There's 24-hour room service.



Devdan Show

The Devdan Show is not only our absolute favourite thing to do in Nusa Dua, but it's also one of the best cultural performances we've seen in Bali.

Nusa Dua's best beaches

Nusa Dua's beautiful white sand beaches are calm azure waters are one of its biggest draws. The area is home to some of the most beautiful, accessible, and cleanest beaches in Bali – mostly thanks to the many high-end beachfront resorts that help to maintain them.





Two Islands

Did you know that "Nusa Dua" translates to "Two Islands?" The area was named after the two small islands that protrude out from its coastline - Peninsula Island and Dharma Island

















Museum Pasifika

Museum Pasifika is a modern gallery in Nusa Dua that's home to the largest collection of Asia-Pacific artwork in Asia.

The museum holds over 600 artworks by 200 artists from 25 different countries. The one thing all of the artists have in common is that they all lived in the Asia Pacific and were inspired by the region in their work.

The Bali Collection

The Bali Collection is a spacious outdoor shopping and entertainment complex in the IDTC area of Nusa Dua. Set amongst a lush green park, the mall is home to a variety of shops, market traders, restaurants, and bars.





Gunung Payung Beach

If you want a change from the beaches of central Nusa Dua, head just 15 minutes south to Gunung Payung Beach on the Bukit Peninsula's southern coast.

Surrounded by limestone cliffs, Gunung Payung Beach is a tranquil secluded beach with pristine white sand, clear blue waters, and amazing natural caves.















Water Blow

Located on Peninsula Island, the Nusa Dua Water Blow is an amazing natural phenomenon where the waves crash through a hole in the volcanic rock and surge high into the air, reaching crazy heights of up to 30 meters.

At high tide, the mighty waves soak everyone in the area – a refreshing way to cool down from the intense Bali heat and keep little ones entertained for a while.



Water sports

Sitting on the small peninsula in the north of Nusa Dua, the area of Tanjung Benoa is known as Bali's watersports hub.

You can enjoy a huge range of exciting water sports activities, including surfing, snorkeling, scuba, jet skiing, waterskiing, banana boats, flying fish, parasailing, and more.

Garuda Wisnu Kencana

The park is home to the iconic Garuda Wisnu Kencana statue, which at 121-meters tall (including the base) is the tallest statue in Indonesia and one of the tallest in the world.

The statue sits within a 60-hectare cultural park where you can learn all about Balinese culture through its museum, amphitheatre, huge sculptures, and a packed schedule of daily cultural performances (including a Kecak dance each evening at sunset).

- Open only to member countries of the Fencing Confederation of Asia and the Oceania Fencing Confederation
- All participating countries (Asia and Oceania) can enter a maximum of four (4) fencers in each individual event, and one team in the team event (three (3) fencers and/or one (1) substitute) All fencers must have a valid FIE License and entries must be encrypted through the FIE website (www.fie.org)

Entry

- Entry fee of US\$50 for individual and US\$150 for team must be paid at the team manager's meeting.
- All entry forms 1,2,3,4 must be submited to the organizer and send to (email address of the organizer)
 - (a) Form 1: Preliminary Entry (AFC 2025 Bali) 1 May 2025
 - (b) Forms 2A & 3: Final Entry (AFC 2025 Bali) 17 May 2025

Awards

- Individual events: one (1) gold, one (1) silver, and two (2) bronze medals to the top four (4) fencers and diplomas to the top eight (8) fencers.
- Team events: four (4) gold medals for the champion team, four (4) silver medals for the second placed team, and two (2) sets of four (4) bronze medals for the two losing teams in the semifinals, and diplomas to the members of the top four teams.
- Individual events will earn FIE ranking points, in accordance with standard FIE rules.

The Directoire Technique will, however, reserve the right to decide, without right of appeal, on any issues not covered by the FIE Rules or by these Rules.

Equipment

All equipment to be used must comply with FIE standards. All equipment must be submited for weapons testing and marked by organizer before they may be used in the competition.

Competion Management

- Referee

FIE-licensed referees will be designated by the FCA. Referees must present themselves during the Referees' meeting on 17 June 2025 Referees must be properly attired in jacket/blazer and long pants.

Directoire Technique (DT)

The DT shall be responsible for the technical organiza8on of the competition. The FCA will designate the DT president and DT member, while the host country will assign another DT Member.

Protests

Appeals against decisions of a referee should be made immediately by the competitor so their team captain to the referee, before any decision is made regarding a subsequent hit. If the referee should maintain his decision, the complaint shall be brought to the attention of the DT.

General Information

- **Currency**: Indonesia unit of currency is the Rupiah (IDR). Foreign currency can be exchanged freely at banks, hotels, the airport and most big shopping malls. Current exchange rate is approximately 16.000 IDR for US\$1. Major credit cards are widely accepted in most places.
- Entry Formalization: All passengers entering Indonesia must possess valid passports. Participants are recommended to check with local Indonesia Embassies for visa applications before traveling. In order to obtain a visa, participants are requested to send copy of their passports by E-Mail to: immigration@asfcbali.com not later than Friday, May 20, 2025. The organizing committee will take care of the necessary formalities.
- Weather & Dress: Indonesia has a warm and humid climate throughout the year with a daily average temperature range of 26°C to 34°C. Light clothing made from natural fabrics like cotton is best for everyday wear.
- Water & Electricity: Tap water should be boiled before drinking. Bottled mineral water is available at any convenience stores or supermarkets. Electricity supply is AC 220-240V/50Hz, European standard CEE-7/7 plug type or compatible.
- **Smoking**: Smoking in all air-conditioned public places (including education institutions) is against the law. Smoking is also prohibited in all covered areas, including shopping centers, restaurants, cafes and bars (some are allowed to set up special smoking rooms). Smoking is also banned in outdoor eateries, coffee shops, canteens and cafes (some areas are set aside for smoking)















Visa Support

Kindly check for visa requirements to Indonesia before making your ticket reservations. Those who need visa assistance and/or visa support, please contact immigration@asfcbali.com no later than 20 May 2025 All participants must possess a valid passport. Passport must be valid for at least six months from the date of entry.
