

2003 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Ladies and gentlemen

This report concerns events which have taken place since January 2003.

The life of the International Fencing Federation has been hit, during this period, by the loss of many friends.

Mr H. M. Widartsadipradja (INA)

Died 8th March 2003 at the age of 74.

Mr H.M. Widartsadiprdja was President of the Indonesia Fencing Association from 1985 to 2001 and Honorary President from 2002. He was Vice President of the Asian Fencing Confederation from 1992 to 1996.

He was the founder and first President of the South-East Asian Fencing Federation (SEAFF). In recognition of his contribution as President and founder member of the SEAFF, he received the title of Honorary President for Life of the SEAFF.

IIse KEYDEL (GER)

Died 5th May 2003 in her eighty-second year.

Member of the German Women's Foil team from 1953 to 1959, she won the individual bronze medal in the 1953 World Championships in Brussels and the team silver medal in the World Championships in Paris in 1957 and in Philadelphia in 1958.

Maitre Boris STAVREV (BUL)

Died unexpectedly on 16th May 2003, at the age of sixty-eight, during a short visit to the country of his birth.

A fencer and national coach of the Bulgarian sabre team until 1984 then of the German team with whom he achieved good results on an international scale.

He was notably the coach for Felix Becker (GER) who won the gold medal in the World Championships in Athens in 1994.

Maitre Robert VAUGENOT (FRA)

Died 21st July 2003 at Nancy after a long and painful illness.

Master of Arms of the Fencing Circle of Berne (Switzerland) from 1950 to 1970, he was the Swiss national coach from 1970 to 1984. Thanks to him, the Swiss epeeists won many Olympic medals in the World Championships during this period.

Roger Barbas (FRA)

Died 24th July 2003 at Lyon (France).

In 1999, in the IRON MASK fencing salle, in the presence of the most senior members of the civil and military services in the region and city, as well as a number of Maitres and ex-pupils from all over France, Maitre d'Armes Roger BARBAS received from the great Olympic champion Christian D'ORIOLA the Legion d'Honneur for his heroic conduct during the 1939-45 war and for his presence for more than twenty years at the IRON MASK in Lyon, one of the most prestigious salles in the world. The plaque and the diploma of honour from the FIE have taken their place among the many souvenirs which have been offered as a posthumous tribute.

Dominique Solari (FRA)

Died 21st September 2003 at Dakar (SEN) at the age of 59. Maitre Solari was director of the internal school of maitres d'armes at Dakar (SEN) from 1998.

He had held a number of similar positions, mainly in Central America and Brazil.

Rodrigo Munoz Alveal (CHI)

Died 11th October 2003 at Havana (CUBA) at the age of 22. The young foilist, who had just taken part in the Fencing World Championships in Havana, died accidentally at his hotel.

Dr. Carlo Filogamo (ITA)

Died 19th decembre 2003 at the age of 94.

He was international referee during many years and had worked as member of Directoire technique in many competitions.

We offer our deepest sympathy to the families of the deceased and to the federations to which they belonged.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS

1 – MANAGEMENT

The management operations of the FIE have been intensive.

The Executive Committee met at Lausanne (SUI) on 10th and 11th May, at Leipzig (GER) on 20th and 21st November 2003. The Bureau met a number of times during the World Championships in Havana (Cuba, 4th – 11th October 2003).

Many consultations took place by letter, fax and email during this time, when an urgent decision was necessary.

The arrangements put in place by the administrative bodies were regularly communicated to FIE members by Letter to the FIE, Letters of Information and Urgent Letters, which replaced the old "circulars".

These Letters and their attachments were sent by electronic mail, thus avoiding delays in their receipt by federations, as well as the cost of postal charges and paper generated by the previous method of sending by post.

The various FIE ranking lists were also put into PDF format and sent to the national federations by electronic mail.

2 - NEW AFFILIATIONS

The Executive Committee gave provisional approval to 2 new federations in 2003:

- The Fencing Federation of the Congo
- The Fencing Federation of Guinea

The FIE has, at present, 113 member federations.

3 - CALENDAR

221 Word Cup tournaments appeared on the 2002/2003 calendar, of which 17 were satellite tournaments.

JUNIOR WORLD CUP

Out of a total of 77 competitions, 14 tournaments were for candidates in category A and 10 were cancelled. 23 tournaments were organised outside Europe and 54 in Europe.

SENIOR WORLD CUP

Out of a total of 91 competitions (not including satellite tournaments), 4 tournaments were cancelled, 31 were Grand Prix. 34 tournaments were organised outside Europe and 57 in Europe.

TEAM WORLD CUP

Out of a total of 36 competitions, 2 tournaments were cancelled, 11 were organised outside Europe and 25 in Europe.

GRAND PRIX

A number of Grand Prix competitions for each weapon were subject to the appointment of referees by the Executive Committee, on the advice of the Refereeing Commission.

The following were allowed:

- for organisers to select a sufficient number of referees from neutral countries
- for fencers to benefit from referees of a similar standard
- for the Commission of Referees to observer these referees with a view to their eventual appointment to other competitions.

4 - REFEREEING EXAMINATIONS

Because of the Olympic qualification due to appear in the 2002/2003 season, only the following examinations took place during this season:

The battles against doping continued throughout the season. The following cases of doping use were noted and sanctions put in place :

As a result of the contract signed between the FIE and WADA, a selection of junior and senior fencers from 43 countries were control tested before competitions, in line with a selection process determined by WADA.

7 - NEW INTERNET SITE

The FIE's new Internet site went live on 1st September 2003, after 2 years of work:

- Many invitations to tender, to find the most reliable companies in the computer field, the best suited to our continually developing needs and which offered the best quality/price.
- Drawing up a detailed 60 page specification matching the FIE's needs.
- Setting up and testing the various site modules.
- Translation of the site into the 3 languages used by the FIE.

As well as the complete "New Look" of the site, the new feature is the linking of the site with the creation of a large, unique database which manages the FIE's data and translates it into electronic format. For examples, competition organisers will send their results directly to the site and the rankings will be done automatically. Plus, the results and rankings will automatically be added to the FIE's general database, allowing one to view athletes' details used for the Olympic Games.

The competition observers' reports will be input directly onto to the site and will no longer appear on paper and the information contained in these reports will also be added to the database in order to provide statistics. Registration of commission members as observers will be done directly onto the site by the Commissions, by user name and password.

Registration of individual fencers and teams for the World Championships and Grand Prix will also be done on-line on the site by national federations and will no longer be the responsibility of the organisers.

8 - PROMOTION

As the 2001 Congress in Havana voted for the possibility of wearing a mask with transparent visor at sabre, the Executive Committee decided to encourage the practice. To this end, 8 Women and Men sabreurs from the same class in the 2003 World Championships in Havana who wore a mask with a transparent visor were awarded a money prize.

The total of these prizes, totalling 48,000 Euros were as follows:

1st 10,000Euros 2nd 5,000 Euros 3rd ex-aequo 2,500 Euros 5th to 8th 1.000 Euros

The FIE also took part in the promotion of the mask with transparent visor, for sabre by :

- offering 10 such masks to 6 national federations (Argentian, Romania, Italy, Cuba, Canada, the Ukraine), a total of 60 masks.
- offering national federations the possibility of ordering their masks from Gajardoni (ITA) and PBT (HUN) at a special FIE price of 150 Euros per mask.

3 - SENIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 2003

These World Championships were held in Havana (CUB) from 4^{th} – 11^{th} October 2003.

II. DEVELOPMENT OF FENCING WORLDWIDE

The FIE's work in developing and offering technical support intensified and diversified in order to make it more effective and worthwhile. We wanted to put in place all the stages necessary to attain the goal of each federation: **the visible improvement of sporting results.** The work was undertaken in the following ways:

- 1. Work to **establish a base** for young candidates to become skilled in the use of weapons through our **permanent schools and our travelling school.**
- 2. Action for **long-term improvement and retraining (3 months)** for coaches. This work was achieved in collaboration with Olympic Solidarity in specialised institutions.
- 3. **Short term improvement courses** (2 weeks maximum), funded by Olympic Solidarity or by a national federation.
- 4. **Training courses for athletes** before the World Championships, organised by the FIE. The principal objective of this new venture, which is funded entirely by the FIE, is to offer fencers from every continent the possibility of **preparing** together in order to **take part in** the World Championships.

1. Schools

The permanent schools for Maitres d'Armes and organisers of the Central American improvement courses continue their work. The FIE and Olympic Solidarity, who subsidise part of this programme, exercise control from time to time over the sporting and financial viability of these schools.

In this way, five schools took part in the 2003 programme:

• School of Santa Cruz of Bolivia

The starting up of this school for South America was planned for January, 2003. For technical reasons (the expert was not available) the school has not begun its activities yet.

School of Dakar

The year 2003 dedicated the second promotion of the fencing masters who took the exam of diploma successfully. Among them, the very first teachers for the African federations, recently affiliated yo the FIE, mainly Burkina Faso, Niger and Mali. The candidates gave evidence of a surprising competence for young people who have never practised fencing previously.

This school thus confirmed its international vocation and it will remain the international training centre of the African Confederation. Regrettably, the trainer of this school, Master Dominique Solari passed away.

The FIE, in association with the Senegalese Fencing Federation, is trying to find an expert who will continue the training work in Dakar.

School of Cape Town

The FIE maiintained its support to the school of South Africa. This school works with two centres: the North centre in Cape Town supervised by Mr Misha Galoukhin and the South centre for the coloured communities of Soweto and Mamelodi having for expert Andrey Kovrijnikh.

In Cape Town 6 fencing masters were awarded a diploma in 2003. Besides, 4 trainers of the last promotion had found a job in clubs.

The work of the trainers of club of Soweto and Mamelodi was very effective. Mpho Nkoane with his épée team won two medals at a National Championship.

School of Oceania

In 2003, the OFMA (Oceania Fencing Master's Academy) organised training courses in several cities of Australia: Perth, Melbourne, Canberra and Sydney. The system of accreditation of the trainers in Australia obliges the technical executives to update their knowledge in recycling courses. OFMA ensured the technical part of fencing for the exams aiming at up-dating knowledge.

As regards the activity of the school in Oceania, the trainers of New Zealand often participated in training or improvement courses organized in Melbourne. The Australian Fencing Federation always invited a great number of countries from Southeast Asia to participate in its training courses under the aegis of the Olympic Solidarity.

Centro-American Itinerant School

Without having a fixed base, the technical trainers of the Cuban Fencing Federation are in charge of conducting long-term training courses according to the demands of central American countries. This type of training has proved to be most welcome to the various countries concerned and well adapted to the needs of the National Federations. Countries having benefited from this type of training include Nicaragua, Honduras, El Salvador, Guatemala, Panama, etc.

3. Courses for preparation of the International Fencing Federation

The International Fencing Federation, true to its programme of the development of fencing in all geographical areas, has continued to offer help, with the aim of the improvement of **athletes**. Many technical courses, already becoming traditional, took place before the World Championships.

a) Course for preparation and participation in the 2003 junior/cadet World Championships in Trapani (ITA)

The International Fencing Federation pursued its programme of development, notably with the organisation of an international training course of 8 days before the junior/cadet World championships in Trapani, with the participation of some 35 junior fencers from 35 different countries of the 4 geographic zones.

b) Course for preparation and participation in the 2003 World Championships in Havana (CUBA)

The International Fencing Federation organised an international training course in Havana from 26th September to 4th October during the week before the World Championships.

32 fencers from 32 different countries and 4 continents took part in the course, which enabled participants to prepare themselves better, with the chance of fencing more competition bouts with different opponents.

The varying sporting levels of the participants allowed everyone to enjoy a valuable exchange of experience. Despite some logistical problems at the beginning of the course, which were resolved by the Cuban Fencing Federation, the course was a great success for the participants.

4 - Material aid

The programme of material aid to the most needy Federations is still in operation. The following national federations have benefited from material aid: Algeria, Bulgaria, Chile, Cuba, Ecuador, Georgia, Guatemala, Honduras, Qatar, Senegal.
