Medical Delegate(s) decide whether the injury justifies the withdrawal of the fencer from the team event. The team captain completes the Team Substitution form and one or both of the FIE medical delegates sign the medical confirmation part of the form.

The determination of injury by the FIE Medical Delegate(s) will be final. There shall be no right of appeal against this decision.

- → b) The replacement athlete is present in the team box and ready to fence without delaying the team event.
- → c) The team captain submits a Team Substitution form to the Technical Directorate as well. This form is then passed to the results staff. Once this notification to the results staff has taken place, the competition shall proceed from the point at which the injury took place.
- d) Only one replacement per team is authorised throughout the competition. A competitor who is replaced cannot again take his/ her place in the team either during the same match or the rest of the competition.

REPLACEMENT FOR TACTICAL REASONS

The circumstances under which a team member may be replaced for tactical reasons are described in the article 0.99.5 of the FIE Organisation Rules, but the following describes the applicable special rules for the replacement for tactical reasons in the Team Events of Olympic Games, Paris 2024:

In the Olympic Games, a competitor who is replaced cannot be replaced again in the team either during the same match or the rest of the competition.

The announcement that a fencer is to be substituted must be made at the latest before the beginning of the relay preceding the next relay of the fencer who is to be replaced.

Before the replacement, the team captain informs the Technical Directorate and provides proof that the replacement fencer is ready to fence without causing any delay in the competition.

In this case, the team captain completes a Team Substitution form and submits it to the Technical Directorate.

The Technical Directorate must inform the team captain of the opposing team and the referee of the match about the replacement.

This form is then passed to the results staff prior to the commencement of the bout.

Referees must be ready approximately 40 minutes prior to the scheduled start of their match (further details pending). Paris 2024 staff will escort them from their lounge to the call room to carry out all of the pre-match procedures (transition through the call room, equipment control, move to the field of play, etc.).



-> PROCEDURES

The appropriate size of two electrical jackets on the body of the fencer is checked by the designated referees in the call room before the athlete's presentation at the beginning of the bout/match.

Please note that no protest against the size of the electrical jacket will be accepted on the piste once the fencers have left the call room.

Chest protectors with the FIE logo will be accepted in the men's competition.

There will be a control that also under-plastrons are in accordance with the rules.

-> FENCERS

The fencers/teams should appear in the call room 30 minutes before the start of the competition to check their equipment.

After this check, the fencers must be absolutely ready to fence, in fencing uniform wearing their glove, with the body-wire connected to their weapon.

All zippers must be closed. The shoelaces must be tied with care and socks according to the rules. Long hair must be tied in a secure way so as not to fall free at any time during the bout and to ensure a correct positioning of the mask on the head.

The fencers should choose the weapon which they intend to use during the bout for the presentation. Change of weapons before the start will not be allowed.

The fencers are requested to be present in the call room without extra gadgets or additional equipment outside the fencing equipment. Under no circumstances may gadgets or additional equipment be used during the presentation or on the piste.

The following spare equipment and its quantity are mandatory in the fencing bag:

- → three (3) extra weapons
- → two (2) extra body wires
- → one (1) extra glove
- → one (1) extra conductive jacket with correct name printed on the back (foil & sabre)
- → one (1) extra fencing mask
- → two (2) extra mask wires (for foil & sabre)

DRESS CODE FOR CORCHES

The coaches should be dressed in the tracksuit (long length) of their fencers' NOC and sport shoes. No T-shirts are allowed.

PRESENTATION AT THE BEGINNING OF THE MATCH

The four (4) fencers on the team will take part in the presentation before their matches, whether the replacement has been made or not.

In the first session, athletes will be presented when they enter the field of play.

In the second session, athletes will be presented twice. The first presentation will take place on the balcony after leaving the call room. The second presentation will take place, as in the first session, when they enter the field of play.

In the first and second sessions, athletes will be presented when they enter the field of play.

Under no circumstances should the fencers dress or undress in public on the FOP except in the case of an accident duly recognised by the doctor on duty or by the representative of the Medical Commission. See Article t.116 of the FIE Technical Rules.

POST-COMPETITION PROCEDURES

LEAVING THE FIELD OF PLAY

After their match, fencers will be accompanied to the mixed zone entrance. Referees must check the bout score sheet and sign it.

Fencers, technical officials and referees leave the field of play (FOP) and walk around the platform (in single file) clockwise.

When a referee has finished a bout, he/she must return to the ITO/NTO Lounge. In case of a delay the referee should go to the call room immediately after the bout is finished.



COMPETITION VENUE

GRAND PALAIS (GRP)

3 avenue du Général Eisenhower - 75008 Paris - France

At the heart of Paris, alongside Invalides, the Eiffel Tower Stadium and Champ-de-Mars Arena, the Grand Palais will be abuzz with the world's most prestigious sporting event and will provide a unique stage for the Olympic and Paralympic competitions over the summer.

In the 8th arrondissement, the Grand Palais is 35 minutes by car from the Olympic Village. In 2024, it will host 7,485 people.

The Grand Palais will also be the competition venue for taekwondo during the Olympic Games and Para taekwondo and wheelchair fencing during the Paralympic Games.

VENUE ACCESS

The arrival of ITOs, NTOs, IF Staff and Executive Board members is planned as follows:

- → 3h30 before the competition: dedicated to non-referee NTOs.
- → 2h30 before the competition: dedicated to the medical delegates and the SEMI commission, so that they arrive at the same time as the first athletes.
- → 1h30 before the competition: for referees, IF staff and the technical directorate.
- → 30 minutes before the competition: for EB members, their guests and IF staff.

They will leave the Grand Palais no earlier than 30 minutes after the last match, and no later than one (1) hour after the end of the last session of the day.

The ITO and NTO load and drop-off area will be located to the west of the Grand Palais, near the PSA and VSA areas on Avenue Franklin Roosevelt.

FIELD OF PLAY (FOP)

The field of play will include five (5) pistes. The pistes and all equipment will comply with FIE regulations.



-> POTENTIAL HEAT CONDITION

As the Grand Palais is a historic venue that is not primarily intended to host sporting events in the middle of summer, some extraordinary arrangements have been made to guarantee the conditions necessary for the competitions to take place.

A fabric will cover the large glass roof to protect the athletes from the sun's rays, and a very large air-conditioning system will be deployed. Despite this, in the case of very hot weather, the air temperature in the competition area could be higher than usual.

For example, when the outside air temperature is 23.8 °C (the average air temperature in Paris in summer), the expected air temperature on the FOP is around 22 °C. When the outside air temperature is 32 °C, the expected air temperature at the FOP is around 24 °C.

VENUE FACILITIES AND SERVICES

→ ITOS' AND REFEREES' LOUNGE

The ITOs' and Referees' Lounge will be located on the ground floor of the Grand Palais and will be equipped with chairs, coffee tables, lockers, Internet access, a TV and a real-time Display System. Drinks and snacks will be provided throughout the day. NTO referees will be invited to use this space.

→ NTOS' LOUNGE

The NTOs' Lounge will be located next to the ITOs' Lounge and will be equipped with chairs, tables, coffee tables, lockers, Internet access, and a TV. Drinks and snacks will be provided throughout the day.

-> INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION LOUNGE

The IF Lounge will be located on the ground floor, in the southwest gallery. Drinks and snacks will be provided throughout the day.

-> CATERING

REFRESHMENT STATION

A refreshment station for technical officials will be located in the Technical Officials' Lounge. It will offer self-service mineral water, Coca-Cola and Powerade (isotonic sports drink) drinks. These refreshments will also be generally available two hours before the start of each day of competition and up until the end of competition.

MEAL

ITOs and NTOs can eat in their lounge. They may bring their own food (a refrigerator is provided) or use the Paris 2024 catering service on presentation of a pre-purchased voucher bought on site. The price of the lunch box will be 12€.

→ MEETING ROOM

The meeting room facilities will be located next to the ITO and NTO lounges and will contain chairs, tables and a white board.

-> EQUIPMENT CONTROL ROOM

The equipment control room will be located on the first floor in the north gallery of the Grand Palais, near the doping control area, and will open every day 2.5 hours before the first match of the day and until the end of competition.

→ MEDICAL SERVICES AND FACILITIES

The athletes' medical station will be located between the call room and the doping control station and will provide services such as first aid, emergency care, sports medicine and physical therapy services to athletes, team officials and technical officials. The Paris 2024 athlete medical team will consist of doctors, physiotherapists and nurses. Ambulances will also be stationed near the Grand Palais during medical services operational hours. Each ambulance is staffed with a crew of three trained medical personnel.

Spectator medical services care for all other client groups, including spectators, workforce, media, sponsors, volunteers, contractors, VIPs, and Olympic Family. First-aid teams will also be in circulation at the venue to respond to any medical problems.

→ SPORT INFORMATION DESK (SID)

The Sport Information Desk (SID) will be located in the Athletes' Lounge. The SID will open on competition days 2.5 hours before competition until the end of competition.

→ LOST AND FOUND (FOR ATHLETES, COACHES)

All declarations concerning a lost item at the venue must be addressed to the Sport Information Desk (SID). Found items must



also be handed in to the SID. The Sport Information Desk is located in the Athletes' Lounge.



TRANSPORT

FROM AIRPORTS/TRAIN STATIONS

Following information is subject to change.

The FIE staff and technical officials will arrive at four (4) entry points:

- → CDG (Charles de Gaulle Airport)
- → ORY (Orly Airport)
- → GDL (Gare de Lyon)
- → GDN (Gare du Nord)



The activation period for these ports of entry will run from 15 July to 14 August 2024.

Depending on the port of entry and the destination hotel, a public transport route and/or a Paris 2024 shuttle system will be used:

From CDG (Charles de Gaulle Airport)

→ To Mercure Paris Centre Tour Eiffel: Paris2024 shuttle 'CDG – West Line' then metro 6

From ORY (Orly Airport)

→ To Mercure Paris Centre Tour Eiffel: public transport metro 14 then metro line 6

From GDL (Gare de Lyon)

→ To Mercure Paris Centre Tour Eiffel: public transport RER A then Metro line 6

From GDN (Gare du Nord)

→ To Mercure Paris Centre Tour Eiffel: public transport metro 4 then metro line 6

The Paris 2024 shuttles will be accessible with the Pre-Valid Card.

For public transport

- → If you arrive by plane, you will receive a 'Navigo pass' at the airport, which gives you free access to public transport in the Paris area for the duration of the Games.
- → If you are arriving by train, a RER/Métro ticket will be given to you at the 'Transport' desk when you arrive at the entry point to take you to your hotel. You will then have to go to the Uniform and Accreditation Centre (for technical officials) or the Press and Olympic Family Accreditation Centre (for IF members) to receive your Navigo pass.

TRANSPORT TO THE VENUE

Buses will be organised to transport staff and technical officials to the competition site and back to the hotel.

On competition days, the technical official's buses will leave from the Mercure Hotel Paris Centre Tour Eiffel (ITO) before arriving at the Platine Hotel (NTO).

The arrival on site of the ITOs, NTOs, IF Staff and the Executive Board members is planned as follows:

- → 3h30 before the competition: dedicated to non-referee NTOs.
- → 2h30 before the competition: dedicated to medical delegates and the SEMI commission, so that they arrive at the same time as the first athletes.


- → 1h30 before the competition: for referees, IF staff and the technical directorate.
- → 30 minutes before the competition: for members of the EB members, their guests and IF staff.

Due to road events, the travel time may be different depending on the day. The final schedule will be displayed at the hotel and at the venue the day before each transport.

They will leave the Grand Palais no earlier than 30 minutes after the last match, and no later than 1 hour after the end of the last session of the day.

Two (2) TOYOTA electric vehicles – with driver – will be made available to the International Federation from 27 July to 6 August. The first vehicle will be dedicated to the President and the second will be shared between the two (2) IF technical delegates.

These vehicles can be parked at the hotel and in the site car park (P3).



Please note that anyone accredited for the Olympic Games will have free access to public transport in the city of Paris.



ACCREDITATIONS

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS:

Technical officials will be invited to validate their Pre-Valid Card and collect their uniform from the Accreditation and Uniform Distribution Centre on the days and at the times shown below:

- → Two (2) TDs and 12 NTOs on 22 July between 12 am and 14:00.
- → Four (4) ITOs and 12 NTOs on 23 July between 10:00 and 12 am
- → 10 ITOs on 24 July between 18:00 and 20:00
- → 26 ITOs and 8 NTOs on 25 July between 10:00 and 12 am

FIE MEMBERS:

- → Members of the International Federation will be invited to validate their Pre-Valid Card: At Charles de Gaulle and Paris-Orly airports;
- → At the Press and Olympic Family Accreditation Centre: Centre de la Presse, Porte Maillot:
- → At the VAHO on site. Please note that the VAHO can only validate PVCs but cannot issue accreditation (in the event of a problem with a PVC, accreditation, loss of accreditation, etc.).

UNIFORMS

Technical officials: will receive the Paris 2024 uniform at the Accreditation and Uniform Distribution Centre (UAC) when their accreditation is withdrawn.

The FIE is covering additional items: a formal jacket and tie for men scarf for women.

PER DIEM

Technical officials: ITOs will receive a per diem of €100, transferred by the international federation, NTOs will receive a per diem of €50, transferred by Paris 2024.

Officials will have to use their per diem to pay for their lunch and dinner.

THE OLYMPIC GAMES: ESSENTIALS

PARIS AND FRANCE IN 2024

ACCOMMODATION

Paris 2024 is tasked with organising and holding the Paris Games and this responsibility includes procuring and allocating accommodation solutions on behalf of the Accredited Games Community. This community includes all those designated by the International Olympic Committee and International Paralympic Committee, in particular members of the IOC and/or IPC, and their invitees, members of the French National Olympic and Sports Committee, French Paralympic and Sports Committee, National Olympic and Paralympic Committees, National and International Sports Federations.

Accordingly, Paris 2024 has booked a contingent of accommodation units with hotels and other establishments offering accommodation at a guaranteed price during the Period of the Games. In order to meet the needs of all stakeholder groups, Paris 2024 has secured more than 54,300 rooms in France, including more than 44,800 in Paris, in strategic locations for the Games.

All the specific information is presented in the Accommodation Guide, shared in December 2021. For IFs specific allocations, please refer to the demands made through the Accommodation Management System (AMS).

Concerning the contractual conditions and obligations linked to Accommodation, all is specified in the Accommodation Allocation Agreement (AAA), sent in 2023.

ACCREDITATION

OLYMPIC IDENTITY AND ACCREDITATION CARD (OIAC)

The Olympic Identity and Accreditation Card (OIAC) is the official Paris 2024 Olympic Games document that establishes the identity of its holder and their entitlements. In addition, the OIAC will provide accredited individuals with access to Olympic venues and other services during the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, according to their role.





To ensure the safety and security of all Games participants, they must pass a background check in order to receive an OIAC. The background check will be carried out by the relevant French Government agencies.

-> PRE-VALID CARD VALIDATION

Before validation, the OIAC is referred to as a Pre-Valid Card (PVC). The Paris 2024 Accreditation team will produce Pre-Valid Cards (PVCs) for all IF staff and international technical officials. Accredited delegates will be able to validate their



PVC in accordance with the dates for each sport.

Individuals arriving in France on international

Individuals arriving in France on international flights at Charles-de-Gaulle and Orly airports will be able to validate their PVCs at the airport from 15 July 2024. Individuals arriving via other ports of entry will have to go to the appropriate accreditation centre to finalise the procedure for validating their accreditation. Each participant will need to visit an accreditation facility in person to finalise the validation procedure. Individuals will need to bring their PVC and the valid ID provided to Paris 2024 during the accreditation application process.

Unlike previous editions of the Olympic Games, the OIAC/PVC does not act as a visa waiver. For accredited participants who need a short-stay

visa to enter the Schengen Area, Paris 2024 submits a visa request as part of the accreditation process. The final visa will be printed on the PVC and not on the participant's passport.

ACCREDITATION CATEGORIES AND PRIVILEGES

All Games participants are provided with access to only the venues and zones that are required for them to complete the duties associated with their roles. The table below outlines the level of access granted to IF population.

→ CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION (COP)

As required by the IOC and in accordance with Rule 40 of the Olympic Charter, IF delegates and J category population (technical officials, judges, and jury members) must complete and sign a Conditions of Participation including the Parental/Legal Guardian Acknowledgement of Consent for Minors form (if applicable), acknowledging their compliance with the IOC and International Federation rules regarding Games participation and the World Anti-Doping Code. Each individual applicant must provide their original signature on a hard copy of the Conditions of Participation form. The form will be available in English and French. Each IF is required to return signed COP prior to arrivals. Paris 2024 will not be able to validate your PVC if the signed COP is not submitted before the Games.

-> UNIFORM COLLECTION AT THE URC

All IF delegates and technical officials should visit the Uniform and Accreditation Centre (UAC) to collect their uniforms or from the accreditation centres in co-host cities.

French Technical Officials will have the possibility to collect their accreditation and uniform in advance at the UAC or in one of the co-host or football cities. For the rest of the technical officials, an UAC visit will be organised for each group of





technical officials according to their programme of activities before the first day of competition. Those who either are unable to complete the validation process at the airport or do not receive their PVCs in advance of the Games will be able to collect their OIAC at the UAC prior to collecting the uniform.

All Technical Officials must go to the UAC, except those officiating in co-host cities, and those who have been identified and contacted for a pick-up in co-host cities prior to their arrival in Paris.

→ ENTRY INTO FRANCE

In line with the Host City Contract, and in agreement with the IOC, PVCs facilitate entry into France. However, unlike previous editions of the Olympic Games, the OIAC/PVC does not act as a visa waiver. For accredited participants who need a short-stay visa to enter the Schengen Area, Paris 2024 submits a visa request as part of the accreditation process.

These requests will be processed centrally in France by the Games Consulate, which is operational since January 2024, and only issues multiple-entry short-stay visas (maximum of 90 days within 180 consecutive days) valid from 26 June 2024 to 11 September 2024. All previous visits to the Schengen Area (including previous short-stay visas) within the last 180 days will count towards the maximum of 90 days.

Any participant requiring a long-stay visa or a short-stay visa outside of these dates will have to follow the standard visa process available from the French authorities. The short-stay requirement also applies to visa exempt participants (non- EU/ Schengen nationals).

Once the short-stay Schengen visa request process has been successfully completed, the visa number will be printed on the participant's PVC, which, together with a valid passport (same document used during the accreditation process), will serve as an entry document to France for the purpose of participating in the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

If the participant does not need a visa, they do not need a visa number printed on their PVC.

-> LOST, STOLEN, DAMAGED ACCREDITATION CARDS

Lost and stolen accreditation cards should be reported immediately to the nearest accreditation centre or to the Olympic Family Hotel (OFH) or to the Venue Accreditation Help Office (VAHO). Participants will be required to complete a Lost/ Stolen Accreditation Card form and present an acceptable form of identification.

Accreditation cards which are damaged in such a way that the photograph and/or the personal information is not legible or that the access control system is not able to read the card, should also be returned for replacement at any accreditation facility that provides accreditation card printing.

Please note that PVCs or OIACs cannot be reissued after the end of the operational period of Paris 2024 accreditation facilities.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Paris 2024 will use several airports and train stations to welcome IF population to the Olympic Games. The period of full arrival and departure operations will be effective 11 days before the Opening Ceremony and will end three days after the Closing Ceremony; 15 July - 14 August 2024.

The types of Port of Entry (POE) mentioned below are used by Paris 2024 to serve the official accommodation of the 2024 Olympic Games.

PRIMARY PORTS OF ENTRY (PPOE).

Paris-Charles de Gaulle (CDG) and Paris-Orly (ORY) international airports will be the Primary Ports of Entry (PPOE) - Olympic Gateway - and will offer full arrival and departure services from 15 July - 14 August 2024. Services will be available in all terminals at the PPOE.

SECONDARY PORTS OF ENTRY (SPOE)

Secondary Ports of Entry (SPOE) will have limited services according to the information provided by IFs in the ADS

Five SPOEs will be available during the Olympic Games:

- → Fa'a'ā International Airport (PPT), Papeete Tahiti
- → Paris-Gare de Lyon (train station), Paris
- → Gare de Marseille Saint-Charles (train station), Marseille
- → Paris-Gare du Nord (train station), Paris
- → Marseille Provence Airport (MRS), Marseille

In addition, 20 Arrivals & Departures Service Points (AND SPs) will be available during the Olympic Games: in co-host cities airport and train stations (see list in the Arrivals & Departures Guide). They will offer the same level of services as in SPOEs; but are activated on restricted dates depending on the competitions and information received via the ADS.

On the days of the Opening Ceremony (26 July 2024) and Closing Ceremony (11 August 2024), the Arrivals and Departures service strongly advises against arriving after 13:00. Transport services will be very limited and therefore congested. In addition, airspace will be closed from 17:30. All services will resume as normal the following day.

Accreditation validation desks will be available in all terminals at Paris-Charles de Gaulle (CDG) and Paris-Orly (ORY) to allow IF population to validate their PVCs.

Accreditation validation desks will be open from 07:00-23:00 from 15 July - 11 August 2024. Validation desks will be located in secure zones of the terminals between immigration and the baggage claim area or in the baggage claim area depending on the terminals. Only PVC validation will be possible at CDG and ORY.



CEREMONIES

The Paris 2024 Opening Ceremony will take place on the river Seine, in the heart of the city, and the Closing Ceremony will be held at Stade de France, near the Olympic Village.

OPENING CEREMONY

For the first time, the Opening Ceremony will not take place in a stadium but in the heart of Paris, on the "Olympic Seine". Athletes will be the heart of the ceremony, which will start with the Athletes' Parade. Throughout the Ceremony, athletes will be featured on boats alongside performers.

The Opening Ceremony will consist of three main elements:

- → Athletes' Parade: NOC delegations will travel six kilometres from east to west on the river Seine.
- → Artistic show: There will be performances on river barges and bridges along the route of the Athletes' Parade.
- → Protocol elements: Some protocol elements of the ceremony will take place at the Trocadéro and Iéna Bridge.

TIME

The Opening Ceremony will start at 19:30 on 26 July 2024 and will end at 23:15.

SEATING AND TICKETS

For the Opening Ceremony, the IF President, IF Secretary General and their accompanying guests, Executive Board Members, IF Delegates and IF Senior Staff will have a seat in the Trocadero's venue.

To reach their seats in Trocadero, they will have to follow this itinerary: they will have to reach the PSA in Kleber metro station and present a valid accreditation along with the elements of the Ceremony Kit. The IF will be in charge of distributing the ceremony kit to all clients, except for the IF President and Sec Gen for who the IOC will manage the distribution.

Your Sport Manager or Services will come back to you to organize your collection of the Ceremony kits.

If for any reason your IF wishes to transfer Trocadero quota, this will be possible only to accredited population. The IF will also have to ensure the transfer of the Ceremony Kit.

ITO will be seating in Quais de Seine. The person in charge of the CTP in your Federation will have to redistribute the tickets to each ITO. Tickets are not transferable.

TRANSPORT TO THE OPENING CEREMONY

Olympic Family members seated on Trocadero will receive information regarding the journey from the Kleber Station to the Trocadero one and the list of metro station closures on 26 July to help them to build their journey planner. For any assistance, please refer to your SPT counterpart.

In addition, the following paragraph is mentioned in the DSLA: "EB members will come to Kléber by public transport to join the operations with the Olympic Family.

Metro Kléber will be secured by Paris 2024 for the accredited guests, mainly the Olympic Family. Metro Kléber, Line 6 of the Parisian metro, is located on Avenue Kléber. Once they arrive at Kléber, the EB members will get on the metro directly to Trocadéro (2 metro stations ahead). The metro will not stop in between the two stations. The metro will only operate for the accredited guests before and after the ceremony.

We recommend getting there before H-3 because of the spectator flow all over Paris. The best way to get to Kléber is by arriving to the stop station Charles de Gaulle - Etoile with the metro lines 1, 2 and RER A. Once arrived at Kléber by walk, they will join the operations with the privatized metro.

They will use the metro to get to Trocadero, to the ceremony. Once the ceremony is over, the operations will run until all the accredited guests have arrived at Kléber."

Regarding ITOs, the journey planners are already available in the DSLA Finale Version.

→ CLOSING CEREMONY

The Closing Ceremony will take place at Stade de France, the nation's largest stadium.

The ceremony will start at 21:00 and finish at 23:15. Note that timings are subject to change.



SEATING AND TICKETS

The IF President, IF Secretary General and their accompanying guests, Executive Board Members, IF Delegates and IF Senior Staff will have to present a valid accreditation along with the elements of the Ceremony Kit. The IF will be in charge of distributing the ceremony kit to all clients, except for the IF President and Sec Gen for who the IOC will manage the distribution.

Your Sport Manager or Services will come back to you to organize your collection of the Ceremony kits.

If for any reason your IF wishes to transfer the quota, this will be possible only to accredited population. The IF will also have to ensure the transfer of the Ceremony Kit.

Regarding ITO, the person in charge of the CTP in your Federation will have to redistribute the tickets to each ITO. Tickets are not transferable.

TRANSPORT TO STADE DE FRANCE

Olympic Family members will receive information regarding the journey from the OFH to Stade de France and the list of metro station closures on 26 July to help them to build their journey planner. For any assistance, please refer to your SPT counterpart.

Regarding ITOs, the journey planners are already available in the DSLA Finale Version.

ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

Paris 2024 has been committed to proposing a different model for the Games, one that is more sober and just as spectacular, and it is mobilising all its energies to achieve this. Paris 2024 is taking action at every level to reduce its impact on the climate and the environment. By developing and testing more responsible solutions in all areas of the organisation, Paris 2024 also hopes to inspire and leave a legacy for more responsible sport.

Paris 2024 is committed to halving its carbon emissions compared with the average for previous editions of the Games (London 2012, Rio 2016).

To achieve this, Paris 2024 is taking action at every level. By relying on 95% existing or temporary infrastructure, by offering twice as much plant-based food, by using less than 50% single-use plastic in catering, by finding a second-life solution for 100% of the temporary infrastructure and furniture on the Games sites, by connecting the venues to the public electricity grid to avoid the use of generators and by supplying the venues with 100% renewable electricity.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The success of more responsible Games is everyone's responsibility. At all the venues, you have the opportunity to act at your own level and help Paris 2024 achieve its objectives for Games that everyone can be proud of. That's why Paris 2024 encourages you to adopt a few eco-reflexes:

- → Using reusable water bottles and water fountains at the Olympic Village to reduce plastic waste.
- → Using the waste sorting system to reduce the volume of waste that is sent to landfill sites.
- → Promoting responsible food options and reducing food waste.
- → Ensuring the responsible management of water and energy resources.
- → Preserving sites and biodiversity, and respecting equipment to encourage their second life.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE

Considering previous studies conducted by Paris 2024, the quality of the officials' experience results from a food and beverage offer that meets the dietary needs an individual. As a result, food and beverage services will be sustainable according to the Food Vision developed by Paris 2024 in collaboration with the Sport Managers' insight.

At competition venues, Paris 2024 will provide food and beverages services for TOs in the Technical Officials' Lounges and Venue Dining.

→ In the Technical Official's Lounge: A refreshment station will be set up in the Technical Officials' lounge of each venue during the Olympic and Paralympic Games, including during the familiarisation phase prior to the start of the competition. The service will include snacks such as cereal bars and fruits, as well as Coca Cola products and hot drinks. Cold drinks will be provided in glass bottles to comply with French AGEC Law.

- → In the Venue Dining: If Technical Officials spend more than four (4) hours on the competition venue, they can order and pay for one (1) of the two (2) meal options available at each Venue Dining:
 - Technical Official Venue Meal (TOVM): packed cold lunch box.
 - Enhanced Technical Official Venue Meal (ETOVM): buffet service with hot and cold options.

Meal services can be provided after completing the purchase by credit card (Visa only) or cash directly at the Venue Dining using the Per Diem allowance of each Technical Official. Vouchers can be purchased near the entrance of the Venue Dining. A counter and cash desk will be set up in all Venue Dining areas before the queuing area. Technical Officials will be given a paper voucher as soon as they have paid. Technical Officials will receive a per diem (see Per diem section below) that is aimed at being used to pay for meal vouchers.

Please note the opening hours of the Venue Dining: 11:00 to 15:00 / 17:00 to 21:00. These opening hours are generic and are in certain cases adjusted according to the competition schedule. The two (2) options can be eaten at the Venue Dining.

HOSPITALITY

As part of this unprecedented celebration and driven by a desire to be innovative, it is fitting that Paris 2024 will also be the first Olympic and Paralympic Games to implement the New Hospitality Model and offer a revolutionary approach that provides fans from all over the world with a first-of-its-kind, unparalleled hospitality experience.

One of the driving forces behind Paris 2024 adapting this new model is to re-invent and elevate the hospitality designed for and delivered to those that are the heart and soul of the Olympic and Paralympic Games – our Games Stakeholders.

IF have access to three types of Hospitality lounges in venues:

- → Olympic Family Lounge
- → Upgraded IF Lounge
- → Private IF Lounge





INSURANCE

Coverage for ITOs and NTOs during the Olympic Games is as follows;

DISABILITY AND DEATH COVER APPLICABLE TO ALL

Assistance and invalidity/death cover are identical for both categories (ITOs/NTOs).

In the event of death or disability occurring in France during the period of mobilisation of technical officials for the Olympic and Paralympic Games, the sum insured is 80,000 euros.

In the event of recognised disability, and after stabilisation, the victim will receive 80,000 euros in the event of disability of more than 60%. In the event of lesser disability, the victim will receive 80,000 euros multiplied by the percentage of disability. For example, if the victim is 50% disabled, he or she will receive €40,000.

MEDICAL EXPENSES REPATRIATION ASSISTANCE COVER

For other cover, a difference must be considered between those (generally French nationals or French residents) who are beneficiaries of the French social security system (A), and those who are not (B).

-> A. BENEFICIARIES OF THE FRENCH SOCIAL SECURITY SYSTEM

URSSAF rules will apply:

- → Use of the "carte Vitale"
- → Complementary reimbursement by the mutual insurance company
- → Any remaining expenses will be covered by the specific guarantee set up by Paris 2024. In order to benefit from this cover, ITOs and NTOs can write directly to assurances@paris2024.org. The Paris 2024 insurance team will put them in direct contact with the relevant insurer.

→ B. FOREIGN BENEFICIARIES NOT COVERED BY URSSAF

→ The claim must be reported to the Paris 2024 insurance team as soon as possible at assurances@paris2024.org. This point is fundamental to confront the insurer with the problem and thus avoid any hassle for the victim.

- → Except in exceptional cases, or where the insurance contract excludes coverage, the aim is to avoid any payment on the part of the victim, as the expenses will be covered directly by the insurer.
- → The amount of medical expenses covered will not exceed 150,000 euros.

→ C. REPATRIATION

→ Whatever the victim's origin or nationality, repatriation is covered at 100% by the insurer contacted by Paris 2024. The final decision to repatriate, as well as the conditions of repatriation, can only be decided by the insurer/assister accompanied by our medical team.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Public health services, including disease surveillance, communicable disease control, food and water quality control and air quality monitoring will be in place throughout France during the Games.

MEDICAL SERVICES AT VENUES

-> ATHLETE MEDICAL SERVICES AT COMPETITION VENUES

At least one dedicated athlete medical station will be available at all competition venues. Each medical station will provide medical such as first aid, emergency care, sports medicine to athletes and team officials.

At most venues there will be an ambulance on site for the evacuation of athletes if needed. If not directly on site, ambulances will be available nearby.

→ TECHNICAL OFFICIALS SERVICES AT COMPETITION VENUES

Medical services to technical officials at competition venues will be provided by the spectators medical services.

-> FIELD-OF-PLAY RESPONSE

Field-of-Play (FOP) teams will provide first aid and emergency care to athletes and team officials on the FOP should such services be required. If necessary, the patient will be taken from the FOP and transported to the athlete medical station, Olympic Village Polyclinic, or a designated Games hospital as appropriate. The order of response on the FOP and any decision-making will differ according to the sport and the rules of the respective IF.





DESIGNATED CAMES HOSPITALS

If the necessary medical services cannot be provided at the venue medical station, IF population will be transferred to designated Games hospitals in Paris or the co-host city.

Any patient suffering from a life-threatening condition at any of the venue zones will be taken to the nearest hospital.

The following public hospitals have been designated as the official hospital for IF population during the Paris 2024 Olympic Games:

PER DIEMS

All Technical Officials participating in the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games will receive a per-diem to cover daily expenses and additional costs (transport between home and the station/airport, meals on and off the competition site, laundry, etc.). To do so, Paris 2024 sends a global Per Diem Grant to each International Federation, who has to transfer the corresponding amount to each IF Delegates and International Technical Officials. For National technical Officials, Paris 2024 sends directly the corresponding amount to the Technical Official. The exact amount of the Per Diem depends on the official operational dates that have been communicated by Paris 2024, or by the International Federation.

Per Diem payment will be made as follows:

- Technical Delegate and International Technical Officials: payment of the Per Diem by the International Federation.
- → National Technical Officials: payment of the Per Diem by Paris 2024 ahead of the event.

RATE CARD

The Rate Card programme is a service provided by Paris 2024 to IFs. The Rate Card team will provide a complete end-to-end service to customers: ordering, invoicing, payment, procurement, delivery and installation.

Paris 2024 has created a Rate Card Ordering Platform to facilitate the ordering process. Rate Card orders placed prior to the Games-time ordering period can only be placed through this platform.

A Rate Card catalogue has been shared with all IFs, covering all the products and services available for IFs. Three main categories of items are available through the catalogue:

- → Technology services
- → Furniture fixtures and equipment
- → Transport (vehicles & VAPPs)

Non-Standard Requests cover products, services and locations requested by Rate Card Customer which are not fully covered in the published catalogue items.

SECURITY

In accordance with its letter of guarantee and the IOC's Host City Contract, the French State is responsible for the safety and security of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

The government will coordinate all security matters as well as emergency services, whilst Paris 2024 is responsible for the design,





implementation, and execution of security measures at Paris 2024 competition and non-competition venues.

Paris 2024 has partnered with national security agencies to integrate the most effective security arrangements within venues and other official sites.

SECURITY AT VENUES

-> VENUE INSPECTION AND LOCKDOWN

All competition and some non-competition venues (such as hotels) will undergo a security inspection by specialist government departments and a lockdown period prior to the Games.

During the lockdown period, all security and safety procedures will be implemented, and access controls will be activated with the support of technology measures. However, please note that French legislation does not allow facial recognition. During this period, no person, vehicle, or equipment may enter the venues without accreditation (or other appropriate access devices) and without passing the appropriate security checks.

After the accreditation check, people wishing to access venues will be subject to a personal and property inspection. Personal and baggage inspections for people whose age, mobility or medical reasons do not allow them to undergo the generic procedure are subject to an adapted procedure that takes better account of their specific needs.

PROHIBITED OR RESTRICTED ITEMS POLICY

-> PROHIBITED ITEMS

These items are strictly forbidden in the Paris 2024 venues.

AT COMPETITION VENUES

- → Firearms and/or ammunition not used for Games competitions.
- → **Replica weapons:** airsoft firearms, replica weapons and/or reproductions that could cast doubt on the owner's intention.
- → Weapons "of opportunity": selfie sticks, everyday blades (such as multi-tools, scissors, ra-zors etc.) that can malevolently be used as a weapon to inflict harm.
- → Explosives, flammable substances, and pyrotechnic devices: explosive devices, improvised explosive devices, gunpowder, smoke bombs, smoke, flares, fireworks, objects re-sembling explosive devices, ignition devices.

- → Dangerous substances, doping products, and illegal narcotics: items likely to in-fringe the law regulating toxic and noxious substances, narcotics and stimulants or other illegal drugs in France, Europe, and other parts of the world, items corresponding to dangerous mate-rials under French legislation, tear gas, pressurised containers, items corresponding to dan-gerous materials,
- → Alcoholic beverages.
- → Glass containers, cans, and tins.
- → Wireless equipment not authorised without a TAG from French spectrum agency (ANFR): radios, microphones, broadcasting cameras, drones, satellite links, wireless 4G routers, jamming or scanning equipment, radio scanners.
- → Political, religious, vulgar messaging, or trademarks: advertising materials, signs, banners, etc. that include a religious or political message, or are deemed contrary to public or-der. Ropes, carboards, posters, and other items that can be used for demonstrations in the ven-ues.
- → Personal mobility devices, whether electric or not: bicycles, scooters, rollerblades, skates, gyropods, hoverboards, etc.
- → Objects producing excessive noise: megaphones, vuvuzelas, air horns.
- → Laser pointers.

IN OLYMPIC VILLAGES

- Firearms and/or ammunition not used for Games competitions.
- → **Replica weapons**: airsoft firearms, replica weapons and/or reproductions that could cast doubt on the owner's intention.
- → Explosives, flammable substances, and pyrotechnic devices: explosive devices, improvised explosive devices, gunpowder, smoke bombs, smoke, flares, fireworks, objects re-sembling explosive devices, ignition devices.
- → Dangerous substances, doping products, and illegal narcotics: items likely to in-fringe the law regulating toxic and noxious substances, narcotics and stimulants or other illegal drugs in France, Europe, and other parts of the world, items corresponding to dangerous mate-rials under French legislation, tear gas, pressurised containers, items corresponding to dan-gerous materials,
- → Wireless equipment not authorised without a TAG from French spectrum agency (ANFR): radios, microphones, broadcasting cameras, drones, satellite links, wireless 4G routers, jamming or scanning equipment, radio scanner.
- → Political, religious, vulgar messaging, or trademarks: advertising materials, signs, banners, etc. that include a religious or political message, or are deemed





contrary to public or-der. Ropes, carboards, posters, and other items that can be used for demonstrations in the venues,

-> RESTRICTED ITEMS

These items are authorised at venues but restricted in quantity and/or nature.

AT COMPETITION VENUES

- → Weapons of opportunity: only walking aids are authorised,
- → Flammable substances: only portable oxygen cylinders for medical use are allowed,
- → Containers: plastic bottles, plastic or metallic flasks/gourd are allowed,
- → Luggage: large sports bags and large pieces of luggage are permitted,
- → Animals: only service dogs are allowed,
- → Flags: only flags of countries and territories participating in the Games are allowed, without rigid flagpoles, and without size restrictions for athletes at competition venues.

IN OLYMPIC VILLAGES

- → Weapons of opportunity: walking aids, everyday blades (such as multi-tools, scissors, ra-zors etc.) that are allowed in planes, that can malevolently be used as a weapon to inflict harm.
- → **Flammable substances**: only portable oxygen cylinders for medical use are allowed,
- → Animals: only service dogs are allowed,
- → Sprays and aerosols: sprays and aerosols used for daily hygiene such as deodorants are al-lowed,
- → Objects producing excessive noise: personal musical instruments and music speakers are allowed,
- → **Flags:** only flags of countries and territories participating in the Games are allowed, without rigid poles. No maximum size for athletes at Villages.

-> OBJECTS CONSIDERED AS "TOOLS OF THE TRADE"

Objects authorised at venues only if they are required to carry out professional activities for certain stakeholders.

AT COMPETITION VENUES

→ Weapon of opportunity: tools such as hammers, wrenches, saws, screwdrivers, etc. needed to maintain sports equipment and personal mobility aids for people

with reduced mobility, but that can malevolently be used as a weapon to inflict harm,

- → Personal mobility devices: bicycles and other personal means of transport required for on-site competitions,
- → **Sprays and aerosols:** sprays and aerosols required for sports and for the treatment of ath-letes,
- Photography equipment: camera lenses larger than 20cm are authorised.
- → **Camera equipment:** all equipment used to take photos and videos to analyse athlete per-formance.
- → Medical equipment for the treatment of athletes.

IN OLYMPIC VILLAGES

- → **Weapon of opportunity:** tools such as hammers, wrenches, saws, screwdrivers, etc. neces-sary to help people settle at villages and the maintenance of sports equipment.
- → Laser pointers to be used in meetings
- → Medical equipment for the treatment of athletes.

At the F-DRM, the Chefs de Mission will receive stickers to be applied on tools of trade that have been registered in advance via Paris 2024 NOC services. The Chef de Mission will be responsible to distribute the stickers to all the delegation.

Please note that for security reasons, the use of drones is strictly forbidden at all competition and non-competition venues of the Olympic Games

Paris 2024 recommends that IF representatives do not programme emergency service numbers into mobile phones as speed dial functions can lead to accidental calls to the emergency services.



TICKETING AND ACCREDITED SEATING

CAMES-TIME TICKET SALES

At Games time, available tickets may only be purchased through the CTP.

-> TICKET TOUTING

Tickets for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games are only on sale on the official ticketing website for future spectators from all over the world. No other sales platform is authorised to sell tickets. By buying tickets or hospitality packages outside official channels, the buyer runs the risk that tickets or packages are not delivered to them, or that access to the sports venues will be denied to them by the Paris 2024 Organising Committee in accordance with the ticketing general terms and conditions. In addition, all buyers and/or sellers are informed that the unauthorised sale or resale of tickets outside of the official channels, constitutes an offense under French law, in particular, an offense sanctionable under article 313-6-2 of the French criminal code.

TRANSPORT

Paris 2024 aims to provide a safe, reliable and efficient system of transport, within the Host Country, free of charge, for technical officials, Olympic Family members and International Federation staff.

The transport services will consist of:

- → Transport for Federations (TF)
- → Public Transport (TP)
- → Transport Connect (TC)
- → On-Demand Transport Service (TX)

The TF Transport service will be provided from each official IF hotel as a base connecting to the competition venues, UAC, technical meetings.

TF TRANSPORT

A summary of transport at the Games follows.

Please note that full details of transport services at the Games, including timetables, may be found in the DSLA communicated to IFs.

Paris 2024 is responsible for providing transport services to properly accredited technical officials and IF staff during the period of the Olympic Games.

These transport services are collectively known as the TF service.

The TF service will be available for all accredited technical officials, judges, jury members, IF staff, and IF media staff.





-> SERVICES BETWEEN HOTELS AND COMPETITION VENUES

A dedicated TF service will operate between technical officials' hotels and each competition venue during the competition period for each sport, in accordance with the competition schedule. In general, TF services will start service two hours before competition and finish one hour after competition.

Where technical officials are required to attend meetings, briefings, venue familiarisations or other events before the start of competition, either at the competition venue or at another venue, TF services will be provided from and to the technical officials' hotels in accordance with the officials' requirements. However, in cases where the number of passengers is small, the principle is that the passengers should travel in the vehicles allocated to IF.

INTERCITY TRAVEL

Transport will be provided for technical officials between Paris and co-host cities. Details will be communicated to technical officials on arrival.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

All accredited stakeholders will be entitled to free-of-charge access to public transport (TP) services within the Greater Paris area and in co-host cities, from 15 July to 14 August 2024.

-> GREATER PARIS AREA

A physical transport card (Navigo) will be provided during the accreditation validation process for each Games stakeholder with TP privileges. At the end of the stay, stakeholders must leave the pass in a dedicated collection box at Transport Desks and Port of Entries.

In the Greater Paris area, most official venues can be reached by TP

Approximate TP hours of operation are as follows:

- → Buses from 05:45 00:45
- → Metro from 05:30 01:15 (until 2:15 on Fridays and Saturdays)
- → RER from 04:30 01:15
- → Trams from 05:10 01:00

These hours are for information only. Full details will be available on the Paris 2024 Transport Accred app.

-> CO-HOST CITIES

In the co-host cities, most competition venues can be reached by public transport (except Tahiti). Bordeaux, Châteauroux, Lille, Lyon, Marseille, Nantes, Nice, and Saint-Etienne all have public transport systems that can be used free-of-charge by accredited stakeholders. Where applicable, access means will be distributed at the relevant co-host city.

Public transport in Châteauroux will be free of charge for both the general public and accredited stakeholders, therefore no access means will be distributed.

TRANSPORT CONNECT (TC)

The Transport Connect service (TC) is dedicated to accredited stakeholders and its aim is to complement public transport services. TC services will include regular shuttle and bus routes that connect transport hubs and public transit stations with venues, making it easier to reach venues than with public transport alone. The TP network will use various forms of transport (metro, bus, tram, RER trains) as well as TC lines. In some cases, TC lines could be replaced by TP if the journey is more direct and efficient.

TC will be operational from 15 July to 14 August 2024. Activations will start 4 hours before competition sessions and end 4 hours after competition sessions. On non-competition days TC will be activated from 8:00 to 20:00.

A TC night loop called Noctilien has also been created to complement regular TP offer during nighttime. It will run between 26 July and 12 August 2024 with a peak frequency of 10 minutes.





TC will be activated in the Greater Paris area, Lyon area, Lyon, Marseille, Lille, Chateauroux, Nantes, Nice, Bordeaux, Saint-Etienne and Tahiti.

The TC system is also available for all spectating athletes to reach competition venues. Spectating athletes can use the Paris 2024 Transport Accred app to plan their route.

Please note that TC drop-off and pick-up zones are located outside venue security perimeters.

TRANSPORT APP

Paris 2024 will launch a dedicated Games-time Transport app for all accredited stakeholders. This will be different to the Île-de-France Mobilités (IDFM) transport app for public transport.

The main functionalities will include:

- → Journey planner to calculate the best itineraries according to user preferences.
- → Multimodal app suggesting itineraries that use both public transport services (TP) and Paris 2024 transport services (each accredited stakeholder will only see the Paris 2024 transport services that they are entitled to).
- → Real-time travel information (travel time updates, next departures, and alerts).
- → Booking functionalities for TX services (available according to user privileges).

The app will be available to download from the Android Play Store and Apple App Store, and will be available in French, English, Spanish.

UNIFORMS

Paris 2024 and Le Coq Sportif, our official partner, have developed a uniform, consisting of a mix of casual and semi-formal items, which combines comfort, aesthetics and functionality, while respecting their joint commitment for sustainability.

The uniform has a unisex design, is adapted to different body types and made in breathable and resistant materials.

All technical officials will be provided with a uniform kit, containing the following items:







UAC - ALTERATION SERVICE

Officials of sports held in co-host cities will be able to collect their uniforms directly from the competition venue, and an alteration service will also be made available.






