

COMPETITION FORMAT

- ▶ **Individual competitions** – One qualifying round of pools, a preliminary direct elimination table, a main direct elimination table of 64 fencers to qualify for a final by direct elimination.
- ▶ **Team competitions** – Integral direct elimination with a direct elimination table which may be incomplete.
- ▶ All places in the table up to 16th place will be fought for. From 17th place onwards, teams will be classified, within each round of the table, according to their initial place in the table.
- ▶ The first four teams will be placed in the direct elimination table according to the current official team ranking of the FIE (cf. 0.86); the remaining ranked teams will be placed in the table by drawing of lots in pairs. The teams that are not classified will occupy the last places in the table and will be separated by drawing of lots (cf. 0.42–0.47).





COMPETITION VENUES

► Arena Carioca 1

Located in the Barra da Tijuca Olympic Park, Arena Carioca 1 is one of the most iconic symbols of Brazilian sport. Built for the Rio 2016 Olympic Games, it was the stage for unforgettable competitions and great performances. With modern infrastructure and capacity for thousands of spectators, it is considered one of the best multi-purpose venues in the country.

► Olympic Velodrome

Next to Arena Carioca 1, the Olympic Velodrome is internationally recognized for its world-class cycling track. With modern architecture and cutting-edge technology, it offers ideal conditions for athletes and spectators, consolidating itself as one of the main sports centers in Latin America.

Access to both venues is facilitated by public transport such as the BRT Transolímpica, with a stop at the Olympic Terminal, as well as taxis and ride-hailing apps (Uber, 99).

ACCREDITATION INFORMATION

- ▶ Accreditation will be carried out directly at the organisation's office, **at Arena Carioca 1, starting two days before the competitions.**

Dates/ Open hours: from march,30 to April, 7 – 08:30 to 17:00

Accreditation will be obligatory to access weapon control, training, the venue, the competition hall, or any other World Championships facility.

- ▶ Officials must go to the venue and show the passport/ ID of all members of their delegation in order to collect their accreditations.
- ▶ Fencers without a chief of delegation will collect their accreditations in person and show their Passports/ ID.
- ▶ Parents accompanying children will not register on the FIE website. They will be accredited directly with the organisers outside in addition to the quota for each delegation.
- ▶ A personal photo of the accompanying parents of the athletes must be sent to the **e-mail below** no later than **March 10, 2026** deadline.
- ▶ An ID photo must be sent as "jpg" to the email below.

PARTICIPANTS MINOR OF AGE

Minors traveling alone

While minors can travel for the Championships on their own, they would need to have the following documents:

- A signed FIE minor athlete travel form and signed by a legal guardian.
- A letter from the minor's national fencing federation stating that the minor is participating in the 2026 Junior and Cadet Fencing Championships.

Minors Traveling with an Adult

Minors who are traveling with an adult who is not the parent or guardian of the minor are required to have the following documents:

- A signed FIE minor athlete travel form
- Passport copies of parents or legal guardians.
- A signed letter of consent from the minor's parent or legal guardian.

Minor Fencers in Groups

The manager or coach of the group should have the following documents:

- A letter on the group's official letterhead stating the name of the group, supervising adult, and name of each fencer in the group, along with their address, phone number, date and place of birth, and the name of at least one of the minor's parents.
- A signed letter of consent from the minor's parent or legal guardian.
- A signed FIE minor athlete travel form
- Passport photographs of the parents or legal guardian.



VISA APPLICATION

To apply for a visa, foreigners must submit the visa application form duly completed, a valid travel document, proof of payment of consular fees, International Certificate of Immunization - when necessary -, and other specific documents for the type of visa requested.

Brazil adopts a policy of reciprocity regarding visas. This means that nationals of countries that require visas for Brazilian citizens will need a visa to travel to Brazil.

VISIT VISA

The visit visa will be issued to foreigners traveling to Brazil for staying up to 90 days without purposes of immigration or the exercise of paid activity . Visit visas can be granted for those traveling for tourism, business, transit, artistic or sports activities, study, volunteer work, among other purposes.

VISA FOR MINORS

The visa application for citizens under 18 must be accompanied by travel written consent of both parents, legal guardians or competent judicial authority.

ARRIVAL INFORMATION

AIRPORTS OF RIO DE JANEIRO

Rio de Janeiro is served by two main airports, both offering convenient access to Barra da Tijuca, where the Olympic Park and competition venues are located.

Galeao – Rio de Janeiro International Airport (GIG)

- **Location:** Ilha do Governador, in the northern zone of the city.
- **Distance to Barra da Tijuca:** approximately 30–33 km (30–60 minutes by car, depending on traffic).
- **Profile:** The largest airport in Rio, handling most international flights as well as domestic connections. It offers modern facilities, duty-free shops, and a wide range of services for travelers.

Santos Dumont Airport (SDU)

- **Location:** Downtown Rio de Janeiro, by Guanabara Bay.
- **Distance to Barra da Tijuca:** approximately 25–29 km (30–60 minutes by car, depending on traffic).
- **Profile:** A smaller airport mainly dedicated to domestic flights, especially the Rio–São Paulo shuttle. Famous for its scenic landings and takeoffs, it provides quick access to the city center.

Transport Options:

Both airports are connected to Barra da Tijuca by taxis, ride-hailing apps (Uber, 99), and shuttle services organised for the championship. Travel times vary with traffic, so participants are advised to plan ahead.





- Meals will be available at the event venue.
- Supermarkets and restaurants are also located nearby.

All hotel packages include accommodation with breakfast, airport/hotel/airport transfer, and shuttle between hotel/Olympic Park/hotel.



BUZIOS:

Búzios is a small and charming peninsula located just a few hours from Rio de Janeiro, known for its crystal-clear waters, beautiful beaches, and vibrant nightlife. Once a fishing village, it gained international fame after being visited by Brigitte Bardot in the 1960s. Today, Búzios offers a perfect blend of natural beauty and sophistication, with a variety of outdoor activities like snorkeling, sailing, and hiking, as well as upscale boutiques, restaurants, and bars. Its picturesque landscapes and relaxed atmosphere make it a top destination for travelers seeking both adventure and tranquility.

PARATY

Paraty is a historically preserved city of Baroque architectural beauty, located on the Costa Verde and 247 km south of the city of Rio de Janeiro. IGUASSU FALLS

Located on the border between Brazil, Argentina and Paraguay, the Iguassu Falls are a unique spectacle that attracts tourists from all over the world. They are made up of 275 different waterfalls which, when joined together, fall 80m in height. On the Brazilian side, the Falls are part of the 425,000-hectare National Park, whose main attraction is the incredible views, and which displays enchanting fauna and flora and allows boat trips on the river, hikes along the trails and bike rides, as well as adventure activities such as rafting, kayaking and abseiling.

SALVADOR

Salvador, the vibrant capital of Bahia, is a city rich in Afro-Brazilian culture and history. Its historic center, Pelourinho, a UNESCO World Heritage site, boasts colorful colonial buildings, cobblestone streets, and lively music. Visitors can explore the iconic Elevador Lacerda, offering stunning views of the Baía de Todos os Santos, and visit the impressive São Francisco Church, famous for its baroque architecture and gold-plated interiors.
