OBITUARIES

The International Fencing Federation has suffered the loss of several friends:

Hee-Woo Kim (KOR), on September 2010.

He was a member of the Directoire technique of several World Championships. He was also elected as member of the Legal Commission in 1985 and 1989..

Attila Kovács (HUN) , on November 11, 2010

Sabre fencer, twice team world champion, and several times university world champion. His father was Pal Kovács, a famous Olympic champion and the former vice-president of the FIE, and his brother, Tamas Kovács was also world champion in sabre, as well as the Head and Secretary General of the Hungarian Fencing Federation for 20 years.

MORIS Sakhvadze (GEO), on January 26, 2011

Moris was a member of the former Soviet Union team from 1960 until 1970. He was crowned twice Soviet Union Champion and won the Soviet Union Cup in 1963. He was also a Champion of the former Soviet Union Socialist Republics in junior and senior events for both individual and team.

Refereeing:

In 1980, Moscow Olympic Games.

In 1992, Barcelona Olympic Games.

As a referee, he officiated at many world championships and world cups.

He was a member of the FIE Refereeing Commission from 1992 up until 2008.

He was also the Secretary General of the Georgian Fencing Federation from 1988 until 2008.

He was awarded the Sigyl of Dignity (honour) for Sport Achievements by the Georgian Government.

He is Honoured Master of Sports of Georgia.

ALFRED Grasnek (AUT), on February 10, 2011.

"Fredí" was the mastermind behind Austria's landmark fencing successes between 1980 and 1990. In 1982, he played a key role in bringing the European Fencing Championships to Austria, as well as the Junior World Championships in 1990.

As Secretary General of the Austrian Fencing Federation, his comprehensive knowledge, paired with his love for fencing earned him a great reputation as a tournament director around the world. Members of the older fencing generation were fortunate enough to have experienced him as an active delegate at European and World championships, as well as at the Olympic Games.

Alfred "Fredí" Grasnek was an active governing member of the Austrian Fencing Federation's Executive Committee, serving many years as President of the Lower Austrian Fencing Association. His love for the sport of fencing, combined with his desire to provide the fencing community with the grounds it needed to prepare the next generation for future victories, were the true foundation for his excellent reputation.

His hard work resulted in his being decorated with the Golden medal for service to the Republic of Austria, as well as the Golden medal for achievement from the Austrian Sport Union.

We express our deepest sympathy to the families and federations of the deceased.

1. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

1.1 MANAGEMENT

The management activities of the FIE have continued with intensity during the second semester of the year.

The Executive Committee met on Octobre 9, 2010 in Moscow (RUS), on December 3rd, 2010 in Moscow (RUS), on February 26, 2011 in Lausanne (SUI), and on June 25, 2011 in Rome (ITA).

The **Congress** of the FIE took place in Moscow (RUS) on December 4 and 5, 2010.

37 Executive Committee consultations were conducted by fax and email throughout the second semester of the year, when urgent decisions were needed.

The measures adopted by these decision-making bodies were regularly communicated to the FIE members, via **13 Information Letters** and **24 Urgent Letters**.

The letters and their annexes were sent to the National Federations, the Members of Honour, the Members of the Executive Committee and the Presidents of the Confederations by electronic mail.

The various rankings of the FIE were also sent to the National Federations by electronic mail.

1.4 ANTI-DOPING

The fight against doping continued throughout the season and there were **0** case of doping in FIE competitions.

- **278 doping controls were carried out** during the 2010/2011 season at World Cup competitions (not including the World Championships and Zonal Championships), including:
 - **92** controls during Junior World Cups
 - **94** controls during Senior World Cups
 - **60** controls during Team World Cups
 - **32** controls during Satellite Competitions
- The FIE conducted out-of-competition doping controls on **25 athletes**.

1.5 ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION

1.5.1 Paris 2010

Introduction

The Athletes Awareness Program (AAP), a joint effort from the WADA and the FIE, aims at educating the athletes regarding clean sport. As the FIE anti-doping team clearly targets the younger generation of fencers, the FIE implemented this program at the FIE Senior World Championships in November 2010, in Paris (FRA) and in the 2011 J/C World Championships in Jordan. This program integrated recommendations from our last experience in Baku, using promotion banners for visibility and targeting mainly the national coaches.

Objectives

- Promotion of a clean sport
- Anti-doping awareness in the fencing environment: fencers, coaches, medical teams, general secretaries and organisers.

Approximately 50 participants, mainly fencers, coaches or national team medical personnel, took the 2010 version of the Anti-doping Quiz. Many "group sessions" were organised with 2-3 additional participants per player. Based on this observation, 100 to 150 key targeted fencing stakeholders have probably participated in this program.

Moreover, thanks to 85 USB keys "FIE Clean Sport" handed to people in charge, i.e. national team coaches or doctors, this awareness program seems to have clearly exceeded its objectives, reaching not only the fencers, but also support personnel who play an essential role regarding clean sport education.

Fencers and national coaches have demonstrated great interest for this new tool regrouping on a practical medium all useful official information relative to anti-doping.

Moreover, by using this tool, the FIE contributes to significantly reduce paper use, which makes this program more environmentally friendly.

Conclusions

- The AAP has successfully reached its main objectives.
 - Proportionally, the AAP reached approximately 1/5 of the fencers present, either directly or through their coach.
 - More importantly, the AAP reached 1/5 of participating countries, through their national coach. We hope they will transmit this information to their athletes during the year.
 - Given the fact that we targeted the biggest fencing countries, the ratio of targeted people to reached people is excellent. Apparently, this proves the efficiency of such an education program. In comparison, the program costs only the equivalent of 2 or 3 doping controls (36 controls were made in Paris).
- The meetings with the national federations representatives allow the FIE to progress efficiently on touchy subjects such as the submission of localisation information on which the planning of out-of-competition controls is based, as well as the missed controls.

Recommendations

- Include the anti-doping stand in the Organisation Handbook of Specifications. The

information session about ADAMS did not take place because the Wifi connection requested five month in advance was not provided.

- Develop an educational plan (with a range of operations going from targeting coaches in 2010 to targeting the general public in 2012).
- Involve one (1) representative of the FIE and one (1) young anti-doping ambassador (fencer or volunteer).

1.5.2 Dead Sea 2011

In 2011, as an integral part of our continued obligation to the IOC and WADA to provide an anti-doping education programme, the FIE Anti-Doping Commission organized a very successful and cost-effective educational Outreach Programme during the Dead Sea World Fencing Championships.

The success of this programme was largely due to the close co-operation with Dr. Kamal Alhadidi (head of the Jordan Anti-Doping Organization - JADO) who kindly provided the stand, tables, chairs, three laptop computers; and most importantly made available a number of friendly and efficient local JADO staff members who willingly volunteered their time to help coordinate the running of the Outreach programme and provided much-needed language translation skills. The valuable contribution provided by the FIE (two attractive photographic banners, 80 USB "keys" with useful information, printed information hand-outs from WADA, and 4 cash 'prizes' of €50 each as daily 'lucky draw' prizes) completed the successful formula.

Our objective was to increase awareness of anti-doping issues among young fencers and their entourage (including coaches, officials, medical and other support staff).

This was achieved by:

- encouraging everyone to play the educational computer quiz game "Play True".
- making WADA information pamphlets freely available.
- making ourselves available for one-on-one doping-related questions and discussions, and
- providing one USB "key" packed with valuable information (including a copy of the "Play True" Quiz) for distribution to each National Federation.

As a result, in the 4 days of the Outreach, a total of 259 persons completed the "Play True" Quiz. These included 170 fencers from 63 countries, coaches, officials and many volunteers from Jordan. These figures far exceed the participation achieved in any previous FIE anti-doping Outreach:

Conclusion: Prior consultation and collaboration with the relevant National Anti-Doping Organization is the best formula for a cost-effective and successful anti-doping outreach programme appropriate for Junior & Cadet World Fencing Championships.

3. AID FROM THE FIE TO THE SPORT DEVELOPMENT

I. Athletes training camps

Since 2002, the FIE has organised 14 one week training camps leading up to the World Championships, and the FIE has provided technical, logistical and financial aid to the participants until the end of the individual event of these Championships.

In 2010, in cooperation with the French Fencing Federation, the FIE organised a training camp at the Fontainebleau EIS, before the Paris World Championships. A record number of participants - 35 from 35 different countries - took part in this training camp for all three weapons.

In 2011, the FIE organised the same kind of training camp the week leading up to the Junior and Cadet World Championships, at the Dead Sea in Jordan. This training camp took place at the Jordanian Olympic Complex, in Amman. Once again a record number of participants took part in the camp, 40 young athletes from 40 countries attended, being invited by the FIE.

These training camps have the following objectives:

- encourage and facilitate the participation of all national federations in the World Championships;
- offer a one week intensive preparation to fencers who do not always have the training partners needed to aim for successful international fencing;
- have these young talented athletes discover the contents and structure of a modern training session;
- have them benefit from the advice of very experienced fencing masters, advice which they will wholeheartedly try to put into practice;
- ensure that they have a first contact with the world's elite fencers in the best possible conditions, so that they are encouraged to work twice as hard and become role models once they return to their own training environment.

II. Coaches training courses

In 2010, the main objectives were the capacity to correctly teach the fundamentals and to consciously utilize the pedagogical methodology. In order to reach these objectives, the training courses were long, i.e. 5 to 8 weeks. Starting in 2011, the FIE began to organise improvement training courses targeting national team coaches in order to reach higher. These training courses were reduced to 2 weeks and their contents have been modified, now including the programming methodology necessary for managing a national team.

The work load of the learning period has been established to 30 hours per week, spread over 10 sessions.

At the end of each course participants took an exam and obtained a diploma.

The same kind of training has been organised on each continent and in all three weapons.

The FIE funded all training and living costs.

Europe

An epee coaches training course was organized in June 2011 in Budapest, Hungary. The FIE asked the national federations to choose either coaches who already took part in former FIE courses, or national team coaches. The following countries sent coaches (16): Macedonia, Holland, Serbia, Portugal, Greece, Great-Britain, Belgium, Ireland, Spain, Finland, Azerbaijan, Croatia, Bulgaria, Denmark, Slovenia, and Poland. The esteemed Prof. Dr. Octavian Zidaru directed this training course.

Asia

In Asia, the same kind of training course was organized in May 2011 in Tashkent, Uzbekistan. The following countries (20) participated: Jordan, Vietnam, Lebanon, Malaysia, Thailand, Nepal, Iraq,

Kazakhstan, India, Iran, Indonesia, Afghanistan, Mongolia, Taipei, Philippines, Bangladesh, Turkmenistan, Tajikistan, Kirghizistan and Uzbekistan. Hugues Leseur and Petru Kuki were the experts directing this training course.

Americas

For the American countries, the foil training course was organized in April 2011, and the participating countries were: Belize, Equator, Panama, Argentina, Aruba, Dominican Republic, Nicaragua, Chile, Honduras, Costa Rica, Paraguay, Curacao, Colombia, Brazil, Guatemala, Venezuela, Uruguay, Bolivia, Peru, Virgin Islands, and El Salvador. Hugues Leseur and Petru Kuki were the experts directing this training course.

Africa

In Dakar, Senegal, a permanent fencing master school is already in place. This year, in June, the FIE also organized an up-to-date high level training course in Dakar targeting foil national team coaches. The following federations were represented: Guinea, Niger, Togo, Mali, Ivory Coast, Botswana, Gabon, Mauritania, Tunisia, Burkina Faso, Egypt, Morocco, Democratic Republic of Congo, Cameroon, Sierra Leone, Nigeria, South Africa, and Senegal.

We can conclude that these training courses have had a great success, as 75 countries from 4 continents took part.

III. Fencing Master Training and Recycling Schools

In Dakar, the fencing master school, created in 1999, fulfils its mandate perfectly. Without this school, the development of African fencing would have remained an impossible mission. The initial objectives of this school were as follows:

- training of fencing masters, for the benefit of new African federations;
- recycling of African fencing masters;
- helping the establishment of the new federations;
- providing high level training for African fencers.

The 6th cohort of the Dakar International Fencing Master School (Ecole internationale des maîtres d'armes - E.I.M.A) started training on November 15, 2010, as several future students and fencing masters teaching at the EIMA participated in the Paris World Championships. However, the host centre was open as early as the beginning of October, to welcome the first students.

Given the problems encountered in the preceding years, and the budgetary restrictions, the EIMA training was reduced from two years to one academic year only, from October to July.

However, this year, the training is planned to end on August 31st, 2011, given the late start mentioned earlier. Three federations, Gabon, Cameroon and Egypt, have already expressed their intent to send students to the EIMA for the 2011-2012 cohort.

1. Composition of EIMA's 6th cohort

For the first time since its inception, the EIMA welcomed students from Anglophone federations. This year the students were coming from the following nations: Sierra Leone (2), Mali (2), Togo (2), Benin (1), Morocco (1), Tunisia (1), Guinea Conakry (1), for a **total of ten (10) students**.

2. Program

Given the compressed training schedule, the program had to be adapted. We felt the hours spent on the secondary subjects (anatomy, physio, training planning, and so on) had to be reduced in order to keep more time for the fencing specific activities.

3. Infrastructures

The EIMA is still looking for resources to purchase its own fencing salle. This would allow students and fencing masters to have more training time, without depending solely on the common fencing

salle, shared between the school and the federation. The diminution of the training hours would then be less prominent.

Until such a time when the school possesses its own room, a space has been set up in a corner of the hosting centre, in which the students can train when the stadium is busy, or when they more detailed and targeted work is needed to develop what they learned during the course.

The classroom, used for theoretical subjects, is also situated in the hosting center.

4. Hosting centre

The hosting center is a building with 8 rooms in which up to 12 students can be lodged. There are several room sizes: single, double or triple.

5. Teaching personnel

There are three categories of personnel:

- **The titular fencing masters**
Julien OUEDRAOGO
Pape Khassoum TOURE (who left the EIMA in May)
- **The trainee fencing masters**
John KAMATE
Baïtir Sidy DIOP
- **The part-time personnel**, essentially the teachers of the secondary subjects.

Beside this permanent personnel, an FIE expert, master Octavian ZIDARU, contributes to the training and is a member of the exam jury at the end of the sessions.

In Melbourne, a centre for Oceania

The Oceania Fencing Confederation and the FIE established an awareness programme for the Olympic Committees of the different countries on the continent to create new national fencing federations.

The programme notably plans to send the fencing masters on technical training courses.

This FIE training school provides a unique opportunity for Oceania to encourage the vocation of fencing master and to perfect the teaching of the already existing fencing masters.

In Australia, these courses are part of the national accreditation system of professional competence.

OFMA Coaching Courses

So far in 2011, OFMA has coordinated the running of three Level 1 Coaching Courses in different States of Australia: they were held in Brisbane (state of Queensland), Melbourne (state of Victoria) and Sydney (state of New South Wales). A Level 2 Coaching Course was also held in NSW. A "How to teach fencing to groups" coaching course (Level 0) was developed earlier in 2011 and an introduction to fencing course is being worked on. A coaching course is planned for later in the year in New Zealand.

Due to the new Program 100 NFFs proposed by the FIE President and unanimously approved by the FIE Executive Committee, 96 NFs from all the 5 continents received considerable material aid in the 2010-2011 season. The base package of fencing equipment included 4 sets of up-to-date fencing apparatus and two ultramodern pistes. NFFs received three hundred forty-two (342) sets of fencing apparatus and one hundred eighty (180) pistes on a charitable basis. For European NFFs involved in the program, grants were allocated, ten thousand (USD 10,000) US dollars each, to procure fencing material from Allstar. The total amount of material aid provided to NFs exceeded nine hundred thirty thousand (USD 930,000) US dollars. Program 100 NFFs was extremely useful for the development of fencing in countries covered by this program. Its results were unanimously approved by members of the FIE Executive Committee, and this program will continue in the 2011-2012 season.

VI. Aid to athletes' participation (see the Financial Report)

Since 2009 the FIE has been implementing a special program for assisting NFF athletes in World Championships. Its results speak for themselves. In the 2010 World Championships in Paris, there was an all-time record number of participating countries (exceeding the symbolic limit of 100 countries).

All the Confederations have received a grant for each National Federation for the funding (plane ticket and hotel) of one (1) athlete to the 2010 Senior World Championships and to the 2011 Junior and Cadet World Championships.

VII. Aid to Presidents' participation (see the Financial Report)

Due to the new program providing for assistance to NFF presidents, all NFF presidents, without exception, could participate in the work of FIE congresses, which is fairly important to the development of international fencing. Over 100 NFF presidents attended the 2010 FIE Congress in Moscow.

All the Confederations have received a grant for each National Federation for the funding of its President to the Moscow Congress. This grant paid for air ticket subsidy and the total cost of their hotel room.

VIII. Aid to the Confederations (see the Financial Report)

All the Confederations have received an annual grant as well as a financial contribution for the implementation of a Development Program.

IX. Prizes for the World Champions

Owing to the FIE President's personal initiative, prize funds have been established since 2009 for athletes participating in World Championships. The prize fund for the 2010 World Championships in Paris made up, for the first time in history, five hundred seventy thousand (USD 570,000) US dollars. Prize certificates for the 2011 Juniors and Cadets World Championships in Jordan totaled forty-two thousand (USD 42,000) US dollars.

The "Foundation for the Future of Fencing" has awarded the medallists:

a) in each weapon at the 2010 World Championships:

Individual:

Fencer ranked 1st, 20.000 USD
Fencer ranked 2nd, 10.000 USD
Fencer ranked 3rd, 5.000 USD

By team:

Team ranked 1st , 30.000 USD
Team ranked 2nd, 15.000 USD
Team ranked 3rd, 10.000 USD

These prizes amounted to a total of 570.000 USD

b) in each cadet weapon and each junior weapon at the 2011 J/C World Championships with an equipment voucher from FIE's partner Allstar/Uhlmann:

Fencer ranked 1st: 1500 USD voucher
Fencer ranked 2nd: 1000 USD
Fencer ranked 3rd: 500 USD

These prizes amounted to a total of 42,000 USD.

4. FIE INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES

- Signing of the agreement with SportAccord - Cooperation on anti-doping issues – Lausanne, February 2011 :

The International Fencing Federation (FIE) is the first member of SportAccord to outsource the administration of its anti-doping programme and to sign a contract with SportAccord on the provision of such services.

- SportAccord Forum and ASOIF and SportAccord General Assembly - London, April 2011 :

- Signing of a memorandum on cooperation with Peace and Sport - London, April 2011;

At the SportAccord Convention 2011 in London, Peace and Sport and the International Fencing Federation (FIE) signed a partnership agreement to develop joint programs for peace-promotion and peace-building across the globe.

This association will increase the operational scope of Peace and Sport, an international initiative placed under the High Patronage of H.S.H. Prince Albert II of Monaco, which works to reconcile divided communities by establishing dialogue through sport and encouraging education and social stability.

The FIE will provide material support, technical resources and expertise for programs aimed at peace education for thousands of young people living in vulnerable situations throughout the world.
