Ladies and Gentlemen,

This report concerns events which have taken place during the year 2006.

OBITUARIES

The International Fencing Federation has been hit, during this period, by the loss of several friends :

- **Mr Emil BECK (GER)**

Former head coach of the German Federation, Mr Emil Beck died on 12 March 2006 at the age of 70 in Tauberbischofsheim.

Guided by his talents, German fencing won no less than 163 medals in the Olympic Games, the World Championships and the European Championships altogether.

He was a visionary who strived for making his sport more media attractive in order to perpetuate its place in the Olympic concert. He created in Tauberbischofsheim a milestone centre of international fencing.

- **Mr Piero DE FAVENTO (ITA)**

Important personality of the Italian fencing, Mr Piero de Favento died on 15 March 2006 at the age of 91.

Former member of the Medical Commission and President of the said commission from 1981 to 1984, Mr de Favento became close to fencing thanks to his prestigious university results.

- **Mr Stefan HAUHLER (ROM)**

Former national trainer of Romania, Mr Stefan Haukler died on 23 November 2006 at the age of 64.

The Romanian Fencing won under his coaching several medals including the silver medal at women's foil in team in the Olympic Games of Los Angeles in 1984, the gold and silver medals in the University Games of 1981 and 1983 as well as several medals in the Junior World Championships between 1983 and 1986.

- **Mr Pierre LACAZE (FRA)**

Fencing Master, former President of the Academy of Arms of France, author of the remarkable book « En garde, du duel à l'escrime », Mr Pierre Lacaze died on 24 December 2006 at the age of 92.

Specialist of the ancient fencing, he knew how to pass on his art, his modern teaching to contemporary champions as well as artists such as the mime Marceau « who by himself, was the three musketeers ».

- **Mr Mario RAVAGNAN (ITA)**

Mr Mario Ravagnan, sabre-fencer and vice President of the Fencing Club of Turin, died on 13 December 2006 at the age of 76.

Mr Ravagnan participated in the Olympic Games of Roma (1960) and Tokyo (1964) and won respectively the bronze and silver medal at sabre, in team competition.

- **Mr Nicola GRANIERI (ITA)**

Mr Nicola Granieri, President of the Fencing Club of Turin during 24 years, died on 28 December 2006 at the age of 64.

Mr Granieri was one of the last representatives of « polyvalent » fencing at a high level being as good at epee as at foil. Winner of the World Cup at epee in 1971, he won a bronze medal at foil, in team competition, at the 1975 world championships and a gold medal in individual at the Mediterranean Games. He also won 17 national titles, in individual or team, at both foil and epee.

- **Mr Ion DRIMBA (ROM)**

Mr Ion Drimba, talented foil fencer, died at the age of 64 in Brazil. He was Olympic Champion at foil at the Games of Mexico in 1968.

We offer our deepest sympathy to the families of the deceased and to the federations to which they belonged.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

1. MANAGEMENT

The management operations of the FIE have been intensive.

The Executive Committee has met 3 times : on 4 and 5 February 2006 in Paris (FRA), on 8 September 2006 in Hammamet (TUN) and on 25 and 26 November 2006 in Paris (FRA).

The Members of the Bureau have met on 3 February 2006 in Paris (FRA), on 11 April 2006 in Taebaek City (KOR), on 7 September 2006 in Hammamet (TUN), on 29 September 2006 and 3 October 2006 in Turin (ITA).

The FIE annual **General Assembly** took place on 8 April 2006 in Taebaek City (KOR).

20 consultations of the Executive Committee took place by fax and e-mail during the year, when an urgent decision was necessary.

The arrangements put in place by these administrative bodies were regularly communicated to FIE members by **17 Letters of Information** and **17 Urgent Letters**.

These letters and their attachments were sent by electronic mail to national federations, Members of Honours, Members of the Executive Committee and Presidents of Confederations.

The various FIE ranking lists were also put into PDF format and sent to the national federations by electronic mail.

On 14 July 2006, the FIE moved into the House of International Sport in Lausanne gathering numerous international federations and sports organisations, as well as two departments of the IOC.

2. NEW AFFILIATIONS

The Executive Committee gave provisional approval to 3 new federations in 2006 :

- The Fencing Federation of Cambodia (CAM)
- The Fencing Federation of Mauritania (MTN)
- The Fencing Federation of Somalia (SOM)

The FIE has at present **121 member federations**.

5. DOPING

The fight against doping continued throughout the season and no case of doping arose.

- **598 doping controls were carried out** on the occasion of World Cup competitions (apart from the World Championships), during the season 2005/2006:
 - 222 controls during Junior World Cups
 - 224 controls during Senior World Cups
 - 120 controls during Team World Cups
 - 32 controls during satellite competitions
- **34 out-of-competition doping controls** were carried out by WADA at random in 2006.

III. DEVELOPMENT OF FENCING WORLDWIDE

NEW FIE PROJECT FOR THE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND TRAINING SUPPORT OF FENCING MASTERS IN FAVOUR OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF FENCING

The training of fencing masters, their improvement as well as the organization of training courses for the athletes were rethought and systematized in order to create more logical and more coherent structures. The actions of development and technical support of the FIE intensified and diversified to make them more profitable and more effective and keeping in mind that the final goal of each federation is to reach **a high international level (even regional, continental, world and Olympic).**

A. CONTINENTAL CENTRES

Project of Continental Centres of preparation for athletes and improvement of fencing masters in direct connection with the FIE World Centre of Fontainebleau

This projects includes at first the creation and the functioning of an International Centre for each continental zone :

1. AFRICA

Fencing masters school and preparation centre for the youth in Dakar, which has been functioning for several years.

2. AMERICA

Preparation centre in Mexico (in process, likely opening in February 2007).

3. ASIA

Preparation center in Beijing, China (to be achieved for the 2007-2008 season).

4. OCEANIA

The fencing masters school of Melbourne is organizing technical training courses since several years.

5. FONTAINEBLEAU

World Training and Preparation Centre of high level for fencing masters.

The continental centres (with the exception of Africa which has continental specificities to be taken into account) are mainly going to welcome a minimum of 3 long-term camps (3 times 30 days per year) annually. The dates of the training camps will be settled with the Confederations taking into account the FIE calendar and continental competitions. Training camps will be organized for each weapon (1 camp at epee, 1 camp at sabre, 1 camp at foil) with the participation of one fencer and one fencing master from each federation of the continent.

The activity of the centres already in function

School of Dakar

The cycle of the third promotion of fencing masters ended successfully. The students who compose this promotion divide up as follows : Niger 2, Burkina Faso 2, Guinea 1 and Mali 2 (one of them was not able to end the training for domestic reasons).

These students are accommodated in full boarding in a town located at 5 minutes on foot from the national stadium where the classes take place. Their expenses are fully paid by the FIE thanks to the subsidy assigned to the School of Dakar.

The FIE subsidy covers the expenses of the students, the speakers (permanent and temporary ones), the purchase of didactic material and the functioning of the School.

It is necessary to mention that all students in training were sent by the new federations created 2 or 3 years ago and which do not have the financial means to take care of their trainees.

All 7 students passed successfully their final examinations in front of a jury composed by Ioan Pop (International Technical Director) and Octavian Zidaru (National Technical Director of the Romanian Fencing Federation) who were assisted by the following Senegalese fencing masters : Coly, Pape Touré, N'Daye.

The head of the promotion was Julien Oudroaugo from Burkina Faso who showed exceptional talents in teaching and practise of the three weapons. Consequently, taking into account his young age (22 years) and obvious possibilities to improve, we took the decision to keep him in the Centre as an athlete with a view of a qualification for the

Olympic Games of Beijing. He participated in the last World Championship of Turin together with the Senegalese Keita. Both sabre fencers were noticed by the international fencing community thanks to their technical evolution taking into account their total lack of international experience.

In 2006, a new promotion of students arrived in Dakar from : Senegal (2), Morocco (3), Congo (2), Guinea (2), Mali (1). We are still expecting the arrival of additional students from Congo Brazzaville (2) and Mauritania (2).

The studies are going to extend over 2 academic years of 10 months each.

Oceania

The Fencing Confederation of Oceania in collaboration with the FIE established a programme to make the Olympic Committees from the different countries of this continent sensitive to the creation of national fencing federations. The programme will propose to send subsequently fencing masters from Australia for technical training courses.

This FIE training school is the unique possibility to create, recycle and improve the skills of Fencing Masters of this region. Thanks to this help from the FIE, the trainer and the director of the OFMA (Oceania Fencing Masters Academy) has the possibility to organise training and improvement courses for the various States of Australia.

These trainings are part of the national system of accreditation of professional competences. The National Technical Director works in close collaboration with the school by assuring the administrative part of the accreditation of the trainers. The NTD provides the trainers with all the important information received from the FIE and from the AFF. The most qualified trainers in Queensland, Western Australia and in the South organize training courses for the young trainers of their region. They work in close collaboration with the national trainer, discover and identify young fencers having a high-level potential.

The itinerant school of South America

Guatemala, Ecuador and Paraguay benefited from periods of training realized by Cuban experts. The trainings lasted between 6 and 12 months and the expenses of the experts were taken care by the FIE.

B. FIE TRAINING COURSES AT THE WORLD CENTRE OF FONTAINEBLEAU

The FIE signed an agreement of cooperation with the Ecole Interarmées des Sports (EIS) of Fontainebleau, 50 km from Paris, for the organisation of international fencing training courses. **In 2006, the FIE organized 3 long-term training camps of 21 days each** in February, May and November. Representatives coming from 30 different countries participated in each camp. Fencers and young fencing masters were invited to participate in these training camps. All expenses (trip, stay, supervision, local transportation) were covered by the FIE. These camps were also used as intensive training courses for athletes and improvement and recycling courses for masters. **A total of about 60 national federations benefited from these FIE training courses given by experts of international reputation.**

C. FIE TRAINING COURSES BEFORE THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

In 2006, the FIE organized its usual training courses one week before the World Championships and the expenses of the participants were totally covered by the FIE until the end of the individual championships.

These training courses preceding the World Championships have radically different goals from the other long-term training courses such as those of Fontainebleau. The objectives are the following :

- Encourage and facilitate federations with lower financial means to participate in the World Championships
- Provide one week of intensive preparation to the fencers who do not have many opponents for the bouts
- Discover the content and the structure of a modern training session
- Ensure a first contact with the world elite
- Above all benefit from the advices of fencing masters because individual courses can not have radical influences one week before a competition of a world level.

During the first training camp of 7 days which was held before the cadet/junior World Championships of Taebaek City, the 34 participants coming from 34 different countries had the opportunity to take part in 11 training sessions with partners of bouts coming from an excellent university club of Seoul.

The second training camp took place before the World Championships of Turin and was organized in collaboration with the Italian Fencing Federation and Organizing Committee of Turin. Thanks to this collaboration, 45 fencers could participate in this training camp which took place in exceptional conditions.
