OBITUARY

The International Fencing Federation has been affected by the loss of several friends and it is with deep sadness that the FIE has learned of the passing of:

MIKHAIL ZOLOTAREV (RUS) 1956 – 2022

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Mikhail Zolotarev on December 22, 2022. He was an Honoured Coach of Russia and a USSR Master of Sports.

Zolotarev worked with the USSR national team from 1985 to 1989, after which he lived and worked in Hungary until 1991. He worked actively for many years with the Russian national foil team. His notable students included Olympic champions Svetlana Boyko and Victoria Nikishina, Olympic silver medallists Sergei Golubitskiy and Vladimir Lapitsky, and numerous winners of European and World Championships.

Mikhail Zolotarev was awarded the medal of the Order “For Merit to the Fatherland of the II Degree” and the honorary badge “For Merit in Sports”.

He was born on February 13, 1956.

ALEKSANDR PAVLOV (RUS) 1954 – 2022

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Aleksandr Pavlov on December 28, 2022. He was a USSR Master of Sports and had been Vice President of the Russian Fencing Federation since 2001.

Pavlov was a referee in all Russian and international categories. He performed much academic work in sports and fencing. He was an Honoured Worker of Physical Culture of the Russian Federation and Candidate of Pedagogical Sciences, Associate Professor. Since 1998 he was head of the Department of Theory and Methodology of Martial Arts. For many years he also worked as part of the integrated scientific group of the Russian fencing team, and in 2009 became its leader. On his personal initiative, annual all-Russian scientific and practical conferences were held, dedicated to the various issues and problems of sport fencing.

For many years, he served as Chairman of the Smolensk Regional Fencing Federation.

Aleksandr Pavlov was born on March 6, 1954.

DAVID LUTONISAMO MAVIVANA (COD) 1971 – 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of David Lutonisamo Mavivana (COD) on January 12. He was the second vice-chairman of the Fencing Federation of the Democratic Republic of Congo, elected in 2020 and in charge of finances for the Federal Executive Committee. Prior to that, he was the third vice-president from 2005 to 2020.

Born on July 21, 1971, in Kinshasa, throughout his life Mr. Mavivana voluntarily participated in multiple activities to promote and develop fencing in the DR Congo. This included participating in many working committees for the sport and introducing numerous mandates in the Federation.

According to a statement from the Federation, “Everyone will remember that David Mavivana has been and will always be for Congolese fencing, a model of continuity and altruism that keeps a door open to the future. We will not forget that he was one of the pioneering members of the sport of fencing in the DR Congo.”

Mr. Mavivana was an entrepreneur, manager and promoter of several initiatives and a partner of the Compagnie Sucrière de Kwilu-Ngongo. He attended the Higher Institute of Commerce in Kinshasa, where he obtained his graduate diploma in commercial and financial sciences with a specialisation in accounting.

ADAM LISEWSKI (POL, MH, HOF) 1944 – 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Mr. Adam Lisewski (POL, MH) on February 23. He was an FIE Member of Honor (2013) and a member of the FIE Refereeing Commission from 1976 to 1984, and 1990 to 1998.

Mr. Lisewski was born on January 20, 1944, in Warsaw and received a master engineering degree from the Warsaw University of Technology. He had a long, distinguished career in fencing as both an athlete and official. Most notably, he was a bronze medallist in men’s team foil at the 1968 Mexico City Olympic Games and later became president of the Polish Fencing Federation from 1980 to 1988 and 1992 to 2008. He served as a board member of the Polish Olympic Committee from 1980 until the present.

For the FIE, Mr. Lisewski was appointed as a technical and refereeing delegate at 15 junior and senior fencing World Championships, and organiser of the 2001 Gdansk Junior and Cadet Fencing World Championships.

He served as a member of the European Fencing Confederation for eight years, organising junior and senior European Championships in Poznan, Krakow, and Gdansk.

As an athlete, in addition to his Olympic bronze, Mr. Lisewski was a four-time team foil medallist at the World Championships (silver, 1965 and 1971; bronze, 1966 and 1967) and won a gold medal at the 1963 University Games in men’s team épée and foil, bronze in men’s team épée in 1965 and silver in men’s team foil in 1970.

Mr. Lisewski’s accomplishments were recognized by being awarded a “Distinguished Master of Sport”, among other accolades including a silver medal for Outstanding Sports Achievements, silver (1979) and gold (1988) Crosses of Merit and the Knight’s Cross of OOP (1997).

ALLAN JAY (GBR, HOF) 1931 – 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Allan Louis Neville Jay (GBR, HOF) born on June 6, 1931. Hailed as one of the greatest fencers in British history and a member of the FIE Hall of Fame, he competed in five Olympic Games, including Rome 1960 in épée and foil where he won silver medals in men’s team and individual épée.

Mr. Jay also took part in the Olympic Games of Helsinki 1952, Melbourne 1956, Tokyo 1964, and Mexico City 1968. Primarily a foilist and épéist, he also competed in team sabre at the Melbourne Olympics.

Mr. Jay won medals at eight World Championships, including becoming world champion with a gold in individual foil in Budapest in 1959. He earned several silver and bronze medals at five World Championships overall, including men’s team foil (bronze, 1955), men’s individual foil (bronze, 1957 and 1959), men’s team épée (bronze, 1957; silver, 1965) and men’s individual épée (silver, 1959).

He also earned seven gold medals at the Commonwealth Games and six at the Maccabiah Games. Early in his fencing career, Mr. Jay competed in the 1950 British Empire Games for the Australian team, where he won a gold medal in men’s team épée.

Mr. Jay served as member of the FIE Disciplinary Commission, elected in 2000 and 2004, and was elected to the FIE Scale of Votes Commission in 1996.

A solicitor by profession, Mr. Jay studied law at Oxford University. He was the vice president of the British Fencing Association and served as their honorary legal advisor for 10 years. He was the British Fencing team manager for 15 years (1982-1996).

AIDA KHASANOVA (UZB) 1983 – 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Aida Khasanova (UZB), born on August 4, 1983, in Tashkent, Uzbekistan. She was a member of the FIE Refereeing Commission, elected in 2021.

Aida Khasanova became an FIE referee in 2014, serving at many international championships and tournaments, and was the first referee from Uzbekistan and Central Asia to represent her homeland at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games in 2021. She was also the only female referee representing the entire Asian region at Tokyo 2020.

“As a referee and FIE commission member, Aida achieved very much in her short life, and she represents success and hope to women in fencing worldwide”, said Irina Knysch, President of the FIE Refereeing Commission. “Not only was she a wonderful friend, but she was also a significant contributor to international fencing on many levels. We will miss her tremendously and always remember her great personality and friendship, and everything she gave to us and our sport.” In 2016, she represented Uzbekistan as a referee at the World and Asian Championships. In 2017, she moved to Lausanne to take part in creating an international handbook on referee training, which was published on the FIE website later that year.

Since then, Aida Khasanova also served as Chief Referee at the Fencing Federation of Uzbekistan and trained numerous international referees who have already represented their country in international competitions.

A Master of Sport in Fencing, Aida Khasanova studied from 2001 to 2006 at the Uzbek State Institute of Sport and Physical education, followed by becoming a methodologist of the Children and Youth School of the Olympic Reserve. She also attended the Academy of International Sports Relations in Korea from 2016 to 2017, where she was selected to take part from more than 50 international candidates.

She held an honorary status as a delegate of the Asian Confederation to the 2018 Asian Summer Games, held in Indonesia.

Prior to her refereeing career, Aida Khasanova was a multiple-time national champion in women’s foil, the Central Asian champion from 2001 to 2006 and a gold medallist at the International Tournament in England in 2005.

JACQUES A. HOCHSTAETTER (SUI, MH, HOF) 1928 – 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Jacques A. Hochstaetter (SUI, MH, HOF), born in 1928 in Geneva, Switzerland. An FIE Member of Honour and member of the FIE Hall of Fame, he was a member of the FIE Executive Committee from 1977 to 1996, including serving as Vice President from 1989 to 1996.

Hochstaetter was a member of the FIE Statutes Committee from 1977 to 1996, over which he presided from 1993 to 1996. He drafted numerous texts and rules, most notably the first rule on publicity, enabling brands to be added on athletes’ equipment and to use fencers’ images in advertisements, which facilitated the process of finding sponsors.

In 1987, he proposed to the FIE Congress to vote on several modifications of the rules, introducing their separation between fencers and the public with a barrier. While a controversial move at the time, the change proved his position was correct and since that time has contributed greatly to increased order being maintained on and around competition pistes.

“We are greatly saddened by the passing of Jacques Hochstaetter, an esteemed member of our federation and also of the FIE”, said Lars Frauchiger, President of the Swiss Fencing Federation. “His lifelong commitment and especially his foresight had an outstanding effect on the sport of fencing that we know and love today. We recognise and are grateful for his dedication and we offer his family our heartfelt condolences.”

Hochstaetter also served several times on the Directoire Technique at World Championships and was the technical delegate to the Mediterranean Games in Athens and Nimes.

In 2002, he was awarded the gold medal for Sporting Merit by the French Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports.

Within the Swiss Fencing Federation, he was part of the council from 1967 to 1987 and presided over the Technical Commission. Several times he served as the Chief of the Swiss Delegation to the World Championships and Olympic Games.

From 1960 to 1982, Hochstaetter was President of the Geneva Fencing Society, of which he is an Honorary President, and he was the promoter and organiser of the "Gascogne Cadets" section of young fencers. Hochstaetter took part in numerous sports, fencing, in which he was a fencing master and practiced for more than 50 years. He always strived to promote both national and international fencing.

In his education and career, he studied law at the University of Geneva, being admitted to the bar in 1952. Following that, he opened his own legal office, which he ran until 1973, followed by joining a colleague to establish a legal office that is still in operation today. There he handled national and international cases dealing with property, tourism, finance, and corporate administration.

Hochstaetter also was a professor of law at the École supérieure de Commerce (Higher School of Business) from 1952 to 1972, a Deputy Judge at the Court of First Instance from 1971 to 1991 and a member of the Commission for Final Internship Exams from 1978 to 1993. Internationally, he was the World President of the International Association of Young Lawyers from 1972 to 1973, a member of the International Union of Lawyers and the European Association of Lawyers, and he sat on the Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAS) for the International Olympic Committee from 1985 to 1995.

NIKOLAY MARINCHESKI (BUL) 1957 – 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Nikolay Marincheshki (BUL), an FIE Olympic and World Championships referee and World Championships medallist.

Marincheshki was born on September 18, 1957. He won a bronze medal with the Bulgarian men's sabre team at the 1986 Sofia World Championships and competed in the Moscow 1980 (individual) and Seoul 1988 Olympic Games (individual and team) men's sabre events. He also earned a silver medal at the 1985 Kobe, Japan World University Games in men's team sabre.

As an FIE Category "A" sabre referee, he served at the Atlanta 1996 Summer Olympics as well as at numerous FIE world competitions and World Championships. He held an FIE Category "B" rating in foil and épée.

Marincheshki was a fencing coach, as well, working in Kuwait, Türkiye, and Austria, where he passed away on August 9, 2023.

JULIO CESAR GONZALEZ TIRADOR (CUB) 1942 – 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the recent passing of Julio Cesar Gonzalez Tirador (CUB), who was an FIE international referee and a member of the FIE Scales of Votes (1993 – 1996) and Rules (2000 – 2008) commissions. He was born on June 20, 1942.

Gonzalez Tirador served as an FIE Category "B" referee in three weapons for 31 years. He also worked on technical directories (DTs) for numerous world cups, Senior and Junior and Cadet World Championships and the Olympic Games in Athens 2004. As part of his work, he completed several FIE technical courses in South America, Central America, and the Caribbean.

At a continental level, he served as the Vice President of the Pan American Fencing Confederation and was the Secretary-General and Technical Director for the Ibero-American Fencing Confederation. Gonzalez Tirador also served on the DT for eight Pan American Games as well as other regional competitions in Cuba and Latin America.

He was a fencer who was in the Cuban "National Épée Selection", and an advanced coach in three weapons. Gonzalez Tirador also was a "methodologist" of the Cuban Fencing Federation.

His education included earning a doctorate in pedagogical sciences and a degree in physical culture with a specialization in fencing, and he later worked as an assistant professor at the "Manuel Fajardo" Higher Institute of Physical Culture.

IOANNIS GOUSOPOULOS (GRE) 1949 - 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Ioannis Gousopoulos (GRE), on July 8, 2023.

Gousopoulos, who was born on Jan. 12, 1949, served as vice-president of the Hellenic Fencing Federation for many years and was an established coach and founder of the first fencing club in the city of Florina. He was Greek champion in both foil and sabre, a medallist of the Balkan Athletics Championships and competed in the World Fencing Championships.

“He was a bright person, deeply respected and loved by the fencing family of Greece”, said Ioannis Lignos, Hellenic Fencing Federation President. “He contributed to the development of our sport with consistency, devotion and integrity.”

Gousopoulos was also a senior officer in the Greek Army, retiring with the rank of major general.

ANVAR IBRAGIMOV (RUS) 1965 - 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Anvar Ibragimov on August 27, 2023. He was a gold medallist in men’s team foil at the 1988 Seoul Summer Olympic Games.

Ibragimov was also a silver (1995) and bronze (1985) medallist at the Senior Fencing World Championships. He won the European Cup five times and was a multiple-time winner of the USSR Championships. He also took the bronze medal in junior men’s individual foil at the 1984 Junior World Championships in Leningrad. He was born in Ufa on November 27, 1965.

BRUNO GABY (FRA) 1956 - 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Bruno Gaby (FRA), at the age of 66 (b. Dec. 19, 1956) in Bali, Indonesia on November 13. He served for many years as an FIE referee, including officiating at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games as well as numerous World Championships, Grand Prix events and World Cups. He was skilled and rated in refereeing in all three weapons.

Gaby was elected to the European Fencing Confederation Refereeing Commission in 2009, following having served as a member of the French National Refereeing Commission since 1992. He was responsible for training many French and French-speaking referees and was also a member of the French National Men’s and then Women’s Sabre Commissions.

The French Fencing Federation stated that “Bruno Gaby passed-on the values of our sport. He was a passionate man, appreciated by his peers, at the service of international fencing and French fencing, in particular”.

Gaby began fencing in Pau, France where he received his fencing master’s diploma in 1979. An avid traveller, he taught in Roubaix, Le Kremlin-Bicêtre, Ozoir la Ferrière, Levallois, Villemomble, Le Puy en Velay, Roanne and Billom, as well as abroad in Portugal as national sabre coach (from 1989 to 1992). In this capacity, he took part in the Barcelona Olympic Games in 1992.

Finally, in 2014, he worked as a coach in Asia in Malaysia, Cambodia, and other neighbouring countries. Most recently, Gaby worked for the Fencing Federation of Cambodia, which appointed him under the auspices of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport. There he led the Cambodian team to win a gold, a silver and two bronze medals at the 2022 ASEAN University Games in Thailand as well as other regional medals. He completed his appointment after the 2023 SEA Games, following Cambodia winning two bronze medals.

In addition to coaching, from 1981 he worked as a local authority official for several municipalities in Roubaix, Villeneuve St Georges, Kremlin-Bicêtre and Thiers, as sports director.

ADEL ZETUNI (LBA) 1967 - 2023

The FIE is saddened to learn of the passing of Adel Zetuni (LBA) at the age of 56 (b. Sept. 11, 1967) on November 27, 2023. He was the former president of the Libyan Fencing Federation.

Zetuni served as LFF President from 2009 to 2016 and is one of the founders of fencing in Libya. He also served as a member of the Libyan Olympic Committee Council from 2010 to 2014.

He was a member of the Executive Committee of the Arab Fencing Federation as well as a former member of the Mediterranean Fencing Confederation Executive Committee and the African Fencing Confederation.

As a member of the Faculty of Physical Education, he taught at the University of Tripoli, and he was President of the Ghotalshall Club from 2006 to 2009.

SAMUEL D. CHERIS (USA, MH, HOF) 1945 – 2023

The FIE is deeply saddened to learn of the passing in Denver, Colorado, USA on December 13 of Samuel D. Cheris (USA), FIE Member of Honour and Hall of Fame member. He was born on November 14, 1945, in Brooklyn, New York, USA.

Cheris was a member of the FIE Executive Committee from 1996 to 2004 and has been a continuous member of the Legal (formerly Statutes) Commission since 1992 and served as its President from 1996 to 2008, and from 2012 until now. Prior to that, he was a member of the FIE PCM Commission (formerly the Propaganda Commission) from 1989 to 1992.

As a young student, he fenced foil at Brooklyn (New York) Technical High School and then for three years at Brooklyn College.

As an assistant fencing coach at Stanford University, Cheris elevated the women's fencing programme from a physical education course to eventual NCAA varsity status – a position it still holds today.

He expanded referee gender and nationality representation at World Cups, World Championships, and the Olympic Games.

Cheris received his MBA and Juris Doctor degrees at Stanford University, graduating in 1971. He was admitted to practice law in California (1972) and Colorado (1973).

He practiced law at the U.S. Court of Appeals – Federal Circuit in 1971 and 1972, and then worked as an attorney. He was named a "Super Lawyer", specializing in the fields of mergers and acquisitions, and closely held businesses.

Cheris co-drafted the revised FIE statutes in 1999, which were approved by the FIE Congress the same year, the FIE Disciplinary code and revised FIE Administrative Rules. In 2018, he submitted to the Congress the FIE Safeguarding Policy, which was approved by the Congress the same year.

In 1994, he supported a proposal from several federations to add English and Spanish as FIE working languages. The proposal was adopted by the Congress the same year.

He organised the 1989 Senior World Championships and 1993 Junior & Cadet World Championships, both of which took place in Denver, his home city.

Sam Cheris was an international referee at foil (B-category) and épée (A-category). He refereed in numerous World Cups and World Championships from 1982 to 1996.

He was President of the Directoire Technique in sabre World Cups and Foil Grand Prix events held in the USA from 2012 to 2020, and a member of the Directoire Technique in numerous Junior and Cadet and Senior World Championships and at the Olympic Games in Atlanta.

He was Chief of Protocol and at Junior and Cadet and Senior World Championships and Olympic Games from 1998 to 2004.

Cheris officiated as FIE Safeguarding Officer in Junior and Cadet World Championships and in the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, as well as Safeguarding mediator.

Cheris represented the United States at more than 25 FIE Congresses. As part of USA Fencing, he played multiple important roles, among other positions, as President, Vice-President, Treasurer and President of the Refereeing Commission (FOC), where he has been the Chair since 2008. He was inducted into the USA Fencing Hall of Fame in July 2023, where he made a personal acceptance speech.

His contributions and accomplishments in the FIE and world fencing were numerous, significant, and outstanding. A press release from USA Fencing stated that Cheris had “the courage to point out what didn’t seem right and the drive and ingenuity to present real solutions.”

We express our sincerest condolences to the bereaved families and federations of the deceased.

The decisions taken by these management bodies have been regularly communicated to the FIE members through **20 Information letters** and **6 Urgent letters**. These letters, as well as their annexes, were emailed to national federations, Members of Honour, and Members of the Executive Committee.

25 changes of nationality were accepted.

1.3 ANTIDOPING

1.3.1 CONTROLS

Antidoping measures were continued throughout the period and **no** case of doping occurred in any competitions organised by the FIE.

In-competition tests: 364 urine tests collected.

Out-of-competition tests: Out of the 84 tests carried out, 76 collected urine samples only and 8 collected urine + blood serum samples.

1.3.2 CLEAN SPORT EDUCATION

In cooperation with International Testing Agency, the FIE provided one-hour, interactive anti-doping webinars available to all athletes, coaches, and officials, prior to the Junior and Cadet World Championships and prior to the Senior World Championships.

The webinars took place respectively:

on March 21, 2023 (total number of participants: 12)

on June 6, 2023 (total number of participants: 51)

The programmes were presented in English, French and Spanish and covered key clean-sport topics including prohibited substances, medications and supplements and therapeutic-use exemptions (TUEs).

The webinars were presented by the ITA, Jeremy Summers, President of the FIE Medical Commission and Dr Sabrina Halaimia, Member of the FIE Medical Commission. Attendees received an official certificate of participation as well as a PDF of the presentation and links for useful related resources.

Furthermore, the International Testing Agency (ITA), in partnership with the FIE, presented five multi-language webinars addressing anti-doping and Clean Sport principles, information and practices for athletes, coaches and federations.

These Clean Sport webinars were part of the FIE educational programmes, and all FIE athletes and coaches have been highly encouraged to participate in all sessions; for those who attended, a certificate of completion was awarded.

The programmes, presented in English with simultaneous interpreting in Arabic, Spanish, French, Russian and Chinese, included the following topics at the following dates and times:

- Webinar Theme: The Doping Control Process - Includes testing procedures (urine and blood) and ABP.

Date and Time: 14:00-15:00 CET, 21 November
- Webinar Theme: Principles and Values of Clean Sport - Includes sanctions, consequences and speaking up.
Date and Time: 14:00-15:00 CET, 28 November
- Webinar Theme: Out-of-Competition Testing - Includes requirements of RTP/TP, whereabouts, use of ADAMS.
Date and Time: 14:00-15:00 CET, 5 December

At the Senior World Championships in Milan (ITA), the FIE, in cooperation with the Italian NADO, provided an educational programme from 22 to 25th of July. The activity, carried out by Cecilia Iacolucci (NADO Italia), reached out approximately 200 people, both fencers and athletes' support personnel.

1.4 **MEDIA**

1.4.1 FIE MEDIA REPORT 2023

During 2023, the FIE continued to increase its influence through multiple media platforms including its website, social media matrix including Instagram, Facebook, Twitter/X, YouTube and LinkedIn, online magazine and TV broadcast. The media coverage on signature events (Senior World Championships and Grand Prix) resulted in fruitful outcomes that guaranteed the continuous growth of digital channels.

The partnership with Eurosport and collaboration with global rightsholders has driven the growth of our global audience and media exposure. Massive increase in volume of posts and optimization of content has allowed the digital channels to achieve a more significant improvement.

1.4.2 DIGITAL CHANNELS

By leveraging on a year with full-form competition calendar, the FIE managed to keep all the digital channels growing continuously and robustly. The successful delivery for the traditional initiatives of World Fencing Day and Donate Your Fencing Gear, as well as the new initiative of Fencing For The Planet, have made great impacts in the digital field, greatly enriched non-competitive content, and generated good engagement with the fencing community.

In terms of photography content, FIE's on-site photographers (Augusto Bizzi and his crew) have covered all the World Championships (senior, junior & cadet, veterans), Grand Prix events, senior World Cups and zonal championships.

In terms of video content, FIE's on-site video production team (ICARUS) have covered both the Junior & Cadet and senior World Championships.

Live stream was available for the direct elimination bouts for all the Grand Prix events, J&C World Championships and Senior World Championships.

Below are some key facts:

Website

In 2023, the website news section maintained its previous release plan. In addition, monthly event information was released at the beginning of each month during the season. As an essential part of the Road to Paris, a sub-site – Paris Loves Fencing - showing the provisional qualification has been launched.

The FIE website reached 10.9 million page views, increasing by 22.5% (8.9 million in 2022), it was visited by 935K users, increasing by 7.2% (872K in 2022), including 907K new users, increasing by 6.7% (850K in 2022). The website received 3.9 million sessions in total, increasing by 56% (2.5 million in 2022).

Among all countries/regions, USA, France, Italy, Hong Kong China and Great Britain were the top five with the most users. The ranking was the same for new users: USA (144K), France (71K), Italy (52K), Hong Kong China (50K), Great Britain (41K).

Instagram

In 2023, the FIE Instagram account experienced 22.1 million impressions and 1,474K engagements, an increase of 100% and 70% respectively. The content interactions reached 273K and link clicks reached 10.4K. Both increased by 100%. With 11K new users added, the total amount reached 109K by the end of 2023.

Facebook

In 2023, the FIE Facebook account received 29 million impressions, a decrease of 10%. Meanwhile, the content interactions reached 502K and the link clicks reached 67.8K, a 27.7% increase and a 144% increase respectively. The number of followers reached 137,519, with 6K new followers (11% increase) added.

Twitter/X

In 2023, the FIE Twitter/X account received 4.6 million impressions, a 213% increase compared to 2022. The engagements reached to 228K, a 315% increase compared to 2022. The number of followers reached 23,898 with 1.5K new followers added.

YouTube

In 2023, the FIE YouTube channel experienced 4.2 million views, 8.7% less than 2022. The viewing time was 505K hours, a 9% decrease compared to 2022. The new subscribers were 8.7K, 13% reduction in growth rate compared to 2022. The video views decreased 21.8% to 600K, the 3.6 million live views were 8% less than the 2022. With 8.7K new subscribers added, the subscriptions reached 93,602 by the end of 2023, with a 10% increase.

LinkedIn

Since 2023, FIE started to post more content on LinkedIn, a channel focused on industry information dissemination. The content published is synchronized with some of the releases on the website, which mainly involves signature events sum-up, and the publication of important information (including initiatives). The aim is to reach different groups through an additional channel. In 2023, the impressions and engagements reached 30K and 2.3K respectively.

During the Milan 2023 World Championships

- YouTube channel page experienced 1.9 million views, a 12% increase compared to Cairo 2022. The engagement number (51K engagements) remained the same as last edition. 266.9K watch time (hours) and 3K new subscribers were 10% and 7% higher than Cairo 2022. Taking all World Championships content into account, including those released before and after the tournament (by Nielsen Sports), the FIE YouTube channel aired by far the most content - 388 hours of broadcast time, a 7.2% increase compared to Cairo 2022.
- Instagram received 3.1 million impressions and 189K engagements, increase by 82% and 31% compared to Cairo 2022 respectively. 1,885 new followers were added during this period.
- Facebook received 2.2 million impressions (a 57% decrease), 100K engagements (a 37% decrease). 340 new followers were added during this period.
- Twitter reached 2.1 million 244K impressions and 104K engagements, increased by 760% and 1900% compared to Cairo 2022 respectively.
- The FIE website received 777K page views (increasing by 13.6%), and 320K sessions (a 23.5% increase). During the event period, 96K new users visited the site, increasing 41.2% (68K in Cairo2022). As a teaser ahead of the event, a series of Ones To Watch releases were published.

Overall, the FIE digital media matrix performed better than last year. While there was a large drop in Facebook's metrics, Instagram and Twitter/X saw explosive growth, and YouTube's stats were steadily increasing. All digital media platforms achieved a more balanced development of key data.

Due to the fact that athletes and stakeholders are relatively focused on Instagram content more than other channels, this part of the data is more prominent compared to other social channels.

1.4.3 DIGITAL MAGAZINE - ESCRIME XXI

In 2023, FIE published two issues, No.122 and No.123, in digital format.

1.4.4 OFFICIAL 2023 FIE PRESS RELEASES

In 2023, the FIE continued direct communication with the press and other interested parties subscribing to official FIE news, publishing and distributing nearly 60 press releases to media and press worldwide. This represents more than 180,000 individual emails sent with FIE news and information about world fencing events, projects and other newsworthy bulletins. Our metrics indicate an "open rate" of FIE emails averaged 32 percent, exceeding the internationally accepted average open rate by press/media by two percent (which is 18-30 percent).

1.4.5 TELEVISION

Grand Prix Events

(* for the Grand Prix, here we present the metrics of the "2022-2023 season" that includes Orleans GP in Dec 2022 and not the Orleans GP in Dec 2023)

The rightsholders include the Olympic Channel, Eurosport (tv) and PCCW (streaming).

FIE Grand Prix broadcasting accumulated an audience of 22.84 million viewers, a 25% increase compared to last edition. The top-five markets by cumulative audiences are: China (8.16 million), Brazil (7.91 million), Italy (2.68 million), Hungary (1.56 million) and France (1.46 million). The top 3 GP events by accumulated audience are: Budapest GP (10.82 million), Shanghai GP (6.7 million) and Turin GP (5.45 million).

In 2023, 47 channels across 54 markets provided altogether nearly 1,729 hours of coverage of FIE Grand Prix 2022/23, 76% more hours than in the past year (+744 hours). All analysed brands generated a visibility of 1,620 hours throughout all Grand Prix competitions, nearly 1142 hours in comparison to 2021/22, increased by 239%. Visible at all events, the FIE logo achieved the highest exposure of all brands tracked (607 hours).

22/23 Grand Prix events received 171 million impressions. The top 3 events in terms of Event Impressions by Matchday are: Shanghai GP (18%), Budapest GP (13%), Seoul GP and Tunis GP (both 12%). The top 5 territories in terms of Event Impressions are: Pan-Asia (22.85 million), China (16.94 million), Poland (10.75 million), Italy (8.64 million) and Germany (8.20 million). Combined, the analysed brands generated €1,347,993 QI (Quality Indexed) Media Value across all Grand Prix event in 22/23 season, a 159% growth to previous edition (€827,395). The FIE logo accounted for 32% of the total QI Media Value, followed by Grand Prix Budapest (20%) and Grand Prix Cali (16%).

Milan Senior World Championships

Milan 2023 generated a cumulative audience of almost 184 million viewers, a 24% increase compared to Cairo 2022. Host nation of this year's event, Italy attracted the biggest audience (45%; 82.5 million viewers). With an audience of 39 million, Japan achieved the second highest share (21%), followed by China (16%; 30 million viewers). The top 5 markets by cumulative audiences are Italy (50.15 million), China (27.67 million), France (24.77 million), Japan (15.65 million) and South Korea (10.29 million). The ranking order for this item is the same as for Cairo 2022. The top 5 broadcasters by cumulative audiences are CCTV5 (27.66 million), M6 (10.57 million), Canale 5 (10.56 million), France 3 (9.78 million) and Rai 1 (9.68 million). The same as Cairo 2022, China's CCTV5 topped all TV channels.

81 channels (3 more channels added) across 54 markets provided together 2,095 hours of coverage for Milan 2023. The broadcast time increased by 28.2%. As mentioned, FIE YouTube channel aired by far the most content of 388 hours. As one of FIE's most important broadcasters, Eurosport's multiple channels occupy nine of the top ten spots in terms of broadcast hours. The event obtained 3.69 billion impressions in total, a 93% increase over Cairo 2022. China (1.81 billion) accounting for the largest share of event impressions, followed by Italy (896 million), Japan (114 million), Hungary (90 million) and Germany (52 million). Among all TV channels, CCTV5 and Rai 2 were the top two contributors, providing 1.33 billion impressions and 555 million impressions, respectively.

The analysed brands generated a QI Media Value of €5,196,544 during Milan 2023, a 45% decrease compared to Cairo 2022.

Eurosport

In the 2022-2023 season, FIE events (Grand Prix events, World Championships) remained 45 mins highlights for Grand Prix and 18 hours live for Senior World Championships across Eurosport channels (Eurosport 1, Eurosport 2 and Eurosport Asia). The coverage duration for Grand Prix is 58 hours, increased by 38%. While the senior World Championships were covered for 70 hours, a 10% decrease.

In terms of TV campaign, 180 TV spots recorded 38.9 million impacts, reaching 12.9 million unique viewers. In addition, Eurosport France provided 2h15m extra live/as live coverage for senior World Championships & international programming.

In 2023, apart from the annual World Fencing Day, FIE officially initiated the Fencing for The Planet Day, which will also continue as an annual celebration. The CMTV department created the official logo and the corresponding key visual materials for the campaign. With the increasing abundance of non-competition content, media content will be more diverse.

At the end of 2023, FIE has a new digital magazine production agency and digital media management service provider. As the new season started in November 2023, the new social media content strategy was implemented. The quantity and quality of social media content was significantly increased. By reaching out to the LOCs of Grand Prix and senior World Cup events, FIE got more on-site content (for free) as good supplementary to the existing image and video content. Meanwhile, QTV has become FIE's live stream clipping service provider, providing short clips of all the Grand Prix events (since semifinals) for social media use. Not only this provided more content for digital media, but it will also be an important step in digital monetization.

Fencing has been a continuous and vibrant sport from the beginning of the modern-day Olympic Games in 1896, making strides to include people of all ages, ethnicity, heritage, culture, religion and skill levels.

The International Fencing Federation (FIE) endeavours to embrace all people, inviting them to experience its diversity and enduring qualities, whether as an athlete, coach, official or supporter. “Fencing is for Everyone” expresses the essence of our sport in a simple but powerful statement designed to encourage all people to be involved.

The full 2023-2024 calendar of fencing events worldwide include competitions at regional, national and international levels for youth, senior and veteran fencers, giving its 155-member organisation unlimited opportunities to reach existing participants and those new to the sport a chance to be part of our world community. Our competitions include 12 events in each age category in men’s and women’s individual and team events in épée, foil and sabre.

1.8 FENCING FOR THE PLANET 2023

1.8.1 FENCING FOR THE PLANET DAY

“Fencing for the Planet”, an FIE global environmental initiative, was officially celebrated for the first time on Saturday, April 8.

The programme approved by the FIE Executive Committee in May 2022, will take place annually on Saturday of the second weekend in April. It aims to encourage the global fencing family to join in the celebration with local and national initiatives and actions to benefit and protect the environment. The various activities around the world will be presented and shared on FIE social media.

The FIE created a working group to oversee and drive the Fencing for the Planet programme, led by the FIE Vice President Ana Irene Delgado Guerra (PAN) and including members of FIE Commissions and confederations. The group includes subgroups addressing issues including policies, donations, guidelines for participation, and publicity.

“We want to increase awareness among fencing athletes of living with the environment, and the FIE is encouraging everyone in the global fencing family to take actions and truly make a difference”, said Ms. Delgado Guerra. “Whether its reducing plastic use in competitions, such as by using refillable water bottles, reducing unnecessary travel, or engaging in projects to help the environment such as planting trees and collecting rubbish on beaches, there are so many ways in which we can all help make our planet more sustainable. As fencers, we must take responsibility at all levels to support and participate in whatever we can do to help, and Fencing for the Planet is a call-to-action for everyone to become involved.”

Fencing for the Planet is providing ideas at many levels to inspire fencers, coaches, clubs, and federations to take part. This includes group actions such as car-sharing to events, beach cleaning, and tree plantings; corporate actions such as installing water refilling stations at competitions, working with energy suppliers who use renewable resources, organising educational activities focused on sustainability and environmental protection for all levels of stakeholders, prioritizing vendors who limit plastic use, and appointing local and regional ambassadors to take the lead in inspiring fencers and clubs to take action. At an individual level, every member of world fencing can lend a hand in many ways, such as using reusable shopping bags, purchasing second-hand clothing and products, minimizing electricity use, recycling trash and using compostable products.

“We are creating a sustainability framework for the FIE”, said Ms. Delgado Guerra. “We have a great team, and we are all dedicated to Fencing for the Planet to make a true difference in improving our world.”

1.8.2 FENCING FOR THE PLANET WEBINAR

The FIE hosted a “Fencing for the Planet” webinar on Thursday, June 8, which was an informative and useful programme that is part of an FIE global environmental initiative. As part of it, local and national initiatives and actions that may be undertaken to benefit and protect the environment were discussed.

The session offered ideas at many levels to inspire fencers, coaches, supporters, clubs and federations to become involved in environmental efforts. This is part of the FIE’s effort to create a global sustainability network, and to make a difference in improving our world.

2 ASSISTANCE OF THE FIE IN SPORT DEVELOPMENT

2.1 TRAINING CAMPS FOR ATHLETES

PLOVDIV

Before the cadet and junior World Championships, an FIE training camp took place on a special Fencing Venue near the city centre of Plovdiv. Each weapon started training 6 days before the individual competition, with 2 training sessions: 3 hours in the morning and 3 hours in the afternoon. 20 fencers from around the world were invited:

- 3 from Africa
- 1 from Oceania,
- 6 from Europe,
- 5 from Pan-America
- 5 from Asia

The training venue had 10 designated pistes exclusively for the FIE camp and had medical service available on site for any emergency or need from the athletes or coaches. Each weapon trained separately, with the following coaches:

- Zoran Tulum (USA), sabre,

The training was specially designed by each coach according to the needs from the group: it included a general group warm up, individual lessons, theoretical and tactical explanations, competition simulation, footwork, coordination activities, among others, everything specially designed for each weapon. The day before competition video analysis was set and a visit to the competition was arranged for weapon control and to get to know the venue.

All expenses were covered by FIE: Flights, transport, visas expenses, individual competition entry fee, hotel, meals, and extra 50€ pocket money.

There were some extraordinary results with two medals, one bronze medal on women's cadet épée (Li-Hsiang Hung from China Taipei) and one silver men's épée (Kruz Schembri from Virgin Islands), who also finished between the best 8 on cadet men's foil.

Each participant took back home a unique experience of training like a professional fencer with top level coach for 6 days and competing on one the most challenging competitions of the junior and cadet circuit, when for some of them was even their first ever international competition and most of them their first world championships.

Beside fencing, every group took different experiences outside the fencing hall, sharing cultures, and showing at all time friendship and respect within each other.

During 6 days from the 16th until the 21st of July, the FIE training camp was set. We invited 20 fencers from around the world were invited to take part in it:

The training was divided into two sessions per day, with a general warm up without mixed weapons and then separate footwork and coordination activities specially designed by each coach according to their own weapon. Every day the coaches carried out group lessons and individual lessons, coordinated specific combat activities, and simulated competitions. Special gifts from manufacturers on the venue were given to the participants.

The last day of the camp and before the competition video analysis was set by each coach on the hotel.

Individual video analysis of the fencers that each participant will face on the pools was set by the épée coach to every participant, highlighting strength and weakness and introducing possibilities to face the competition.

The training was in a special designated place of the competition venue with 12 pistes, a doctor was always available at the same place if needed. The training was organised as follows:

- 4 days with two sessions of training: morning from 9 to 12 and afternoon from 15 to 18, 2 days only morning session only.
- the 20th afternoon dedicated time for weapon control
- the 21st (day before competition starts) afternoon session with video analysis and strategies, at the hotel.

Transportation from hotel to competition and back was provided on every training and competition days.

During competition days lunchboxes were distributed to every athlete and coach during breakfast.

The participation of all the fencers in the competition was as expected, highlighting the result of Erbil Nisanur 30/131, but more important the behaviour of all of them show respect, fair play, and friendship within the participants of the camp and all other fencers.

2.2 OCEANIA FENCING MASTER ACADEMY (OFMA)

Oceania Fencing Confederation (OFC) Coaching Commission

In 2023 three new members from Australia, French Polynesia and New Zealand respectively were welcomed onto the Commission.

The Coaching Commission met online monthly during 2023 to plan and progress various OFMA projects and to administer the operational activities of OFMA.

A 2023 Coach Education Plan was developed to assist the education and training of Level 1 and aspirant Level 1 Coaches in Epée.

Planning for an online Level 2 Epée Coaching Course in 2024 was also carried out in partnership with Global Fencing Masters.

OFMA Coach Education

In January, the OFMA Coaching Programmes Director (OCPD) travelled to Brisbane to conduct face-to-face revision of the course content and assessments for three participants (1 for Papua New Guinea, 2 for Fiji) in the 2022 online Level 1 Foil Course.

The OCPD also travelled to Papua New Guinea in March to revise the online Level 1 Foil Course with three coaches and assess them. He also continued coaching and development work. Coaching Commission members in New Zealand also conducted content revision and assessments of Level 1 Foil (Group) coaches at four locations.

Under the auspices of OFMA, the OFC partnered with Global Fencing Masters (GFM) to advertise and conduct an online Level 1 Epée Course as a follow up to the 2022 online Foil Course. Again, using a web-based learning platform, a phone app and Zoom technology, the Course was presented over four months from March to June to 19 Coaches from Australia and New Zealand.

Some participants have been assessed and certified as Level 1 Epée (Group) coaches by the OCPD in Australia and by other Coaching Commission members in New Zealand. The remaining assessments will be conducted in early 2024.

2.3 BUDAPEST ACADEMY

During 2023, the FIE Budapest Coaching Academy continued to form fencing coaches on a 3-month course specific for each weapon. The Academy strategy, as decided on 2016, is to propose an education centre for coaches, where coaches from all over the world can learn and improve their level, so they can return home updated and with first level knowledge.

During 2023, three 3-month courses were organised:

Sabre: from January 16th to April 13th, 2023. For this initial course, there were only 3 applications, so it was first postponed to the beginning of the course to April 24, to join the epée course, but still no more applications were received, therefore it was cancelled.

Epée: from April 24th to July 20th, 2023, there were 8 candidates accepted (2 from Africa, 2 from Europe and 2 from Oceania). African participants were not granted visa, so the course started and developed by 4 participants (3 men and 1 woman).

Foil: from July 31st to October 27th, 2023. There were 8 applications accepted: 5 from Asia and 3 from Europe. One European participant could not attend, and one Asian participant was not granted visa. The course was integrated with 5 men and 1 woman.

After the course finished, individual e-meetings with coaches and participants were set to receive feedback on how to improve the course for the future, important information was collected and will be analysed to improve the course.

The training sessions were scheduled from Monday to Friday, 6 hours per day, for 12 weeks.

Daily course schedule (Weeks 1-8)

- **09.00-09.45:** General warm up, fencing specific warm up, games.
- **10.00-10.45:** Exercises for footwork development.
- **11.00-12.30:** Weapon-specific coaching with weapon specialist coach.
- **15.00-17.00:** Weapon-specific coaching - ongoing development.

Daily course schedule (Weeks 9-12)

- Preparing for practical exam.
- Construction of the exam-lesson. Practicing, overseen by mentor coach.
- Exams

The Hungarian University of Sport Science joined the programme and provided theory lessons on sport physiology, training theory, sport pedagogy, sport psychology and Biomechanics, all in different modules given by specialized instructors and researchers from the University, divided on a 16-hour long class time. As part of this agreement, the University acknowledges the Academy training and awards internationally recognized Level 2 diplomas to those Academy students who pass the final exam.

At the end of the programme both practical and theoretical exams were organised to demonstrate and prove learned knowledge.

Mr. Zoltan BERNAT was responsible for the everyday courses of the academy, taking care of any special request or issue that might rise.

The experts selected to provide the specific fencing training are renowned fencing coaches:

Sabre: Maître Zsolt NEMCSIK

Epée: Maître György FELLETÁR

Foil: Maître Zoltan BERNAT

- 9 out of 10 students were experienced coaches, with more than 5 years' experience before getting into the Academy.
- All graduate students were encouraged to pass their knowledge and to improve the fencing in their own countries.

Local authorities of Budapest helped to find ideal facilities to rent where coaches could learn and practice under the best conditions. Full accommodation and catering were given to students during all their course.

All participants stayed on the Benczúr Hotel. All meals were served at the hotel. The hotel is in a walking distance from the training venue.

Transportation to the university for theoretical courses was made by public transport covered by each participant.

A special aid for participants of 300CHF was given to cover part of their transport expenses when requested by participants.

2.6 EQUIPMENT AID

The programme for 2023 consisted of 600,000 CHF budget, 6000 CHF for each federation, total 103 federations. All fencing material is FIE homologated for competition. Orders were for Absolute Fencing, Allstar, Artos, Favero, Fencing Vision, Leon Paul, PBT, Rana Kilit and Uhlmann.

The programme started on February with the invitation to confederations and in April the confirmation of countries and wishing lists were mostly received. During May, the orders were submitted to manufacturers for preparation and in July the shipments started.

FIE requested presidents of confederations to send a list of 25 countries that would receive equipment and desirable equipment.

2.8 ASSISTANCE WITH ATHLETES' PARTICIPATION PROGRAMME 2023

Since 2009, the FIE has implemented a special aid programme for NF athletes participating in Senior Zonal Championships and the World Championship (junior and senior).

For each national federation taking part, all the confederations received a subsidy intended to cover expenses (plane ticket and hotel) for an athlete entered for:

- The Senior Continental Championships
- The Senior World Championships

2.9 ASSISTANCE FOR CONFEDERATIONS

All confederations received an annual subsidy and a subsidy for their administrative expenses.

2.10 ASSISTANCE FOR COMPETITION ORGANISERS

Each national federation having organised an FIE competition (senior World Cup, Grand Prix) and applying, received a subsidy of CHF 3000 to cover the cost of video refereeing.

The FIE subsidized the cost of Swiss Timing for the Grand Prix events and the Senior World Championships.

2.11 FENCING EQUIPMENT REPAIR COURSE IN SOUTH AFRICA

A fencing weapons repair course took place at the FIE Coaching Academy in Johannesburg, South Africa, from September 18 to 22, 2023. Six attendees from three Africa nations participated (South Africa, Kenya, and Uganda). Mr. Gilles Martinage (FRA) presented and led the event.

Topics for the course included the following areas:

- An overview of electrical signalling systems, covering installation, connections, and complete system checks (cables, reels, and the piste)
- A general review of electrical science: open and closed circuits, resistance, continuity, and insulation
- Specific technical information for all weapons, including the electrical circuits of foils and épées
- Identifying and localizing various failures throughout global systems, from the weapon to the scoring machine Fitting weapons with new blades: length adjustments for handles, bending blades, connecting wires and complete checks
- A detailed look at épée and foil tips: How to adjust them, working with weights and springs and how to identify and fix various weapons failures following a complete check
- A review of rewiring foil and épée blades
- Managing and organising weapons control at events: A review of the rules, how to organise and important safety considerations

The topics covered included theoretical and practical elements and included recalls in connection with FIE rules.

EFC CONGRESSES IN 2023

Ordinary Congress was held in Krakow (POL) on 24.06.2023.

SOLIDARITY PROGRAMME

The Solidarity Programme project, launched on 14th January in Paris, on the Foil World Cup, in the presence of the highest European sports authorities, as well as government institutions and representatives of the Olympic Committees and the diplomatic body of the countries concerned, has been designed to encourage technical, cultural, organisational, and managerial exchange and to strengthen a spirit of solidarity between European Federations. Seven Federations have joined the project, making themselves available to organise courses in favour of the technical and organisational growth of the European fencing system:

France has organised a course for épée trainers and one for laser fencing;

Italy has organised a course for managers to face the issue of promoting youth fencing, a course for foil trainers and one for historical fencing teachers;

Great Britain has organised a course for Safeguarding Officers;

Sweden a course for Technical Directors and Call Room Staff;

Spain a course for aspiring referees and Hungary a course for sabre trainers.

These historical Federations took charge for providing trainers with gained experience, as well as board and lodging for the participants, involving about 12 participants per course, with about 120 participants representing the various European Federations. The initiative has received enthusiastic approval among the participants and there are underway works to replicate this act of solidarity which goes beyond the technical-economic contribution, representing an important cultural message.

PROMOTIONAL PROGRAMME

The Promotional Programme project, in compliance with the provisions of the Confederation's Statutes, thanks to the contribution of a sponsor, made its debut in the Confederation's activity with the aim of promoting fencing where it is not yet officially recognized or in those Federations that need support to better organise activities. With these aims, trainers were sent to North Macedonia, Kosovo, Montenegro, Bosnia Herzegovina, and Albania. The initiative was appreciated by the local managers of the various countries as well as by local athletes.

2.12.2 ASIAN FENCING CONFEDERATION (FCA)

VISION AND PROGRAMME OF THE FENCING DEVELOPMENT IN ASIA

- Mutual aid and support for small, developing, and leading federations.
- Organisation of joint academic training seminars for coaches, referees, and for the administration of national fencing federations of Asia and Oceania.
- Organisation of joint training camps for talented athletes and coaches of national fencing federations from Asia and Oceania.
- Introduction of new ideas for the mass attraction of children to fencing using modern electronic kits for children's fencing.
- Mass Involvement of hundreds of thousands of children in fencing classes in Asia with the help of a fun innovative interactive children's online fencing encyclopaedia.
- Development of a special project of Asian championships for children from 9-10 years old, and 11-12 years old.
- Development of high-performance sports in our region for reaching Asia's leading position in the world.
- Development cooperation and mutual assistance with the African and the Pan American confederations in the framework of the signed agreement.
- Expansion of professional employment in the field of fencing and the support of fencing-related professions.

FCA SUPPORT TO THE DEVELOPMENT COUNTRIES

- 18 athletes from developing countries supported for participation in different competitions of FCA and FIE
- 5 coaches supported by FCA for participation in seminars as additional participants

Some of the federations received pistes for competitions upon request, some received the FIE maraging blades and other FIE competition's uniforms.

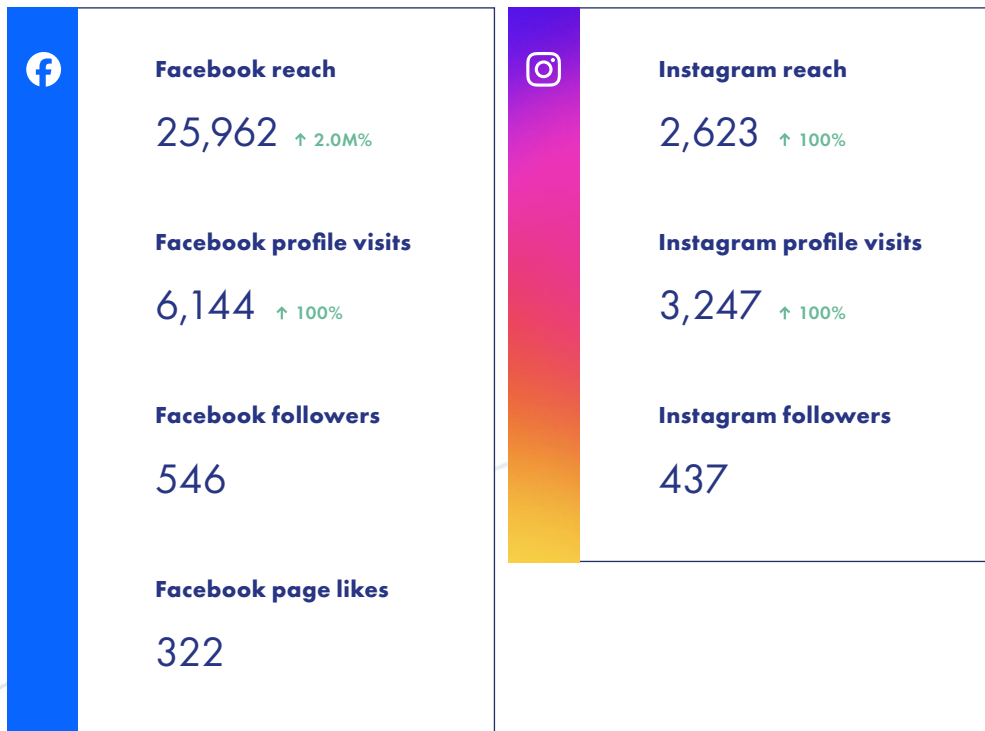

REFEREEING

- FCA referee's seminar in Kuala Lumpur 2023

Successful organisation seminar for referees in Malaysia. Most accent on the increase and support to women's.

- Organization of refereeing webinars in 2023

Successfully organised two webinars in 2023. These webinars were attended by more than 60 referees in the three weapons.

- FIE Referees Exams in Kazakhstan, for Asia 2023

58 candidates, registered from 23 Asian countries, participated on FIE exams in Almaty in the B Category Exams. 29 referees got the FIE B licenses. In the framework of increasing the women participation, FCA supported five women from five regions for the participation in the seminar in Kuala Lumpur and the FIE exams in Almaty. 16 Asian FIE female referee licenses qualified in these exams (foil – 7 women, Epée – 4 women, sabre – 5 women).

FIE COACHES COURSES

The main goal of the Coaching courses was to increase the level of knowledge in the preparation of top-level athletes. It is very important for the Asian Fencing Confederation to increase the quality of the training system for the developing national federations/associations and create more high-level athletes in the Asian zone.

ACTIVATION OF FCA COMMISSIONS AND COUNCILS

FCA for the last years increased the activity of all Commissions and Councils that continued working and presented short reports and plans.

Refereeing Commission:

1. Obtaining a recommendation from the FIE Refereeing Commission for several new referees who have succeeded in the B license during the previous two seasons.
2. Request the Asian federations to nominate several promising new young referees and begin appointing them in upcoming tournaments such as the AC Cup, veterans' competition and Asian Under-23 championships.
3. Suggest continuing holding various activities with the aim of developing the level of Asian referees, which contributes to the further development of the level of Asian fencing in general.

- Mr. Abbas Ali Faryabi - Head of the Technical Commission - informed about the plans of the technical commission. The Commission become initiator for:
 - Starting the Cadet Asian Cup and according to decision by board members already organised three Cadet Asian Cups in Hong Kong, Jordan, and Uzbekistan.
 - Starting to have the FCA cadet ranking, that to be ready managed by Mr. Vincent Tsui Man.
 - Dr Michiko Dohi –Head of the Medical Commission, informed about plans, who will work on the FCA competitions and for organisation of the doping seminar.
 - Mr. Hou Zhi Gang – Head of the SEMI Commission briefly informed about plans who should worked on upcoming FCA competitions and what we should improve in organisation.
 - Mr. Kovac Lin – Head of the Veterans Council informed that it will be very useful if will be made known what country will organise the Asian Fencing Veterans Championship in advance. He recommends organising it in August or first part of September before the Veteran Fencing World Championships. And according to the Board member's decision this important competition was organised in September 2023 in UAE, even if there was very limited registration.
 - On behalf of Women's Council Mrs. Gulnara Saidova noted that Council must more attention on increasing the women referees and requested support from FCA for women in Asia.
 - The Promotion Commission presented a summary of its discussions, but rather had instead jot down the points discussed below:
 - Goals / Direction of social media platform – followers, attraction, interaction etc.
 - Budget of social media landscape - to see how far can develop, how much can be done?
 - Interaction & synergy to be duplicated in website & social media platforms – meeting to be scheduled

- Promotion of events to be posted in advance
- Co-operation with Regional Directors & other Asian federations regarding their activities and calendar and event they want to promote
- Reposting and content duplication from other accounts
- Template for different types of posting/ news
- CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) activities – e.g., gear donation, levelled and scaled throughout Asia

Also, the importance of active participation of all members of the commissions, as unfortunately not all elected members attend the meetings and actively participate in them. Another important point was initiated from Promotion Commission to add to the next FCA elections recommendations to all national federations and associations to present candidatures of persons that have experience and capabilities in the field of the corresponding Commission.

2.12.3 PAN AMERICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

PAN AMERICAN JUNIOR AND CADET CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

They took place in the city of Bogota, Colombia, from 28 February to 7 March 2023. This important event took place in the Palacio de los Deportes, gathering more than 300 athletes on their way to the Junior and Cadet World Championships in Plovdiv.

PAN AMERICAN SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

In the city of Lima, Peru, from 14 to 21 June 2023, the 2023 Pan American Senior Championships took place in the velodrome of the VIDENA high performance centre. This competition brought together the best fencers of the continent who would also see action at the Pan American Games in Santiago de Chile.

PANAMERICAN CHILDREN'S AND VETERANS' CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

From 14 to 18 August 2023, the Pan American Children's and Veterans' Championships took place in Montevideo, Uruguay. In an atmosphere of great excitement and joy we celebrated the 10th anniversary of the Pan American Championships in the children's and veterans' categories, with the participation of more than 600 athletes. Record participation since the beginning of these competitions.

2023 COURSES FOR COACHES

From 4 to 15 December 2023, the FIE Pan-American Course for Epée coaches, taught by master Gennady Tyshler, was held in the city of Lima, Peru. With a total of 35 coaches from 28 national federations, different themes were developed for the training of national coaches. The participants also attended a seminar on refereeing rules by Mr. Amgad Badawi.

CPE 2023 CONGRESS

The annual Pan American Congress was held in Panama City, Panama, on 16 September 2023, at the Intercontinental Miramar Hotel, where the presidents and delegates of the affiliated national federations met; the agenda developed for the ordinary annual congress was unanimously approved by those present, who expressed their full approval of the management of President Logvin.

2.12.4 OCEANIA FENCING CONFEDERATION (OFC)

DEVELOPING NEW FEDERATIONS IN THE PACIFIC

The OFC currently has six full members (American Samoa, Australia, Guam, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, and Samoa) and two associate members (Tahiti and New Caledonia).

The OFC has continued to support the Fiji Fencing Federation by including two coaches in our coach education activities and the Regional Development Officer (RDO) will visit Fiji again in 2024 to progress the development of Fencing.

In February, the President and RDO met with interested parties from Tonga to discuss the possibility of starting a federation in that island nation. Discussions have been ongoing.

DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES DURING 2023

- The OFC held a very successful Strategic Planning and Succession Planning Workshop, followed by an OFC Board Meeting in Melbourne from 3 to 5 February.
- The OFC Annual General Meeting was held online in May. Four OFC Board meetings were also held online throughout the year.
- OFC Administration was carried out on email, in online meetings and phone, with regular meetings between the OFC President, Regional Development Officer/OFMA Coaching Programme Director and the OFC Secretary/Finance Officer.
- The OFC Coaching Commission met online eight times.
- The OFC and the Oceania Fencing Master's Academy (OFMA) partnered with Global Fencing Masters (GFM) to deliver the GFM Level 1 Online Epée Course, building on last year's successful online Foil Coaching Trial. 23 students from across Oceania participated.
- The online trial was followed up in the second half of 2023 with face-to-face content review and assessments of the trainee coaches. These sessions will be completed in 2024.
- Leon Thomas (OFC Regional Development Officer) travelled to PNG (Papua New Guinea) from 21 to 31 March, to assist Fencing PNG re-establish the fencing programme and to assess three Level 1 Foil Coaches. All were successful, so there are three new accredited coaches in PNG and the Development Programme was reactivated after COVID. Also, two hundred school children from Port Moresby were introduced to Fencing during the visit.
- The RDO visited Samoa and American Samoa from 18 May to 9 June. In Samoa, he met with representatives from the fencing association and the Samoa Association of Sports and National Olympic Committee (SASNOC) to discuss plans to grow and develop the fencing programme.
- In American Samoa, the RDO worked with representatives of the federation to introduce fencing to 350 school students, as well as delivering a Development Programme to approximately 100 young participants and organising five junior competitions. He also provided ongoing coaching mentoring to the resident coach.

OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The Oceania Junior Championships were held in Dunedin, New Zealand from 1 to 2 July.
- The Oceania Cadet Championships were held in Papeete, Tahiti from 29 September to 1 October. This is the first time that an Oceania Championship has been held in Tahiti, successfully hosted by the Tahitian Fencing Federation.
- The Oceania Senior Championships were held in Melbourne, Australia from 1 to 5 December.

The events were attended by fencers from Tahiti, New Zealand, and Australia, but we are hoping that more of our member federations will be able to compete in 2024, with the return to less expensive airfares for travel around the Pacific.

For each event, the OFC funds the attendance to officiate at the championships of a referee from Oceania who aspires to become an internationally qualified referee.

PARTICIPATION IN FIE EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

Helen Smith (OFC President) and Leon Thomas attended the Organisation of Sports Federations of Oceania (OSFO) and Oceania National Olympic Committees (ONOC) General Assemblies in Brisbane from 18 to 21 April. These meetings and informal discussions are very important for the development of Fencing in the zone.

Fencers from Oceania participated in the World and Asian Junior, Cadet, and Senior Championships, the Asian and World Veteran Championships, as well as in many others FIE events.

Fencers from New Zealand benefitted from participation in the FIE Training Camps held before both the Junior and Cadet and Senior World Championships in Plovdiv and Milano respectively.

In 2023, several Oceania referees officiated at FIE competitions including World Cups, Junior World Cups, Satellites, Grand Prix events, University Games and Asian Championships. Three Oceania referees were successful in the FIE B Licence Referee examinations held in 2023 in Kazakhstan.

The OFC thanks the FIE Sports Department for its assistance with the 2023 Material Aid Programme. Grants of equipment were awarded to Papua New Guinea, American Samoa, and Australia.

All Oceania federations were represented at the online Extraordinary Congress of the FIE on 10 March 2023. With the help of a travel subsidy from the FIE, five of the six Oceania federations were represented either by a Delegate or Proxy at the FIE Congress held in Sharm-El-Sheikh on 25 November.

SUPPORT FROM FIE

The OFC appreciates the invaluable and generous administrative and technical support it receives from the Interim President, the CEO and all the staff at the FIE office.

The OFC acknowledges the important financial support it receives annually from the FIE and was very grateful to receive an additional grant for 'Help to Confederations' from the FIE this year.

We hope that the funding for the Regional Development Officer position that was from the FIE budget from 2023 will be reinstated to maintain the very important OFC development activities in future.

2.12.5 AFRICAN FENCING CONFEDERATION

Main activities of the African Fencing Confederation in 2023

The highlights of 2023:

1. Organization of the African Cadet-Junior Championships:

- The African Cadet-Junior Fencing Championships was organised by the Fencing Federation of Ghana in Accra from February 15Th to 21St, 2023.

2. Organization of the African Seniors Championships:

- Fencing Federation of Egypt hosted the competitions in Cairo from June 18Th to 23Rd 2023.

3. Organisation of the FIE international competitions:

- Senior Men's Foil World Cup was organised in Egypt from 23Rd to 26Th of February 2023.
- Senior Women's Foil World Cup was organised in Egypt from 23Rd to 26Th of February 2023.
- Senior Men's Sabre Grand Prix was organised in Tunisia from 13Th to 15Th of January 2023.
- Senior Women's Sabre Grand Prix was organised in Tunisia from 13Th to 15Th of January 2023.

4. Participations in FIE competitions:

African fencers participated in the FIE organised competitions:

- Junior and Cadet World Championships in Plovdiv, Bulgaria, from 1St to 9Th of April 2023
- Senior World Championships in Milan, Italy, from 22Nd to 29Th of July 2023
- Various World Cups, Grand Prix events, World Cups and Satellites

5. FIE Academy SA

In the period from February to November 2023 the FIE Academy in Johannesburg, South Africa, successfully finalised programme for the 2023 Class of students from 3 African Countries (South Africa (2), Kenya (2), Uganda (2)).

The FIE Academy SA provides successful students with two degrees:

- HIGHER CERTIFICATE IN COACHING SCIENCE, Level 5 Qualification registered on the Higher Education Qualification Sub Framework. This qualification is internationally recognized through the REPSSA individual registration and provides the ability for employment as a coach, physical education teacher, personal trainer etc.
- FIE COACHING DIPLOMA, the FIE approved fencing coaching degree in three 3 weapons.

6. Continental Activities

- The CAE President visited Equatorial Guinea and had meetings with national Olympic Committee and Ministry of Sport and helped them to resolve problem of the Fencing Federation that had been suspended due to the organisational problems.
- The CAE President made official visit to Burkina Faso to help restoring fencing in this country.

7. International Activities

The CAE President participated to the 2023 Intercontinental Conference "New Methods and New Vision for Development of Fencing World", organised by the Asian Fencing Confederation in Tashkent (Uzbekistan).

The CAE President Also participated on to the 2023 Congress of the Pan-American Fencing Confederation.

8. Board Meetings

Alongside the Junior and Cadet and Senior African Championships, the CAE Board meetings were organised on 20Th of February 2023 in Accra (Ghana) and 21St of June 2023 in Cairo (Egypt).

9. Arab Games

Fencers from African Arabic countries participated in July 2023 in 2023 Arab Sports Games in Algeria. The CAE President Mr Mbagnick participated in these games.

10. Alliance Francophone d' Escrime

Some African countries are founding members of the Alliance Francophone d' Escrime and they were involved in activities of this alliance.

11. CAE Congress

The CAE Extraordinary Congress was on 24Th of November 2023 in Sharm El Sheik, Egypt.

12. FIE Congress

Presidents and representatives of African National Federations participated in the FIE Congress in Sharm El Sheik, November 25Th 2023.

13. AASC Congress

On 26Th of November 2023, the CAE Secretary General participated in the Electoral General Assembly of the Association of African Sports Confederations in Cairo (Egypt).
