Weapons: Women's foil, épée, and sabre; Men's foil, épée, and sabre

Programme and schedule of the events: See the programme on page 2

Accreditation:

The participants will have to present the following documents at the time of the accreditation:

Passport

2005 FIE license

Medical Certificate (attesting the aptitude of the participant to practise fencing)

Discharge of Responsibility (signed letter at time of registration)

Categories:

The participants will be divided into 2 groups according to their age appearing on the passport and they can fence only in these categories:

Category A: **50 to 59 years old at September 1st 2005**

Category B: **60 years old and more at September 1st 2005**

Prizes:

Gold, silver and two bronze medals, as well as diplomas, for each category.

Also FIE medal for the winner in each category.

Formula:

Pools of 6 or 7 fencers, bouts of 5 hits of 3 minutes. After the pools direct elimination of 10 hits, 2 rounds of 3 minutes, with one minute break between each round; in sabre 1 minute break after 5 hits. A consolation round is planned for eliminated fencers. If there are fewer than 10 fencers in a category: single pool.

Entries:

The number of entries per federation is limited to four (4) participants per country, age group, and weapon. Entries must be sent **by the national federation** of each participant to the United States Fencing Federation (USFA) - (email address: info@USFencing.org **with copy to the FIE**, (email address: info@fie.ch) **before August 10, 2005, deadline.**

An entry fee of US \$ 70 (= € 55) per participant/weapon is payable at accreditation **in cash.**

Referees:

Participating delegations must be accompanied by the number of A or B category referees with valid FIE-license 2004/2005, provided for by article o.88 of the rules:

1-4 fencers = no obligation; 5-9 fencers = 1 referee; 10 or more fencers = 2 referees.

Equipment of fencers:

The personal equipment of the fencers must comply to the FIE rules. The transparent mask is obligatory at sabre competitions. A control of the equipment will take place the day **before** the competition.

FIE Licence:

The participants will have to present their FIE licences 2004/2005 at the time of accreditation.

Travel and stay:

Travelling, accommodations and boarding expenses **are the responsibility of the participants.** Please see suggestions on the website of the Organizing Committee:
